## ANNUAL REPORT.

Mr. President and Gentlemen,
In presenting to you the Twenty-third Annual Report, your Committee are pleased to congratulate the members on the very excellent position which the Club continues to occupy. The membership roll has been well maintained, and your financial position remains strong and unimpaired.

Although not attaining that success in championship events which was hopefully looked for, and which the outlook at the beginning of the season warranted us in anticipating, your Committee are proud to congratulate the Club in gaining the Championship Sculls.

Throughout the season the members evinced the greatest enthusiasm in regatta and Club races, and also in the social fixtures your Club held.

We regret that our position on the premiership list has somewhat suffered this year, but we urge the members to pull together with all enthusiasm, and by dint of their united efforts we can confidently look forward to once more regain our former place as premier Club. Otherwise in every aspect the prospects for the coming season (1903-4) look bright and promising.

We started the season with a credit balance of $\mathscr{C} 419 \mathrm{~s}$. Id., and closed with a balance of $£ 8$ ros. 5 d. , having during that period paid off the sum of $\mathscr{f} 62 \mathrm{I} 2 \mathrm{~s}$., balance owing on cost of new dressing room, which
must be considered eminently satisfactory.

## INTERSTATE RACES.

The Interstate Eight was rowed at Melbourne on the Lower Yarra on 2nd May, 1903, and resulted in an easy win for Victoria. We regret that on this occasion your Club was not represented in the Victorian crew. Mr. Sloan was profferred a seat, but circumstances compelled him to decline,

The Interstate Sculling Race was held over the same course, immediately preceding the eightoared race. The entries were Messrs. P. C. Ivens and H. Brasch (Victoria), J. J. Daley (New South Wales), and T. H. Bourke (Tasmania). The race resulted in a win for Mr. Bourke, with Mr. Ivens in second place. Your Club had the honor of having its member, Mr. P. C. Ivens, selected to represent Victoria. Mr. Brasch, also of your Club, who had shown magnificent form throughout the season, requested, and was granted permission by the V.R.A., to compete. In sculling into second place, Mr. Ivens put up a most meritorious and plucky exposition.

## V.R.A. CHAMPIONSHIP RACES.

Championship Sculils, rowed on the Saltwater River on 25 th October, 1902 .-The entries were Messrs. P. C. Ivens and H. Brasch, of your Club; C. Suffren, Ballarat; and C. Stamper, Albert Park. ## CLUB RACES.

Your Committee again have pleasure in recording the success of these events. ## COMBINATION RACES.

To mark the opening of the season, Combination Eight-oared Races were held on the I It October, 1902, for trophies valued at $£ 8$ ros. Entries totalling 112 were received, forming 14 crews. A large gathering of Members and their friends, including a fair number of ladies, assembled to witness the sport. The race was rowed off in heats of three crews each, and in every instance the verdict was gained by the barest margin. The final was won by Messrs. J. A. Williams (Yarra), R. W. May (Banks), A. W. Bernadou (Mercantile), P. Tulloch (Yarra), H. Shaw (Mercantile), C. Rippon (Footscray), A. G. Walker (Banks), and E. Taylor (Footscray).

The Club again took advantage of Cr. S. J. Morell's generous donation to hold Combination Eights, on the 28 th March, 1903, for trophies valued at $£ 8$ 10s.
