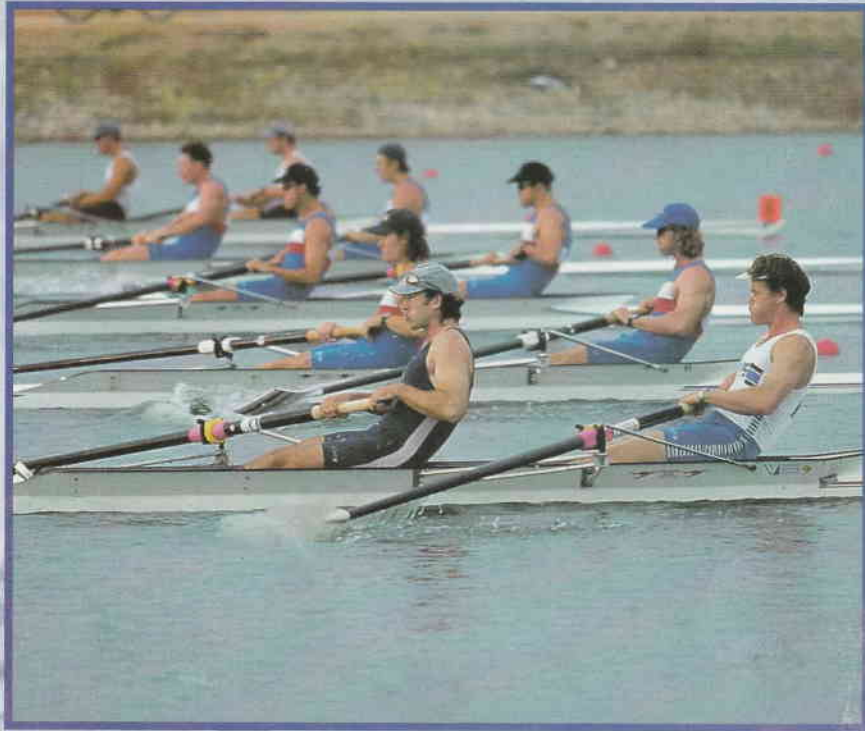

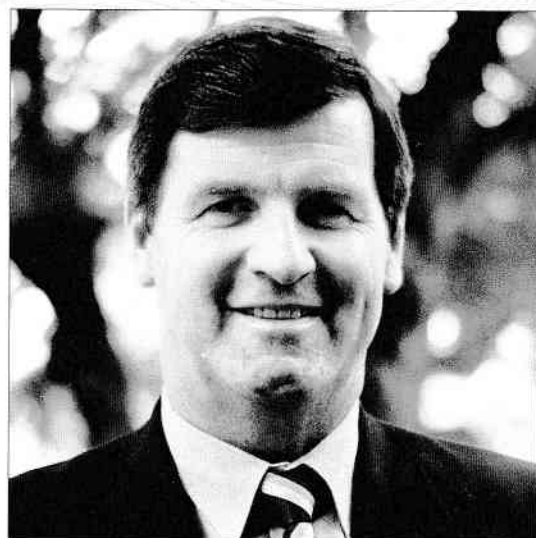

ROWING AUSTRALIA PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



It is a most pleasurable duty for me to welcome you all to the Sydney International Regatta Centre for the **ABN-AMRO 1996 Australian Rowing Championships**.

We come to these championships for the first time under the banner of **ROWING AUSTRALIA**.

As the days of premier rowing competition on the Nepean River, which has served us so well, fade the days of the Australian Rowing Council as we knew it are also closing.

The cathartic days which affected our sport in mid 1995 have passed—not only by time but by events which will direct national rowing well into the future.

Since we last met in Collie, Western Australia, we had the first ever national rowing conference in Melbourne in May. That conference identified our strengths and weaknesses and the attendees gave our Council some clear directions for change. The problems which beset our 1996 senior team and high performance program were catalytic and provided impetus, first for the Board and then the Council, in November 1995 to change our structures.

With few exceptions our administrative team of volunteers and staff shouldered both the difficulties and the solutions together. The cohesion in critical situations was admirable so that the incoming Executive Board on 17 March has every chance of quickly and effectively taking our national sport to the next and exciting phase.

That Board will have as its springboard the positive and inspiring outcomes of a most successful **ABN-AMRO 1996 Australian Rowing Championships**.

A long time servant of rowing, Don Croot, stepped forward last year to chair the Organising Committee for these championships. Tough and determined and with a lot of volunteer support, Don and his team have left no issue alone in the preparations for these titles.

His efforts and the vision of the members of the New South Wales Rowing Association will assure many "firsts" for this regatta.

At these first national championships on this new rowing course it is appropriate that we salute the Penrith Lakes Development Corporation for its imagination, attention to detail, widespread consultation and above all, its investment for rowing. When the King's Cup crews sweep down the course on Sunday, 17 March, with Channel 7 beaming the race across Australia, the General Manager of the Corporation, Mr Ian Stainton and Senior Engineer, Mr Peter McGhee and their dedicated team can take a deserved bow.

Don Croot and his team recognised early that the expenses of these championships would necessitate major sponsor and supplier support. We were delighted to hear the news last year that **ABN-AMRO** was the naming rights sponsor. We honour the company and Jerome Rowley for this invaluable support of national rowing. On Saturday, 16 March, we will host the Annual Dinner of Rowing Australia. On that evening we will honour the first ever life members of the Australian Rowing Council now Rowing Australia. Messrs Bob Aitken, MBE, John Coates, AO and Berry Durston will be honoured for their long and impressive service to rowing.

The organisers, administrators, umpires, media persons, dignitaries, sponsors, spectators are all, in the end, serving the participants.

One thing is certain—these championships will produce excellent entries and fascinating racing. For this year the senior events have been opened to all members of the high performance squads who will be worthy representatives for us later this year at the Olympic Games in Atlanta. The race practice will be invaluable.

Our aim, when I became President two years ago, was to achieve a record four medals of any colour at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics. My confidence that our rowers can achieve that result has never wavered and is shared by all members of Rowing Australia's administrative team. I hope that the riches and depth of the ranks of rowers can be fully harnessed by the selectors, the coaches and the Institutes of Sport, to reach the highest Olympic goals that are both within sight and grasp.

I close my final President's Message with a word to the youth, junior and school crews at these championships—be back here in four years, not as spectators but as members of a proud and all conquering Australian Olympic Rowing Team.

The nine lane rowing and canoeing course at the S.I.R.C. is magnificent—the times at the Olympic Trials recently indicate that the course is quite fast—and I am sure racing during the regatta will be of a very high standard. 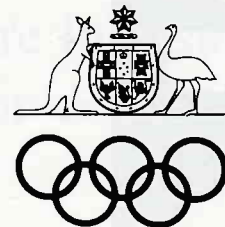
Australia has been competing in Olympic rowing since the 1912 Olympic Games in Stockholm with our earliest successes recorded in 1928 and 1932 when Bobby Pearce won consecutive gold medals in the single sculls.

And of course we all remember Merv Wood's gold medal in 1948, his silver medal in Helsinki in 1952, and other medals to Australia, including the magnificent silver medals in the men's eights at Mexico in 1968 and the men's quad scull at Los Angeles in 1984.

In more recent times, Australia capped its most successful Olympic rowing regatta ever with two gold medals and three overall finalists at Lake Banyoles in Barcelona in 1992. The men's coxless four, world champions of the past two years, carried with them the expectations of all Australians and performed superbly to provide double gold following victory in the men's double sculls.

As the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games draw closer we are again looking forward to a great Olympic regatta. Already nine boats out of a total fourteen events have qualified. Our recent successes in national and international competition have us well placed for what will certainly be a great regatta on the beautiful Lake Lanier.

The Australian Olympic Committee is pleased to support our Australian rowers and provide assistance by way of grants for international competition and we look forward to



significantly increasing our direct assistance to athletes and coaches through the 2000 Gold Medal Plan after Atlanta.

INTERSTATE AND NATIONAL ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Interstate rowing competition in Australia originated in four-oared gigs, the first recorded race being held in 1863 on the Parramatta River in New South Wales over a distance of three miles. New South Wales and Victoria were the competing States, the first named being the victor in a time of 19 minutes 25 seconds. A number of contests followed in this class of boat between crews from New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania, often with more than one Club crew from each State taking part in the competition.

Rowed in Melbourne over a distance of four miles in 1878, the first interstate eight-oared race contested between New South Wales and Victoria was won by Victoria, and continued as an annual event between them until 1885 when Queensland and Tasmania joined the competition followed by Western Australia and South Australia in 1897 and 1899 respectively. The records showed that up until 1890, New South Wales and Victoria were the principal contestants with New South Wales recording its first victory at the second meeting in 1879. Following their re-entry to the competition in 1890, Queensland recorded their first win in 1891, followed by Tasmania in 1906, South Australia in 1913 and Western Australia in 1921 at Launceston.

The first men's interstate Single Sculling Championship won by M.J. Slack representing Queensland was rowed in Brisbane in 1892 in conjunction with the already well established eight-oared race, and since 1895 has been an annual event on the interstate rowing calendar.

Interstate Challenge races for women commenced in 1912 when a Brisbane Ladies' Rowing Club four representing Queensland defeated the Albert Park Ladies in Melbourne. A return visit by the Victorian representatives in the following year resulted in a second Queensland victory on the Brisbane River by a mere two feet.

Competition between the States ceased during the First World War, 1915 to 1919 and resumption 15th May, 1920, on the Hamilton Reach of the Brisbane River introduced to the interstate competition our two most prestigious perpetual rowing trophies, namely, the King's Cup for the Men's eight-oared Championship and the United Licensed Victuallers Association of Queensland Trophy for the Women's four. The history of both these trophies along with the other more recent perpetual trophies now presented annually to the successful Interstate Championship crews is contained later in this programme.

Central control of rowing in Australia became necessary to arrange and co-ordinate Australian and International

competition and assume responsibility for the now well established annual Interstate Championships. Following the Interstate Regatta in Brisbane on 15th May, 1920 the Australian Women's Rowing Council was formed. The 1st May, 1925 heralded the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council, and thereafter the two Councils conducted their affairs independently until 1976 when amalgamation of both into the now renamed Australian Rowing Council secured a continuity of control and standardisation of regulations, the benefits of which will ensure the future growth and success of the sport both here and overseas.

The Second World War again interrupted the Interstate Rowing Championships, there being no men's competition between the years 1940 and 1945, and the curtailment of women's races between 1942 and 1948. On resumption, the need for Australian representation at international meetings became more evident, and the addition of test races in other classes of boats became a regular feature at the interstate regattas. The introduction of additional events to Interstate Championship status has provided annual competition for other classes of competitors, and we commend the foresight of the Rowing Councils in legislating for the inclusion of the Men's Lightweight Four in 1958, the Women's Single Scull in 1963, the Women's Lightweight Four in 1968, the Men's Youth Eight and the Women's Youth Four in 1988. The Women's Youth Four was replaced by a Women's Youth Eight in 1994.

In 1962 the Council made provision for the National Regatta to be conducted bi-annually over 2,000 metres to provide small boat competition regularly, thereby facilitating the selection of Australian representative crews for international competition and substantially reducing the need for test races.

The first regatta program comprised National Championship events for four with cox, four without cox, pair with cox, pair without cox, double scull, lightweight eight, lightweight pair with cox, and lightweight single scull. The development of the regatta witnessed the inclusion of additional classes of oarsmen along with schoolboy representatives, and since 1974 has been held annually in conjunction with the interstate Championships. The Women's Council conducted their National Club Championships annually. Resulting from the amalgamation of the National Councils in 1976, the combined National and Interstate Championship regatta now comprises a full programme for both men's and women's sculling and rowing races in all classifications.



NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

REGATTA SECRETARY'S OFFICE: The Regatta Secretary's Office is located at the rear of the Finish Tower.

WEIGH-IN STATION: The Weigh-in station is located in the Athletes' area close to the launching pontoons.

BOAT WEIGHING: Boat weighing will be conducted close to the launching pontoons.

LANE NUMBERS: All boats must carry lane numbers which will be available from the marshals close to the launching pontoons for a refundable deposit of \$10.

STARTING PROCEDURE:

The Countdown: The Starter shall inform the crews of the time remaining before the start and tell them in which lane each will race.

Late Arrival: Crews must be at their starting positions at least two (2) minutes before the starting time of their race. The Starter may warn any crew arriving at its starting position less than two minutes before the starting time. A warning has the same effect as one given for a false start. The Starter may exclude a crew arriving after the starting time. The Starter must inform the Referee of any warning or exclusion.

Breakages: The start is not delayed for broken oars, fittings or equipment.

Two Minutes to Go: When the Starter announces "Two Minutes" this shall signify to the crews that they are formally under Starter's orders. The announcement of "Two Minutes" shall also be an instruction to the crews to prepare to race and to the Aligner to commence the aligning of boats. The crews must be ready to race within the two minute period.

Aligning: The Aligner indicates to the Starter that the boats are properly aligned by raising a white flag. Should correct alignment be lost during the subsequent starting procedure, the Aligner lowers the flag.

Roll-Call: When the boats are aligned and the crews are ready to race the Starter shall make a roll-call by announcing - in lane order - the names of each of the crews in the race. Once the roll-call begins the crews must make sure that their boats are straight. Each crew is responsible for being both straight and ready at the end of the roll-call. Once the roll-call begins the Starter shall take no further notice of any crew which then indicates that it is not ready or that it is not straight.

The Start: After the last crew has been named in the roll-call the Starter shall check that the Aligner's flag is still raised and shall then say "Attention". The Starter shall then raise the red flag. After a clear pause the Starter shall drop the red flag quickly to one side, simultaneously saying

"Go". The pause between the raising of the flag and the start command (dropping the red flag and saying "go") shall be variable.

Starting procedure using coloured indicator discs

After the last crew has been named in the roll-call the Starter shall check that the Aligner's flag is still raised and shall then say "Attention". The Starter shall then press a button to change the visible signal from the neutral position to red. After a clear pause, the Starter shall give the start by pressing a button which shall, at the same moment, (a) change the red signal to yellow; (b) make an audible signal through the loudspeakers; (c) start the timing system for the race. The pause between the red signal and the start command (the yellow signal and the audible signal) shall be variable.

Interruptions: If the starting procedure is interrupted for any reason external to the crews or for a false start, the Starter must begin the procedure again, starting with the roll-call.

Quick Start: In exceptional circumstances the Starter may decide to dispense with the roll-call. If so, the Starter must inform the crews that the "quick start" shall be used. Once the normal start has been used the Starter shall not change to the quick start for the same race. For the quick start, instead of the roll-call, the Starter shall say "quick start - attention". The Starter shall then raise the red flag. After a clear pause the Starter shall give the start by dropping the red flag quickly to one side and simultaneously saying "go". The pause between the raising of the flag and the start command (dropping the red flag and saying "go") shall be variable.

False Start: Should a crew start too soon, the Aligner shall inform the Starter and Umpire by waving a red flag. The Starter shall stop the race by ringing a bell and then waving the red flag. After the race has been stopped the Aligner shall tell the Starter by name (not lane number) which crew or crews started too soon. The decision as to whether one or more crews started too soon is the sole responsibility of the Aligner. When the crews return to their starting positions, the Starter shall warn the crew or crews at fault. This warning shall hold good until the race has been rowed and shall therefore apply in the case of a postponement or a re-row.

Exclusion: The Starter shall exclude from the race a crew causing two false starts or which has received two warnings in the same heat.

FINISH: The Judges at the finish shall indicate the crossing of the line by each crew or sculler in the race by sound signal.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS CONT.



WEIGH IN: Lightweight competitors shall be weighed in racing uniform by a person duly appointed by the Organising Committee conducting the regatta not less than one hour and no more than two hours before the starting time appearing in the program for their first race on each day of racing. If the competitor has races in other events on that day, the weight recorded for the first event may be applied to qualify for such subsequent events. However, the competitor may re-weigh for such subsequent events within the time limits applicable to those events. This weight may also be carried forward for other lightweight events on that day of racing.

Coxswains shall be weighed in racing uniform by a person duly authorised by the Organising Committee conducting the regatta (and at times specified by the Organising Committee) not more than 24 hours and not less than one hour before the advertised starting time of their first race in such regatta. Immediately after the race the coxswain of the winning crew together with the dead weight carried (if any) shall again be weighed by a person duly authorised by the Organising Committee conducting the regatta.

WITHDRAWALS: Withdrawals shall be notified to the Regatta Secretary's office at the earliest possible time but not less than one hour before the respective event.

SUBSTITUTES: All crews have the right to replace up to fifty percent of their rowers and the coxswain provided that a written declaration of the names and status of any such replacements be presented at least one hour before the race to the Regatta Secretary's Office. No substitute is permitted for a sculler except for a sculler in an Interstate Championship.

No competitor may race for two different clubs at the same regatta but a competitor may represent his/her State and his/her Club and his/her School at a regatta. A coxswain may steer for any number of clubs at a regatta. No change may be made in a crew which has already raced in a heat of

its event except in the case of serious illness or accident in which case a medical certificate shall be tendered to the Referee and the Jury shall determine whether such a change shall be permitted.

COMPETING BOATS: The bows of all boats shall be fitted with a white ball 4 cm in diameter in soft rubber or similar material unless the bow is so constructed as to afford equivalent protection and visibility.

EQUIPMENT DAMAGE: If a crew while in the first 100 metres of the race indicates that it has suffered damage to its boat or equipment, the Starter or Umpire will stop the race.

UMPIRE'S DIRECTIONS: The Umpire may not steer a crew unless there is an obstacle in its lane. If a crew is about to impede another by its wash or by leaving its lane the Umpire raises a white flag and calls the crew at fault, indicating the required change of direction by lowering the flag to one side. If a crew is about to cause a collision, the Umpire may call its attention by raising the white flag and stop it by giving the command "STOP". Crews interfering with their opponents may be excluded from the race.

WINNING CREWS: All first, second and third placed crews and scullers in "Final" events are to proceed to the boating area as directed by the marshal and then to the Victory Dais for the presentation of trophies or medallions immediately after the race concludes. Other competitors should proceed in an orderly manner back to the boating area and leave the water as soon as practicable.

BRIEFING OF COMPETITORS: A meeting of coaches, rowers, coxswains, scullers, Umpires and Starters shall take place in the Grandstand at the Finish, S.I.R.C. at 3.00 pm on Monday, 11 March, 1996.

BRIEFING OF SCHOOL COMPETITORS: The briefing of school coaches, rowers, coxswains and scullers will be held in the Grandstand at the Finish, S.I.R.C. at 7.00 am on Friday, 15 March, 1996.

BOAT TRAFFIC RULES

POWER BOAT USAGE

The course shall be CLOSED to all power boats, except official craft, at all times.

BOAT TRAFFIC RULES

PROCEDURES FOR BOAT LAUNCHING:

Six pontoons numbered from south to north. Crews returning to the pontoons may use only pontoons 1, 2 and 3.

Crews going out may use only pontoons 4, 5 and 6. When boating or leaving the water crews must obey the instructions of the boat marshals at the pontoons.

BOAT TRAFFIC RULES DURING COMPETITION PERIOD:

During the competition period the course will be closed for training 30 minutes prior to the starting time for the first event. The course must be cleared by this time. All infringements will be penalised. The course will be available for training 30 minutes after the finish of the last race and will close again at 7.00 pm. Crews may only use the boating lake for warm-up and cool-down during this period and must follow the rowing directions on the boating lake (anti-clockwise around AND NOT THROUGH the centre line of buoys) keeping well clear of crews being marshalled to proceed to the start.

To proceed to the start crews should be positioned in the

marshalling area near "the start bridge" at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start of their race and report to the Boat Marshal in that area. The Marshal will direct crews under this bridge and into Lane zero. Do not leave Lane 0 until directed by the Starter or Aligner.

At the completion of their race crews must vacate the finish area as soon as possible and proceed immediately under the "Finish Bridge" to the boating lake for cool-down and leaving the water.

On finals days there will be a marshal in the incoming pontoons area to assemble placegetting crews for return to the victory dais for the presentation ceremony.

BOAT TRAFFIC RULES DURING TRAINING PERIODS:

During training periods the course may be used as follows: Crews training on the course will proceed to the start under the "marshalling" bridge and in to Lane 0 and proceed towards the 2000m start in lanes 1 and 2. Crews training on the course heading towards the finish will use Lanes 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9. **DO NOT USE LANES 3 and 4.** Crews returning to the start must use lanes 1 and 2.

Upon completion of training, crews must vacate the finish area as soon as possible and return to the boating area under the "Finish Bridge" to the boating lake.

All these traffic rules and rules of rowing are to protect and ensure the safety of all competitors. Any directions from Boat Race Officials or marshals **MUST BE OBEYED** and crews disobeying these directions will be penalised.

STATUS OF COMPETITORS

SENIOR A	All rowers shall be eligible to compete in a Senior A category in the appropriate division.
SENIOR B	A rower ceases to be Senior B on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 21 years. After that date the rower is classified as a Senior A.
YOUTH	A rower ceases to be Youth on 1 July after reaching the age of 19 years. This definition also applies to the coxswains of a Youth crew.
JUNIOR	A rower ceases to be Junior on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 18 years. This definition also applies to the coxswains of a Junior crew.
SCHOOL	A rower who is attending secondary school as a full-time student shall be eligible to compete in the School category. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a School crew.
UNDER 17	A rower ceases to be eligible for Under 17 events on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 17 years. The coxswain of an Under 17 crew is NOT bound by this definition.
UNDER 16	A rower ceases to be eligible for Under 16 events on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 16 years. The coxswain of an Under 16 crew is NOT bound by this definition.

HISTORY OF THE KING'S CUP



First won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Regatta held 2nd to 4th July of that year, this handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race for that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful A.I.F. No. 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914–18 War.

The successful crew comprising Sgt. A.A. Robb, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas) 11st 10lb, Bow: Lieut. F.A. House, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas) 11st 12lb, 2; Lieut. T. McGill, Leichhardt Rowing Club (NSW), 12st 10lb, 3; Gunner A.V. Scott, Murray Bridge Rowing Club (SA.), 13st 4; Lieut H. Hauenstien MM, Leichhardt & Balmain Rowing Clubs (NSW), 13st 9lb, 5; Major SA. Middleton, D.S.O., Glebe & Sydney Rowing Clubs (NSW), 13st 6lb, 6; Gunner G.W. Nettam, West Australian Rowing Club (WA), 11st 12lb, 7; Captain H.C. Disher, Melbourne University Boat Club (Vic), 11st 11lb, Stroke; Sgt A E Smedley, Sydney Rowing Club (NSW) Cox; defeated the A.I.F. No. 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds—the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and United States.

The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian Military Authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the Australian War Museum. On 14th May, 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Association held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual trophy for the Australian Eight Oared Championship. This request was refused and on 12th October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30th October, 1920 and signed by



Captain H.C. Disher, was sent to His Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy. A reply dated 13th May, 1921, received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr Winston Churchill, stated that "His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight oared Race of Australia".

The trophy was, in fact won twice—first by the Australian oarsmen in three strenuous races and then by the Australian Rowing Administrators in three equally strenuous contests with the Australian authorities who had taken possession of it.

HISTORY OF THE PRESIDENT'S CUP

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President Mr. E.C. Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersalls Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the late A.A. Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian Olympians

have been the holders of this trophy. The records of R.H. (Bob) Pearce holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medallist in 1928 and 1932, his cousin C.A.(Cecil) Pearce, four times holder and M T.(Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic Gold, Silver and bronze Medallist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively and all representing New South Wales are well known.

HISTORY OF THE U.L.V.A. TROPHY

Presented by the United Licensed Victuallers Association of Queensland to the Australian Women's Rowing Council in 1920, and affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as "Bertha", this handsome sterling silver trophy crafted in London depicts Dorothy Arnold Ekins, the petite girl from Mannum, holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb of her day... floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers!!!

Dorothy, a lightweight by today's standards, along with three other members of her home Club representing South Australia, won the first Women's Interstate Four-oared Championship from New South Wales and Queensland in a time of 4 minutes 55 seconds.

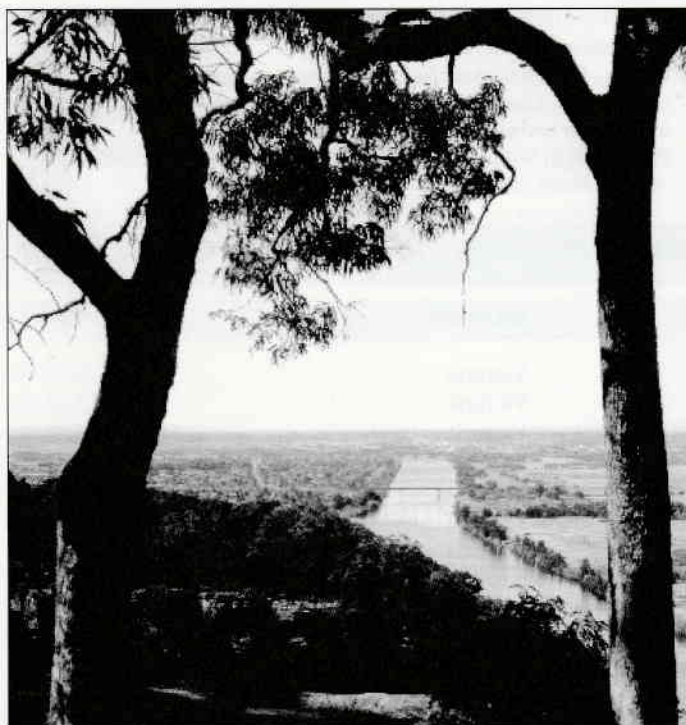
HISTORY OF THE PENRITH CUP

The introduction of the Interstate Lightweight Four Oared Championship in 1958 for oarsmen then weighing not more than 140 Ibs, and for which the Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy, laid the foundation for this class of rowing in Australia.

The weight limit for lightweight competitors in Australia has varied from time to time between the States, however, since 1974, the year which heralded the first F.I.S.A. Lightweight Championship at which Australia recorded a Gold medal victory the Internationally accepted lightweight limits, have been adopted nationally.

HISTORY OF THE NOEL F. WILKINSON TROPHY

Recognising necessity to introduce a class of rowing in which Australian Youth oarsmen could compete, the Australian Rowing Council initiated the interstate Youth Eight-oared Championship at an age limit some eighteen months older than the Internationally accepted Junior age limit. The first Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974, and in that same year, the Council accepted the offer by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event.

Junior (age limit) events for other classes of boats forming part of the National Regatta programme now collectively fulfill the purposes originally envisaged by both the Council and the Donor, namely, an incentive to young oarsmen to continue in the sport subsequent to completion of their secondary education by providing acceptable competition at a National level and foster their development into higher classifications.

HISTORY OF THE VICTORIA CUP

At the first Women's interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship contested on the Yarra River in Melbourne victory was recorded by Victoria with a crew stroked by one of Australia's best known oarswomen, Margaret Agnew Mackenzie, whose efforts in negotiating with the Women's Rowing Council secured lightweight rowing as an annual event on the women's Interstate rowing programme. The Victoria Cup, presented by the Victorian Ladies' Rowing

Association, is the perpetual trophy for this event. Lightweight women have recorded International victories the first being at the inaugural competition between the United States of America, Canada and Australia at St. Catherines, Canada, in 1979, when Australia was successful in the two events for which crews were entered—Lightweight Four with Cox and Lightweight Pair with Cox.

HISTORY OF THE NELL SLATTER TROPHY

Dating back to 1901 at the Great Federation Regatta staged on Albert Park Lake, Cassie Wooly McRitchie representing Victoria and using a skiff loaned to her by the then Governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, defeated her challenger from Sydney, Elizabeth Messenger, and was presented with a magnificent pearl and ruby bracelet by the Duke of Gloucester. So great was the public interest in the female scullers that police were required to keep the inquisitive spectators at bay. At the great age of 96 she passed away in 1973, and will for all time be

remembered as the founder of the first all women's rowing club at Albert Park in 1907. Cassie McRitchie is justifiably known as the "mother" of Victorian women's rowing.

First introduced in 1963 in Brisbane, the Women's Interstate Single Sculling Championship has continued as an annual event for which the Nell Slatter Trophy, presented by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association as a tribute to the then President, is the perpetual trophy.

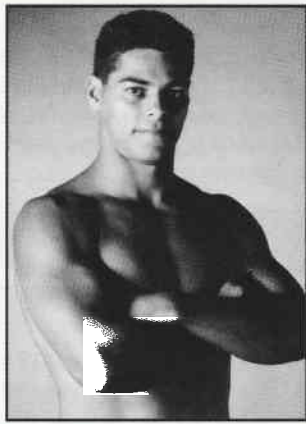




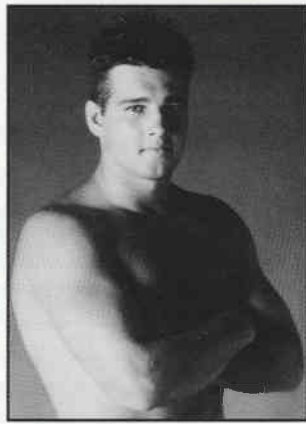
