MESSAGE FROM COUNTRY ROAD

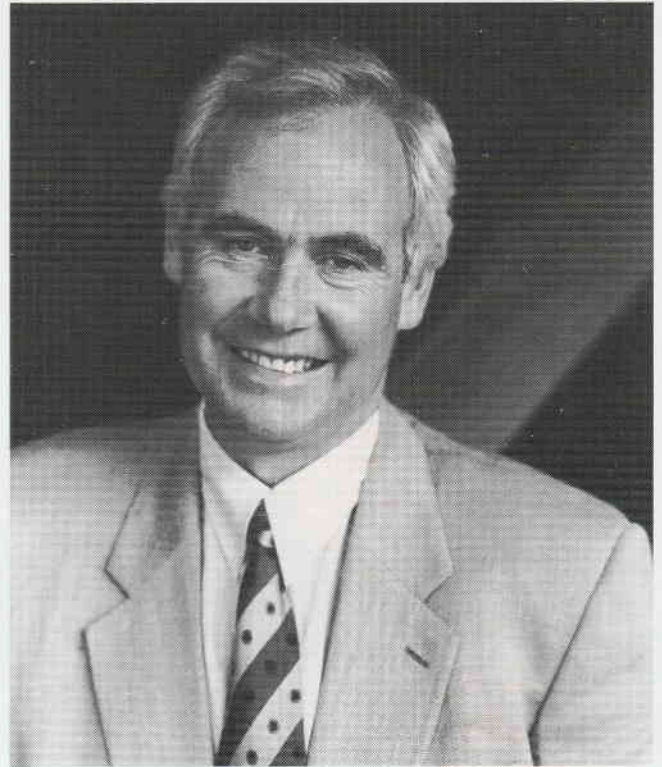
The 1991 King's Cup and Australian Rowing Championships sees the culmination of an exciting, 12 months sponsorship for Country Road.

Australian Rowing and the National Championships

The development of national rowing competition in many ways reflects the history of Australia. Intercolonial races for men began as early as 1863 and developed steadily until an annual competition including eights and single sculls was in place by 1895. (Races between schools and universities were also held during this era.)

The competition continued as interstate rowing after Federation until being interrupted by the First World War. Racing resumed in 1920, the eights race now being the King's Cup. It was not until 1958 that the men's lightweight four was added as a third race. During this time the other major national competitions were test or selection races for Commonwealth and Olympic Games.

Women's interstate rowing began in 1912 and continued as a fours race until a single scull race was added in 1963 and then a lightweight four in 1968. During this time competition was vigorous, although women's rowing did not have the larger base of school competition enjoyed by the men.

The interstate competition started independently by the men and women is now one regatta, normally held on the Sunday following the national championships. The programme now includes a men's youth eight and women's youth four.

During the 1960s and 1970s rowing grew, with baby boomers having more leisure time, and women becoming more active in the sport. Social change and this growth influenced the decision to hold the first full combined national championships in 1976, which included eleven events for women. The men's and women's associations joined to form the Australian Rowing Council which set up the structure for the rapid growth over the past 15 years.

Since the union in 1976 the sport has flourished, as is shown by the number and quality of entries at this regatta. There would

be few sports able to boast so many international medallists competing at national championships.

There are many factors and individuals that have contributed to this growth in our sport, including the appointment by Council of our first national coaching director, Mr Reinhold Butschli in 1979. As a result many developments were initiated during the 1980s:

- The National Regatta programme was enlarged to include the important international categories of Junior and Senior B for men and women.
- Coaching education and a more uniform approach to technique were generally accepted.
- National selection regattas were introduced to provide extra domestic competition for internationals and a fairer method of selection.
- The Australian Institute of Sport accepted rowing as a sport in their programme.
- Growth in women's rowing has been exceptional, particularly in schools.
- Talent identification programmes in the states are recruiting potential champions from outside our regular development areas.
- Most states now have their own coaching directors and support of state sports institutes.

These factors and community attitudes to health, fitness and non contact sport will ensure the development of rowing. The limiting factors in this growth are the shortages of club administration, equipment and coaching.

It is hoped the recent restructuring of the ARC to include a Board that meets regularly will provide the sound management to continue and improve the development to date.

Rowing for Life

An interview with Bob Bradley

What keeps a man interested in rowing at the age of sixty? For some it would be simply to keep fit, for others to continue the habits of a long-practised sport or simply the enjoyment of being out on the water. But at a time when most rowers have long since put their oars back on the rack, Bob Bradley is not only still rowing, but competing in regattas, and *winning*.

Bob Bradley sees rowing as a way of life, a philosophy almost. Rowing is a discipline which has taught him mastery over himself, given him control of himself physically and mentally, and brought him confidence. What is more, he has obviously enjoyed it. Today he is a great advertisement for his sport, looking years younger than he is, fit, relaxed and comfortable with himself. He is the perfect counter to the medical view that rowing is too strenuous a sport.

As a young apprentice with the railways in 1947, Bob was doing his own training by running in the Adelaide parklands. He was hoping to join a running club, but when someone mentioned that the S.A. Railways Institute was looking for new rowers he leapt at the opportunity. Thus began his rowing career.

At school he had enjoyed a range of sports, especially athletics, but the school did not have the money to support more than one or two grades in any sport. Unless you were an excellent footballer or cricketer, you got little encouragement. Weekend sport was also difficult, as Bob had to work Saturday mornings. Not physically large, he had some hopes of achieving success as a long distance runner, but rowing soon gained all his interest.

On joining the club he was immediately placed in a crew — 'There were no rowing machines then, so we went straight into tubs', he reports. The training of the day taught the 'straight back' style of rowing. This placed emphasis on style and appearance, and was not scientifically based. Rowers were taught 'to take it on the shoulders and the legs', and 'swing' into it. Weight and sheer physical endurance were relied on to win races. Training was based around time on the water and rowing 'flat out'. This approach did not change significantly for about twenty years, and as the eastern states began to discover a more scientific basis to rowing technique they were able to dominate the smaller states, such as South Australia, in major events like the King's Cup.

After a year or so rowing in novice fours, Bob began sculling. 'I started to realize that if I was going to have a career in rowing I couldn't stay in crews. It still happens — if one person is missing you can't get out. At least today you can do some other form of training, such as rowing on a machine, but we had only running as an alternative.'

Bob did not start weight training until he was 30, and at the start of his career weighed only about 10½ stone (67 kg). This made it hard for him to compete with rowers in the 12, 13 or 14 stone category — the lightweight class had not yet been introduced.

The equipment did not make rowing easy, either. There were no epoxy resins, so everything, including oars, had to be tacked together with copper nails. The boat's shells were made from cedar veneer and were heavy in construction. A split in the shell would follow the grain and tend to run the whole length of the boat. The only way to end the split was to 'tingle' it. This required placing a sliver of veneer over the split, drilling a line of tiny holes either side pushing small

copper nails through and gently turning them over to hold the sliver. It was then sealed with liberal coatings of varnish. The boats therefore gradually got heavier, and slower. They only had a working life of about 10 years. A regatta was a real trial. Going to Murray Bridge, or even just to Port Adelaide, meant putting the boat on a train, meeting it at the other end and then carrying it as much as a mile to the water!

Training when Bob began included heavy and light rowing sessions and running. The 'heavy' rowing nights might include eight 500 m sprints as hard as you could row, i.e. '110%'. At the top you rowed back lightly and then repeated the sprint. A 'light' night meant six 900 m sprints doing 10 heavy strokes, 10 light, 20 heavy, 20 light and so on. A running night might mean a 6 or 7 mile run.

At an early stage in his career Bob consulted a doctor about chronic tiredness. He was not only training as many nights a week as possible, but trying to complete his draughtsman's qualifications at night school and attend a couple of dances a week. The doctor told him to quit rowing — it was 'too strenuous a sport' — and to take up tennis. After a couple of miserable weeks Bob ignored the doctor and went back to rowing. He realized that he had just been pushing his body too hard and quickly learned to pace himself. Nowadays his training always includes proper periods of recuperation. He works in cycles of effort and active rest. Since then Bob has never had problems with health or injuries.

By carefully watching himself on 'up-and-down' waves of training, and paying attention to technique and speed work he has built up his confidence. 'I classified myself as fitter than anyone else on the water, and that fitness gave me

confidence to be able to win races when the pressure was on.'

Bob has also maintained his versatility. Although primarily a sculler, he would always jump into a spare seat to row in a crew when the opportunity arose. His highest achievement in a crew came as a sit-in in a Junior Four Championship.

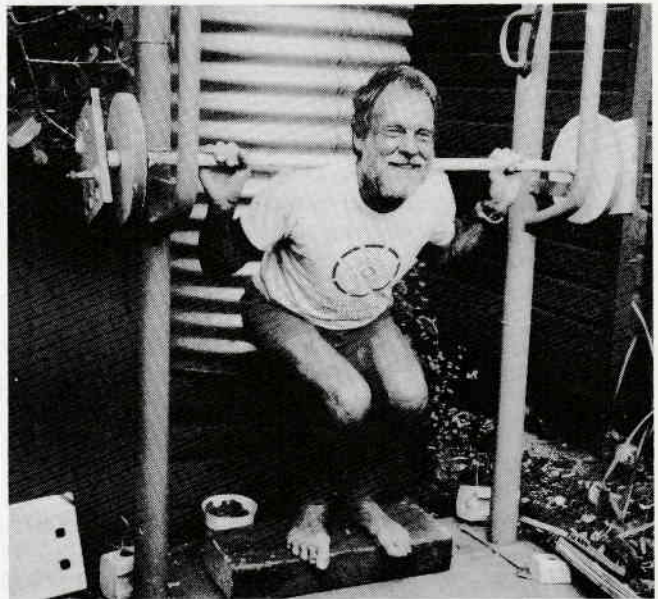
He believes in versatility. 'The crew aspect tends to spoil rowing. I think that in a club everyone should row in sculls or pairs, and train against each other. In a regatta everyone is also entered in eights and fours, and the sculls and pairs become their individual races. That is the key to success.'

'Sculling helps rowing in every way. Mainly it helps 'in the head' - it's up to you to make things work. You can't sit it out like you can in a crew.'

When Bob bought his first scull – an old wood veneer boat

that had to be rescued from the ceiling of the flooded Murray Bridge club house – it cost him a month's wages, about £30. Today he has two modern boats, though they are not particularly 'high-tech'. Although Bob thinks high-tech boats do give an advantage, he obviously believes very strongly in the ability of the rower him- or herself. After all, he spent his first three years not only training, but competing, in the club's tub scull.

Bob has never been a great keeper of records – 'I never thought that one day a record of all these races would come in handy, so I don't remember exactly' – but he reckons to have about 9 sculling state titles in the open class, plus about 6 or 7 lightweight titles as well. Since he began competing in the veteran classes he has won 9 successive Australian titles, and also won the next younger age class. At the 1989 Australian Masters in Adelaide he achieved 7 gold, 1 silver and a bronze medal. At the inaugural World Masters at Toronto in 1985 he was placed fifth in the single sculls against international competitors.

Asked about the highlights of his career he recalls the Australian Championship he took out in 1979 with Rob Booth in the Lightweight Double Sculls. At the time he was 49. 'We hadn't trained much together, but we had the same timing in the boat, the same length of stroke. When we pushed off from the bank Rob said 'What's our plan'. I said 'I don't know. I suppose we just do the best we can.' We started very quickly, looked around and saw everyone behind us. With every stroke we seemed to pull away. Half way through the race I started to worry: 'When are they going to come at us?' It was just a great race - we had the fitness and the timing.' Their record time of 5 min 37.5 sec still stands.

The next year he recalls that they 'got done'. But that has never worried Bob. He still maintains a vigorous training schedule – it cannot be called 'punishing' because that is not the way he approaches training. For him rowing is not just brawn, nor just fitness alone – it is a total approach to producing the best from the human body on the water. This approach is obviously working because Bob is still winning races in his age class *and* the class above him (i.e. younger) and still putting in times that would make a young man proud. Nor does he see any need to stop – he just keeps on rowing!

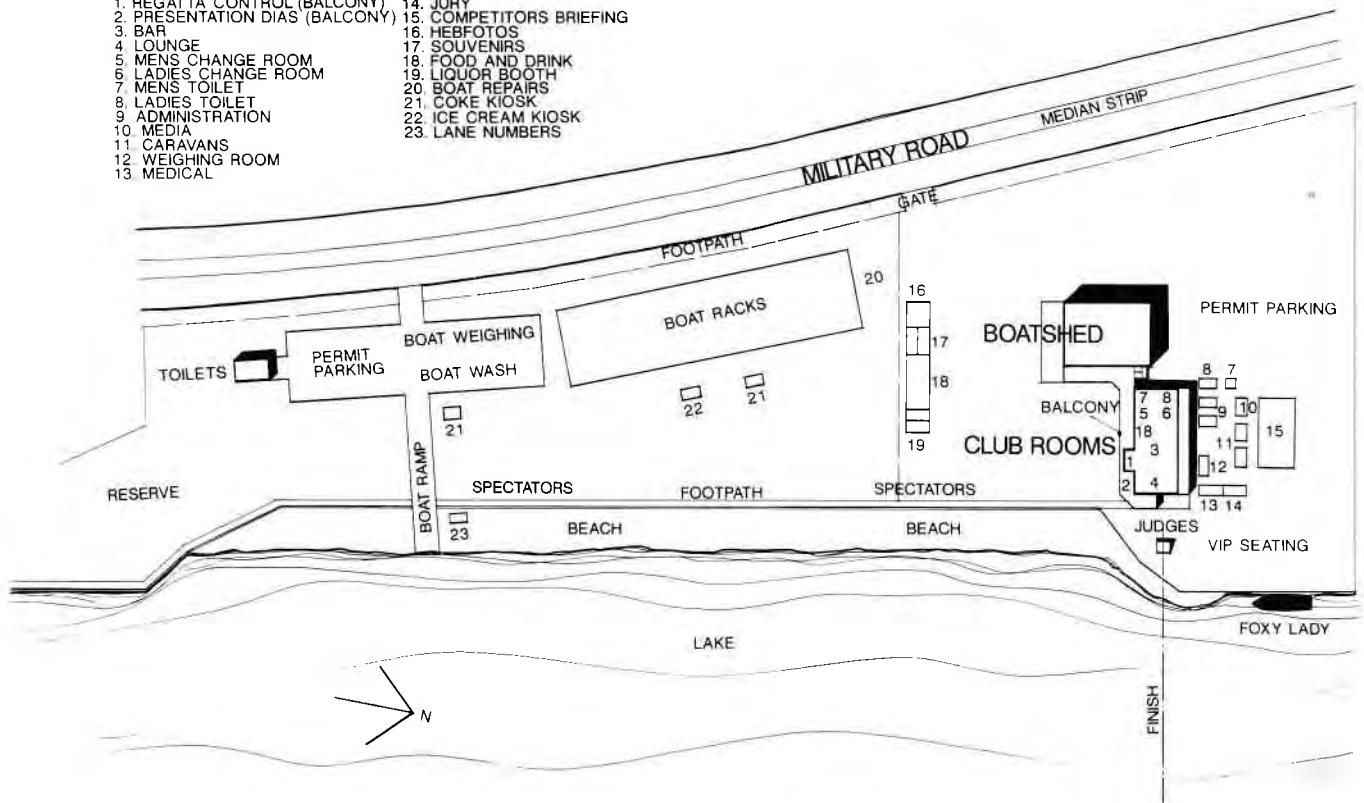

Notice to Competitors

Starting Times

Competitors must be at their starting positions at least two minutes before the time laid down for the start of their event.

Late Arrivals

The Starter may warn any crew arriving at its starting position less than two minutes before the start time of their event. A warning has the same effect as one given for a false start. The Starter may exclude a crew arriving after the start time.

Starting Procedure

As soon as the Judge at the start indicates that the boats are properly aligned the Starter raises a red flag. After making sure that all crews are ready the Starter gives the warning command 'Are You Ready?' and, after a clearly marked pause, the starting command 'Go!', at the same time quickly lowering the red flag to one side.

False Start

If a crew starts too soon the Starter stops the race by ringing a bell and then waving a red flag. In the case of a false start the Starter warns the crew or crews at fault. The starter excludes from the race a crew causing two false starts.

Equipment Damage

If a crew, while still in the first 100 metres of the race indicates that it has suffered damage to its boat or equipment the Starter or Umpire stops the race by ringing a bell and waving a red flag.

Umpire's Directions

The Umpire may not steer a crew unless there is an obstacle in its lane. If a crew is about to impede another by its wash or by leaving its lane the Umpire raises a white flag and calls to the crew at fault, indicating the required change of direction by lowering the flag to one side. If a crew is about to cause a collision the Umpire may call its attention by raising the white flag and stop it by giving the command 'Stop'. Crews interfering with their opponents may be excluded from the race by the Umpire.

Protests

Except in unavoidable circumstances a crew claiming that its race has been improperly run must make its protest to a member of the Jury immediately after the finish of the race and before getting out of the boat. A representative of such crew shall confirm any such protest in writing to the Jury within one hour of the completion of the race concerned setting out the reasons for the protest and lodging the sum of twenty dollars with the Jury.

Lane Numbers

All boats must have the appropriate lane number disc in position on the bow when racing. Discs will be supplied at the launching beach by a Regatta Official and must be returned immediately after use. A deposit of five dollars per disc applies.

Weighing of Lightweight

Lightweight competitors shall be weighed in bathing trunks or swimsuit by a Regatta Official not less than one hour and not more than two hours before the advertised starting time for their first race on each day of racing.

- (a) Having then made weight he/she may weigh in within the same time limits relative to any subsequent race in another event correctly entered for and programmed on that day.
- (b) Should weight not be made he/she must weigh in within the same time limits relative to any subsequent race correctly entered and programmed on that same day until weight is acceptable after which (a) will apply.

Coaching

It is prohibited to give any instructions, advice or directions to rowers or crews which are racing with any electric, electronic or other technical device, either directly or indirectly.

At West Lakes, for safety reasons, coaches, supporters and spectators are not permitted to accompany races on bicycles.

Boat Weights

Minimum weights for boats (with fittings essential to their use; in particular with riggers, stretchers and slides but without oars or sound amplification equipment and loud speakers, if used) are as follows:

Blade Thickness

The edges of blades must have a minimum thickness throughout as follows:

- oars : 5 mm
- sculls : 3 mm

This thickness shall be measured 3 mm from the outer edge of the blade for oars and 2 mm for sculls.

Coxswains

Coxswains shall be deemed to be members of the crew. There shall be no age limit for coxswains in races for senior crews. The minimum weight for a coxswain (in bathing trunks or swimsuit) is 50 kg for men's crews and 45 kg for women's crews, juniors, schoolboys and schoolgirls provided that the minimum weight for the coxswain (in bathing trunks or swimsuit) of a crew entered in a lightweight women's event is 40 kg. To make up this weight a coxswain must carry dead weight. No article of racing equipment shall be considered as part of this dead weight. This dead weight shall be carried in (a) sealed bag(s) and shall be placed in the boat as close as possible to the coxswain. Coxswains shall be weighed by an authorised official not more than 24 hours and not less than one hour before the advertised starting time of their first race in the Regatta.

Substitutions

All crews have the right to replace up to 50% of their rowers and the coxswain as well, provided that a written declaration of the names and status of any such replacements be presented at least one hour before the race to the Organising Committee who must mention the substitution in their official report. No substitute is permitted for a single sculler except as provided in Rule 5.10. No change may be made in a crew which has already raced except as provided in Rule 5.10.

Scratchings

Scratchings must be notified to the Recorder not less than one hour before their respective event.

Status of Competitors

School - A School competitor is one who is attending a secondary school as a full time day student and representing his/her school. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a School crew.

Junior - A competitor ceases to be a Junior on 31 December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of eighteen. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Junior crew.

Youth - An oarsman may row in Youth events up to 30 June following his nineteenth birthday. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Youth crew.

Senior B - A competitor ceases to be a Senior B on 31 December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of twenty-two.

Senior A - All rowers shall be eligible to compete in Senior A crews.

Lightweight - Lightweight races are restricted to male rowers weighing 72.5 kg or less and female rowers 59 kg or less in the case of single sculling races and in all other classes of boats to male rowers weighing 72.5 kg or less and female rowers 59 kg or less provided that the average weight of all members of the crew in which such rower races (excluding the coxswain) does not exceed 70 kg in the case of male rowers and 57 kg in the case of female rowers.

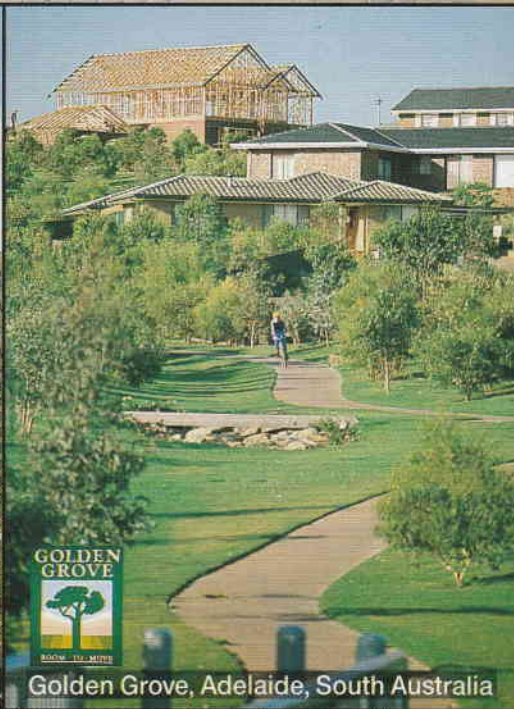

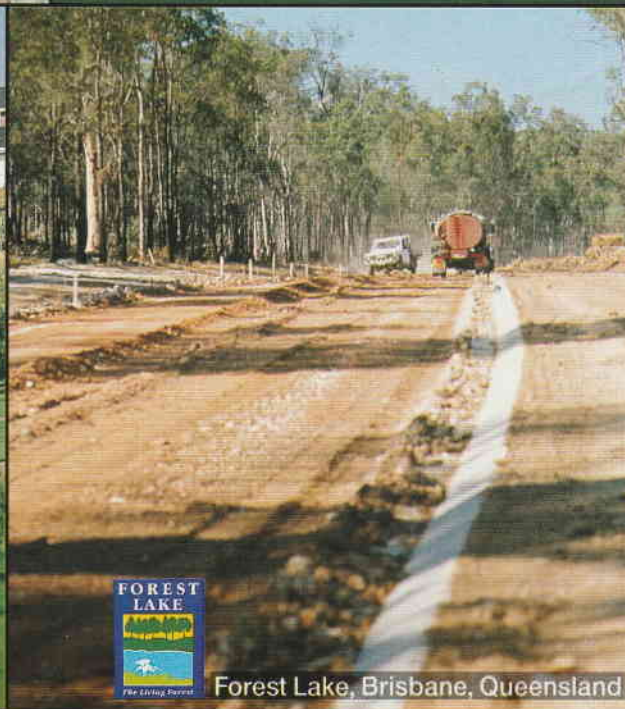

History of the Penrith Cup

The introduction of the Interstate Lightweight Four-oared Championship in 1958 for oarsmen then weighing not more than 140 lbs (63.5 kg), and for which the Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy, laid the foundation for this class of rowing in Australia.

The weight limit for lightweight competitors in Australia has varied from time to time between the States, however, since 1974, the year which heralded the first F.I.S.A. Lightweight Championship at which Australia recorded a gold medal victory, the Internationally accepted lightweight limits have been adopted nationally.

History of the Noel F. Wilkinson Trophy

Recognising the necessity to introduce a class of rowing in which Australian Youth oarsmen could compete, the Australian Rowing Council initiated the Interstate Youth Eight-oared Championship at an age limit some eighteen months older than the Internationally accepted Junior age limit. The first Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974, and in that same year, the Council accepted the offer by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event.

Junior (age limit) events for other classes of boats now forming part of the National Regatta programme collectively fulfil the purposes originally envisaged by both the Council and the donor: an incentive to young rowers to continue in the sport.

History of the President's Cup

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President, Mr E.C. Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersall's Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the late A.A. Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian Olympians have been

the holders of this trophy. The records of R.H. (Bob) Pearce, holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medallist in 1928 and 1932, his cousin C.A. (Cecil) Pearce, four times holder and M.T. (Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic Gold, Silver and Bronze Medallist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively and all representing New South Wales are well known.

History of the U.L.V.A. Trophy

Presented by the United Licenced Victuallers Association of Queensland to the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council in 1920, and affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as 'Bertha', this handsome sterling silver trophy crafted in London depicts Dorothy Arnold Ekins, the petite girl from Mannum, holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb

of her day . . . floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers!

Dorothy, a lightweight by today's standards, along with three other members of her home Club and representing South Australia, won the first Women's Interstate Four-oared Championship from New South Wales and Queensland in a time of 4 minutes 55 seconds.

History of the King's Cup

First won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Regatta held on 2-4 July of that year, this handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race of that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful A.I.F. No. 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914-1918 War.

The successful crew comprising Sgt A.A. Robb, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas.), 11st. 10b., bow; Lieut. F.A. House, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas.), 11st. 12lb., 2; Lieut. T. McGill, Leichhardt Rowing Club (NSW), 12st 10lb., 3; Gunner A.V. Scott, Murray Bridge Rowing Club (SA), 13st., 4; Lieut. H. Hauenstein, M.M., Leichhardt and Balmain Rowing Clubs (NSW), 13st. 9lb., 5; Major S.A. Middleton, D.S.O., Glebe and Sydney Rowing Clubs (NSW), 13st. 6lb., 6; Gunner G.W. Nettam, West Australian Rowing Club (WA), 11st. 12lb., 7; Captain H.C. Disher, Melbourne University Boat Club (Vic.), 11st. 11b., stroke; Sgt A.E. Smedley, Sydney Rowing Club (NSW), cox, defeated the A.I.F. No. 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds, the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and the United States.

The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian military authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the Australian War Museum. On 14 May 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Associations held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual trophy for the Australian eight-oared Championship. This request was refused and on 12 October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup, with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association, and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30 October 1920, and signed by Captain H.C. Disher, was sent to His Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy. A reply dated 13 May 1921, received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr Winston Churchill, stated that 'His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Race of Australia'.

The trophy was, in fact, won twice; first by the Australian oarsmen in three strenuous races and then by the Australian Rowing Administrators in three equally strenuous contests with the Australian authorities who had taken possession of it.

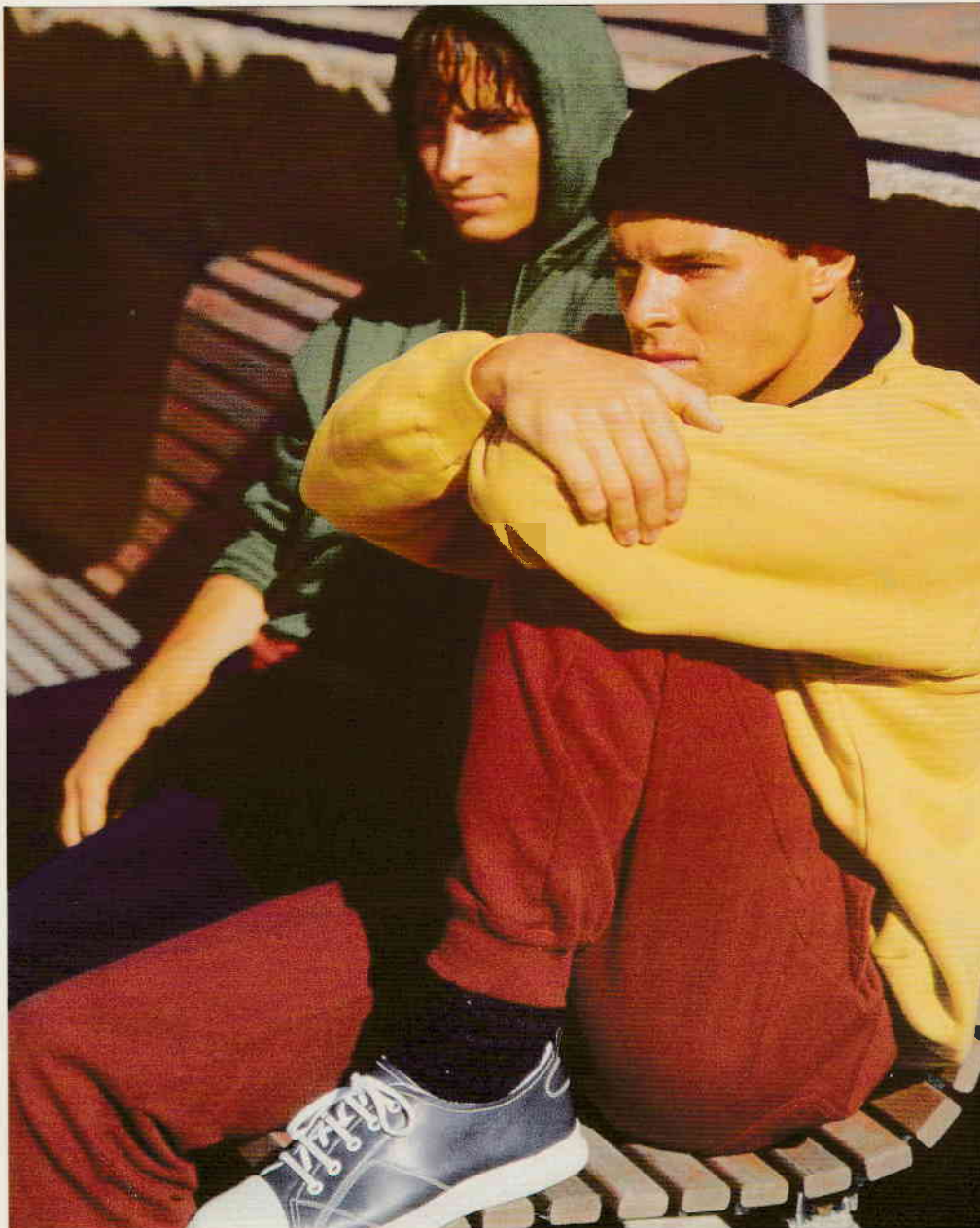
