## Victorian Rowing Association President's Message

On behalf of the Victorian Rowing Association it gives me great pleasure to welcome all competitors and supporters to the 1992 Kings Cup and National Regatta.

This is the 25th occasion since its foundation in 1876 on which the Victorian Rowing Association has hosted what was originally the Intercolonial and subsequently the Interstate Eights and is now the Kings Cup Regatta.

From the first event in 1878 the race was rowed upstream on the Lower Yarra River, over distances varying from 2½ to 3 miles, in 1950 finishing just below Spencer Street Bridge. With the adoption of the 2000 metres Olympic distance in 1956 and on the five subsequent occasions when the race was in Victoria, the Regatta was held on Lake Wendouree at Ballarat, the last occasion being a very memorable Regatta in 1985.

This year the Kings Cup Regatta is being conducted for the first time at the National Water Sports Centre at Carrum. Although this purpose-built rowing facility is still in its infancy, it provides a splendid venue for an event of international standard which the Regatta has now become. In common with other water sports, the Victorian Rowing Association is most appreciative of the input received from the Victorian Government

under Premier John Cain and subsequently Premier Joan Kirner, for the support of the Minister for Sport and Recreation, Neil Trezise, and for the work of the Dandenong Valley Authority (now Melbourne Water) in bringing the course to fruition.

The organisation of the first major regatta on a new venue has been no easy task and the Association is grateful for the work of the Organising Committee chaired by John Harry which has been over many months engaged in planning and implementation. We also thank the Manager of the Centre, Margaret McLean, Mr Ross Goodings and their staff and Melbourne Water for their co-operation and invaluable assistance.

It is most fitting on this occasion, that amongst many distinguished guests we are able to welcome His Excellency the Governor-General Bill Hayden and Mrs Hayden. Their attendance at the Regatta is a significant honour for the Centre and for our Sport.

We look forward to an excellent regatta.

# History of the Interstate and National Rowing Championships of Australia

Interstate rowing competition in Australia originated in four-oared gigs, the first recorded race being held in 1863 on the Paramatta River in New South Wales over a distance of three miles. New South Wales and Victoria were the competing States, the first named being the winner in a time of 19 minutes 25 seconds. A number of contests followed in this class of boat between crews from New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania, often with more than one Club crew from each State taking part in the competition.

Rowed in Melbourne over a distance of four miles in 1878, the first Interstate eight-oared race contested between New South Wales and Victoria was won by Victoria, and continued as an annual event between them until 1885 when Queensland and Tasmania joined the competition followed by Western Australia and South Australia in 1897 and 1899 respectively. The records show that up until 1890, New South Wales and Victoria were the principal contestants with New South Wales recording its first victory at the second meeting in 1879. Following their re-entry to the competition in 1890, Queensland recorded its first win in 1891, followed by Tasmania in 1906, South Australia in 1913 and Western Australia in 1921 at Launceston.

The first men's Interstate Single Sculling Championship won by M.J. Slack representing Queensland was rowed at Brisbane in 1892 in conjunction with the already well established eight-oared race, and since 1895 has been an annual event on the Interstate rowing calendar.

Interstate Challenge races for women commenced in 1912 when a Brisbane Ladies' Rowing Club four representing Queensland defeated the Albert Park Ladies in Melbourne. A return visit by the Victorian representatives in the following year resulted in a second Queensland victory on the Brisbane River by a mere two feet.

Competition between the States ceased during the First World War, 1915 to 1919, and resumption on 15th May, 1920, on the Hamilton Beach course of the Brisbane River introduced to the Interstate competition our two most prestigious perpetual rowing trophies, namely, the King's Cup for the men's eight-oared Championship and the United Licenced Victuallers Association of Queensland trophy for the women's four. The history of both of these trophies along with the other more recent perpetual trophies now presented annually to the successful Interstate Championship crews is contained later in this program.

The central control of rowing in Australia became necessary to arrange and co-ordinate Australian

International competition and assume responsibility for the now well established annual Interstate Championships, and following the Interstate regatta at Brisbane on 15th May, 1920, the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council was formed. The 1st May, 1925, heralded the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council, and thereafter the two Councils conducted their affairs independently until 1976 when the amalgamation of both into the now renamed Australian Rowing Council secured a continuity of control and standardisation of regulations, the benefits of which will ensure the future growth and success of the sport, both here and overseas.

The Second World War again interrupted the Interstate Rowing Championships, there being no men's competition between the years 1940 and 1945, and a curtailment of women's races between 1942 and 1948. On resumption, the need for Australian representation at International meetings became more evident, and the addition of test races in other classes of boats became a regular feature at the Interstate title regattas.

The introduction of additional events to Interstate Championship status has provided annual competition for other classes of oarspersons, and we commend the foresight of the Rowing Councils in legislating for the inclusion of the Men's Lightweight Four in 1958, the Women's Single Scull in 1963, the Women's Lightweight Four in 1968 and finally, in 1974 the Men's Youth Eight. The addition of Championships for Pairs and Double Sculls in 1953 failed due to lack of interest, and in 1955 these events were withdrawn.

In 1962 the Council made provision for the National Regatta to be conducted bi-annually over 2,000 metres to provide small boat competition regularly, thereby facilitating the selection of Australian representative crews for International competition, and substantially reducing the need for test races. The first Regatta program comprised National championship events for four with cox, four without cox, pair with cox, pair without cox, double scull, lightweight eight, lightweight pair with cox and lightweight single scull. The development of the regatta witnessed the inclusion of additional classes of oarsmen along with schoolboy representatives, and since 1974 has been held annually in conjunction with the Interstate Championships. Resulting from the amalgamation of the National Councils in 1976, the combined National and Interstate Championship regatta now comprises a full program for both men's and women's rowing and sculling races in all classifications.

# Notice to Competitors

**Secretary's Office:** The Regatta Secretary's Office is located in the competitors area behind the finishing tower.

**Weigh-In Station:** The Weigh-in station is located at the freeway end of the boatsheds on the lower level. Check weighing of coxswains after races have been rowed will be carried out in the enclosure beneath the finishing tower.

**Boat Weighing:** The boat weighing will be situated in the boat storage area.

**Starting Times:** Competitors are to be within the Start Zone five minutes before the time appointed for starting their event, and must be in their starting position at least two minutes before the time laid down for the start of their event.

**Late arrivals:** The Starter may warn or exclude from the race any crew arriving at its starting position less than two minutes before the scheduled starting time. A warning has the same effect as one given for a false start.

**Starting Procedure:** As soon as the Aligner indicates that the boats are properly aligned by raising a white flag, the Starter raises a red flag—the Starter shall give the warning command "ARE YOU READY" and, after a clearly marked pause, the starting command "GO" at the same time lowering the red flag to one side.

**False Start:** If a crew starts too soon, the Starter stops the race by ringing a bell and then waving a red flag. In the case of a false start the Starter warns the offending crew or crews. A crew causing two false starts shall be excluded from the race.

**Equipment Damage:** If a crew while still in the first 100 metres of the race indicates that it has suffered damage to its boat or equipment, the Starter or Umpire stops the race. The signal by an Umpire to stop the race shall be by ringing a bell and waving a red flag.

**Umpire's Directions:** The Umpire may not steer a crew unless there is an obstacle in its lane. If a crew is about to impede another by its wash or by leaving its lane, the Umpire raises a white flag and calls the crew at fault, indicating the required change of direction by lowering the flag to one side. If a crew is about to cause a collision, the Umpire may call its attention by raising the white flag and stop it by giving the command "STOP". Crews interfering with their opponents may be excluded from the race.

**Finish:** The Judges at the finish shall

indicate the crossing of the line by the winning crew and each other crew in the race by sound signal.

**Coxswains:** Coxswains shall weigh in on Tuesday after 10.00am, or not more than 24 hours and not less than one hour before their first race in the regatta.

**Lightweight Competitors:** Lightweight competitors shall weigh in no more than two hours and not less than one hour before their first race on each day of racing.

**Competing Boats:** The bows of all competing boats shall be fitted with a white ball 4cm. in diameter in soft rubber or similar material unless the bow is so constructed as to afford equivalent protection and visibility.

**Lane Numbers:** All competing boats shall carry a numbered disc showing the lane number in which it will race in each event. Lane number discs will be supplied by the Regatta Officials at the launching area, and must be returned to them immediately upon the return of each crew to the launching area.

**Scratchings:** Scratchings shall be notified at the Secretary's Office at the earliest possible time, but not less than one hour before their respective event.

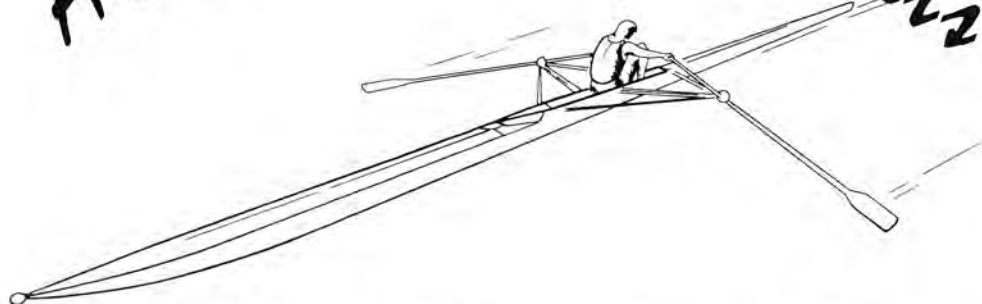
**Substitutes:** Substitutes in any crew shall be notified at the Secretary's Office and shall be made in accordance with Rule 37.10.10.

**Winning crews:** All winning crews and scullers are to proceed direct to the Victory Dais for the presentation of trophies and medallions immediately after the race concludes. Other competitors are required to wait for the winner to lead the way to the Dais, after which they should proceed in an orderly line (preferably in order of finishing, 2nd to 6th) back to the launching pontoons.

**Briefing of Competitors:** A meeting of coaches, rowers, coxswains, scullers, umpires and starters shall take place in the competitors marquee at 3.30pm Tuesday 10th March 1992.

A further meeting specifically for school competitors shall take place in the competitors marquee at 3.30pm on Thursday 12th March 1992.

# Boat Traffic Rules

## 1. RULES MUST BE OBEYED

For the convenience and safety of all crews using these confined waters it is essential that the following traffic rules be observed during both training periods and competition periods. Any crew breaking these rules will be referred to the jury for confirmation of the appropriate penalty which can be the awarding of a false start.

## 2. PROCEDURE FOR BOAT LAUNCHING

All boats must be launched facing west (away from the finish line) and proceed around the line of buoys (approximately 150 metres past the finish line) to the far side of the course before proceeding to the start. This procedure is required at both training and competition periods.

## 3. TRAINING PERIOD RULES

- a) On competition days the course will be closed for training from 45 minutes prior to the starting time for the first event until 5 minutes after completion of the final event for the day.
- b) During training periods the southern side of the course including lanes 7 and 8 will be for traffic proceeding to the start. The northern side of the course including lanes 1 to 5 will be for traffic moving towards the finish.
- c) Lane 6 is closed to all crews during training.
- d) All crews rowing towards the start in lanes 7 and 8 or towards the finish in lanes 2 to 5 will be non-stop 2000 metres. Crews practicing starts or intending to stop midway must train outside the course lanes or in lane 1 if rowing towards the finish.
- e) Crews rowing towards the finish who intend to again proceed to the start are to use lanes 3, 4 or 5 and row slowly to the turn buoys (150 metres past the finish) before moving to the southern side of the course. Crews rowing towards the finish who intend returning to the boat launching area after

crossing the line must use lanes 1 or 2 or outside lane 1.

- f) Crews must not proceed past the starting installation during training periods. They must turn across the course within 100 metres of the start and only when there will be no interference with crews leaving the start who have the right of way. Crews must not cross the course at any other point.

## 4. COMPETITION PERIOD RULES

- a) All crews proceeding to the start shall use the area between lane 8 and the southern bank. Lane 8 is closed to all up traffic.
- b) Crews proceeding to the start may only stop part way provided they do not hinder progress of a following crew;
- c) On reaching the start zone, crews must proceed beyond the starting installation and await marshalling instructions. Crews must not stop close to the start line.
- d) All crews are to come on to their starting lane via the northern side of the starting installation. Crews will be called to the start in order of the highest lane number to the lowest.
- e) If time permits, you can practice start only in your race lane. However it is your responsibility to be in position for your race start 2 minutes prior.
- f) Any crew arriving too late to start or any crew removed from an event at the start is not to row down a numbered lane. It will return to the finish by rowing between lane 1 and the northern bank.
- g) Crews who wish to warm up or cool down may only cross the course from south to north and only at two specific points. Provided a race in progress is not within 500 metres, crews may cross at either the 1500 or 500 metre lines.
- h) On final days the winning crew will cool down by returning only as far as the 1500 metre line before crossing to the northern bank and rowing down to the victory dais.

# The Way to the Finals

## 1-6 CREWS:

All crews go directly to Final.

## 7-8 CREWS:

2 Heats—each winner to Final;  
1 Repechage—first four to Final.

## 9-12 CREWS:

2 Heats—each winner to Final;  
2 Repechages—first two in each to Final.

## 13-15 CREWS:

3 Heats—first three to Semi-Final; 1  
Repechage—first three to Semi-Final; 2  
Semi Finals—first three in each to Final.

## 16-18 CREWS:

3 Heats—each winner to Semi-Final; 3  
Repechages—first three in each to Semi-Final; 2 Semi-Finals—first three in each to Final.

## 19-24 CREWS:

4 Heats—each winner to Semi-Final; 4  
Repechages—first two in each to Semi-Final; 2 Semi-Finals—first three in each to Final.

## 25-36 CREWS:

6 Heats—each winner to Semi-Final; 6  
Repechages—each winner to Semi-Final; 2  
Semi-Finals—first three in each to Final.



# Definitions

## UNDER 17

This category for boys and girls is introduced into this regatta to provide an opportunity for Clubs/Institutes to enter their Talent Identification Programme (TIP) crews that are in their preparatory year prior to Junior competition. A competitor ceases to be eligible for Under 17 on 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of seventeen. This definition also applies to the coxswain of an Under 17 crew.

## SCHOOLS

A school competitor is one who is attending a secondary school as a full time day student and representing his/her school. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a school crew. School events are restricted to crews consisting of representatives of one school only.

## JUNIOR

A competitor ceases to be eligible for Junior on 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of eighteen. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Junior crew.

## YOUTH

A competitor ceases to be eligible for Youth on the 1st July following him/her reaching the age of nineteen.

## UNDER 23

A competitor ceases to be eligible for Under 23 on 31st of December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of twenty two. After that date he/she shall be classified as Senior A.

## COXSWAIN

Coxswains shall be deemed to be members of the crew. There shall be no age limit for coxswains in races for Senior crews.

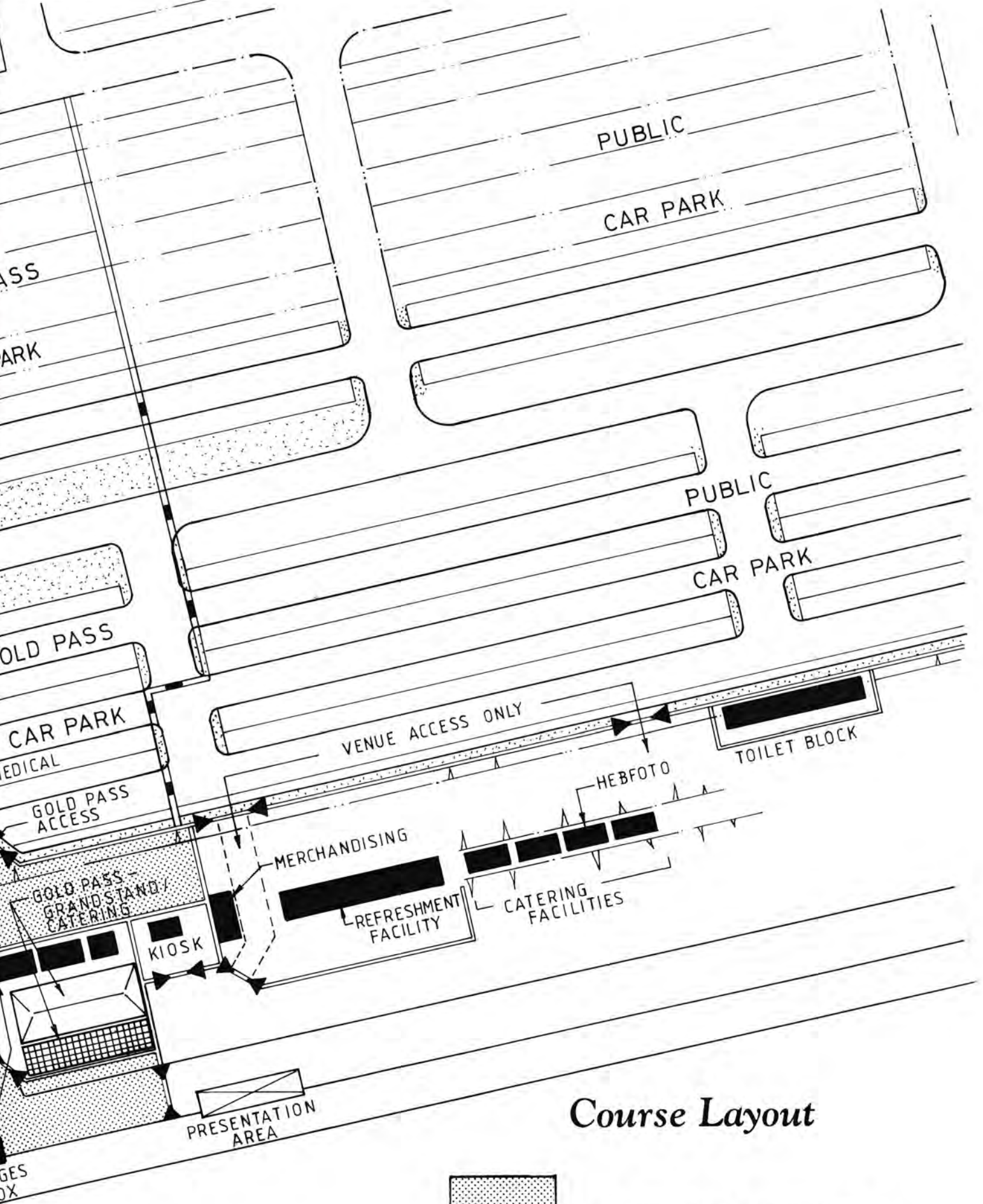

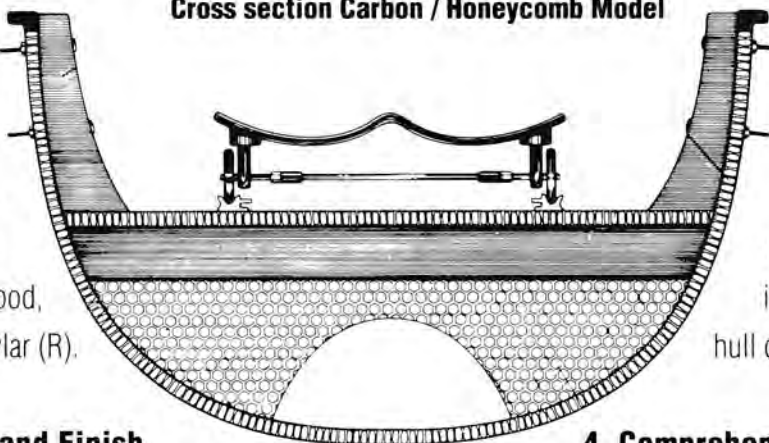

## History of the Nell Slatter Trophy

Dating back to 1901 at the great Federation Regatta staged on Albert Park Lake, Cassie Woolly McRitchie representing Victoria and using a skiff loaned to her by the then Governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, defeated her challenger from Sydney, Elizabeth Messenger, and was presented with a magnificent pearl and ruby bracelet by the Duke of Gloucester. So great was the public interest in the female scullers that police were required to keep the inquisitive spectators at bay. At the great age of 96 she passed away in 1973, and will for all time

be remembered as the founder of the first all women's rowing club at Albert Park in 1907. Cassie McRitchie is justifiably known as the "mother" of Victorian women's rowing.

First introduced in 1963 at Brisbane, the Women's Interstate Single Sculling Championship has continued as an annual event for which the Nell Slatter Trophy, presented by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association as a tribute to the then President, is the perpetual trophy.

## History of the President's Cup

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President, Mr. E. C. Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersall's Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the late A.A. Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian

Olympians have been the holders of this trophy. The records of R.H. (Bob) Pearce, holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medallist in 1928 and 1932, his cousin C.A. (Cecil) Pearce, four times holder and M.T. (Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic Gold, Silver and Bronze Medallist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively and all representing New South Wales are well known.

## History of the Victoria Cup

At the first Women's Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship contested on the Yarra River in Melbourne, a victory was recorded by Victoria with a crew stroked by one of Australia's best known oarswomen, Margaret Agnew McKenzie, whose efforts in negotiating with the Women's Rowing Council secured lightweight rowing as an annual event on the women's Interstate rowing program. The Victoria Cup, presented by the Victorian Ladies' Rowing Association, is the perpetual trophy for this event.

Lightweight women have recorded International victories, the first being at the inaugural competition between the United States of America, Canada and Australia at St. Catherines, Canada, in 1979, when Australia was successful in the two events for which crews were entered – Lightweight Four with Cox and Lightweight Pair with Cox.

In more recent times Australian crews have been Silver medallists at World Championships in 1988 and 1990.

## History of the Penrith Cup

The introduction of the Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship in 1958 for oarsmen then weighing not more than 140 lbs., and for which the Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy, laid the foundation for this class of rowing in Australia.

The weight limit for lightweight competitors in Australia has varied from time to time between the States, however, since 1974, the year which heralded the first F.I.S.A. Lightweight Championship at which Australia recorded a Gold medal victory, the Internationally accepted lightweight limits have been adopted nationally.

## History of the Noel F. Wilkinson Trophy

At the 1972 Federation Internationale Societies A'Liviron (F.I.S.A.) Conference held in Copenhagen, the President at that time, Thomi Keller appealed to all delegates to make every effort to increase the number of oarsmen and women in their country.

The then Australian delegate to F.I.S.A. Noel Wilkinson conveyed Thomi Keller's request to the Australian Rowing Council inc. (ARC) recommending that it should consider conducting an Interstate Youth Eight oared Championship,

with an upper age limit some eighteen months older than the internationally accepted junior age limit. Recognising the need to encourage school leavers to carry on rowing after secondary school, the ARC adopted the proposal in 1973.

The first Mens Youth Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974. In that same year the ARC accepted the offer made by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event, which was awarded to the winning crew from Tasmania.

## History of the U.L.V.A. Trophy

Presented by the United Licenced Victuallers Association of Queensland to the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council in 1920, and affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as "Bertha", this handsome sterling silver trophy crafted in London depicts Dorothy Arnold Ekins, the petite girl from Mannum, holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb of

her day....floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers! Dorothy, a lightweight by today's standards, along with three other members of her home Club and representing South Australia, won the first Women's Interstate Four-oared Championship from New South Wales and Queensland in a time of 4 minutes 55 seconds.

## History of the King's Cup

First won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Regatta held on 2nd to 4th July of that year, this handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race of that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful A.I.F. No. 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914-1918 War.

The successful crew comprising Sgt. A.A. Robb, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas.), 11st. 10lb., bow; Lieut. F. A. House, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas.), 11st. 121b., 2; Lieut. T. McGill, Leichhardt Rowing Club (N.S.W.), 12st. 10lb., 3; Gunner A.V. Scott, Murray Bridge Rowing Club (S.A.), 13st., 4; Lieut. H. Hauenstein, M.M., Leichhardt and Balmain Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st. 9lb., 5; Major S.A. Middleton, D.S.O., Glebe and Sydney Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st. 6lb., 6; Gunner G.W. Nettam, West Australian Rowing Club (W.A.), 11st. 12lb., 7; Captain H.C. Disher, Melbourne University Boat Club (Vic.), 11st. 11lb., stroke; Sgt. A.E. Smedley, Sydney Rowing Club (N.S.W.), cox, defeated the A.I.F. No. 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds, the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and United States.

The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian Military Authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the Australian War Museum. On 14th May, 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Associations held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the

Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual trophy for the Australian eight oared Championship. This request was refused, and on 12th October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup, with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association, and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30th October, 1920, and signed by Captain H.C. Disher, was sent to His Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy. A reply dated 13th May, 1921, received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Winston Churchill, stated that "His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Race of Australia".

The trophy was, in fact, won twice; first by the Australian oarsmen in three strenuous races and then by the Australian Rowing Administrators in three equally strenuous contests with the Australian authorities who had taken possession of it.
