

Australian Rowing Council President's Message

Welcome to Wellington Dam, Collie, Western Australia.

On behalf of the Australian Rowing Council I am pleased to welcome long travelled competitors, officials and supporters to the 1995 SUNSMART Australian Rowing Championships and King's Cup regatta.

The principal sponsor of these championships is the Cancer Foundation of W.A. We thank the Foundation sincerely for its support for this regatta and for sport in general in Western Australia.

This has been a very large regatta to organise. Bill Cooper and his Organising Committee have worked tirelessly to ensure the success of these championships. We thank them and congratulate them for their efforts.

Internationally our results were again very good this year. At the World Championships in Indianapolis, U.S.A., Australia qualified into twelve finals which was a record for this country and behind only Germany in the total number of finals contested but gold medals eluded us. The final medal tally was one silver and three bronze.

Bruce Hick, Gary Lynagh, James Seppelt and Andrew Stunel won silver in the men's lightweight coxless four; they were coached by Matt Draper. Richard Wearne and Robert Walker coach by Harald Jahrling grabbed the bronze medal in the men's coxless pairs finishing only 1.60 seconds behind world and Olympic champions, Steve Redgrave and Matthew Pinset of Great Britain. Anna Ozolins and Carmen Klomp, coached by Paul Thompson, continued the medal charge by Australia's younger brigade of rowers in the womens coxless pair when they won bronze. Our women's four of Alison Davies, Megan Still, Kate Slater and Victoria Toogood also coached by Paul Thompson was just 2.09 seconds from a gold medal when they too won a bronze medal.

At the World Junior Championships in Munich, Australia was represented by five crews all of which made finals with four of the five medalling. Amy Safe sculled magnificently to win gold in the women's single scull; she was coached by Simon Gillet. Neil Oakes, Wade Barber, Ben Chapman, Monte Goulding and Stuart Masson (cox), coached by Barbara Gillet were third in the men's coxed four. Both double sculls also finished third; they were Tami Stone and Anna Tree, coached by Peter Tierney and Martin Ingliss and Hamish Karrasch, coached by Jack Hutchinson.

We also boated three medal winning crews at the Nations Cup in Paris and our under 23 rowers retained the Rusty Robertson Trophy against New Zealand in Adelaide.

These results do not occur by chance but reflect the effective work of dedicated athletes, coaches and officials and the generous offerings of our supporters. In particular I would like to acknowledge the continued support of the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Olympic Committee and Qantas Airlines.

Whilst our number of employees has gradually increased and in this regard I welcome our first High Performance Manager, Samantha Stewart, we remain ever alert to and thankful for the contribution of our volunteers. Last year our teams were well served by volunteers including media representatives, doctors, masseurs, physiotherapists, managers, coaches and boatmen. On the administrative side I recognise the consistent contribution by all our state and national umpires, members of the Council, Board, Commissions and networks and I make particular reference to the outstanding work of our Director of Finance, James Lowe.

In seeking to gain most from what is being offered by the Australian Government and the Australian Olympic Committee, and all the Institutes, much of the focus of the ARC Board this year has necessarily been on the elite end of the sport - it is our intention to now give more attention to the majority of participants in the sport. To that end I encourage interested people to attend our first National Rowing Conference in Melbourne on 27 and 28 May this year where all innovative ideas and proposals will be welcome. This conference in many ways is the first stepping stone to our future. Since the creation of the ARC in 1925, a state based structure has served our sport, but the implementation of the Olympic Athlete Program has shown how a truly national based program with careful integration and consultation can work with notable early success.

To the rowers for whom these championships are organised - go fast and enjoy each race.



Status of Competitors

Senior A:

All rowers shall be eligible to compete in Senior A category in the appropriate weight division.

Senior B:

A rower ceases to be a Senior B on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 21 years. After that date the rower is classified Senior A.

Lightweight:

Lightweight races are restricted to male rowers weighing 72.5 kilograms or less and female rowers weighing 59 kilograms or less in the case of single sculling races and in all other classes of boat to male rowers weighing 72.5 kilograms or less and female rowers weighing 59 kilograms or less provided that the average weight of all members of the crew in which such rower races (excluding the coxswain) does not exceed 70 kilograms in the case of male rowers and 57 kilograms in the case of female rowers.

Youth:

A rower ceases to be Youth on 1 July after reaching the age of 19 years. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Youth crew.

Junior:

A rower ceases to be a Junior on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 18 years. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Junior crew.

School:

A rower who is attending secondary school as a full time student. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a School crew.

Under 17:

A rower ceases to be eligible for Under 17 events on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 17 years. The coxswain is not bound by this definition.

Under 16:

A rower ceases to be eligible for Under 16 events on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 16 years. This definition also applies to the coxswain of an Under 16 crew.

Coxswains:

Coxswains shall be deemed to be members of the crew, however a woman may steer a men's crew and a man a women's crew. There is no age limit for coxswains in races for Senior crews.

Interstate and National Rowing Championships

Interstate rowing competition in Australia originated in four-oared gigs, the first recorded race being held in 1863 on the Paramatta River in New South Wales over a distance of three miles. New South Wales and Victoria were the competing States, the first named being the victor in a time of 19 minutes 25 seconds. A number of contests followed in this class of boat between crews from New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania, often with more than one Club crew from each State taking part in the competition.

Rowed in Melbourne over a distance of four miles in 1878, the first Interstate eight-oared race contested between New South Wales and Victoria was won by Victoria, and continued as an annual event between them until 1885 when Queensland and Tasmania joined the competition followed by Western Australia and South Australia in 1897 and 1899 respectively.

The records showed that up until 1890, New South Wales and Victoria were the principal contestants with New South Wales recording its first victory at the second meeting in 1879. Following their re-entry to the competition in 1890, Queensland recorded their first win in 1891, followed by Tasmania in 1906, South Australia in 1913 and Western Australia in 1921 at Launceston.

The first men's Interstate Single Sculling Championship won by M.J. Slack representing Queensland was rowed at Brisbane in 1892 in conjunction with the already well established eight-oared race, and since 1895 has been an annual event on the Interstate rowing calendar.

Interstate Challenge race for women commenced in 1912 when a Brisbane Ladies' Rowing Club four representing Queensland defeated the Albert Park Ladies in Melbourne. A return visit by the Victorian representatives in the following year resulted in a second Queensland Victory on the Brisbane River by a mere two feet.

Competition between the States ceased during the First World War, 1915 to 1919 and resumption on 15th May, 1920, on the Hamilton Reach of the Brisbane River introduced to the Interstate competition our two most prestigious perpetual rowing trophies, namely, the King's Cup for the Men's eight-oared Championship and the United Licensed Victuallers Association of Queensland Trophy for the Women's four. The history of both these trophies along with the other more recent perpetual trophies now presented annually to the successful Interstate Championship crews is contained later in this programme.

Central control of rowing in Australia became necessary to arrange and co-ordinate Australian and International competition and assume responsibility for the now well

established annual Interstate Championships. Following the Interstate Regatta at Brisbane on 15th May, 1920 the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council was formed. The 1st May, 1925 heralded the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council, and thereafter the two Councils conducted their affairs independently until 1965 when amalgamation of both into the now renamed Australian Rowing Council secured a continuity of control and standardisation of regulations, the benefits of which will ensure the future growth and success of the sport, both here and overseas.

The Second World War again interrupted the Interstate Rowing Championships, there being no men's competition between the years 1940 and 1945, and the curtailment of women's races between 1942 and 1948. On resumption, the need for Australian representation

at International meetings became more evident, and the addition of test races in

other classes of boats became a regular feature at the Interstate

Regattas. The introduction of additional events to Interstate

Championship status has provided annual competition for other classes of competitors,

and we commend the foresight of the Rowing Councils in

legislating for the inclusion of the Men's Lightweight Four in

1958, the Women's Single Scull in 1963, the Women's Lightweight

Four in 1968, the Men's Youth Eight and the Women's Youth

Four in 1988. This year the Women's Youth Four has

been replaced with a Women's Youth Eight on the

Interstate program, and in the National events we have

the addition of Men's and Women's Junior Eights. The addition of Championships for Pairs and Double Sculls

in 1953 failed due to lack of interest, and in 1955 the events were withdrawn.

In 1962 the Council made provision for the National Regatta to be conducted bi-annually over 2,000 metres to provide small boat competition regularly, thereby

facilitating the selection of Australian representative crews for International Competition and substantially

reducing the need for test races. The first Regatta programme comprised National Championship events for four with cox, four without cox, pair with cox, pair

without cox, double scull, lightweight eight, lightweight pair with cox, and lightweight single scull. The

development of the regatta witnessed the inclusion of additional classes of oarsmen along with schoolboy

representatives, and since 1974 has been held annually in conjunction with the Interstate Championships.

Resulting from the amalgamation of the National Councils in 1976, the combined National and Interstate Championships regatta now comprises a full

programme for both men's and women's sculling and rowing races in all classifications.



History of the King's Cup

First won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Regatta held on 2nd to 4th July of that year, this handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race for that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful A.I.F. No. 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914-1918 War.

The successful crew comprising Sgt. A.A. Robb, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas) 11st 10lb, Bow: Lieut. F.A. House, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas), 11st 12lb, 2; Lieut. T. McGill, Leichhardt Rowing Club (N.S.W.), 12st 10lb, 3; Gunner A.V. Scott, Murray Bridge Rowing Club (S.A.), 13st, 4; Lieut. H. Hauenstien, M.M., Leichhardt & Balmain Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st 9lb, 5; Major S.A. Middleton, D.S.O., Glebe & Sydney Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st 6lb, 6; Gunner G.W. Nettam, West Australian Rowing Club (W.A.), 11st 12lb, 7; Captain H.C. Disher, Melbourne University Boat Club (Vic), 11st 11lb, Stroke; Sgt A.E. Smedley, Sydney Rowing Club (N.S.W.) Cox, defeated the A.I.F. No. 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds, the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and United States.

The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian Military Authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the

Australian War Museum. On 14th May, 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Association held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual Trophy for the Australian Eight-oared Championship. This request was refused, and on 12th October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup, with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association, and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30th October, 1920 and signed by Captain H.C. Disher, was sent to his Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy. A reply dated 13th May, 1921, received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr Winston Churchill, stated that "His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Race of Australia".

The trophy was, in fact, won twice, first by the Australian oarsmen in three strenuous races and then by the Australian Rowing Administrators in three equally strenuous contests with the Australian authorities who had taken possession of it.



History of the President's Cup

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President Mr. E.C. Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersall's Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship, for men.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the late A.A. Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian

Olympians have been the holders of this trophy. The records of R.H. (Bob) Pearce, holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medalist in 1928 and 1932, his cousin C.A. (Cecil) Pearce, four times holder and M.T. (Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic Gold, Silver and Bronze Medalist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively and all representing New South Wales are well known.

History Of The Penrith Cup

The introduction of the Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship in 1958 for oarsmen then weighing not more than 140lb, and for which the Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy, laid the foundation for this class of rowing in Australia.

The weight limit for lightweight competitors in Australia has varied from time to time between the States, however, since 1974, the year which heralded the first F.I.S.A. Lightweight Championship at which Australia recorded a Gold medal victory, the Internationally accepted lightweight limits have been adopted nationally.

History Of The Noel F. Wilkinson Trophy

Recognising the necessity to introduce a class of rowing in which Australian Youth oarsmen could compete, the Australian Rowing Council initiated the Interstate Youth Eight-oared Championship at an age limit some eighteen months older than the internationally accepted Junior age limit. The first Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974, and in that same year, the Council accepted the offer by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event.

Junior (age limit) events for other classes of boats now forming part of the National Regatta programme now collectively fulfil the purposes originally envisaged by both the Council and the Donor, namely, an incentive to young oarsmen to continue in the sport subsequent to completion of their secondary education by providing acceptable competition at a National level and foster their development into higher classifications.

History Of The U.L.V.A. Trophy

Presented by the United Licensed Victuallers Association of Queensland to the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council in 1920, and affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as "Bertha", this handsome sterling silver trophy crafted in London depicts Dorothy Arnold Ekins, the petite girl from Mannum, holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb of her day ...floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers!

Dorothy, a lightweight by today's standards, along with three other members of her home Club and representing South Australia, won the first Women's Interstate Four-oared Championship from New South Wales and Queensland in a time of 4 minutes 55 seconds.

History Of The Victoria Cup

At the first Women's Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship contested on the Yarra River in Melbourne, a victory was recorded by Victoria with a crew stroked by one of Australia's best known oarswomen, Margaret Agnew McKenzie, whose efforts in negotiating with the Women's Rowing Council secured lightweight rowing as an annual event on the women's Interstate rowing programme. The Victoria Cup, presented by the Victorian Ladies Rowing Association, is the perpetual trophy for this event.

Lightweight women have recorded International victories, the first being at the inaugural competition between the United States of America, Canada and Australia at St. Catherines, Canada, in 1979, when Australia was successful in the two events for which crews were entered - Lightweight Four with Cox and Lightweight Pair with Cox.

History of the Nell Slatter Trophy

Dating back to 1901 at the great Federation Regatta staged on Albert Park Lake, Cassie Wooly McRitchie representing Victoria and using a skiff loaned to her by the then Governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, defeated her challenger from Sydney, Elizabeth Messenger, and was presented with a magnificent pearl and ruby bracelet by the Duke of Gloucester. So great was the public interest in the female scullers that police were required to keep the inquisitive spectators at bay. At the great age of 96 she passed away in 1973, and will for all time be remembered as the founder of the first

all women's rowing club at Albert Park in 1907. Cassie McRitchie is justifiably known as the "mother" of Victorian women's rowing.

First introduced in 1963 at Brisbane, the Women's Interstate Single Sculling Championship has continued as an annual event for which the Nell Slatter Trophy, presented by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association as a tribute to the then President, is the perpetual trophy.


