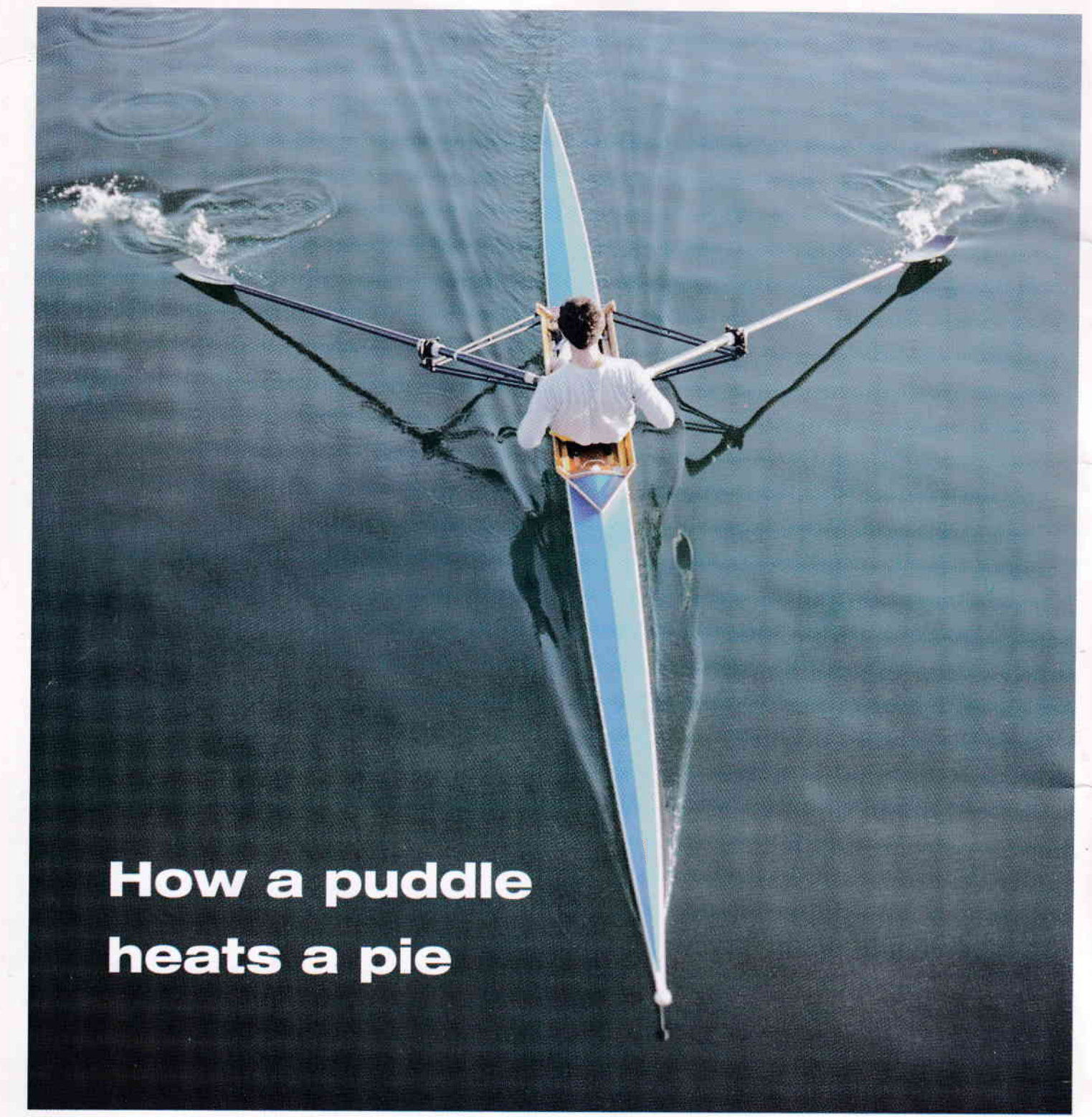

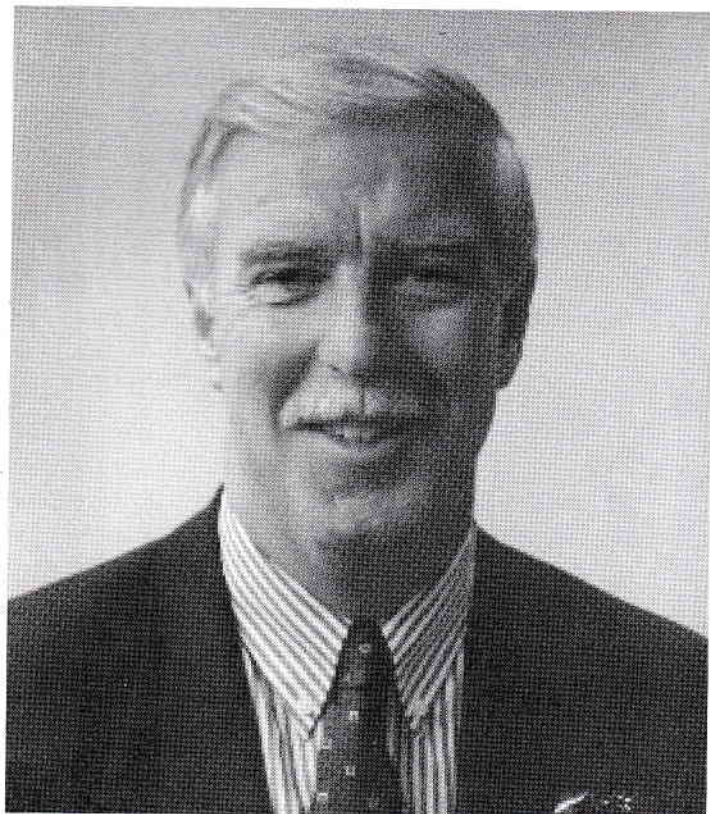

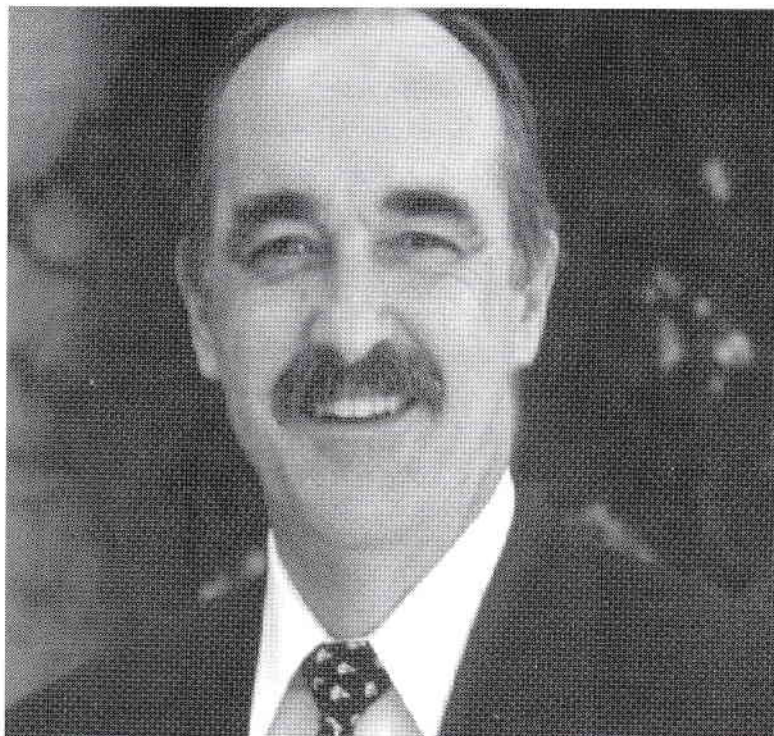
Finally, to all the competitors and officials I wish you a successful regatta and look forward to some great racing.

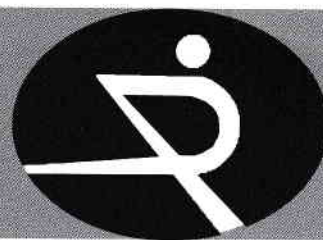

TIMOTHY LEIGH HAWKINS

(JUPER)

14/11/73 - 12/10/02



Tim was born with rowing in his blood and started coxing at the age of 10 with the Lindisfarne Rowing Club and Geilston Bay High School in Tasmania. He won selection as a coxswain representing Tasmania in the Kings Cup and Youth Eight events. He had already attended 8 National Regattas before he first competed in the single scull in 1990. In 1991 he gave up coxing to concentrate on his sculling and although he was still only coxswain weight he finished 5th in the Junior Mens Single Scull. He did not have a rowing partner but entered the Junior Mens Double Scull in the hope of finding someone at the regatta and eventually teamed up with Dan Bailey (Canberra) who had only limited rowing experience. The boys were able to race in the "Rusty Robertson" - a very good racing shell at the time - and this gave them confidence. After a couple of training rows together they competed in, and comfortably won, the Junior Mens Double Scull Championship of Australia. Some of the other juniors competing in the event were Duncan Free and Robert Walker who have both gone on to have exceptional international rowing careers.



As the win was so unexpected a large group gathered to congratulate the boys after the race, one of whom was Reg Galvin - Penrith Sculling Coach - who made the comment "I watched the race and the boat was going like a freight train" Tim always remembered this. Tim went on to represent Australia in the Double Scull at Under 23 and Senior World Championships.

He retired from competitive rowing at age 23 to concentrate on his university studies doing Commerce / Law which he successfully completed with Honours in Law. He was to commence his legal career with a Hobart Law firm in January 2003. During his time at university he still maintained a keen interest in rowing and was an active member of the Lindisfarne Rowing Club giving many days voluntary work helping with the rebuilding of the Club after it was burnt to the ground. He also helped the younger rowers of the club and at local schools with coaching and advice whenever possible. Each year he continued his strong interest in the National Championships although in his eyes the West Lakes Regatta in 1991 was the best regatta of all time. He would always take keen interest in watching the Mens Junior Double Scull but when asked his opinion of the race he would shake his head and say "their going alright but not moving like a freight train".

Tim was tragically killed at the age of 28 by a terrorist bomb in Bali on 12th October, 2002.

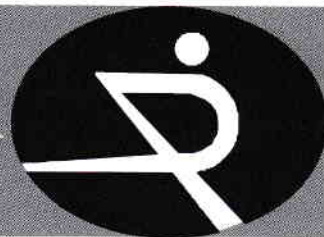

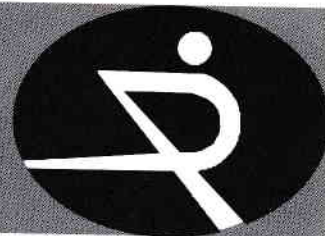

HISTORY OF THE INTERSTATE AND NATIONAL ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS OF AUSTRALIA

Interstate rowing competition in Australia originated in four-oared gigs, the first recorded race being held in 1863 on the Parramatta River in New South Wales over a distance of three miles. New South Wales and Victoria were the competing States, the first named being the victor in a time of 19 minutes 25 seconds. A number of contests followed in this class of boat between crews from New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania, often with more than one Club crew from each State taking part in the competition.

Rowed in Melbourne over a distance of four miles in 1878, the first Interstate eight-oared race contested between New South Wales and Victoria was won by Victoria, and continued as an annual event between them until 1885 when Queensland and Tasmania joined the competition followed by Western Australia and South Australia in 1897 and 1899 respectively. The records showed that up until 1890, New South Wales and Victoria were the principal contestants with New South Wales recording its first victory at the second meeting in 1879. Following their re-entry to the competition in 1890, Queensland recorded their first win in 1891, followed by Tasmania in 1906, South Australia in 1913 and Western Australia in 1921 at Launceston.

The first men's Interstate Single Sculling Championship won by M.J. Slack representing Queensland was rowed at Brisbane in 1892 in conjunction with the already well established eight-oared race, and since 1895 has been an annual event on the Interstate rowing calendar.

Interstate Challenge race for women commenced in 1912 when a Brisbane Ladies' Rowing Club four representing Queensland defeated the Albert Park Ladies in Melbourne. A return visit by the Victorian representatives in the following year resulted in a second Queensland Victory on the Brisbane River by a mere two feet.

Competition between the States ceased during the First World War, 1915 to 1919 and resumption on 15th May, 1920, on the Hamilton Reach of the Brisbane River introduced to the Interstate competition our two most prestigious perpetual rowing trophies, namely, the Kings Cup for the Men's eight-oared Championship and the United Licensed Victuallers Association of Queensland Trophy for the Women's four. The history of both these trophies along with the other more recent perpetual trophies now presented annually to the successful Interstate Championship crews is contained later in this programme.

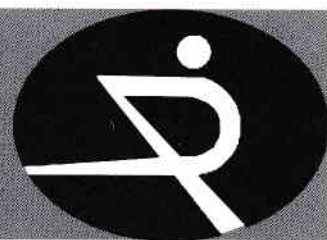
Central control of rowing in Australia became necessary to arrange and co-ordinate Australian and International competition and assume responsibility for the now well established annual Interstate Championships. Following the Interstate Regatta at Brisbane on 15th May, 1920 the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council was formed. The 1st May, 1925 heralded the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council, and thereafter the two Councils conducted their affairs independently until 1976 when amalgamation of both into the now renamed Australian Rowing Council secured a continuity of control and standardisation of regulations, the benefits of which will ensure the future growth and success of the sport, both here and overseas.

The Second World War again interrupted the Interstate Rowing Championships, there being no men's competition between the years 1940 and 1945, and the curtailment of women's races between 1942 and 1948. On resumption, the need for Australian representation at International meetings became more evident, and the addition of test races in other classes of boats became a regular feature at the Interstate Regattas.

The introduction of additional events to Interstate Championship status has provided annual competition for other classes of competitors, and we commend the foresight of the Rowing Councils in legislating for the inclusion of the Men's Lightweight Four in 1958, the Women's Single Scull in 1963, the Women's Lightweight Four in 1968, the Men's Youth Eight and finally the Women's Youth Four in 1988. The addition of Championships for Pairs and Double Sculls in 1953 failed due to lack of interest, and in 1955 the events were withdrawn.

In 1962 the Council made provision for the National Regatta to be conducted bi-annually over 2,000 metres to provide small boat competition regularly, thereby facilitating the selection of Australian representative crews for International Competition and substantially reducing the need for test races. The first Regatta programme comprised National Championship events for four with cox, four without cox, pair with cox, pair without cox, double scull, lightweight eight, lightweight pair with cox, and lightweight single scull. The development of the regatta witnessed the inclusion of additional classes of oarsmen along with schoolboy representatives, and since 1974 has been held annually in conjunction with the Interstate Championships. Resulting from the amalgamation of the National Councils in 1976, the combined National and Interstate Championship regatta now comprises a full programme for both men's and women's sculling and rowing races in all classifications.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS



Briefing of Competitors

A meeting of coaches, rowers, coxswains, scullers, umpires and starters shall take place in front of the Facilities Building at Lake Barrington at 3.00p.m. on Sunday 20th April, 2003.

Briefing of School Competitors

The briefing will be held at 11.30a.m. in front of the Facilities Building At Lake Barrington, Friday, 25th April, 2003.

Secretary's Office

The Regatta Secretary's Office is located near the Boatshed.

Weigh-in Station

The Weigh-in station is located in the Boat-House.

Boat Weighing

The boat weighing will be situated adjacent to the Boat-House.

Drug testing

Please note that the ASDA and/or WADA may be drug testing competitors at the National Championship Regatta.

Testing may occur before the first day of racing. At that time, the testing is regarded as out of competition testing. Urine and blood samples may be taken for testing.

Testing may also occur at any time during the racing program. At that time, the testing is competition testing. Urine and blood samples may be taken for testing.

The Start

The Countdown

The starter shall inform the crews of the time remaining before the start and tell them in which lane each will race

Late Arrivals

Crews must be at their starting positions at least two (2) minutes before the starting time of their race. The Starter may warn any crew arriving at its starting position less than two minutes before the starting time.

A warning has the same effect as one given for a false start. The Starter may exclude a crew arriving after the starting time. The Starter must inform the Referee of any warning or exclusion.

Breakages

The start is not delayed for broken oars, fittings or equipment.

Two minutes to go

When the starter announces "two minutes" this shall signify to the crews that they are formally under Starter's orders.

The announcement of "two minutes" shall also be an instruction to the crews to prepare to race and to the Aligner to commence the aligning of boats. The crews must be ready to race within the two minutes period.

Aligning

The Aligner indicates to the Starter that the boats are properly aligned by raising a white flag or by pressing the "crews aligned" button on the console.

Should correct alignment be lost during the subsequent starting procedure, the Aligner lowers the flag or presses the "crews not aligned" button.

Roll Call

When the boats are aligned and the crews are ready to race, the Starter shall make a roll-call by announcing - in lane order - the names of each of the crews in the race.

Once the roll-call begins the crews must make sure that their boats are straight. Each crew is responsible for being both straight and ready at the end of the roll-call.

Once the roll-call begins the Starter shall take no further notice of any crew which then indicates that it is not ready or that it is not straight.

The Start

After the last crew has been named in the roll call, the starter shall check that the aligner's flag is still raised and shall then say

'ATTENTION'

The starter shall then raise the red flag.

After a clear pause, the starter shall drop the red flag quickly to one side, simultaneously saying

'GO'

The pause between the raising of the flag and the start command (dropping the red flag and saying 'go') shall be variable.

Starting Procedure Using Coloured Indicator Lights

After the last crew has been named in the roll-call the Starter shall check that the Aligner's flag is still raised or crews lights are "on" and shall then say "Attention". The Starter shall then press a button to change the visible signal from the neutral position to red. After a clear pause, the Starter shall give the start by pressing a button which shall, at the same moment, (a) change the red signal to yellow; (b) make an audible signal through the loudspeakers; (c) start the timing system for the race. The pause between the red signal and the start command (the yellow signal and the audible signal) shall be variable.

Interruptions

If the starting procedure is interrupted for any reason external to the crews or for a false start, then the starter must begin the procedure again, starting with the roll call.

Quick Start

In exceptional circumstances the starter may decide to dispense with the roll call. If so, the starter must inform the crews that the "quick start" shall be used. Once the normal start has been used the starter shall not change to the quick start for the same race.



NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

For the quick start, instead of the roll call, the starter shall say **'quick start -attention'**

The starter shall then raise the red flag or the attention lights are turned "on".

After a clear pause the starter shall give the start by dropping the red flag quickly to one side and simultaneously saying **'go' or press the "go" button (lights change and a start signal generated)**.

The pause between the raising of the flag and the start command (dropping the red flag and saying 'go') shall be variable.

False Start

Should a crew start too soon, the Aligner shall inform the Starter and Umpire by waving a red flag or by pressing the false start button which emits a flashing red lights and an audible beeper. The Starter shall stop the race by ringing a bell and then waving the red flag, or by pressing the false start button which emits a flashing red lights and an audible beeper.

After the race has been stopped the Aligner shall tell the Starter by name (not lane number) which crew or crews started too soon. The decision as to whether one or more crews started too soon is the sole responsibility of the Aligner.

When the crews return to their starting positions, the Starter shall warn the crew or crews at fault. This warning shall hold good until the race has been rowed and shall therefore apply in the case of a postponement or a re-row.

Finish:

The Judges at the finish shall indicate the crossing of the line by the winning crew and each other crew in the race by a sound signal.

Coxswains

Coxswains shall weigh in not more than 24 hours nor less than 1 hour before their first race in the regatta.

Lightweight Competitors

Lightweight competitors shall weigh in not more than two hours and not less than one hour before their first race on each day of racing.

Competing Boats

The bows of all competing boats shall be fitted with a white ball 4cm in diameter in soft rubber or similar material unless the

bow is so constructed as to afford equivalent protection and visibility.

Lane Numbers;

All competing boats shall display on the bow the lane number in which it will race in each event. Lane numbers will be supplied by the Regatta Officials at the launching area for a deposit of \$10.00 and must be returned immediately upon return of each boat to the launching area for refund of deposit. Only lane numbers supplied by the organising committee will be used.

Scratchings

Scratchings shall be notified at the Secretary's Office at the earliest possible time, but not less than one hour before their respective event.

Substitutes

Substitutes in any crew shall be notified at the Secretary's Office and shall be made in accordance with regulation 4.8

Equipment Damage

If a crew while still on the first 100 metres of the race indicates that it has suffered damage to its boat or equipment, the Starter or Umpire stops the race.

Umpire's Directions

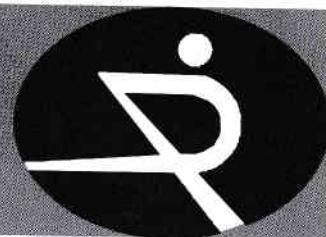
The Umpire may not steer a crew unless there is an obstacle in its lane. If a crew is about to impede another by its wash or be leaving its lane the Umpire raises a white flag and calls the crew at fault, indicating the required change of direction by lowering the flag to one side. If a crew is about to cause a collision, the Umpire may call its attention by raising the white flag and stop it by giving the command "STOP: . Crews interfering with their opponents may be excluded from the race.

Winning Crews

All winning crews and scullers in Finals events are to proceed direct to the Victory Dais for the presentation of trophies and medallions immediately after the race concludes. Other competitors are required to wait for the winner to lead the way to the Dais, after which they should proceed in an orderly line (preferably in order of finishing, 2nd to 8th) back to the launching pontoon

BOAT TRAFFIC RULES – LAKE BARRINGTON



SAFETY IS ALL IMPORTANT

BASIC RULES FOR ALL OCCASSIONS

- 1.1 Traffic flow generally will be in an anti-clockwise direction.
 - i.e. Eastern shore while moving North.
Western shore while moving South.
- 1.2 Lanes are marked 1 to 8 (8 lanes) from the Eastern shore.
- 1.3 Pontoons are numbered 1 to 4 from North to South.

Crews/scullers going out may only use pontoons 1 and 2 and shall proceed along the eastern shore toward the start.

Crews/scullers returning to shore may use only pontoons 3 and 4 which must be approached from the direction of the finish along the Eastern Shore.
- 1.4 Boats may only cross the course at one location – that is within the first 100 metres from the start, commonly called “the start zone”.
- 1.5 Any boat crossing the course within the start zone must do so with the **GREATEST OF CARE POSSIBLE**. During periods of competition, permission must be obtained from the Starter before proceeding across the course.
- 1.6 Whether Racing or Training, crews and scullers should proceed at least 100 metres beyond the Finish Line before turning to the left and proceeding back along the Eastern shore (adjacent to the Judges Tower) towards the pontoons. All crews and scullers are only to turn around the yellow marker buoy beyond the Finish, anti-clockwise, before returning in front of the Finish Tower. At no time is any crew or sculler who has finished a race, or completed a training row, to return in front of the Judges Tower without turning around the yellow buoy, nor to cross any portion of the course.
- 1.7 At no time should crews/scullers proceed further than 500m in a Northerly direction behind the Start installations (i.e. not beyond sight of the Start). Beyond this point the lake is allocated for use of power boats and water skiers, and rowing crews/scullers are **NOT** to interfere with other lake users.

There is no restriction on lake usage by rowers in a southerly direction beyond the Finish Line.

TRAFFIC RULES – TRAINING

During periods other than those for competition, training may be undertaken provided all of the foregoing traffic rules are constantly obeyed and with the added provision for training on the buoyed course as follows:

- 2.1 Lanes 1,2 and 3 may be used only in a Northerly direction (finish to start). Crews/scullers rowing in this reverse direction should **STOP** at least 250 metres from the Start to avoid collision with crews crossing the course in the Start Zone.
- 2.2 Lanes 4 and 5 will be **CLOSED** at all times other than for competition.
- 2.3 Lanes 6,7 and 8 may be used only in a Southerly direction (start to finish). Crews must complete the full 2000 metre course at all times.
- 2.4 When training on the course as described in 2.1 and 2.3, any crew/sculler stopping must immediately look behind for other crews in the same lane. If a crew is coming up behind they must clear the lane or move on quickly.

TRAFFIC RULES – COMPETITION

Traffic Rules for Competition periods shall take effect half an hour before the scheduled starting time of the first race on the programme and shall expire 10 minutes after the conclusion of the 1st race on the programme.

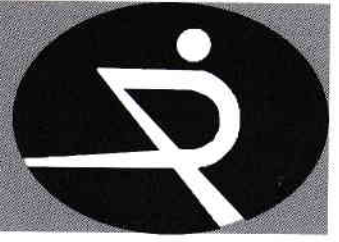
- 3.1 During competition periods crews/scullers should continue to observe the basic rules 1.1 to 1.7 above. However some crews will choose to move behind the Start for a warm-up and others will remain in the area to the East of the Start Zone prior to racing. Thus crews/scullers may be approaching their start position from either side of the course and the GREATEST CARE POSSIBLE must be taken.
- 3.2 The areas adjacent to the Start Zone should not be used for warming up prior to competition due to the congestion of boats that sometimes arise in this area. Warming up should whenever possible be undertaken while proceeding from the pontoons to the start line towards Kentish Park.
- 3.3 The area on the Eastern side of the start pontoon should not be used for warming up. It is within the Start Zone and boats should only be in this area awaiting permission from the Starter to enter their lane for the commencement of a race.
- 3.4 Crews/Scullers moving in the area north of the Start Line should always move in an anti-clockwise direction.
- 3.5 Once the previous race has cleared the 100 metre zone the crews for the next race may move with care into their lanes only when instructed to do so by the Starter.
- 3.6 Crews/Scullers may practice in their own lane before the start of their race between the start and the 500 metres, provided there is adequate time before the start and PROVIDED they obtain the specific approval of the Starter who shall first ascertain that the lane is clear of other boats.
- 3.7 Crews are reminded that “any competitor arriving at the starting position less than two minutes before the starting time may be awarded a false start”. The starting position means having your boat held by the appropriate boat-holder.
- 3.8 During periods of competition, crews/scullers proceeding back to the pontoons from the finish MUST pass between the outer limits of lane 1 and the shoreline in front of the judges Tower. They must not row in a northerly direction onto any lane of the course.

TRAINING DURING HOURS OF COMPETITION

On days of competition further special rules shall apply from half an hour before the scheduled start of the first race on the programme until 10 minutes after the conclusion of the last race on the programme.

- 4.1 Provided there is the utmost co-operation from crews and scullers, the Boat Race Officials will permit training during hours of competition. IF THERE IS ANY INTERFERENCE WITH CREWS COMPETING, THIS PERMISSION WILL BE WITHDRAWN IMMEDIATELY.
- 4.2 The course shall be CLOSED to all power boats, except official craft, from a point 250 metres north of the Start to a point 250 metres south of the Finish.
- 4.3 Crews/Scullers preparing for a race shall have absolute priority of usage of launching pontoons over crew/scullers proceeding for a training row.
- 4.4 Crews/Scullers participating in training only shall proceed under the normal traffic rules as quickly as possible beyond the Start to avoid any interference with crews warming up for race preparation.
- 4.5 Crews/Scullers may return from the Start area along the Western side of the lake provided they do not move closer to the outer limits of lane 8 than 100 metres, save near the start and finish.

- 4.6 Crews training must not pace any race in progress.
- 4.7 Crews training must stop at least 250 metres from the finish (in either direction) if any race is within 500 metres of the finish.
- 4.8 Crews training are asked to display full consideration for the crews engaged in actual competition and must stop rowing well before a race overtakes them.

CREWS RACING OR ABOUT TO RACE MUST BE SHOWN THE ULTIMATE CONSIDERATION BY CREW/SCULLERS WHO ARE TRAINING ONLY.

PENALTIES FOR BOAT TRAFFIC INFRINGEMENTS

- 5.1 All licensed Boat Race officials are authorised to award appropriate penalties against any crew or sculler who infringes these traffic rules whether they occur during a competition period or during training periods.
- 5.2 Such penalties may include exclusion from a regatta, or awarding a false start in the next event contested and/or a monetary fine.

ADAPTIVE TRAINING

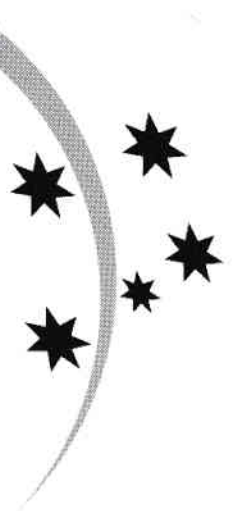
The Organising Committee requests that all Team Managers, Coaches and Athletes respect the principles of understanding, consideration and care with our disabled rowers during their training periods.

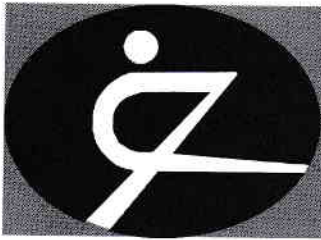
As in the previous Australian Championships our **ADAPTIVE** athletes will participate, continuing our intergration programme. Based at the 500 Metre mark (Murfett's Bay) disrowers will be easily identified on water due to the specialised rowing craft and will be supervised during their training periods.

We ask for your consideration and care when meeting the Adaptive rowers both on and off water.

SAFETY IS ALL IMPORTANT

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EVENT DESCRIPTION AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Event 1A: An adaptive fixed seat single scull raced over 500 metres.

This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull with pontoons unless all competitors are able to row without pontoons. To be eligible for the event an athlete must not be able to have use of their legs.

If there are sufficient entries there will be separate divisions for athletes **with** and **without** body swing. If insufficient entries for a separate Division the competitor with the body swing would be strapped to prevent body swing and enable fairer competition.

A competitor in Event 1A is ineligible to compete in events 1B, 2A, 2B and 3B.

Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 1B: An adaptive sliding seat single scull raced over 500 metres.

This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull with pontoons unless all competitors are able to row without pontoons. The event is for a competitor who has the use of their legs, but is unable to handle a conventional single scull and is unable to compete over 1000 metres.

A competitor in Event 1B is ineligible to compete in events 1A, 2A, 2B and 3B.

Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 2A: An adaptive sliding seat single scull raced over 1000 metres.

This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull. Pontoons are optional. The event is for a competitor who has the use of their legs, is unable to handle a conventional single scull but is able to compete over 1000 metres in an adaptive scull.

A competitor in Event 2A is ineligible to compete in event 1A, 1B, 2B or 3A.

Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 2B: A conventional single scull raced over 1000 metres.

This event to be rowed in a conventional single scull.

A competitor in Event 2B is ineligible to compete in events 1A, 1B, 2A. and 3A.

Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 3: A conventional double scull raced over 1000 metres.

Only athletes who are eligible to compete in event 2A or 2B are eligible for this event.

The athlete with a disability must row in the stroke position. The athlete in the bow position must be an eligible Masters rower, minimum age 27, who has not competed in state and national regattas at elite level for at least 12 months.

Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 64 (FISA) Mixed coxed four raced over 1000m.

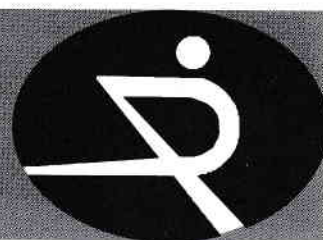
This event is to be rowed in a conventional stern coxed four.

The crew must be made up of 50% male and 50% female.

Only athletes eligible for events 2A , 2B and 3 will be eligible to compete in this event.

STATUS OF COMPETITORS

OPEN All rowers shall be eligible to compete in an Open category in the appropriate division

UNDER 23 A rower ceases to be Under 23 on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 22 years. After that date the rower is classified as a Senior A

YOUTH (Under 21) A rower ceases to be a Youth on 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of 20 years. This definition also applies to the coxswains of a Youth crew.

UNDER 19 A rower ceases to be Under 19 on 31 December of the year in which he or she reaches the age of 18 years. This definition also applies to the coxswains of a Junior crew.

SCHOOL A rower who is attending secondary school as a full-time student shall be eligible to compete in the School category. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a School crew.

UNDER 17 A rower ceases to be eligible for Under 17 on 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of 16 years. This definition also applies to the coxswain of an Under 17 crew.

LIGHTWEIGHT: Lightweight races are restricted to male rowers weighing 72.5 kilograms or less and female rowers weighing 59 kilograms or less in the case of single sculling races and in all other classes of boat to male rowers weighing 72.5 kilograms or less and female rowers weighing 59 kilograms or less provided that the average weight of all members of the crew in which such rower races (excluding the coxswain) does not exceed 70 kilograms in the case of male rowers and 57 kilograms in the case of female rowers..

HISTORY OF THE NELL SLATTER TROPHY

Dating back to 1901 at the great Federation Regatta staged on Albert Park Lake, Cassie Wooly McRitchie representing Victoria and using a skiff loaned to her by the then Governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, defeated her challenger from Sydney, Elizabeth Messenger, and was presented with a magnificent pearl and ruby bracelet by the Duke of Gloucester. So great was the public interest in the female scullers that police were required to keep the inquisitive spectators at bay. At the great age of 96 she passed away in 1973, and will for all time be remembered as the founder of the first all women's rowing club at Albert Park in 1907. Classie McRitchie is justifiably known as the "mother" of Victorian women's rowing.

First introduced in 1963 at Brisbane, the Women's Interstate Single Sculling Championship has continued as an annual event for which the Nell Slatter Trophy, presented by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association as a tribute to the then President, is the perpetual trophy.

HISTORY OF THE PRESIDENT'S CUP

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President Mr.E.C.Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersall's Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the late A.A. Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian Olympians have been the holders of this trophy. The records of R.H. (Bob) Pearce, holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medallist in 1928 and 1932, his cousin C.A.(Cecil) Pearce, four times holder and M.T.(Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic Gold, Silver and Bronze Medallist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively and all representing New South Wales are well known.

HISTORY OF THE VICTORIA CUP

At the first Women's Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship contested on the Yarra River in Melbourne, a victory was recorded by Victoria with a crew stroked by one of Australia's best known oarswomen, Margaret Agnew Mackenzie, whose efforts in negotiating with the Women's Rowing Council secured lightweight rowing as an annual event on the women's Interstate rowing programme. The Victoria Cup, presented by the Victorian Ladies 'Rowing Association, is the perpetual trophy for this event.

Lightweight women have recorded International victories, the first being at the inaugural competition between the United States of America, Canada and Australia at St. Catherines, Canada, in 1979, when Australia was successful in the two events for which crews were entered - Lightweight Four with Cox and Lightweight Pair with Cox.

HISTORY OF THE PENRITH CUP

The introduction of the Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship in 1958 for oarsmen then weighing not more than 140 lbs, and for which the Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy, laid the foundation for this class of rowing in Australia.

The weight limit for lightweight competitors in Australia has varied from time to time between the States, however, since 1974, the year which heralded the first F.I.S.A. Lightweight Championship at which Australia recorded a Gold medal victory, the Internationally accepted lightweight limits have been adopted nationally.

HISTORY OF THE NOEL F. WILKINSON TROPHY

Recognising the necessity to introduce a class of rowing in which Australian Youth oarsmen could compete, the Australian Rowing Council Initiated the Interstate Youth Eight-oared Championship at an age limit some eighteen months older than the Internationally accepted Junior age limit. The first Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974, and in that same year, the Council accepted the offer by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event.

Junior (age limit) events for other classes of boats now forming part of the National Regatta programme now collectively fulfil the purposes originally envisaged by both the Council and the Donor, namely, an incentive to young oarsmen to continue in the sport subsequent to completion of their secondary education by providing acceptable competition at a National level and foster their development into higher classifications.

HISTORY OF THE QUEEN ELIZABETH 11 TROPHY (FORMERLY THE U.L.V.A. TROPHY)

Presented by the United Licenced Victuallers Association of Queensland to the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council in 1920, and affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as "Bertha", this handsome sterling silver trophy crafted in London depicts Dorothy Arnold Ekins, the petite girl from Mannum, holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb of her day.....floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers !!!

Dorothy, a lightweight by today's standards, along with three other members of her home club and representing South Australia, won the first Women's Interstate Four-oared Championship from New South Wales and Queensland in a time of 4 minutes 55 seconds. Renamed the Queen Elizabeth 11 Trophy in 2003.

HISTORY OF THE KING'S CUP

First won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Regatta held on 2nd to 4th July of that year, this handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race for that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful A.I.F. No. 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914 -18 War.

The successful crew comprising Sgt. A.A. Robb, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas), 11st 10lb, Bow: Lieut. F.A. House, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas), 11st 12lb, 2; Liet. T. McGill, Leichhardt Rowing Club (N.S.W.), 12st 10lb, 3; Gunner A.V. Scott, Murray Bridge Rowing Club (S.A.), 13st, 4; Lieut. H. Hauenstien, M.M., Leichhardt & Balmain Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st 9lb, 5 Major S.A. Middleton, D.S.O., Glebe & Sydney Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st 6lb, 6; Gunner G.W. Nettam, West Australian Rowing Club (W.A.), 11st 12lb, 7; Captain H.C. Disher, Melbourne University Boat Club (Vic), 11st 11lb, Stroke; Sgt A.E. Smedley, Sydney Rowing Club (N.S.W.) Cox, defeated the A.I.F. No. 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds, the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and United States

The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian Military Authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the Australian War Museum. On 14th May, 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Association held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual Trophy for the Australian Eight-oared Championship. This request was refused, and on 12th October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup, with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association, and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30th October, 1920, and signed by Captain H.C. Disher, was sent to his Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy. A reply dated 13th May, 1921, received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr Winston Churchill, stated that "His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Race of Australia".
