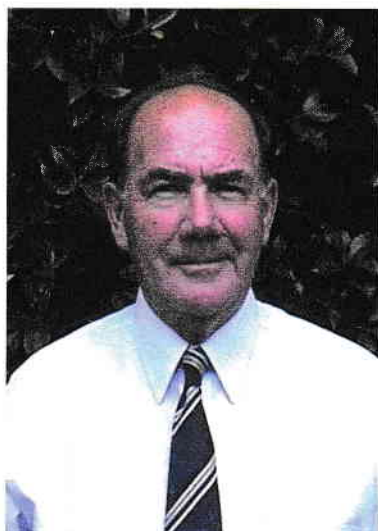

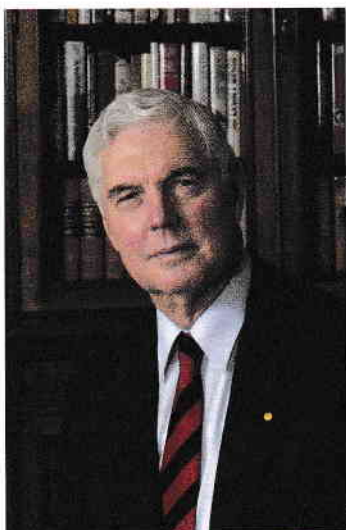
To all the competitors we wish you good rowing in the spirit of true and fair sporting endeavour.

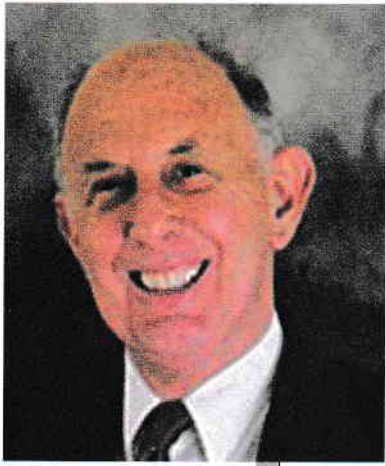

In recognising Rowing Victoria's and its member clubs' ability to increase active participation rates in sport and recreation, VicHealth together with Rowing Victoria have entered into the Partnerships for Health Scheme "Health through Rowing".

Rowing Victoria has developed major capacity building projects to undertake over the three years of the Health Through Rowing Partnership which aim to firstly to increase physical activity through participation and secondly to provide a healthy & welcoming environment.

Competent Coxswain is designed to increase the knowledge and skill of coxswains with a view to coxswains going on to become accredited coaches through the National Coach Accreditation Scheme.

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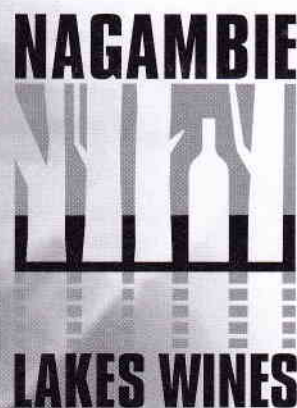
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INTERSTATE AND NATIONAL ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS OF AUSTRALIA

Intercolonial Men's Four Racing

Interstate rowing competition in Australia originated in four-oared gigs, the earliest race being held in 1863 on the Parramatta River in New South Wales over a distance of three miles. Crews from New South Wales and Victoria competed with the crew from New South Wales being the victor in a time of 19 minutes 25 seconds. In this race the crews represented their colonies and each bore the name of its colony. The Victorian crew was made up from the Elswick, Melbourne and Melbourne University Clubs. At this time there were many disputes over the amateur status of crews between the colonies, which prevented true intercolonial races taking place on a regular basis. In particular, Victoria alleged that New South Wales crews included crew members who were watermen or oarsmen who had raced for money prizes. It was not until 1870 when another race was conducted of an intercolonial status. This was at the Balmain Regatta. This race included a Tasmanian crew and was won by Sydney Rowing Club. The next race, in Hobart in 1872, was of particular interest due to the inclusion of crews from three colonies NSW, Victoria and Tasmania. The Parramatta crew which finished second included an oarsman who became Australia's first Prime Minister, Edmund Barton. In 1873 and 1874 intercolonial races were again conducted. In 1874, both the Victorian and New South Wales crews represented their colonies. The next intercolonial four oared race was conducted in 1888 when a New Zealand crew competed, and the last was in 1896.

Intercolonial Men's Eights Championships

In October, 1877, the year in which eight-oared boats may be said to have first come into general use in many of the rowing centres in Australia, a challenge was sent by the Victorian Rowing Association to the Sydney and Mercantile [now Mosman] Clubs in New South Wales. This was taken up with spirit by the last-named club, and the first eight-oared race took place on the 6th March 1878, over about four miles on the Lower Yarra. The NSW crew contained members from both the Sydney and Mercantile Clubs and Victoria was the victor in this contest. This was the first Intercolonial Men's Eight Championship.

This race has become one of the world's famous rowing championships, and has continued annually to this day, except for the two World Wars, one year in the Great Depression and one year where a cyclone disrupted the event. In those early days where distance was such an issue, it is easy to recognize why this annual event was a great event.

Queensland and Tasmania joined the competition in 1885, followed by Western Australia and South Australia in 1897 and 1899 respectively. The records show that up until 1890, New South Wales and Victoria were the principal contestants, with New South Wales recording its first victory at the second meeting in 1879. Following their re-entry to the competition in 1890, Queensland recorded its first win in 1891, followed by Tasmania in 1906, South Australia in 1913

and Western Australia in 1921 at Launceston. The King's Cup trophy for this event was introduced in 1921.

Intercolonial Men's Sculling Championships

The first intercolonial sculling race was between A Nicholls of Victoria and H Freeman of New South Wales in 1868 when Nicholls won the event. Whilst there was a further race in Melbourne in 1873, the first recognized intercolonial race was held in conjunction with the intercolonial eights race in 1892 at the Brisbane regatta. The race was between M J Slack of Queensland and M Lambert of NSW with Slack taking the title. The contest has been conducted with the eights race ever since.

Interstate Women's Fours Championships

The Interstate Challenge race for women commenced in 1912 when a Brisbane Ladies' Rowing Club four representing Queensland defeated the Albert Park Ladies in Melbourne. A return visit by the Victorian representatives in the following year resulted in a second Queensland victory on the Brisbane River by a mere two feet. Despite women's rowing being active well before this time, the first recognized start to interstate competition in fours was on 15th May 1920 on the Hamilton Reach of the Brisbane River following the resumption of competition after WWI. It saw the introduction of one of the most prestigious perpetual rowing trophies, the United Licensed Victuallers Association of Queensland Trophy for the women's four. This regatta was also significant for women's rowing with the formation of the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council, some five years prior to the formation of the men's association.

Development of the Interstate Championships

Central control of rowing in Australia became necessary to arrange and coordinate Australian and International competition and assume responsibility for the now well established annual interstate Championships. Following the interstate Regatta at Brisbane on 15th May 1920 the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council was formed. The 1st May 1925 heralded the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council. The two Councils conducted their affairs independently until 1976, when amalgamation of both into the now renamed Australian Rowing Council secured a continuity of control and standardisation of regulations, the benefits of which will ensure the future growth and success of the sport, both here and overseas.

The Second World War again interrupted the Interstate Rowing Championships. There was no men's competition between the years 1940 and 1945, and women's races were curtailed between 1942 and 1948. On resumption, the need for Australian representation at international meetings became more evident, and the addition of test races in other classes of boats became a regular feature at the interstate regattas.

The introduction of additional events to Interstate Championship status has provided annual competition for other classes of competitors, and we commend the foresight of the Rowing Councils in legislating for the inclusion of the Men's Lightweight Four in 1958, the Women's Single Scull in 1963, the Women's Lightweight Four in 1968, the Men's Youth Eight in 1974 and finally the Women's Youth Four in 1988. The addition of Championships for Pairs and Double Sculls in 1953 failed due to lack of interest, and in 1955 the events were withdrawn.

In 1962 the Council made provision for the National Regatta to be conducted bi-annually over 2000 metres to provide small boat competition regularly, thereby facilitating the selection of Australian representative

crews for international competition and substantially reducing the need for test races. The first regatta programme comprised National Championship events for four with cox, four without cox, pair with cox, pair without cox, double scull, lightweight eight, lightweight pair with cox, and lightweight single scull. The development of the regatta witnessed the inclusion of additional classes of oarsmen along with schoolboy representatives, and since 1974 has been held annually in conjunction with the Interstate Championships. Resulting from the amalgamation of the National Councils in 1976, the combined National and Interstate Championship regatta now comprises a full programme for both men's and women's sculling and rowing races in all classifications.

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NAGAMBIE LAKES REGATTA CENTRE

Background—Rowing in Nagambie

The Goulburn Weir just north of Nagambie was constructed in 1891 and the backup of water behind the weir created Lake Nagambie.

The reservoir behind Goulburn Weir forms part of an extensive water storage and irrigation system administered in Tatura by Goulburn Murray Water.

The Goulburn Weir is an integral part of a complex and widespread irrigation system in the Goulburn River Valley, the water level in Lake Nagambie is constant throughout the year. The full supply level is 124 metres above sea level. The Weir is over 10 kilometres north of the area used for rowing, thereby no river flow or current is generated on or around the rowing course.

Within two years of the creation of Lake Nagambie, rowing was developed as a regular sport and a rowing regatta was held at Nagambie in 1894. The Nagambie Rowing Club was created in 1893 and won its first senior premiership as early as 1919 and gained its first representative in the King's Cup in 1934.

An undoubted highlight for the Club came in 1964 when Nagambie rowers Neil Lodding and Bruce Richardson with coxswain Wayne Gammon were selected to represent Australia in the men's coxed pair at the Tokyo Olympics.

The current Nagambie clubrooms were opened on the 26th December 1980 and the club remains an integral part of the local community and of rowing in Victoria. The Nagambie Rowing Club is proud of its association with the Australian Rowing Championships.

Development of the Rowing Course

Members of the Rowing Club, Goulburn Murray Water and the predecessors to the Shire of Strathbogie accelerated discussion towards the development of a 2000 metre rowing course in 1992-93. In 1994 advice and support was sought and received from representatives of the Victorian Rowing Association and the then Australian Rowing Council.

In July 1995, the Australian Rowing Council allocated the 1998 Australian Rowing Championships and King's Cup Regatta to Lake Nagambie and soon after a joint funding commitment was made by the Department of Sport and Recreation (Vic.) and the Shire of Strathbogie.

Phase One of the construction commenced on the 14th May 1996. It was agreed that the dimensions

of the course would be 2150 metres in length, 108 metres in width and with up to 8 lanes for competition and a 'returning' lane. Whilst rowing has been the principal catalyst for the creation of the facility, it now accommodates national standard canoeing.

About 160,000 cubic metres of earth was dug and relocated to reclaimed areas to provide a peninsula upon which is located, on the northern side, competitor and spectator facilities.

In a partnership arrangement between Goulburn Murray Water and the Shire of Strathbogie, former Rowing Australia CEO, David Schier, was seconded to oversee the completion of phase one and all stages of phase two of the development.

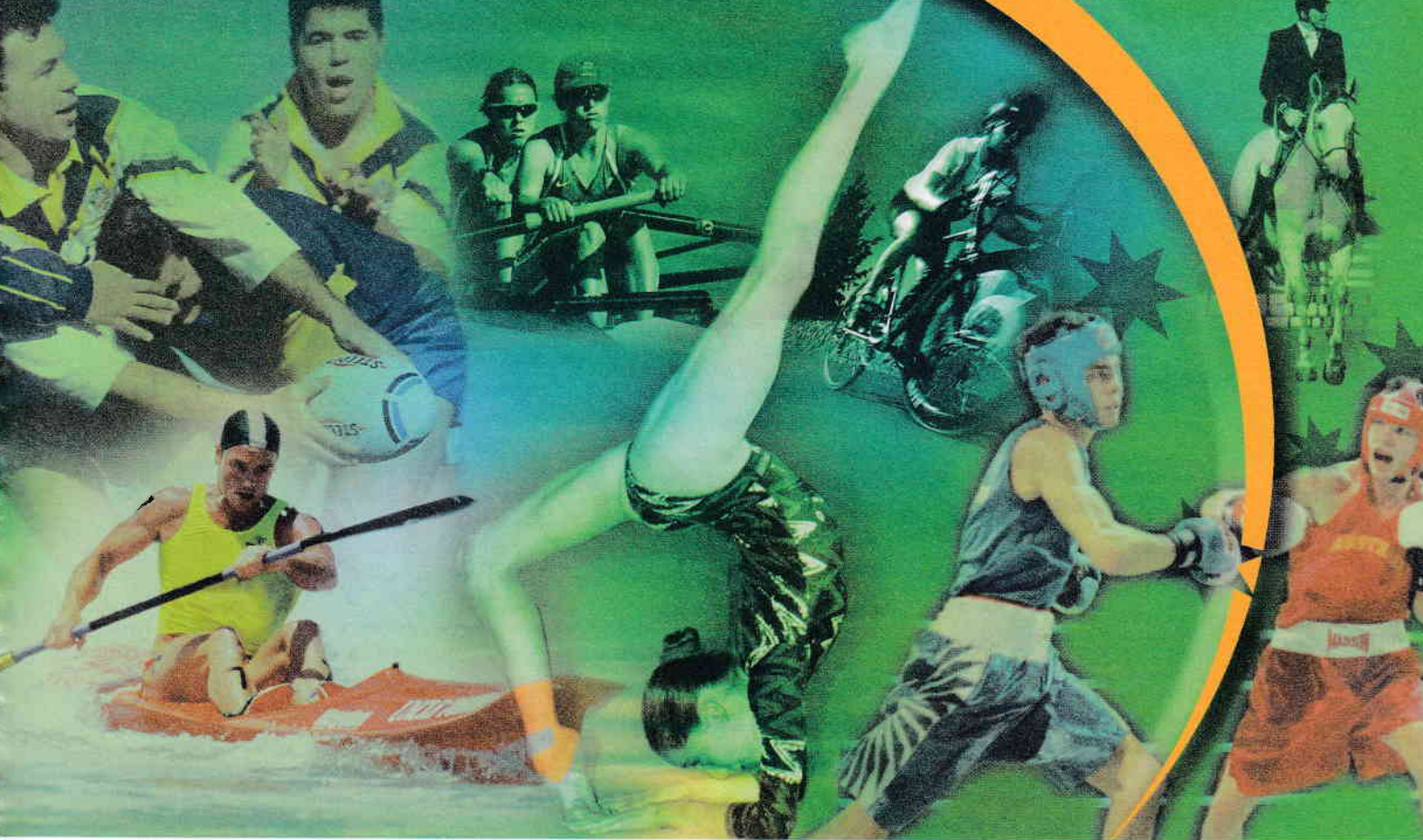
Construction continues into 1997, allowed for an extension of the peninsula to 900 metres and the creation of a power boat launching area to assist water-skiers access the northern section of the lake when rowing regattas are not held. The foreshore development was also designed to accommodate the particular interests of disrowers.

The completion of phase two works provided the facility with a fully buoyed course, fixed starting installation; provision of all essential services (water, power, waste, telephone, timing, public address, internal roads, irrigation, signage, security fencing), permanent boat shed with competitor amenities and an all encompassing regatta headquarters and judges rooms.

The course was officially opened on the 7th March 1998, by a long time advocate and supporter of the development, the then Deputy Premier of Victoria, Patrick McNamara, M.P. A week later the Tattersalls Regatta Headquarters was opened. It contains a multi-purpose ground floor room, kiosk, toilets, regatta administration office, course commentators room, an office and a room for judges and photo-finish camera operations.

Since the official opening in 1998, the course and facilities were managed by the Nagambie Lakes Authority. In 2001, the Shire of Strathbogie, with the continued support of Goulburn Murray Water, assumed the responsibility for the facilities day to day management and have continued to develop and improve the centre's facilities, attracting an impressive array of major rowing and canoeing regattas.

Despite state-wide drought conditions over the last few years, the Nagambie Lakes Regatta Centre has continued to provide a fully operational facility and a constant water level for training camps and regattas. During 2004 the centre has played host to 10 rowing and canoeing regattas, including State & National Championships, and more than 20 training camps.



Winning Partnership

The Australian Sports Commission is the Australian Government agency responsible for the funding and development of sport in Australia. Through its two main programs – the Australian Institute of Sport, and Sport Performance and Development – the Australian Sports Commission supports a wide range of initiatives designed to develop sporting excellence and increase participation in sport by all Australians.

Rowing Australia is one of 85 national sporting organisations that have formed a winning partnership with the Australian Sports Commission to develop their sport in Australia.

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NOTICE TO COMPETITORS AND COACHES

Competitors briefing

A meeting of managers, competitors, coaches, and boat race officials will take place at 3.00pm Sunday 7th March 2004 in the VIP marquee; and a schools meeting will be held at 4.00pm on Thursday 11th March, 2004.

Lightweight and coxswain weighing

- Scales will be available for check weighing from 8.00am Sunday 7th March 2004.
- Official weighing for lightweights will be conducted according to the Rules of RA. viz Lightweight rowers shall be weighed in racing uniform by a person duly appointed by the Organizing Committee conducting the regatta not less than (1) hour and not more than (2) hours before the starting time appearing in the program for their first race on each day of racing.
- If a rower has races in other events on a day of racing, the weight recorded for the first event may be applied to qualify for subsequent events.
- Rowers may re-weigh after their weigh-in for their first event on a day of racing within the time limits applicable to that event. This weight may also be carried forward for any other races in which the rower competes on that day of racing.
- Coxswains found underweight will be referred to the Jury. Crews could be disqualified if they are found to have competed with an underweight coxswain.
- Official weighing for Coxswains shall be conducted according to the Rules of RA. viz Coxswains shall be weighed not more than twenty four (24) hours and not less than one (1) hour before the advertised starting time of their first race of that regatta and shall be weighed in racing uniform.
- Coxswains of men's crew will have a minimum weight of 55 kilograms.
- Coxswains of women's, schoolboys, schoolgirls, and all U17 and U19 crews will be a minimum weight of 50 kilograms.

Boat weighing

- All boats are to be weighed and checked for the appropriate safety equipment prior to their first race.
- Crew/scullers rowing in boats that have not been weighed will be placed last in their race.
- All safety equipment, particularly shoe release, heel ties and bow ball, must be correctly fitted and functioning when boats are presented for weighing or boats will not be weighed. Control Commission will be monitoring all boats that are launching for competition and will not allow any boats on the water that do not comply with the appropriate safety equipment rules.
- Heel tie downs must limit the heel of fitted shoes to be raised no higher than 60mm above the heel of the footstretcher.
- Official boat weighing will be available from 7th March 8.00am and from one hour prior to the first race of each competition day.
- Crews and Scullers racing in underweight boats will be disqualified.
- All boats shall be weighed with fittings essential to their use and in particular with riggers, stretchers and slides but without oars or sound amplification equipment and loudspeakers.

Minimum Boat Weights:

Substitutions and Withdrawals

- All withdrawals and substitutions must be made to the Regatta Secretary at the Regatta Information Centre.
- Official withdrawal and substitution forms must be fully completed and signed by an official of the respective State Association.
- Withdrawals must be made not less than one hour before the respective event/race.
- Substitutions in any crew can only be made according to the Rule 4.8 of the Rowing Australia Rules and Racing Code.
- Substitutions can only be made up to 1 hour prior to the start time of the first race of the event for that crew.
- No change can be made to a crew which has already raced in a heat of its event, except in cases of serious illness or accident – refer to Rule 4.8.2.

Bow numbers

- All competing boats are required to display an official bow number (colour coded) on the bow of the boat, representing the allocated lane number for that race.
- Lane numbers will be supplied by the Regatta Officials in the boat shed (see site map) for a deposit of \$10. This must be returned to the Officials immediately upon return of each boat to the launching area for deposit refund.

Boat trailers

- Volunteer trailer marshals will be on hand to direct trailers on arrival.

Ceremonies

- First, second and third placed crews and scullers in the finals are to proceed to the Victory Dais for presentation of trophies and medallions immediately after the race.

Racing code

- The 2004 Australian Rowing Championships and Interstate Regatta is conducted under the Rules and Racing Code of Rowing Australia Inc.
- Managers, coaches and athletes should make themselves familiar with the rules of racing.

Starting times

- Competitors are to be within the start zone five minutes before the time appointed for starting their race.
- Competitors must be held in their starting position at least two minutes before the time laid down for the start of their race.
- The starter may warn or exclude from the race any crew/sculler arriving at the starting position less than two minutes before the scheduled starting time. A warning has the same effect as one given for a false start.
- Starting procedure will be in accordance with RA rules, i.e. using 'traffic' lights.



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False start

- If a crew/sculler starts too soon, the starter stops the race by ringing a bell and then waving a red flag or alternatively an intermittent audible sound with flashing lights will be used. In the case of a false start the Starter warns the offending crew(s)/sculler(s).
- A crew causing two false starts shall be excluded from the race.

Equipment damage

- If a crew while still in the first 100 metres of the race indicates that it has suffered damage to its boat or equipment, the Starter or Umpire stops the race.
- The signal by an Umpire to stop the race shall be by ringing a bell and waving a red flag.

Umpire's direction

- The Umpire may not steer a crew/sculler unless there is an obstacle in its lane.
- If a crew/sculler is about to impede another by its wash or by leaving its lane, the Umpire raises a white flag and calls the crew/sculler at fault, indicating the required change of direction by lowering the flag to one side.
- If a crew/sculler is about to cause a collision, the Umpire may call its attention by raising the white flag and stop it by giving the command 'STOP'.
- Crews/scullers interfering with their opponents may be excluded from the race.

Finish

- The Judges at the finish shall indicate the crossing of the line by each crew in the race by sounding signal.

Competition Rules

4.8 ALTERATIONS TO CREWS

- 1.1.1 All crews have the right to replace up to fifty percent of their rowers and the coxswain, provided that:
- (1) The substituted rower is from the same State Association represented in the original entry form;
 - (2) A written declaration of the names and status of such replacement(s) be presented at least one (1) hour before the race to the Organizing Committee, which must mention the substitution in their official report;
 - (3) The written declaration notifying the change of name and status of such replacements is certified by the Secretary,

the Team Manager or nominated State Official of a State Association, to confirm that the notified substitute competitor(s) is/are registered rower(s) with the State Association with which their Club or School is affiliated.

- 4.8.2 No change may be made to a crew which has already raced in a heat of its event, except:
- (1) in the case of serious illness, or
 - (2) an accident
- and in either case a medical certificate shall be tendered to the Referee, and the Jury of that Regatta shall decide whether such change shall be permitted.
- 1.1.2 No substitute is permitted for a sculler except for a sculler in an Interstate Event.
- 4.8.3 Notwithstanding the provisions of Rules 4.8.1 and 4.9, the Competition Director shall have the discretion to approve an alteration to a crew provided appropriate proof is provided to show that such approval is in the best interests of the sport and the competitors.
- (1) In exercising the discretion in 4.9A (1) the Competition Director may take into account:
- (a) the availability of rowers from the Clubs involved in the crew as originally entered;
 - (b) the availability of competitors within similar age groups of the crew members as originally entered;
 - (c) doctors certificates (if appropriate);
 - (d) retention of the representation of the crew as identifiable with a Club or State;
 - (e) advice from the Jury (if appropriate);
 - (f) any other matter appropriate in the circumstances."

1.2 COMPOSITE CREWS

- 4.9.1 Clubs may, with the approval of their State Association, enter composite crews in Regattas held under the auspices of Rowing Australia, provided that:
- (a) Crews entered as a composite crew must have no less than 50% of their number, excluding the coxswain (if any), from the same Club;
 - (b) Not more than three (3) Clubs may be represented in a composite crew;
 - (c) All clubs represented in a composite crew shall come from the same State Association.
 - (d) Any crew change must comply with Rule 4.8.
- 4.9.2 (a) At the National Championships, competitors who are scholarship holders at the time of entry with the Australian Institute of Sport or any State Sport Institute or Academy may compete in crews comprised of competitors from the same Institute or Academy or in crews comprised of competitors from other Clubs from the State Association with which the competitors were affiliated at the time of taking up the scholarship, but they may not compete with any other Institute or Academy.

- (b) For the purposes of this Rule an “AIS Scholarship Holder” shall mean a current residential scholarship holder who has held such scholarship for a continuous period of four months before the date of commencement of the National Championships.
- (c) For the purposes of this Rule a “State Institute Scholarship Holder” or “Academy Institute Holder” shall mean a current scholarship holder who has held such scholarship for a continuous period of four months before the date of commencement of the National Championships.

Status rules

Rule 2.5 governs the status of competitors at all regatta is conducted under auspices of Rowing Australia. The following examples are supplied to assist in applying this rule to the 2004 regatta;

Under 17	Born on or after 1 Jan 1988
Under 19	Born on or after 1 Jan 1986
Youth	Born on or after 1 Jan 1984
Under 23	Born on or after 1 Jan 1982

A school competitor must qualify as a youth and be a full time student at the school. This also applies to coxswains of school crews. Members of school crews must be students of the same school.

THE WAY TO FINAL

Rowing six lane progression system

Racing for all Championship and non-Championship events will take place over six lanes using the six lane progression system.

Progression Rules

6 or less entries Final only

7 to 8 entries	Two preliminary heats and one repechage heat. Winner of each preliminary heat goes to the final, remainder go to the repechage. First four crews in the repechage heat go to the final.
9 to 12 entries	Two preliminary heats and two repechage heats. Winner of each preliminary heat goes to the final, remainder go to the repechage heats. First two crews in each repechage heat go to the final.
13 to 15 crews	Three preliminary heats, one repechage heat and two semi finals. First three crews in each preliminary heat go to the semi finals, the remainder go to the repechage. First three crews in the repechage go to the semi finals. First three crews in each semi final go to the final.
16 to 18 entries	Three preliminary heats, three repechage heats, two semi finals. Winner of each preliminary heat goes to the semi finals, remainder go to the repechage heats. First three crews in the repechage heats go to the semi finals. First three crews in each semi final go to the final.
19 to 24 entries	Four preliminary heats, four repechage heats, two semi finals. Winner of each preliminary heat goes to the semi finals, remainder go to the repechage heats. First two crews in each repechage heat go to the semi finals. First three crews in each semi final go to the final.
25 to 36 entries	Six preliminary heats, six repechage heats, two semi finals. Winner of each preliminary heat goes to the semi finals, remainder go to the repechage heats. Winner of each repechage heat goes to the semi final. First three crews in each semi final go to the final.
37 to 54 entries	Nine preliminary heats, nine repechage heats, three semi finals. Winner of each preliminary heat goes to the semi finals, remainder go to the repechage heats. Winner of each repechage heat goes to the semi finals. First two crews in each semi final go to the final.

Progression Rules for Selection Events

(Note that in addition to other selection events these progression rules will apply to the following under 23 championships—Men: U23M1x, U23ML1x, U23M2-, U23ML2-, Women: U23W1x, U23WL1x, U23W2-)

6 or less entries	Final A only
7 to 12 entries	Two preliminary heats, two finals. First three crews in each heat go to Final A, remainder to Final B
13 to 18 entries	Three preliminary heats, two semi finals, three finals. First four crews in each preliminary heat go to semi finals A/B, the remainder go to Final C. First three crews in each semi final go to the Final A, remainder go to Final B
19 to 24 entries	Four preliminary heats, four semi finals, four finals. First three crews in each preliminary heat go to semi finals A/B. remainder go to semi finals C/D. First three crews in semi finals A/B go to Final A, remainder from semi finals A/B go to Final B. First three crews in semi finals C/D go to Final C, remainder go to Final D.

BOAT TRAFFIC RULES

Power Boat Usage

- The course and lake shall be closed to all power boats except official craft.
- Rowing training accompanied by a power boat may be undertaken on the Goulburn River upstream of the Scour. The river is entered through the Scour adjacent to the boat launching lagoon.

Procedures for Boat Launching

- Launching area is from the beach directly in front of the boat racks on the southern side of the Furlong Cove.

Procedures for boat Landing

- Landing beach is on eastern side on Peninsula.

Boat Traffic Rules During Competition Period

- The 'warm up' area is a busy area, north of the course. Crews must move in a clockwise direction. Traffic travelling towards the start from launch area will pass to the north of the dead tree area to the northern end of the 'warm up' area.
- At the completion of races, crews must proceed along the returning lane between Lane 1 and the spectator area.
- For crews winning medals in final races, the beach with victory dais is in front of the spectator area.
- Once crews proceed into the start area they cannot return to the 'warm up' area, they can only proceed to the start.
- Crew wanting to 'warm up' may proceed to the 'warm up' area as if going to the start and return along the northern side of the course.

Boat Traffic Rules During Training Period

- On competition days the course will be closed for training from 45 minutes prior to the starting time for the first event. The course must be cleared in the next 15 minutes.
- During training periods the southern side of the course including lanes 5 to 8 will be for traffic moving towards the finish. The northern side of the course including lanes 1 to 3 will be for traffic moving towards the start line or boat rack area. Lane 4 will be vacant.
- Lane 4 will be closed to all crews.
- All rowing within the lanes on the course will be non-stop for 2000 metres. Crews practising starts or intending to stop along the length must train off course.
- Crews must turn beyond the finish line.
- Crossing the course will only be permitted in the area 100 metres from the starting platform.

All these traffic rules and rules of rowing are to protect and ensure the safety of all competitors. Any directions from marshals or safety boats must be obeyed and crews disobeying these directions will be referred to the Unpires' Jury for an appropriate penalty.

Disrow Training

The Organising Committee requests that all team managers, coaches and athletes show understanding,

consideration and care for disabled rowers during training periods.

As in the previous Australian Championships, disrow athletes will participate, continuing the integration programme.

Disrowers will be easily identified on water due to the specialised rowing craft and will be supervised during their training periods.

We ask for your consideration and care when meeting the disrowers on and off water.

Boat Stretchers

To avoid accidents arising from capsizing, all boats must be equipped with stretchers or shoes which allow competitors to get clear of the boat without using their hands and with least possible delay.

Thickness of Blades

Edges of blades must have a minimum thickness throughout as follows;

OARS	5 mm
SCULLS	3 mm

The thickness shall be measured 3 mm from the outer edge of the blade for oars and 2mm for sculls.

Bow Balls

The bows of all boats shall be fitted with a white ball 4 cm in diameter in soft rubber or similar material unless the bow is so constructed as to afford equivalent protection and visibility.

Notes on the weighing of boats

(1) Electronic Equipment

In order to simplify the weighing of boats RA does not require that wires and certain items of electronic equipment have to be removed from the boat during the weighing.

The following weight allowances will be made to the minimum weight:

For one speaker	0.15 kg
For the wiring	-8+ 0.60 kg
	-4's 0.40 kg
	-2's 0.20 kg
for one 'stroke coach' (wire and magnet)	0.10 kg

Any other type of electronic equipment, which is fixed in the boat, must be removed during weighing as there is no weight allowance available.

(2) Water

After the race the normal wetted surface of the boat is accepted but...

Any standing water must be removed before the weighing, particularly any water between the shoulders, under the canvas.

(3) Additional Weight

If it is necessary to add extra weight to the boat this must be positively fixed to the boat (nails, screws etc).

(4) Other Items

All other items (tools, cloth, sponges, drinking water bottles etc) must be taken out of the boat before the weighing.

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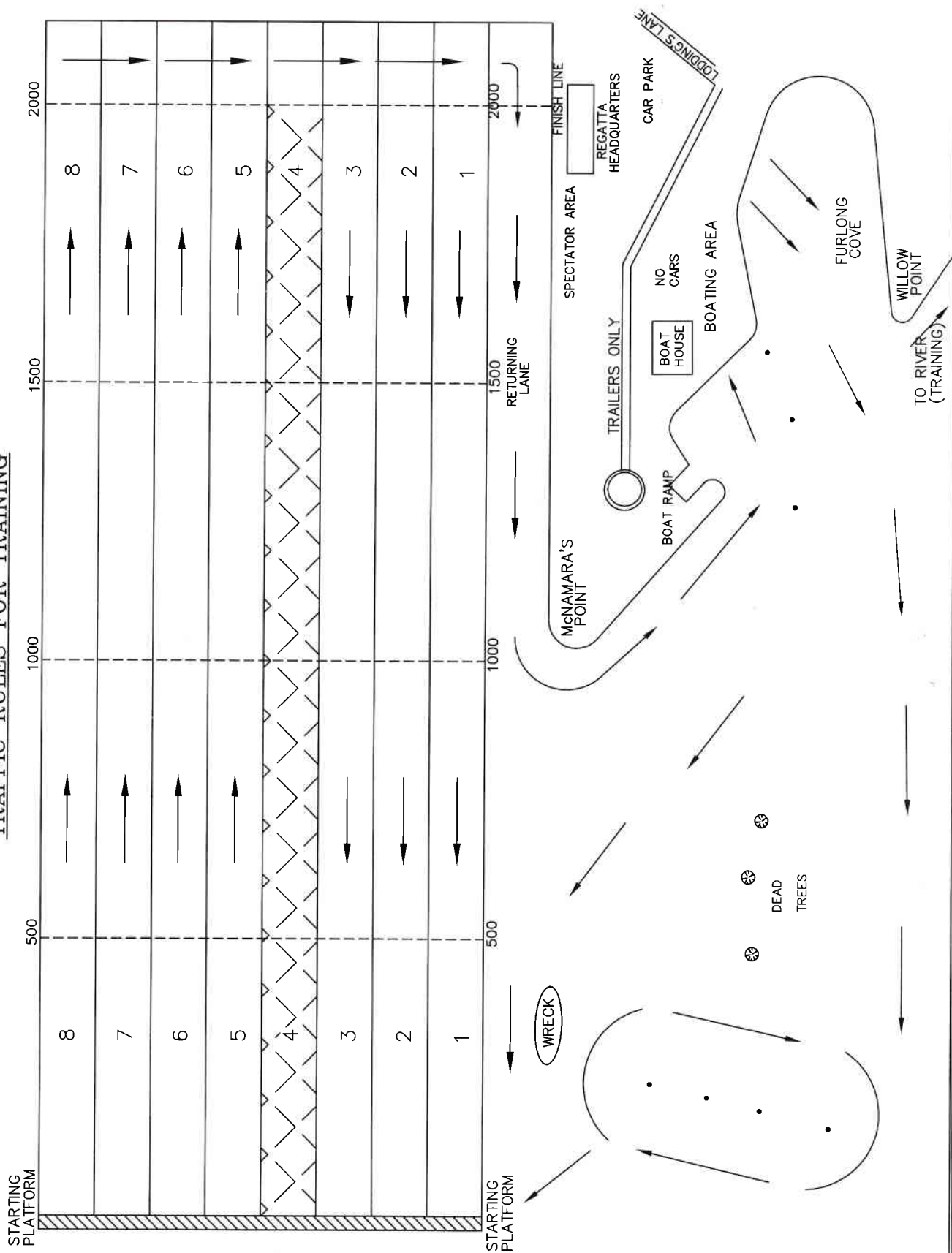
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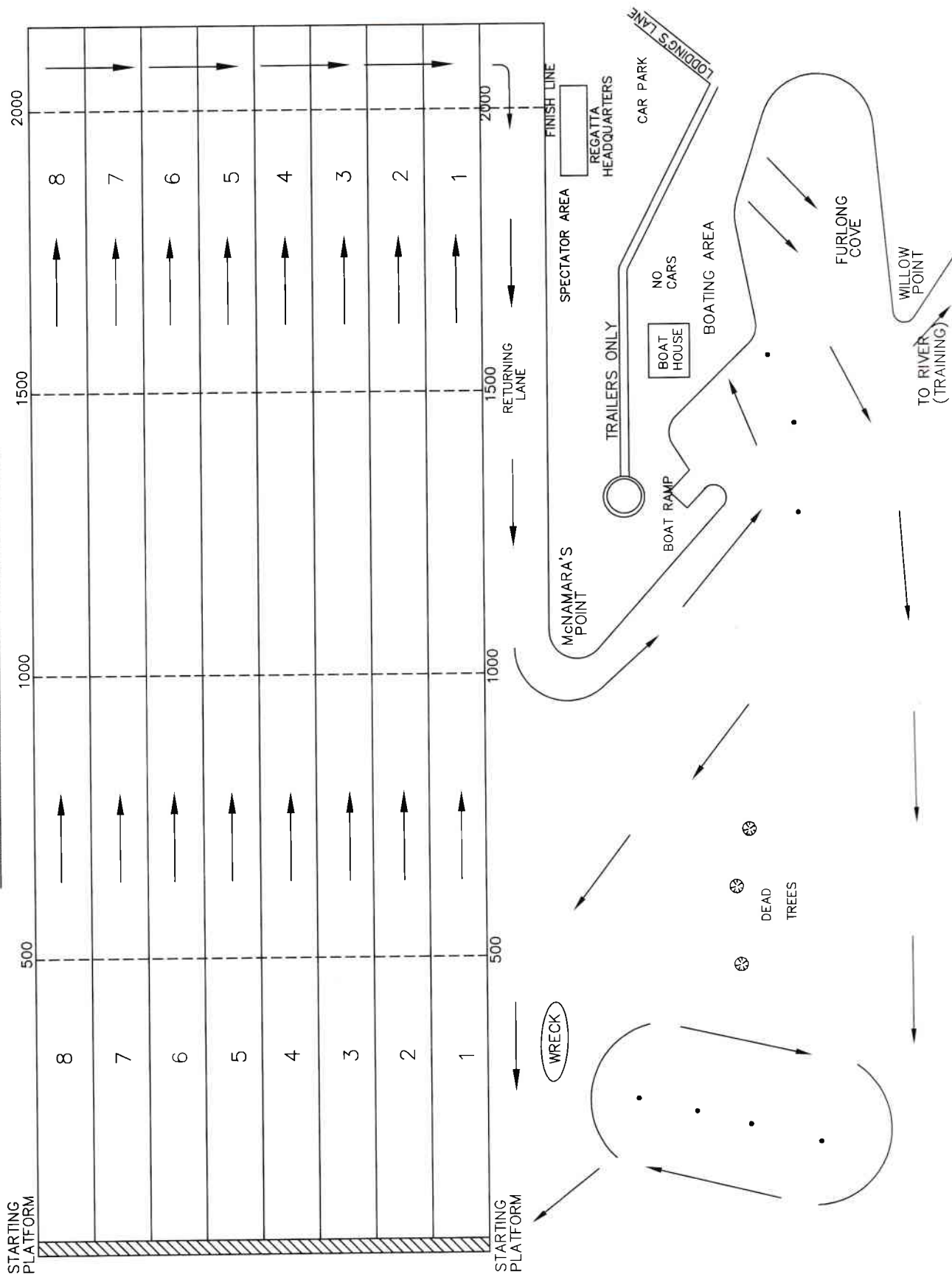
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NAGAMBIE LAKES ROWING COURSE TRAFFIC RULES FOR TRAINING

STATUS OF COMPETITORS

2.5.1 Rowers are divided into the following classes:

- (1) School
- (2) Under 17
- (3) Under 19
- (4) Under 21 (Youth)
- (5) Under 23
- (6) Open
- (7) Lightweight
- (8) Disrow.

2.5.2 A School competitor is one who:

- (1) Qualifies as Under 21 (Youth) under the provisions of these Rules; and
- (2) Is attending a secondary school as a full time day student.

This definition also applies to the coxswain of a School crew.

A rower ceases to be Under 17 on the 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age 16. This definition also applies to the coxswain of an Under 17 crew.

2.5.4 A rower ceases to be Under 19 on the 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of 18. This definition also applies to the coxswain of an Under 19 crew.

2.5.5 A rower ceases to be Under 21 (Youth) on the 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of 20. This definition also applies to the coxswain of an Under 21 (youth) crew.

2.5.6 A rower ceases to be Under 23 on the 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches

the age of 22. After that date he/she shall be classified as Open.

2.5.7 All rowers shall be eligible to compete in the Open category in the appropriate weight division.

2.5.8 School events are restricted to crews consisting of representatives of one school only.

2.5.9 No competitor may race for two different Clubs at the same regatta but a competitor may represent his/her State and his/her Club and his/her School at a regatta.

2.6.0 Adaptive or Disrow competitors:

(a) A Disrow competitor is a rower who qualifies in either of the following categories:

- (i) Able bodied with sensory impairment, intellectual impairment, head injury or similar;
- (ii) Physical disabled being a paraplegic, amputee. Cerebral Palsy, Spina bifida or similar;

(b) Disrow competitors shall be classified in both men's and women's events as either Senior or Youth within the meaning of these Rules.

(c) Events for Disrow competitors at the Australian Rowing Championships shall be conducted over 500 metre course in such categories as may be approved by the Board from time to time.

EVENT DESCRIPTION AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Event 1A: An adaptive fixed seat single scull raced over 500 metres.

This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull with pontoons unless all competitors are able to row without pontoons. To be eligible for the event an athlete must not be able to have use of their legs.

If there are sufficient entries there will be separate divisions for athletes with and without body swing. If insufficient entries for a separate division the competitor with the body swing would be strapped to prevent body swing and enable fairer competition.

A competitor in Event 1A is ineligible to compete in events 1B, 2A, 2B and 3B.

Separate men and women's divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 1B An adaptive sliding seat single scull raced over 500 metres.

This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull with pontoons unless all competitors are able to row without pontoons. The event is for a competitor who has the use of their legs, but is unable to handle a conventional single scull and is unable to compete over 1000 metres.

A competitor in Event 1B is ineligible to compete in events 1A, 2A, 2B and 3B

Separate men and women's divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 2A: An adaptive sliding seat single scull raced over 1000 metres.

This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull. Pontoons are optional. The event is for a competitor who has the use of their legs, is unable to handle a

conventional single scull but is able to compete of 1000 metres in an adaptive scull.

A competitor in Event 2A is ineligible to compete in events 1A, 1B, 2B and 3A

Separate men and women's divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 2B: A conventional single scull raced over 1000 metres.

This event to be rowed in a conventional single scull. A competitor in Event 2B is ineligible to compete in events 1A, 1B, 2A and 3A

Separate men and women's divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 3: A conventional double scull raced over 1000 metres.

Only athletes who are eligible to compete in event 2A or 2B are eligible for this event.

The athlete with a disability must row in the stroke position. The athlete in the bow position must be an eligible Masters rower, minimum age 27, who has not competed in state and national regattas at elite level for at least 12 months.

Separate men and women's divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event 64 (FISA) Mixed coxed four raced over 1000 metres.

This event is to be rowed in a conventional stern coxed four.

The crew must be made up of 50% male and 50% female.

Only athletes eligible for events 2A, 2B and 3 will be eligible to compete in this event.

ADAPTIVE EVENT DESCRIPTION AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Event: AD-M/F-FIX-1A

Description: An adaptive fixed seat single scull raced over 500 metres.

- This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull with pontoons unless all competitors are able to row without pontoons.
- To be eligible for the event an athlete must not be able to have use of their legs.
- If there are sufficient entries there will be separate divisions for athletes with and without body swing. If insufficient entries for a separate Division the competitor with the body swing would be strapped to prevent body swing and enable fairer competition.
- A competitor in event AD-M/F-FIX-1A is ineligible to compete in events AD-M/F-S1X-1B, AD-M/F-S1X-2A, AD-M/F-C1X-2B and AD-M/F-C2X-3.
- Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event: AD-M/F-S1X-1B

Description: An adaptive sliding seat single scull raced over 500 metres.

- This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull with pontoons unless all competitors are able to row without pontoons.
- The event is for a competitor who has the use of their legs, but is unable to handle a conventional single scull and is unable to compete over 1000 metres.
- A competitor in event AD-M/F-S1X-1B is ineligible to compete in events AD-M/F-FIX-1A, AD-M/F-S1X-2A, AD-M/F-C1X-2B and AD-M/F-C2X-3.
- Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event: AD-M/F-S1X-2A

Description: An adaptive sliding seat single scull raced over 1000 metres

- This event to be rowed in Hale type adaptive scull. Pontoons are optional.
- The event is for a competitor who has the use of their legs, is unable to handle a conventional single scull but is able to compete over 1000 metres in an adaptive scull.
- A competitor in event AD-M/F-S1X-2A is ineligible to compete in event AD-M/F-FIX-1A, AD-M/F-S1X-1B, or AD-M/F-C1X-2B.

- Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event: AD-M/F-C1X-2B

Description: A conventional single scull raced over 1000 metres.

- This event to be rowed in a conventional single scull.
- A competitor in Event AD-M/F-C1X-2B is ineligible to compete in events AD-M/F-FIX-1A, AD-M/F-S1X-1B, and AD-M/F-S1X-2A.
- Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event: AD-M/F-C2X-3

Description: A conventional double scull raced over 1000 metres.

- Only athletes who are eligible to compete in event AD-M/F-S1X-2A or AD-M/F-C1X-2B are eligible for this event.
- The athlete with a disability must row in the stroke position.
- The athlete in the bow position must be an eligible Masters rower, minimum age 27, who has not competed in state and national regattas at elite level for at least 12 months.
- Separate men and women's' divisions will be held if there are sufficient entries to make a race.

Event: AD-M/G-C4+-4

Description: A conventional stern coxed four raced over 1000 meters.

- Athletes with use of their legs, trunk and arms (4+LTA in FISA Classifications)
- Athlete disability to be one of the following:
 - Blind: 10% of vision (B3); obligatory use of blind mask according to the International Blind Sports Association (IBSA) classes
 - Amputee
 - a) one single foot amputation
 - b) 3 fingers hand amputee
 - Neurological impairment: causing loss of ankle flexion and extension
 - Cerebral palsy: CP8 (Cerebral Palsy International Sport and Recreation Association (CP-ISRA) classes
 - Intellectual impairment: International Sports Federation for Person with an Intellectual Disability (INAS) criteria

To ensure that you have a good season observe the regulations contained in the Marine Act and the Waterways By-laws. Details of regulations may be obtained through Parks Victoria or Rowing Victoria.

Tips for a safe time on the water:

- < **Keep to the right** side of the river or other vessels.
- < **Give way** to downstream vessels at bridges.
- < Avoid collisions by being **aware** and **considerate** of other vessels.
- < Use **lights** to be seen from sunset to sunrise.
- < Maintain **equipment**.
- < Be prepared, know **emergency contacts**.
- < Follow directions of **Parks Victoria** staff and **Water Police Officers**.

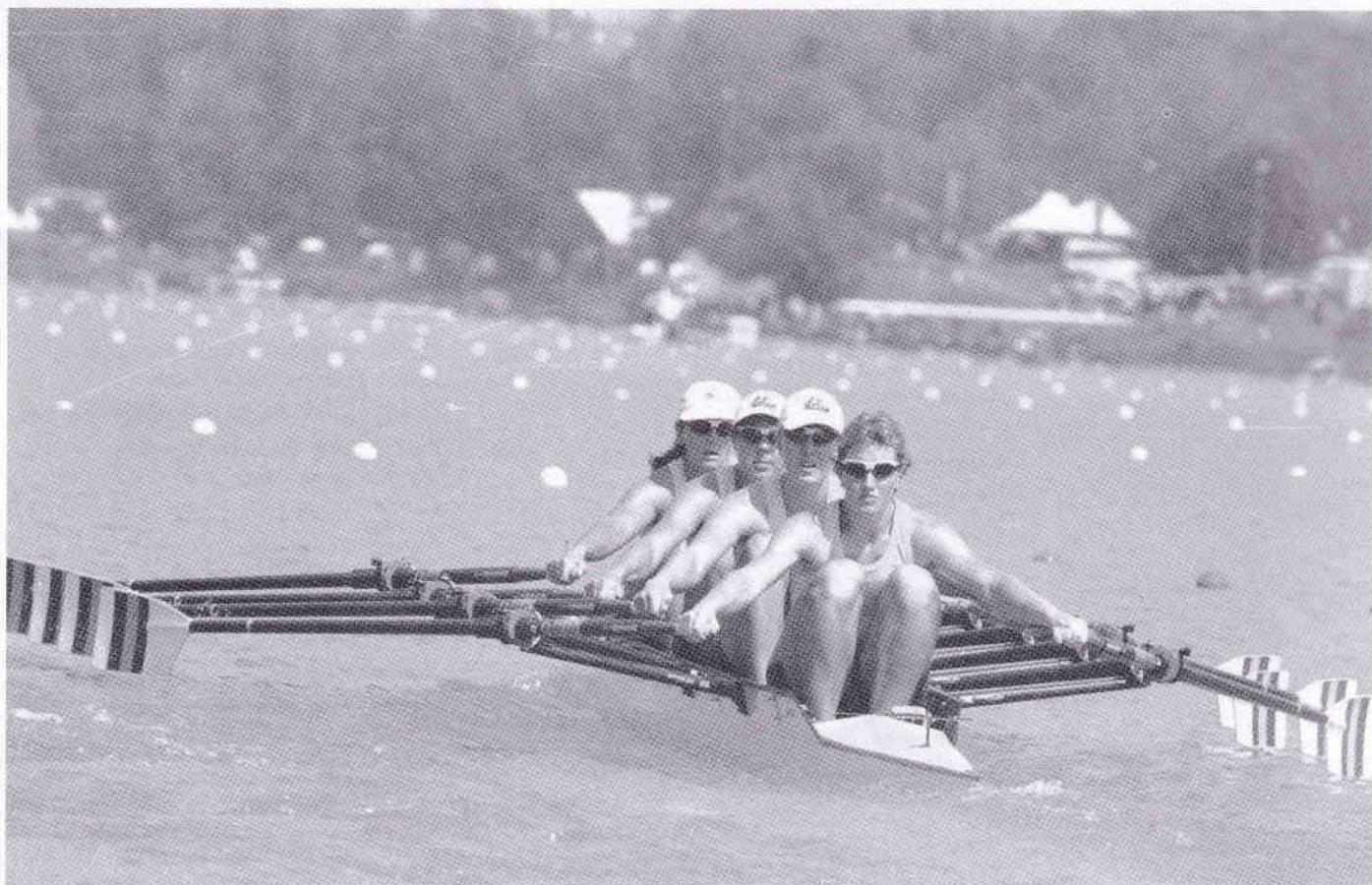

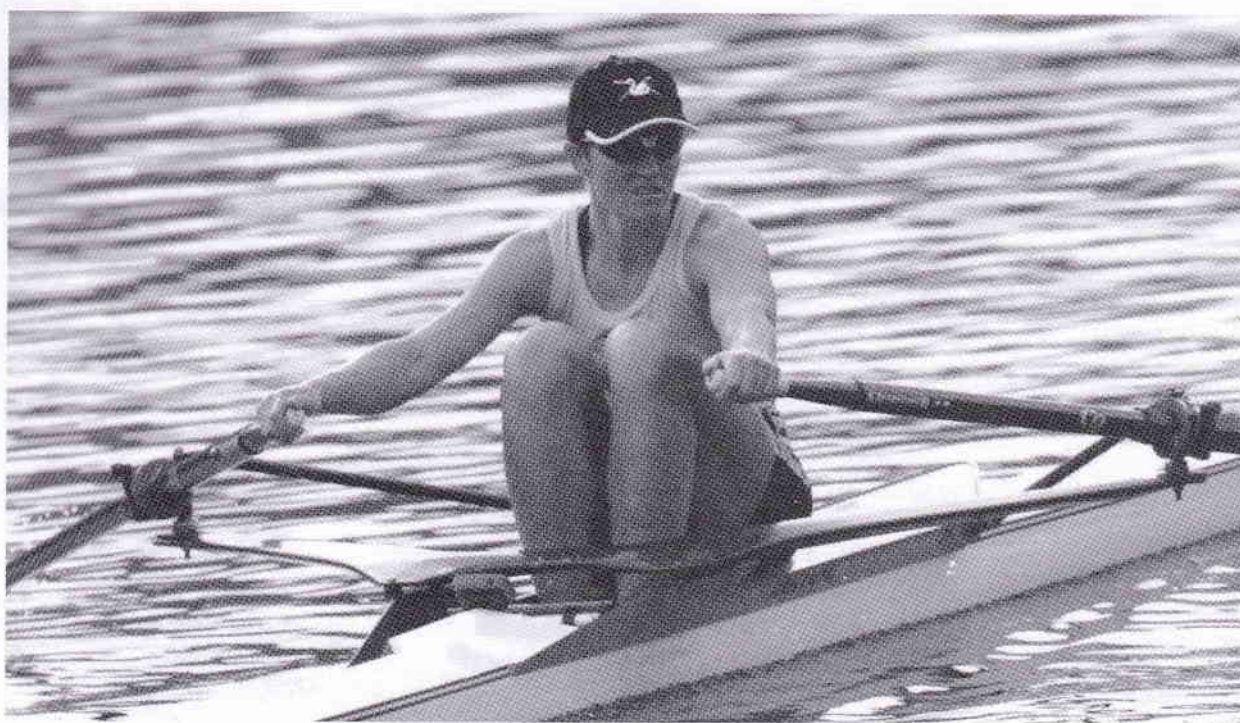

ROWING AUSTRALIA TROPHY LIST

INTERSTATE TROPHIES

ULVA Trophy (1920); Was originally designated for Women's coxed Four, then Coxless four and finally the Interstate Women's Eight in 1999. This trophy was presented by the United Licensed Victuallers Association of Queensland to the Australian Women's Rowing Council in 1920. The trophy (known as Bertha) was made of 200 silver guineas and is modelled on the figure of the winning stroke (Dorothy Arnold) of the South Australian Women's Coxed Four. The trophy is presented by the Governors wife.

Kings Cup (1921); This Cup was presented by King George to the Amateur Rowing Council of Australia in 1921 for the annual Interstate eight oared race for men. This Cup is presented by the Governor General (or nominee) to the stroke of the winning crew. Special medallions to be struck are the Kenny medals, which can be presented by the RA President and/or Event Sponsor to members of the winning.

President's Cup (1926); Interstate Men's single scull. This Cup was presented by Mr E.C. Watchorn who was the first President of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council and also a trustee of the George Adams Estate (Tattersall's) who donated the Cup for the Interstate Single Sculling Championships. This Trophy is presented by the President of Rowing Australia.

Penrith Cup (1958); Interstate Men's lightweight coxless four. This Cup was presented by the Penrith City Council to the Amateur Australian Rowing Council in 1958 for the Men's lightweight coxless four. This trophy is presented by the Mayor of Penrith (or nominee). Special medallions are struck and presented to each member of the winning crew.

Nell Slatter Trophy (1963); Interstate Women's single scull. This trophy was donated by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association to the Australian Amateur Women's Rowing Council for the Interstate Women's single scull. This Trophy is presented by an Event sponsor or stakeholder.

Victoria Cup (1968); Interstate Women's lightweight quad. This Cup was presented by the Victorian Ladies Rowing Association to the Australian Women's Rowing Council for the Interstate lightweight four oared race. It was later changed to the Interstate lightweight quad. The Trophy is presented by an Event sponsor or stakeholder.

Noel Wilkinson Trophy (1974); Interstate Men's youth eight. This trophy was instigated by the Australian Rowing Council and a trophy was donated by Noel Wilkinson for the Interstate youth eight oared championship. This Trophy, and medallions are presented by an Event Sponsor or stakeholder.

Bicentennial Trophy (1988); Interstate Women's youth eight. The Cup was presented to the Australian Rowing Council by the New South Wales Rowing Association in 1988 for the Women's Interstate Youth Fours race. This was later changed to be given to the Women's Interstate youth eight. This Trophy is presented by an Event Sponsor or stakeholder.

Zurich Cup (1999); Interstate point score. This Cup was presented by Zurich Financial Services to Rowing Australia in 1999 for the purpose of presenting to the winning state in the interstate point score. The Zurich Cup is one of only 500 in the world that were made from sands collected by Olympians from every Olympic country in the World. This Cup is presented by the most Senior Manager of Zurich to the President,

Chairman or Councillor of the winning State just after the announcement of the winners of the last race and Interstate pointscore determination.

Governors General Plate (1999); Interstate Women's eight. This plate was presented by the Governor General to Rowing Australia in 1998 (raced in 1999) for the Interstate women's eight oared race. The Cup is presented by the Governor General (or nominee). In addition to this the U.L.V.A. Trophy is issued to the winning crew. This trophy can be issued by the female partner of the Event Sponsor.

Queen Elizabeth 2nd Cup (2001); To be designated. This Cup was sought by the Brisbane Boys College to commemorate success in the Henley Regatta in a Schoolboys eight race. The Queen supported the designation for an International Schoolboys Eight Race to be conducted annually in Australia. The Board, and Council, are yet to designate the Cup.

Special note: During each Interstate Race either the RA President, or his wife/partner will accompany guest presenters on the dias.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS TROPHIES

Herald and Weekly Times Trophy (1968); This trophy was presented to the Women's Junior Coxed Four (presently known as the Women's Under 19 Coxed Four). This trophy is presented by an Event sponsor or stakeholder.

Herald and Weekly Times Cup (1968); Championships Women's senior 'A' lightweight single scull. This trophy is presented by an Event sponsor or stakeholder.

Carlton and United Brewing Plate (1968); Women's National Senior pair oared Championship. This plate is presented by an Event Sponsor or stakeholder.

Lucern Cup (1974); A Cup donated to Rowing Australia for the National Championships Senior 'A' Men's lightweight coxless four race. This trophy was awarded by Colin Smith representing the first Australian lightweight crew to win a world championship medal. A member of this crew or their nominee present the Trophy and medallions.

Florence Eaton Trophy (1982); Championships women's senior 'A' eight. This trophy is presented by an Event sponsor or stakeholder.

Australian Union of Old Oarsman Trophy (1982); Championships senior 'B' Men's Eight (currently known as Men's Under 23 eight). This trophy is presented by a representative of the host state Old Oarsmen.

Barrington Cup (1984); The Barrington Cup was designated as the Championships Schoolboy Eight race. This trophy was donated by the Tasmanian Rowing Council to the Australian Rowing Council. In 2000 and 2001 the Trophy was designated to the Eight Oared Schoolgirls race of Australia.

This Cup is now in limbo due to a complication of the Queens Cup designation.

Thomas Keller Memorial Trophy (1990); Championships Men's Under 19 Single scull. This trophy was presented by the Tasmanian Rowing Council to Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1990 for the Championships Junior 'A' single scull. The trophy is presented by the most senior FISA representative at the event.

BOB BLAKE PERPETUAL SHIELD

The shield was donated by 'Freedom on the River' the Western Australian disabled rowing group and contested for the first time in 2001. It is awarded to the State earning the most points overall in the adaptive rowing events at the Australian National Rowing Championships. Points are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd placed rowers and the total points divided by the total number of entries per State.

The Shield is named for Bob Blake who has worked for disabled rowing nationally as well as in his home state of Tasmania since 1989. Bob's contribution and commitment to disabled rowing is immense.

HISTORY OF THE NELL SLATTER TROPHY

Dating back to 1901 at the great Federation Regatta staged on Albert Park Lake, Cassie Wooly McRitchie representing Victoria and using a skiff loaned to her by the then Governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, defeated her challenger from Sydney, Elizabeth Messenger, and was presented with a magnificent pearl and ruby bracelet by the Duke of Gloucester. So great was the public interest in the female scullers that police were required to keep the inquisitive spectators at bay. At the great age of 96 she passed away in 1973, and will for all time be remembered as the founder of the first all women's rowing club at Albert Park in 1907. Classic McRitchie is justifiably known as the "mother" of Victorian women's rowing.

First introduced in 1963 at Brisbane, the Women's Interstate Single Sculling Championship has continued as an annual event for which the Nell Slatter Trophy, presented by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association as a tribute to the then President, is the perpetual trophy.

HISTORY OF THE PRESIDENT'S CUP

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President Mr.E.C.Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersall's Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the late A.A. Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian Olympians have been the holders of this trophy. The records of R.H. (Bob) Pearce, holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medallist in 1928 and 1932, his cousin C.A.(Cecil) Pearce, four times holder and M.T.(Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic Gold, Silver and Bronze Medallist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively and all representing New South Wales are well known

HISTORY OF THE VICTORIA CUP

At the first Women's Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship contested on the Yarra River in Melbourne, a victory was recorded by Victoria with a crew stroked by one of Australia's best known oarswomen, Margaret Agnew Mackenzie, whose efforts in negotiating with the Women's Rowing Council secured lightweight rowing as an annual event on the women's Interstate rowing programme. The Victoria Cup, presented by the Victorian Ladies 'Rowing Association, is the perpetual trophy for this event.

Lightweight women have recorded International victories, the first being at the inaugural competition between the United States of America, Canada and Australia at St. Catherines, Canada, in 1979, when Australia was successful in the two events for which crews were entered - Lightweight Four with Cox and Lightweight Pair with Cox.

HISTORY OF THE PENRITH CUP

The introduction of the Interstate Lightweight four-oared Championship in 1958 for oarsmen then weighing not more than 140 lbs, and for which the Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy, laid the foundation for this class of rowing in Australia.

The weight limit for lightweight competitors in Australia has varied from time to time between the States, however, since 1974, the year which heralded the first F.I.S.A. Lightweight Championship at which Australia recorded a Gold medal victory, the Internationally accepted lightweight limits have been adopted nationally.

HISTORY OF THE NOEL F. WILKINSON TROPHY

Recognising the necessity to introduce a class of rowing in which Australian Youth oarsmen could compete, the Australian Rowing Council initiated the Interstate Youth Eight-oared Championship at an age limit some eighteen months older than the Internationally accepted Junior age limit. The first Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974, and in that same year, the Council accepted the offer by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event.

Junior (age limit) events for other classes of boats now forming part of the National Regatta programme now collectively fulfil the purposes originally envisaged by both the Council and the Donor, namely, an incentive to young oarsmen to continue in the sport subsequent to completion of their secondary education by providing acceptable competition at a National level and foster their development into higher classifications.

HISTORY OF THE U.L.V.A. TROPHY

Presented by the United Licenced Victuallers Association of Queensland to the Australian Women's Amateur Rowing Council in 1920, and affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as "Bertha", this handsome sterling silver trophy crafted in London depicts Dorothy Arnold Ekins, the petite girl from Mannum, holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb of her day.....floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers !!!

Dorothy, a lightweight by today's standards, along with three other members of her home club and representing South Australia, won the first Women's Interstate Four-oared Championship from New South Wales and Queensland in a time of 4 minutes 55 seconds.

HISTORY OF THE KING'S CUP

First won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Regatta held on 2nd to 4th July of that year, this handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race for that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful A.I.F. No. 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914 -18 War.

The successful crew comprising Sgt. A.A. Robb, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas), 11st 10lb, Bow: Lieut. F.A. House, Derwent Rowing Club (Tas), 11st 12lb, 2; Liet. T. McGill, Leichhardt Rowing Club (N.S.W.), 12st 10lb, 3; Gunner A.V. Scott, Murray Bridge Rowing Club (S.A.), 13st, 4; Lieut. H. Hauenstien, M.M., Leichhardt & Balmain Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st 9lb, 5 Major S.A.Middleton, D.S.O., Glebe & Sydney Rowing Clubs (N.S.W.), 13st 6lb, 6; Gunner G.W. Nettam, West Australian Rowing Club (W.A.), 11st 12lb, 7; Captain H.C. Disher, Melbourne University Boat Club (Vic), 11st 11lb, Stroke; Sgt A.E. Smedley, Sydney Rowing Club (N.S.W.)Cox, defeated the A.I.F. No. 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds, the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and United States

The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian Military Authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the Australian War Museum. On 14th May, 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Association held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual Trophy for the Australian Eight-oared Championship. This request was refused, and on 12th October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup, with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association, and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30th October, 1920, and signed by Captain H.C. Disher, was sent to his Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy. A reply dated 13th May, 1921, received from the Secretary of State for

the Colonies, Mr Winston Churchill, stated that "His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Race of Australia".
