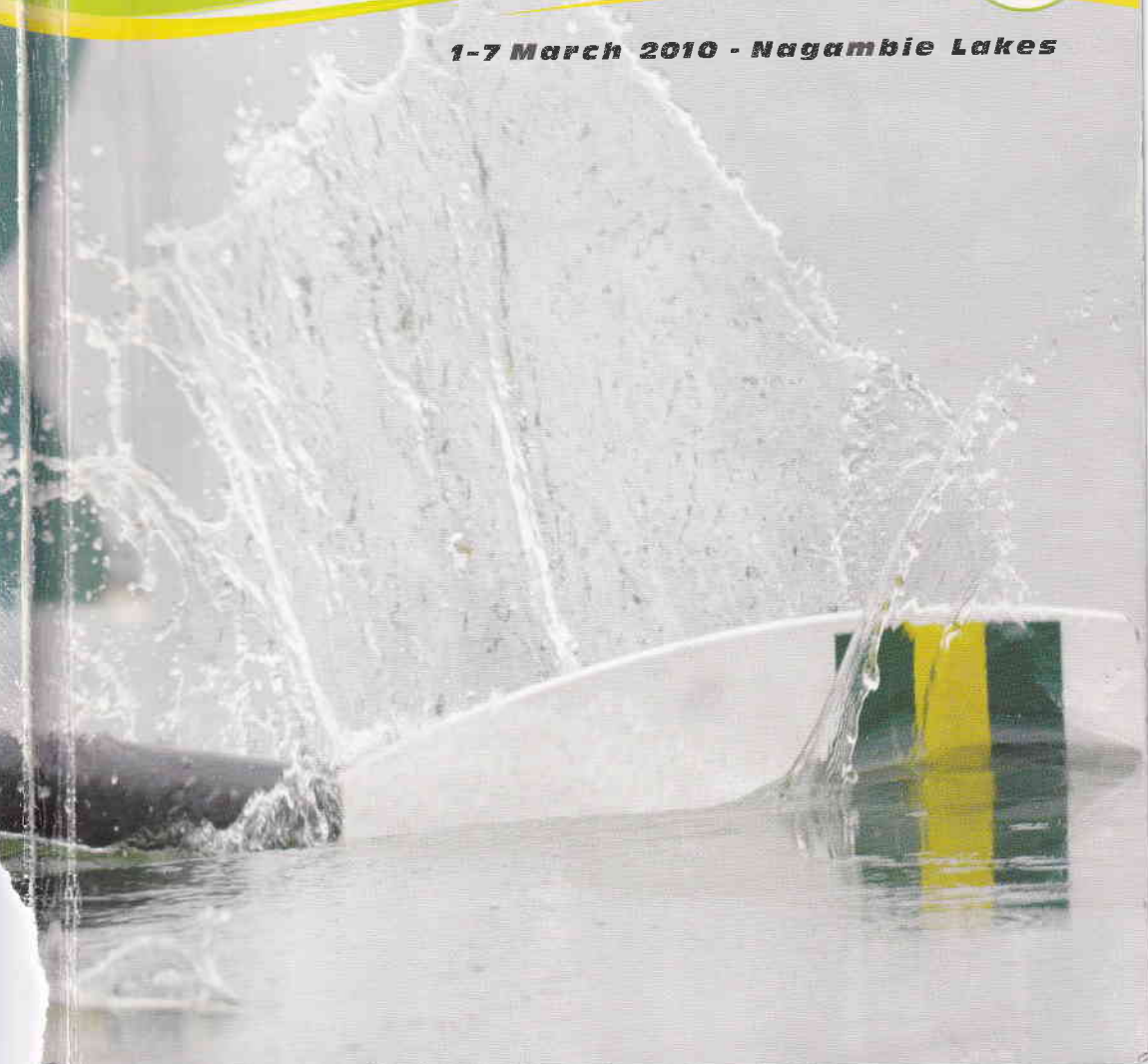

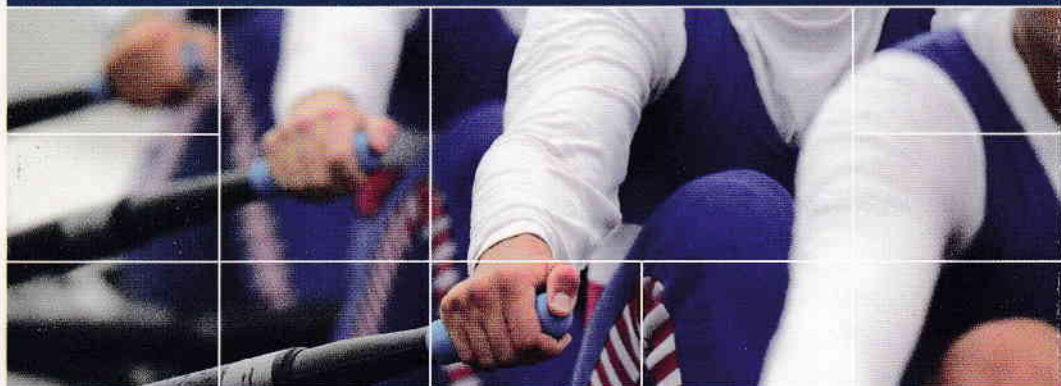

Australian Rowing Championship Medallions

Rowing Australia is delighted to uphold the prestige of the Interstate Regatta by continuing to present quality medallions befitting of such esteemed and distinguished competition.

As in 2009, winners of the women's events of the Interstate Regatta will be awarded with medallions individually designed for their specific event and all winners of Interstate races will receive medallions of the highest quality.



Interstate M8+

The Kenny Medal is awarded to winners of the King's Cup which crews have competed for since 1921 as well as the Interstate Men's Single Scull which scullers have been competing for since 1926.



Interstate W8+

This medallion will be awarded for the first time to winners of the Queen's Cup. Queen Elizabeth II provided her consent for this trophy in 2003.



Interstate Youth M8+

This medallion is awarded to winners of the Interstate Men's Youth Eight and carries the name of Noel F Wilkinson who provided the original trophy for the event in 1974.



Interstate Youth W8+

This medallion will be awarded for the first time to winners of the Bicentennial Cup for racing between Interstate Women's Youth Eights. The Cup was first presented by NSWRA in 1988.



Interstate ML4-

The Penrith Cup was first presented by the Penrith City Council in 1958 and was the pinnacle of a lightweight oarsman's career until FISA introduced lightweight rowing in 1974.



Interstate W1x

This medallion will be awarded for the first time to winners of the Nell Slatter Trophy for Women's Interstate Sculling which has been raced annually since 1963.



Interstate WL4x

This medallion will be presented for the first time to winners of the Interstate Women's Quad Scull. This race was first contested in 1968 with the perpetual trophy being presented by the Victorian Ladies' Rowing Association.



Common Reverse

This common reverse will form the back of all medals presented and features the names of all seven States competing in the Interstate Championships. This design will feature for the first time during this years event.

The Origins of Rowing Victoria

Rowing Victoria is one of the first rowing associations ever created in the world. It was established in 1876 to manage the Melbourne Regatta which evolved into the Melbourne Henley regatta, act a Parliament for the many Victorian clubs and select representative crews. The rules adopted were drafted by John Hood later Mr Justice Hood, and the principles behind those rules survived for well over 100 years.

Prior to the Association being formed, the business of the Clubs was managed by the Melbourne Regatta Committee. Until 1979, the men's and women's associations were separate. The women's association was formed in about 1920 and actively participated in the national body from 1921.

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Fenner and Yates inducted as life members

David Yates and Barbara Fenner have been admitted as life members of Rowing Australia, joining the eight previously inducted members.

Both David and Barbara have made a significant contribution to Australian rowing and are worthy recipients of the accolade.

David has established himself as one of Australia's longest serving national selectors, completing his 17th season in 2009, having initially sat on his first selection panel in 1989. David trained and worked as a scientist and introduced a new level of analysis and rigor around selections which played a large role in producing an era of great success. He has passed on these analysis skills to many other selectors and so enhanced the sport's ability to maintain our success. He and his fellow selectors have also selected some masterful crews which surprised many in our sport. For example the selection of Peter Antonie and Steve Hawkins in the double scull for 1992 Barcelona Games was an inspired choice despite their size. The selection of their coach one of the toughest decisions that they had to make.

As a coach he was successful in guiding Peter Antonie to a gold medal in the men's lightweight single in 1986 at the World Championships, while in 1988, he presided over the men's quad scull and men's single scull at the Olympic Games in Seoul.



David was also the national assistant team manager for the 1991 World Championships and has been the coach of numerous winning scullers in the President's Cup and national regattas.

Barbara competed in the women's eight for Australia at the 1978 World Championships in New Zealand but has also been heavily involved in the coaching and administration of the sport over the past 30 years.

She was the national team manager at the 1984 World Championships, the Assistant Manager in 1985 and then an established coach of Australian crews between 1987 and 1995. She coached the Australian

women's lightweight four to a silver medal at the 1988 World Championships and the junior men's coxless four to bronze in 1994.

Barbara has been a selector at both junior and under 23 level for Australia, and was a selector for the Senior A team for the first time in 2009. She was the RA National Director of Coach Education from 1997–2002, has been a member of the FISA Youth Commission, as well as the General Manager of the South Australian Rowing Association. Her achievements and contribution to the sport are enormous.

Rowing Australia would like to congratulate both Barbara and David and look forward to their continued association with the sport in future years.

Special Thanks

The Australian Rowing Community thanks Pat McNamara

The Honourable Pat McNamara retired as Rowing Australia President in November last year, ending a nine year term which transformed both the Rowing Australia organisation and the broader Australian rowing community.

Pat came to the Rowing Australia Presidency in November 2000 following a successful career in state politics, including a seven year stint as Deputy Premier of Victoria, and from his very first involvement began building his remarkable legacy for the sport.

Pat's list of achievements during his time as President are outstanding and are one of the primary reasons that Rowing Australia is in such a strong and successful position. Pat's political acumen enabled him to form excellent working relationships with the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Olympic Committee and the Australian Paralympic Committee, all of which have contributed to the prominent position that Rowing Australia now enjoys in the Australian sporting landscape.

Pat was central to the restructuring and streamlining of Rowing Australia, firstly in instigating the governance review that resulted in the conversion of RA to a Company Ltd by Guarantee and more recently in establishment of the National Rowing Centre of Excellence, the joint venture between Rowing Australia and the Australian Institute of Sport.

Additionally, Pat has played a vital part in improving Rowing Australia's standing and reputation within both the Australian and International rowing communities.

In 2008 he was the driving force in establishing the Coalition of Australian Olympic Sports (CAOS) featuring the major Olympic sports; Swimming, Athletics, Cycling, Canoeing and Sailing in preparing a submission to the Independent Sport Panel Review. Pat has also developed effective and prominent relationships with both FISA and core Commonwealth

rowing nations, including a term as President of the Commonwealth Rowing Association from 2001-2005, emphasising his commitment to rowing beyond the boundaries of Australia.

Domestically, Pat has also played a vital role in improving the rowing infrastructure throughout the country, most notably through his central role in the construction of the Nagambie Lakes rowing course, but equally in his advocacy of the courses at West Lakes (SA) and

Champion Lakes (WA).

Rather than reducing his involvement in rowing since his retirement from the Rowing Australia Presidency, Pat has thrown himself into a prominent role with the recently established Oceania Rowing Confederation (ORCON), ensuring that his knowledge and experience are not lost to the rowing community.

The Australian rowing community thanks Pat for his incredible service and dedication as President of Rowing Australia and wish him the all the best for his future endeavours.



The Australian Rowing Community thanks Stephen Hinchy

Dr Stephen Hinchy is a name synonymous with Australian rowing but unfortunately it is a name that will be missing from the 2010 Australian Rowing Championships following his retirement as a Boat Race Official (BRO) earlier this year.

Stephen has been a central figure at regattas around Australia since 1964 when he became a Queensland BRO. Six years later he received his Australian Amateur Rowing Council BRO status and over the last 40 years he has established himself as one of Australia's senior most racing officials. During this time he has only missed one Australian Rowing Championships, a true signal of his dedication to Australian rowing.

Stephen's rowing achievements however don't stop in the official's boat. He commenced rowing in 1957 with Brisbane State High School and Commercial Rowing Club, winning several state titles in both the men's four and men's eight. He also represented Queensland in the King's Cup in 1962.

As part of Queensland rowing, Stephen has acted as QARC Treasurer (1965-69), QARC Chairman (1969-71, 1987-93), QARC Deputy Chairman (1982-83), Rowing Queensland Chairman (1993-96) Rowing Queensland President (2001, 2006) and has been the Team Doctor for the Queensland Rowing Team on numerous occasions.



At the National level, Stephen was President of Rowing Australia from 1996-2000 and has been an RA councilor several times in the last two decades.

Stephen's dedication and achievements within the rowing community speak for themselves and have resulted in a number of deserved accolades. He

received an OAM for Services to Sport in 1997 and has also been awarded Life Membership of Rowing Australia, Rowing Queensland and the Commercial Rowing Club.

Outside of rowing Stephen has completed six sports medicine courses, is a registered Pharmacist (1971) and medical practitioner (1977) and is a Level 2 sports trainer.

Dr Stephen Hinchy has dedicated a lifetime and more to the development of rowing in Queensland and Australia.

Steve has given tirelessly to the development of the sport in Queensland and Australia and has dedicated much of his spare time to

officiating, administration and management of rowing locally and nationally.

The entire Australian rowing community congratulates and deeply thanks Stephen for his 40 plus years of service to the sport we all love and recognises that future Australian Rowing Championships will be the poorer for his absence.

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Nationals Report

Noel Donaldson AIS/National Head Coach, Men

With the National Rowing Centre of Excellence not quite 18 months young there has been much excitement amongst the elite athletes creating a truly competitive national environment. Almost all of the top group of athletes have been together on camps in late 2009 and again in January 2010. Although there is a much greater alignment of training philosophies across the country the National Championships will be the first real test of where each athlete's current racing status lies. I'm pleased to offer an insight into possible performance standards and wish David Colin well with his tips! The main focus will be on pair oared and single scull events as these are the events that mainly lead to the next round of National Selection in April.

At the time of writing the final entries have not been received so apologies if the band of coaches re-align the racing entries of their athletes.

Lightweights:

Both the men and the women have seen much greater numbers in their squads with the return of some Olympians and former World Champion athletes.

Girls:

The 2009 World Championship 6th placed double scull of Bronwen Watson (SUBC) and Alice McNamara (MUBC) know too well that they have contenders in the form of the returning Tara Kelly (UQBC), 2007 quad World Champ; the dynamic duo from Tamar Carly Cottam and Ingrid Fenger, both world champs. Last year's number 3 Maja Fiddler (Torrens) is another to keep them honest. A special mention must be made of Hannah Every-Hall (Noosa), mother of two littlies, who on her comeback trail has also been close to top of the bunch. The former world quad champ wants to go to London in 2012. Quietly looming is Miranda Bennet (Baxter) (UTS) also from the original quad champs – sounds like we must have won that event a few times with no less than 7 competing at the Nationals. And yes the rumours are true that 2008 Olympian and former double world champion Marguerite Houston is just back from Ireland and already stirring it up in Queensland. There is absolutely no chance of anyone picking the final 6 in this group.

The South Australian domination of the interstate Victoria Cup quad race is over for the time being and the race remains open.

Boys:

Sam Beltz, Tom Gibson, Anthony Edwards, Todd Skipworth, Ben Cureton and Rod Chisholm the 6 Beijing Olympians will all compete. A coup in re-grouping the lighty men has occurred since the beginning of this season. With the National priority on the lightweight four almost all the top contenders will row in the pair and four. New father "A Rod" Chisholm will stay in the single while still on parenting duties but we expect to see a very competitive field of lightweight pairs. With a few niggling injuries and a balance of numbers to manage

across the states there may be a few late changes but we hope to see the WA boys take on the Tassie lads and a Victorian and Queensland pair aiming to cause some havoc. Cureton (Swan River) and Skipworth (Swan River) have plenty of past form but the returning Hawaiian ironmen may still need some rowing miles in their legs. They will be pushed by their training mates Ross Brown (Swan River) and Perry Ward (Swan River) both from the 2009 teams. The boys from over Bass Straight will line up with experienced Beltz (Lindisfarne) and Edwards (New Norfolk) whilst Tom Gibson (Huon) will partner Ali Foot (Tamar) who makes a serious move over from sculling in the 2009 team. Blair Tunevitsch (Tamar) is still trialling partners otherwise he'll give Chisholm a run for his money in the single and try his hand in the Tassie Penrith Cup crew. Victorians Tom Bertrand (Mercantile) and Angus Tyers (MUBC) from the 2009 world champs four will match any of the combinations on horsepower and they know Nagambie well. Although he'll spend some time in the hot tub Queenslander Michael McBryde (UQBC) is a world bronze medallist in this event (with Ross Brown) and we all know he'll aim to have his bow in front early. He'll be partnered by Darryn Purcell (Toowong) also from the 2009 world champs four. This event has had disappointing entries recently but now with the National interest the heats and finals will be action packed.

Watch out for the Penrith Cup on Sunday when the WA and Tassie rivalry resumes chased by the Queenslanders and the Vics.

Heavyweights:

Girls:

Try picking the form here. The main focus early this season has been on the girls sculling but in recent times a group returning from the 2008 Beijing eight have been back with one oar in their hands.

In the sculling group we expect that Pip Savage (Commercial) and Sally Kehoe (SUBC) will continue their competitiveness at the head of the field. They were 4th in the 2009 World Champs double scull and have impressive resume's. Returning from the Beijing quad is Kerry Hore (New Norfolk) and as each week goes by Kerry gets closer to the top girls. Perhaps on a slower returning path is former National Champion Amber Bradley (ECU), also from the Beijing quad, but her experience will see her compete with the current top girls. 2009 sweep rowers Kim Crowe (MUBC), the current National Team captain and her former partner Sarah Cook (SUBC) have made excellent transitions to the scull and should work their way into final contention. Although their form has been a bit spasmodic in the lead up former world champion double scullers Brooke Pratley (SUBC) and Liz Kell (SUBC) will add spice to this excellent field. Making the final will be a tough call and some girls with good pedigrees will have to miss out.

In the sweep group the standouts in the pairs will be new

mum Sarah Tait (Mercantile) and Sarah Heard (MUBC) and assuming they keep up their form in State trials Pauline Frasca (Mercantile) and Phoebe Stanley (MUBC) will be more than honest having recently completed huge personal best ergometer testing results. Former pairs silver medallist Natalie Bale is trying to settle a combination and she will also be competitive in this event. We can expect a spread from one end of the final field to the other with the National priority being on the pair oared event so the medals will be very keenly sought.

Without stealing David Colvin's predictions we should expect Victoria to continue its dominance in the Queens Cup, the interstate women's eight race.

Look out for some exciting talent in the Under age events. The 2009 Junior medallists have been mixing it with the seniors in training and should dominate the younger events. Jess Hall (Qld), Maddie Edmonds (Qld), Amy Fowler (ACT) and Alex Hagen (WA) are now training at the A.I.S. in Canberra to further enhance their competitive chances.

Boys (sweep):

With the Olympic and current world silver medallists in full training together in Victoria at the V.I.S., with Olympic Champion Duncan Free back and Sam Conrad, James Chapman and Tom Laurich returning from the Beijing eight the sweep group looks increasingly formidable. Added to this talent are the current A.I.S. group, many from the 2009 World Champs eight, to make sure a place in the men's pair final is very well earned. The current National Champions Cameron McKenzie-McHarg (MUBC) and James Marburg (MUBC) have new partners in Francis Hegerty (SUBC) and John Linke (Mercantile) respectively. We all remember their classic boat stopper from the last Nationals in Nagambie – maybe the reason for the change of partners! Duncan Free (UQBC) is training on the Gold Coast with new partner Sam Conrad (UQBC) and this combination of huge men will take some stopping. New dad Matty Ryan (SUBC – Olympic four) is rowing with business partner and housemate Fergus Pragnell (SUBC – 2009 eight) in a new combination. Young guns from the 2009 U23 team Josh Dunkley-Smith (Mercantile) and Nick Purnell (SUBC) have older and more seasoned partners in Tom Larkins (MUBC) and Sam Loch (SUBC). Larkins was 2nd in the pair last year and Loch continues his form from the 2008 and 2009 eights. Expect both these pairs to perform well. Pairing are last years 4 and 5 seats from the eight Tom Swann (Mercantile) and Bryn Coudraye (Adelaide). Coudraye returns after breaking his elbow from a bike fall. Brodie Buckland (SUBC) and Ned Kinnear (AUBC); Richard Allsop (SUBC) and Dominic Grimm (Sydney); Tom Laurich (Mosman) and James Chapman (UTS) round out a very elite field. Pick the final here – no chance!

Expect a huge emotional showdown between the titleholders New South Wales and Victoria in the interstate men's eight race for the Kings Cup. This will be an excellent way to end the Championships.

Boys (sculling):

When Rhett Ayliffe and John Driessen took on coaching the sculling group one of their aims was to ensure the scullers performed as well as the sweeps. On current form they are relatively equal and with medals in 2008 and 2009 they certainly succeeded in lifting the standard.

Headlining the group is David Crawshaw (Mercantile), the current National Team Captain and Beijing Gold medallist from the double scull. David has been in fine form in the Time Trials and he will be hard to beat. His 2009 Silver Medal quad crewmates in Daniel Noonan (Mosman), Nick Hudson (SUBC) and Jared Bidwell (UQBC) will continue to put heat on him. New to the sculling field this year is Beijing reserve sweeper Karsten Forsterling (MUBC). The Victorian stalwart is in excellent form in all trialing and testing and is aiming to seriously take on the "hot shots". James McRae (Murray Bridge) and Chris Morgan (AUBC) from the 4th placed Beijing quad and current world best time holders have had quieter 2009's to get ready for the 2010 assault. McRae studied and helped the U23's win bronze and Morgan worked and did serious aerobic training. Their current ergometer test results will put them more at the top of this field. Danjels Reedman (St George), the 2009 reserve is over his back injury and this boat is one of his best. Also from the Beijing quad is Brendan Long (Tamar) who has had a string of injuries and if he gets to the start he will have done well.

Look out later on – Dr Scott Brennan (Gold Medal 2x Beijing) is back in full training and will aim for team selection in April. The Tasmanian medico is now based at the A.I.S. and wants to repeat in London.

David Crawshaw has overlooked the Victorian Kings Cup to focus his State intentions on the Presidents Cup and more points for Victoria. Dan Noonan wants to repeat in the Kings Cup which will open the door for the remaining NSW athletes to take on David on Sunday. SA will be well represented and Bidwell will fly an honest Queensland flag.

We'll all be excited to see some great racing and how well the athletes manage what often are challenging conditions in Nagambie. Often it is a war of attrition as the finals of all boats are at the end of a tough week. Good racing to all competitors.

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Progress to 2012 Olympic Games

London's Calling...

The Olympic Games 2012 are approaching fast and I am getting more excited by the day with how far high performance rowing in Australia has come and ultimately what we can achieve both in London 2012 and beyond.

Rowing Australia's vision is to be Australia's leading Olympic sport and our goal is to achieve sustainable medal winning performances at Olympic and Paralympic Games. The National Rowing Centre of Excellence has now been in operation for about 18 months and is aiming at making these visions reality.

For those of you who may be unfamiliar with the NRCE, it is the joint venture between Rowing Australia and the Australian Institute of Sport, tasked with driving high performance rowing in Australia. It has been a remarkably seamless evolution to date and an exciting coming together of experienced, capable and passionate people. Likewise across Australia I am impressed with the quality of people operating within rowing environments and supporting high performance structures. I have witnessed a real openness and willingness to contribute and adapt to our new direction. With the above in mind, I personally can see no reason why Australia cannot be the leaders of world rowing that we aspire to be.

In London we will be focused on achieving gold medal performances. This will not be easy and we have already been strategically working through each category to ensure we give ourselves the best chances of success. A key ingredient in the strategy will be a truly National approach to the development of the top athletes right across Australia with all coaches and state programs working together to ensure our Olympic and Paralympic teams are clearly filled with the best people.

Our performances in London 2012 are critical, however of equal importance is our drive to build a national high performance rowing system that can stand the test of time – systematically building Olympic and Paralympic gold medal winning boats. To achieve this we need an effective integration and utilisation of all available HP resources across Australia. Every part of the system must be built with the “do it once, do it right” principle, carefully considering how all the pieces fit together.

We must remain focused on the things that truly make up world leading programs – quality athletes, quality coaches, quality sports science and medicine, topped off with quality support structures.

At the NRCE we have been working exceptionally hard to put these structures in place from talent identification and elite development through to the pointy end of the Senior A program. The focus for 2010 will be to complete the final pieces of the puzzle and continue to polish things to ensure we are extracting as much from the system as possible. We are building the system to last and are striving to provide a program with integrity, stability and certainty that will allow everyone to operate with clarity and confidence.

This cannot be done without strong partners and the necessary support structures. I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge our key partners: the Australian Sports Commission, whose assistance is vital to our future success; the Institutes and Academies across Australia and their commitment and expertise; Sykes Racing and Croker Oars for their generous support of the Australian Under 23 and Junior Teams. Also, I would like to sincerely thank the NRCE leaders, Peter Fricker and Phil Borgeaud from the AIS and Colin Smith and Andrew Dee from Rowing Australia, whose leadership, backing and support has been exceptional, allowing us to get on with the job. Last but not least, I would like to acknowledge and thank the Rowing Australia Board members, who have placed their faith in us and our direction.

Finally a message to the most important people, our talented aspiring athletes: remember that you do not find Olympic Gold Medals in the bottom of Weet-Bix boxes. Winning at the highest level requires commitment, exceptional discipline, and hard work. Now is a good time for you to get all these things in place and strive for the top. Competing at the Australian Rowing Championships and reaching for those medals by giving your best, is a step in the right direction. If you bring what it takes and have the willpower to take it further, we at the NRCE will do all in our power to provide the platform for you to realise your dreams.

All the very best to all competitors and coaches here at the 2010 National Championships, and I look forward to working with you into the future.

We don't have the pristine waters of Penrith Lakes or Lake Barrington so success here generally comes to those who refuse to be distracted by the conditions. The Victorians have already raced here in three separate regattas in 2010, so they are well prepared for whatever this lake has to offer.

The quality of athletes here is certainly several steps ahead of last year's post Olympic regatta with a number of returning Beijing Olympians. Some have been to the Hawaiian Ironman triathlon, others have taken time to start a family, others even to discover for the first time what it is to hold down a full time job in the big world outside rowing and still prepare for these Championships. It makes this regatta a fascinating mix of those youngsters continuing their rise against those on the way back.

Instead of trying to pick every event, I have limited myself to those events I really want to see, and they are a sample of the open events, and the 8 Interstate races on Sunday. Given the testing nature of racing at Nagambie, I have also included the winners here last time in 2007.

So with all that in mind, here goes:

Women's Single Scull (W1x)

2009 Champion – Sally Kehoe

2007 Champion – Pippa Savage

These two stars have been going head to head for a number of years and Sally would probably have the numeric advantage. However with a recent win at the NSW Champs Pippa will be confident. Keep an eye out for previous winners Amber Bradley & Kerry Hore, not to mention Kim Crow and the 2006 World double scull champs Liz Kell & Brooke Pratley. A great field.

My tip – Sally Kehoe

Men's Single Scull (M1x)

2007 & 2009 Champion – David Crawshaw

Who would bet against the Olympic Champion who has been untouchable in Australia for the last few years? There are no lack of willing challengers, led by 2009 M4x Silver medallists Dan Noonan, Jared Bidwell & Nick Hudson, & the returning Dr Scott Brennan. There are a few smokies out there but keep an eye out or James McRae and Karsten Forsterling.

My tip: David Crawshaw

Women's Pair (W2-)

2009 Champions – Phoebe Stanley (MUBC) and Pauline Frasca (MerCs)

2007 Champions – Kim Crow (MUBC) and Sarah Cook (Canberra)

The defending champions are in very good form, both here at Nagambie and in camp in Canberra. They will be hard to beat. A small but quality field including Beijing Olympians Sarah Heard (MUBC) and Sarah Tait (MerCs) amongst others

My tip: Stanley & Frasca

Men's Pair (M2-)

2009 Champions – James Marburg & Cameron McKenzie-McHarg (MUBC)

2007 Champions – Drew Ginn (MerCs) & Duncan Free (Surfers Paradise)

You have to be really good to win this one in this field. The defending champs now have new pair partners, one of the Olympic Champs in the pair is back with a new pair partner, and Noel Donaldson and Rhett Ayliffe have a new generation coming through at the AIS including NSW Champs winners Josh Dunkley-Smith (MerCs) and Tom Larkins (MUBC). A difficult one to pick.

My tip: Dunkley-Smith & Larkins in an upset of sorts.

Women's Lightweight Single Scull (WL1x)

2009 Champion – Bronwen Watson (SUBC)

2007 Champion – Amber Halliday (AUBC)

Last year's win for Bron Watson was a great result for a long time campaigner who has been in the system for many years. But she's not in the great form of last year and it may come down to a battle between the returning Mum & NSW Champ Hannah Every-Hall and the 2008 champion Alice McNamara (MUBC).

My tip: Alice McNamara in a close one.

Men's Lightweight Single Scull (ML1x)

2009 Champion - Todd Skipworth

2007 Champion – Sam Beltz

It's always great quality and really aggressive racing with the lighty men, & while I confess I don't know a huge amount about this field, I do try and make a point of watching how they just move. The Tassie and WA guys have led the lighty men in Australia for a few years now so:

My tip – Todd Skipworth

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RA Short History

RA was initially established on 1st May 1925 as the Australian Amateur Rowing Council. It was incorporated on the 15th of November 1982, changed its name to Australian Rowing Council Inc in 1984, changed its name to Rowing Australia Inc on 2nd March 1996 and finally became a public company in January 2007 and so became Rowing Australia Ltd.

Prior to 1925, the conduct of the Interstate Championships and representation at the Olympic Games was managed by the State Associations initially by correspondence and later by Inter-State Conferences which met at the Interstate Championships. These conferences became annual events from 1907, exempting war years. A proposal to form the Australian Amateur Rowing Council failed at the 1909 conference in favour of the continuation of the conference system.

Regulations were brought into effect for the conduct of the Intercolonial and Interstate Championships well prior to the formation of RA. Whilst there were many debates over rules from the very first race, the first call for a conference came from NSW in February 1887 to discuss the possibility of sending a combined crew from all colonies to compete in England.

Probably the biggest issue from 1873 to 1896 was the question of who constituted an amateur. This dispute, largely between Victoria and New South Wales, restricted inter colonial competition until resolution.

It is interesting to note that New Zealand competed in several intercolonial championships and it was clear that pre Federation, New Zealand were to a large extent regarded as another colony which could compete. New Zealand sought permission to compete at the Interstate Championships in 1913. The Australian States had no objection subject to there be no need for them to travel to New Zealand.

For most of the Council's early years, its business was mostly the conduct of the Interstate Championships. The activity of the organisation grew in the 1950s and 1960s with greater international competition and the commencement of national championships in 1962. However even in 1964, the activity was low by modern standards. The financial report of the 1963-64 year shows income of £150 of affiliation fees and £18 of interest. Expenditure was £126 comprising affiliation fees to FISA and AOF, typing expenses and trophies for the Interstate events. The Council was run of course solely by volunteers at that stage.

It was not until the mid to late 1970s that the activity of the Council grew enormously. The work of the President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer was extensive. This arose with the responsibility for national teams, to the AOF, to FISA, to government arising from funding flowing to sport and the employment of a coaching director. Eventually the activity was too much for volunteers to handle and the Council sought professional administrative support. Today the business of Rowing Australia is large and has an extensive staff to manage it.

The structure of the Council was forced to change to meet the demands of the sport. No longer did the Council meet once or twice a year and let the President, Secretary and Treasurer run the operation between meetings. An executive board of volunteers was created in 1990 to better manage the sport and spread the workload. Only once in 1995 did the transition to professional administration falter when financial issues almost left the association in liquidation. However the strength of the sport and of those involved overcame the issues and within months in 1996, we were the most successful rowing nation in the world.

Whilst we are critical of our own administration from time to time, it is clear that this sport has generally been well served by its administrators and has been well ahead of its peers both locally and internationally.

In the past 30 years, the results speak for themselves. The sport has excelled internationally, it has developed and kept quality administrators such as John Coates and John Boulton, it has imported key people such as Reinhold Batschi to develop training techniques, professionalism, coaches and coaching education, it has created some of the world's best rowing courses, it has created many rowing courses, it has gained access to the AIS and State Institutes, it has made the difficult transition to professional administration, it has gained the confidence of Government and the Olympic Council, it has high quality coaches throughout the land and it has consistently maintained a pool of high quality athletes throughout the land.

The original Women's Council

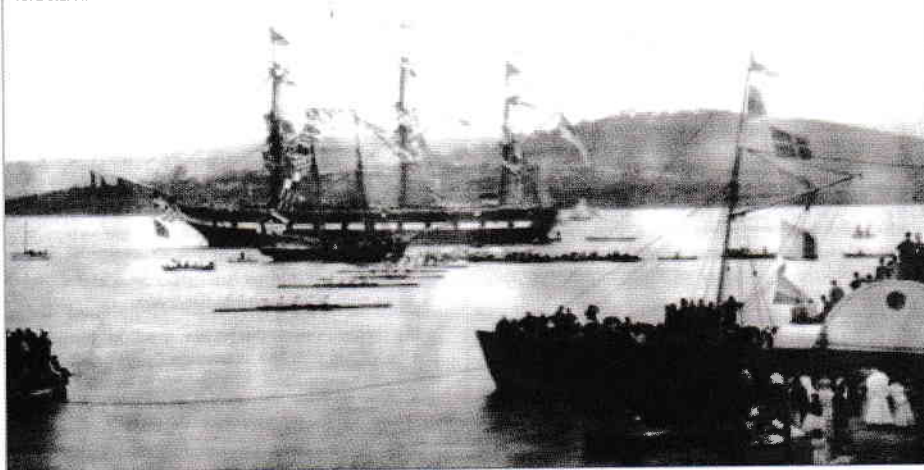
The women were separately represented by The Australian Ladies' Rowing Council, later the Australian Women's Rowing Council which was absorbed into RA in 1979.

The Australian Women's Rowing Council, then styled The Australian Ladies' Rowing Council, was created before the AARC on 13 May 1920 at the Telegraph Chambers Brisbane. It arose from a meeting of representatives of the lady rowers of South Australia, New South Wales and Queensland and was called by the Honorary Secretary of the Brisbane Ladies' Rowing Club.

On 15 March 1920 an Interstate Women's Fours race was conducted in conjunction with the Interstate men's eight race in Brisbane. A proposal to allow the conduct of an Interstate Women's Four Oared race at the Men's Interstate Championships was defeated at the Interstate Conference on 22nd April 1921. Whilst this was the first official Interstate Championship, other Interstate contests had already been conducted in 1901 and 1919.

History of the Interstate Championships

Early History of the Intercolonial Four-Oared Racing

Although earlier international races were conducted between crews from ships visiting Australia, the first inter colonial amateur racing took until 1833. The following early history of intercolonial competition is provided by John Lang in his book *The Victorian Oarsman* published in 1919:

Before 1878, various boat races between the Australian Colonies had taken place in four-oared gigs, but in the year 1878 the first boat race in eights, between any of the Colonies, was rowed when Victoria defeated New South Wales.

The earliest race recorded between crews of different colonies was conducted on 9 November 1833 when a Sydney crew defeated a Hobart Town crew in whalers. The race was very popular and caused quite a stir.

However the earliest Intercolonial amateur boat race with a distinct Intercolonial character was rowed in 1863 in gigs over a three-mile course on the Parramatta River, N.S.W. The N.S.W. four defeated Victoria (time, 19 min. 25 sec.). In this race the crews were of a representative character, and each crew bore the name of its colony. The Victorian crew was made up of members from the Elswick, Melbourne, and Melbourne University Clubs.

After the race the differences about the amateur status of oarsmen in the two Colonies became accentuated, Victoria alleging the New South Wales crew was to all intents and purposes watermen, having rowed against watermen and for money prizes. The Victorian definition excluded both sorts of oarsmen from amateur competition.

For some years this break continued, preventing competition by crews really representing the Colonies, though club crews frequently raced in Intercolonial matches, the crews being club crews charged more or less with a mission to win the honours for their Colony.

In 1870 a race took place at the Balmain Regatta, N.S.W., which the New South Wales crew won against Tasmanian crews, Victoria not being represented.

In 1872 a race was rowed over a five-mile course on the Derwent River, Tasmania, the Sydney Rowing Club winning against the Parramatta Rowing Club, some Hobart Club crews, and one from the Barwon Rowing Club, the time for, the course being 36 min. 30 sec.

The same year over a 7,000-yard course on Sydney Harbour, two crews from the Sydney Rowing Club beat a Victorian crew (of an Intercolonial character, the crew being composed of members of various clubs, among whom were members of the Civil Service, University, and Melbourne Rowing Clubs). The 1872 regatta was a highlight of early colonial life with some 20,000 spectators watching the event and much press coverage.

Next year (1873) Victoria secured the first win with another non-club four (Melbourne, Melbourne University and Warehousemen). The other crews in the race were club crews, comprising two from Ballarat, a Sydney Rowing Club crew, and crews from Hobart Town and Geelong. The race was rowed over about four miles on the Lower Yarra — time, 25 min. 30 sec. This race is generally recognised as the first "official" Intercolonial match.

After much debate between Victoria and New South Wales over the amateur definition, a race was organized in 1874 over the Parramatta championship course, 3 miles 300 yards; time, 21 min: 59 sec. New South Wales won easily before a crowd of some 15,000 spectators and much press coverage.

For some years after this no such meetings took place until, at the New South Wales Regatta, 1888, a Victorian four, which Mr. George E. Upward stroked, beat New Zealand, New South Wales, and Tasmania in that order. The last of the Intercolonial four-oar races was rowed (in outriggers) on the Parramatta in 1896, over 2.25 miles; Victoria first, New Zealand second, New South Wales third.

John Lang writes that:

The 1873 and 1874 gig races were the first races of a character where the crews were representing their respective colonies, the other events before this date being more or less competitions between clubs or combination crews from the various colonies.

Early History of the Intercolonial Eight-Oared Event

The following early history of this event is related in John Lang's Book *The Victorian Oarsman* published in 1919:

In October, 1877, the year in which eight-oared boats may be said to have first come into general use in many of the rowing centres in Australia, a challenge was sent by the Victorian Rowing Association to the Sydney and Mercantile (now Mosman) Clubs in New South Wales. This was taken up with spirit by the last-named club, and the first eight-oared race took place on the 6th March, 1878, over about four miles on the Lower Yarra, from Stony Creek up round what is now "The Old River" to the Gas Works.

For about two-thirds of the distance the race was very interesting. At a quarter-mile Victoria was leading by a half-length. At the Sugar Works Victoria led by a clear length. Rounding the bend at the junction of the Saltwater River the New South Wales crew came up like a racehorse, and looked as if they would go right away. Victoria spurted, and for half a mile the boats rowed level. After that the Victorians went, gradually ahead, the pace having told more on the other crew. The New South Wales men pressed Victoria again half a mile from the finish, but were unable to catch up, and Victoria won by two lengths. No official or reliable time was taken.

The Intercolonial Boat Race, rowed regularly every year until war broke out, is one of the chief rowing championships of the world. In no other country is there regular annual competition in rowing between six great centres so far separated as Brisbane and Perth, with 3478.25 miles of railway between them: Victoria has got a great proportion of the wins, and until recent years time after time brought home the Australian Championship. Lately the Victorian flag has been displaced by the colours of Tasmania (1908, 1909, 1914), New South Wales (1908, 1910, 1911), and South Australia (1913).

The 1906 Interstate programme the writer provides some suggestions why the race is so great.

"The word 'greatest' is used advisedly. Rowing never has been able to get a 'gate', and the rowing associations throughout Australia are poor -- terribly poor -- so

that to send crews thousands of miles every year is a tremendous achievement.

If determination and enthusiasm makes a thing great, then the Interstate eight race must be so counted. If the severe training, and personal sacrifice of the 40 or 50 athletes in the race, without any hope of reward -- not even a 'tin pot' -- make a contest great, then the Interstate is again so.

And if strength and skill, combined with grit and gentlemanly attributes, characterize a set of sportsmen and make their competition great, assuredly is the championship race great.

The history of it is a record of clean sport, and a monument to the survival of pure amateurism. The breadth of scandal has never tarnished the bright escutcheon of amateur rowing in Australia, and the Interstate race holds the proudest place among the many proud records emblazoned on the banner. And long may it so continue.

May the best crew always win and may rowing and the Interstate contests last as long as Australia is a land of sport."

Interstate Men's Eight Oared Championship for the King's Cup



The King's Cup trophy was first won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Peace Regatta held 2-4th July. This handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race for that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful AIF No 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914-18 War.

The successful crew defeated the AIF No 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds, the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and United States

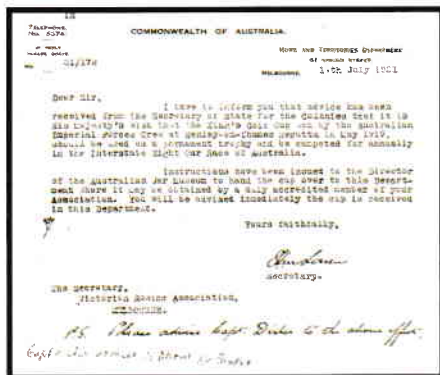
The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian Military Authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the Australian War Museum.

On 14th May, 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Associations held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual trophy for the Australian Eight-Oared Championship. This request was refused, and on 12th October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association, and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30th October 1920, and signed by Captain H C Disher, was sent to his Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy.

A reply dated 13th May 1921 received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr Winston Churchill, stated that, 'His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Race of Australia'.

The letter below formalized the transfer in July 1921.



The first Interstate Men's Eights Championship raced for the King's Cup was in 1922. However for the record, the sport and the trophy itself have recorded that crews raced for the Cup from 1920.

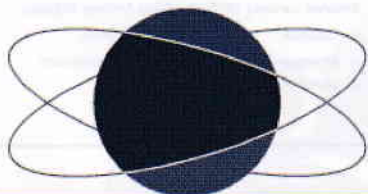

Mineral Commerce Services

Following the Armistice which ended World War 1 while the troops of the Allied armies were being demobilised and sent home a number of sporting events were organised to keep them occupied. The Peace Regatta at Henley and the Inter Allied Games in Paris continued the traditional connections between sport and war which was highlighted by then relatively recent commencement of the modern Olympic movement. This article honours this tradition and the AIF No. 1 crew rowers by looking at both their war and sporting records.

All crews competing for the Kings Cup were made up of men who had served their country during the Great War.

What is less well known is the men of the winning Australian crew not only came from the Australian Army but that all had been on active service, (three in the Infantry, five in the Artillery, and one in the Medical corps).

House, McGill and Middleton all fought at Gallipoli and then in France. In July and August 1916 together with Hauenstein, Smedley, Robb and Scott they took part in the very fierce fighting around Pozieres and Mouquet Farm. Hauenstein in the pioneers and Scott who was then in the Infantry were both wounded at Pozieres. Hauenstein was awarded the Military Medal for bravery in the field and Smedley was Mentioned in Dispatches.

Keith Heritage a member of the 1912 Australian crew which won the Henley Grand Challenge Cup and competed at the Stockholm Olympics was also in the 19th Battalion with Middleton and was killed at Pozieres. Three of the 1912 Olympic crew participated in the AIF crews, Middleton, Hauenstein and Ross Soden.

McGill was wounded three times in France and Belgium. The first at the second Battle of Bullecourt in May 1917. The second time (in the thigh) was at Poelcapelle, which was part of the Battle for Passchendaele in October 1917 and the third time was at Hangard Wood during the German counter offensive of March/April 1918.

Fred House was gassed during the fighting along the Menin Road and Passchendaele in October 1917.

A summary of the known actions these men fought in reads like a typical list of Australia's First World War battle honours.

The army records of the crew also mentions some of the more colourful aspects of their service during the war. It would seem like many rowers today they enjoyed a drink when off duty. A couple were even reprimanded for drunk and disorderly conduct however given the horrific conditions they endured it is very understandable.

It also seems Scott wasn't one to take no for an answer! In April 1918 he was court marshalled for disobeying an order. It seems his brother had been either wounded or killed and he had requested leave to visit him. Leave was refused as this was at the time of German counter offensive. Scott refused to report for duty until his request for leave had been escalated to a higher authority. He was duly found guilty and sentenced to one years imprisonment with hard labour. The sentence was suspended 3 months later because of his good record which is just as well as he would have missed selection in the Peace Regatta crew if he had served his full term!

One of the most interesting facts regarding Sidney Middleton is that he competed in the Australian Olympic Rugby Union team in 1908 that won a gold medal. He remains the only Australian to compete in both sports at the Olympic Games. He captained Australia in rugby in its three Tests against New Zealand in Australia. He also played in a Test against England but probably missed selection against Wales due to an outburst (he swung a blow against an opposing forward) against Oxford resulting in him being sent off.

It is reported that he coached the 1919 1st AIF crew in the UK in the last week prior to the racing. Extracts from John Lang's book *The Victorian Oarsman* in 1919 record that his coaching "improved their pace and form very much indeed. A great deal of their success is due to him."

The no. 2 crew proved faster in the last two trials. With a little more than week to go, three members of the second crew were moved into the 1st crew. "The critics were open mouthed when they heard of it." From that day, however, "there was continual improvement in the style, and the gain in ability was accompanied by a corresponding increase in confidence, both on the part of the crew and its supporters."

From the *Australian Dictionary of Biography*: Enlisting as a private in the 5th Battalion, Australian Imperial Force, on 17 August, he was a sergeant at the Gallipoli landing and was commissioned on 28 April 1915. 'Darkie' Marshall was soon recognized as a fearless and daring leader. At Lone Pine he destroyed a troublesome sniper with a bomb of his own making and led bombers who cleared the Turks from the communication trenches with jam-tin bombs. For his work on Gallipoli he was awarded the Military Cross.

As a company commander in the 57th Battalion Marshall led the first trench raid of the 5th Division in France. On the morning after Fromelles he was observed running with another officer, half-way between the opposing lines, hunting for wounded soldiers. Marshall was for a few months second-in-command of his battalion until 10 April 1917 when he was promoted lieutenant-colonel to command the 60th Battalion. He had risen rapidly under the stern eye of Brigadier General H.E. Elliott and now became an outstanding unit commander with the distinction, unique in the A.I.F., of the Distinguished Service Order and two Bars. He was also mentioned in dispatches four times. The first D.S.O. was for his skilful and fearless handling of his own and other battalions at Polygon Wood, 25-26 September 1917, when he was largely responsible for the 15th Brigade's success. When Elliott visited him at a critical moment and Marshall indicated the source of the trouble, Elliott said, 'Come on, Marshall, you and I can fix that pill box' – and they did.

In the famous night counter-attack at Villers-Bretonneux, 24-25 April 1918, Marshall took control of the attacking battalions of the 15th Brigade at their forming-up position and 'got the whole brigade straightened up and moving forward on the right lines'; the operation was a brilliant success. He was awarded a Bar to the D.S.O. for his part in the battle.

Marshall led the 54th Battalion from May 1918 until the A.I.F. was withdrawn from operations in October. He again distinguished himself in the great battles beginning on 8 August and, for his part in the capture of Péronne on 1-3 September, was awarded a second Bar to his D.S.O. Against fierce resistance, he personally organized 'the attack on the ramparts and the mopping up of the town. Through his splendid energy and example... the town was held and three guns and about 600 prisoners captured by his battalion'.

Interstate Women's Eight Oared Championship for the Queens Cup

The commencement of Interstate Women's competition is unclear but is thought to have started in 1912. However the first recognized championships occurred in 1920 when the Interstate Women's Four Championship was conducted in conjunction with the Interstate Men's Championships.

The Australian Women's Rowing Council was also established at these Championships. It is worth noting that the Australian Amateur Rowing Council was not formed until 1927.



ULVA Trophy

The 1920 Interstate Women's Four Championship was won by South Australia represented by a Mannum Rowing Club crew stroked by Dorothy Arnold. The United Licensed Victuallers Association (ULVA) of Queensland presented to the Australian Women's Rowing Council this unique sterling silver trophy. The trophy was crafted by London silversmiths to depict Dorothy Arnold, the petite girl from Mannum

who stroked the winning crew. She is holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb of her time, namely a floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers. The trophy is inscribed with the following words: Interstate Ladies Four-Oared Championship Trophy Presented by Queensland Licensed Victuallers Association E H Ruddle Esq. President 1920.

The trophy is affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as Bertha. However in 1941, on the motion of NSW, the Australian Womens Rowing Council resolved to drop the name Bertha and that it be officially known as the ULVA Trophy. This change occurred only officially with the name Bertha still used by oarswomen.

In 1958, there was a brief discussion at the Australian Womens Rowing Council about the outmoded appearance of the trophy. Fortunately the majority of members disapproved of any alteration to modernise the dress of the model of the trophy.

In 2003, the trophy became officially known as the Queen Elizabeth II Trophy, or the Queens Cup. The original ULVA trophy remains the perpetual trophy.

There was an interesting lead up to the allocation of Queens Cup to the women's eight oared Championship with the Queens Cup originally being destined for an international schoolboy regatta.

In 1993, Brisbane Boys' College raced Eton in the final of the Princess Elizabeth Cup at Henley and won. This was the first time that an Australian Schoolboy Crew had won this prestigious event.

In 1997 Simon Newcomb approached Dr Steve Hinchy (President of Rowing Australia) and asked for permission to approach Buckingham Palace and the Queen's Private Secretary Sir Robert Fellowes as to whether Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II would be prepared to provide a trophy to be known as the Queen's Cup for an annual International Schoolboy Race. The first race should take place to coincide with the centenary of Brisbane Boy's College in 2002.

Simon Newcomb OAM of Brisbane continued to correspond with the Queen's Private Secretary Sir Robert Fellowes, Buckingham Palace, Rowing Australia, Government House in Brisbane and also in Canberra. On 26th November 1999, the following response was received from Kevin Davidson, Senior Adviser to the Governor General:

Dear Dr Hinchy [then President of Rowing Australia],
I refer to your letter of 19th April 1999 to the official Secretary requesting Her Majesty The Queen's consent to donate a perpetual trophy for an annual International schoolboy rowing event to be held in Australia. The Official Secretary has recently received formal advice that her majesty has consented to a Royal trophy to be called 'The Queen Elizabeth Cup' to be raced for in Australia by schoolboy crews from all over the world on an annual basis. Her Majesty is content for the first event to be held in Brisbane to coincide with the centenary celebrations of the Brisbane Boys' College in 2002.

Rowing Australia subsequently determined that the trophy would be best allocated to the women's eight event to provide some equity of regal trophies for men's and women's Interstate eight oared championships and thus provide synergy with the Kings Cup.

In early 2001 approaches were made by Rowing Australia to the Governor General to have the trophy changed from an International Schoolboy Race to the Women's Interstate Eight Oared Championship. The Queen provided her consent to this change which occurred in 2003.

Interstate Men's Sculling Championship for the President's Cup

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President Mr EC Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersall's Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the Late A A Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian Olympians have been the holders of this trophy. The records of these, all representing NSW, are well known:

- Henry (Bobby) Pearce, holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medallist in 1928 and 1932,
- His cousin C A (Cecil) Pearce four times holder,
- Duncan Free six times holder and Olympic medallist in the quad scull, and
- M T (Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic gold, silver and bronze medallist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively.

Perhaps the most unlucky sculler was G Squires from Tasmania who was placed second on seven occasions, third on another and won the race only once in 1963.

Interstate Women's Sculling Championship for the Nell Slatter Trophy

Dating back to 1901 at the Great Federation Regatta staged on Albert Park Lake, Cassie Woolly McRitchie representing Victoria and using a skiff loaned to her by the then Governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, defeated her challenger from Sydney, Elizabeth Messenger, and was presented with a magnificent pearl and ruby bracelet by the Duke of Gloucester. So great was the public interest in the female scullers that police were required to keep the inquisitive spectators at bay.

Cassie McRitchie is justifiably known as the "mother" of Victorian women's rowing and as the founder of the first all women's rowing club at Albert Park in 1907. In 1973 at the great age of 96, she passed away.

Despite this great start to women's interstate sculling in 1901, the first interstate championship was not conducted until 1963 in Brisbane and has continued annually since that date.

The Nell Slatter Trophy was presented by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association in 1963 to be the perpetual trophy for the Championship as a tribute to the then Queensland President Nell Slatter.

Interstate Men's Lightweight Four Championship for the Penrith Cup

The Interstate Lightweight Four Championship was introduced in 1958 after a long history of lightweight rowing within Australia.

The original weight restriction was for athletes who weighed no less than 140 lbs (63.6 kg). The weight limits have changed over time but since 1974 have mirrored those of FISA namely 72.5 kg maximum and 70 kg crew average.

The Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1958 by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy for the event. The event was the pinnacle of a lightweight oarsman's career until 1974 when the first FISA Championships were conducted. The strength and depth of Australian lightweight rowing was shown by a gold medal at the 1974 FISA Championships in the fours and the considerable success achieved by Australian lightweight rowers ever since that time. The quality of winning crews of the Penrith Cup is consistently very high.

Interstate Women's Lightweight Quad Scull for the Victoria Cup

The first Women's Interstate Lightweight Four-Oared Championship was contested on the Yarra River in Melbourne on 28th April, 1968. The victory was recorded by Victoria with a crew stroked by one of Australia's best known oarswomen, Margaret Agnew Mackenzie, whose efforts in negotiating with the Women's Rowing Council, secured lightweight rowing as an annual event on the women's Interstate rowing programme.

The Victoria Cup, presented by the Victorian Ladies' Rowing Association, is the perpetual trophy for this event.

Lightweight women have recorded many international victories, the first being at the inaugural competition between the United States of America, Canada and Australia at St. Catherines, Canada, in 1979, when Australia was successful in the two events for which crews were entered — Lightweight Four with Cox and Lightweight Pair.

From 1996, the event became coxless. In 1999, the change was made from coxless four to quad scull as most lightweight women's rowing was in sculling boats due to the introduction of an Olympic women's lightweight double sculling event.

Interstate Men's Youth Eight Championship for the Noel Wilkinson Trophy

Recognising the necessity to introduce a class of rowing in which Australian youth oarsmen could compete, the Australian Rowing Council initiated the Interstate Youth Eight-Oared Championships at an age limit some 18 months older than the internationally accepted junior age limit.

The first Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974, and in that same year, the Council accepted an offer by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event. Noel was a great fundraiser for both Australian rowing teams and also for Australian Olympic teams. He was also a long serving Treasurer of the Australian Rowing Council.

The Youth Championships, combined with the junior events conducted in other boat classes at the National Championships, fulfils the original purpose of Council and the donor, namely to provide an incentive for young oarsmen to continue in the sport following completion of their secondary school education and a development step to higher classifications.

The trophy is inscribed as follows:

The cup itself is one of only 500 in the world that were made from the sands collected by Olympians from every Olympic country in the world.

Naturally the cup is presented after the last Interstate Championship each year to the Councillor of the winning State.

John Lang reports this event in his book *The Victorian Oarsman* published in 1919:

"For some years this break [Ed: the break caused by the disagreement over an amateur definition] continued, preventing competition by crews really representing the Colonies, though club crews frequently raced in Intercolonial matches, the crews being club crews charged more or less with a mission to win the honours for their Colony. In 1870 a race took place at the Balmain Regatta, N.S.W., which the New South Wales crew won against Tasmanian crews, Victoria not being represented."

The race attracted a prize of 100 sovereigns or trophies to that value at the option of the winner.

Before a crowd of 15,000 spectators, a stronger and heavier Victorian crew won by only three lengths in a good race.

The Victoria stroke, George Upward, was very influential in keeping Intercolonial competition going by boating sanctioned but not official Victorian crews despite the amateur issue not being resolved with NSW. He was a very influential rowing administrator.

This was one of more interesting Interstate Championship races ever rowed. It was raced in rough conditions. Queensland started well taking the lead from the other two states. NSW was swamped half way through the race and withdrew. Victoria then started working their way through the Queensland lead but was repelled by Queensland who maintained a two length lead.

About a quarter of a mile from the finish, Queensland was hit with a significant wash from a passing steamer and the two seat blade was snapped. To minimize the impact of carrying him, the two men jumped overboard. The Victorians made the best of the situation surviving the wash and passed the Queensland crew.

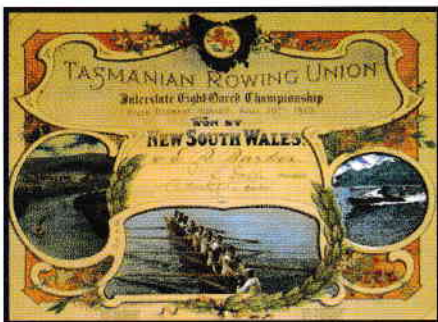

The eights race was won comfortably by South Australia who all hailed from the Murray Bridge Rowing Club. They rated 32 off the start and settled to 28 for most of the middle part of the race. They brought up the rate to 30 over the final 3/4 mile. After winning the event, the South Australian newspapers and local politicians all sought their immediate selection as the Olympic crew for 1920. Though not required to attend under the rules of competition, Western Australia overcame the cost and also raced making the event a full field for the resumption after the Great War. The weather conditions were ideal.

The margin between Baynes and Westbrook remained within a length until Baynes made his move with 5000 yards to go. The margin went quickly from one length to two quickly as Westbrook had no answer to this move. Baynes had spent some time in Sydney under George Towns in preparation for this event which also doubled as the test race for the 1920 Olympic Games. Baynes advised after the race that he could not attend the Games due to study commitments

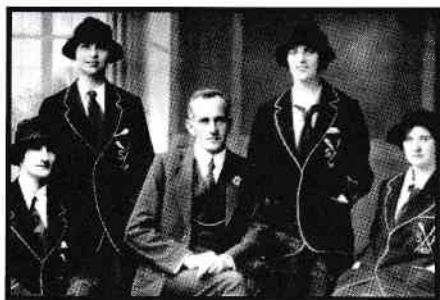

The first official women's championship was conducted at the same time and place as the men's championships and provided good racing. NSW raced well and took the early lead. The South Australians then put on a great effort to row through the NSW crew and take the lead. The Queensland crew also rowed through the NSW crew to gain level terms with the South Australians. The crews used tub fours. The South Australians were all from the Mannum Club. Perhaps more notable was the creation of the Australian Women's Rowing Council at this regatta on 13th May 1920. Furthermore, the Queensland United Licensed Victuallers' Association donated a splendid trophy made from 100 silver guineas to be known as the ULVA trophy but more commonly and affectionately known as "Bertha". It was a fitting trophy for such an important event.

The decision by the AARC to hold the Interstate Championships at the best location in each State rather than the city based course was having effect. The Victorian Team

The following description comes from the Victorian Rowing Association Annual Report of 1930 and shows the tenacity of the race:

"Victoria led from the start, closely attended by Western Australia and Queensland. At the quarter mile, Victoria held a third of a length advantage from Queensland, followed closely by West Australia, with New South Wales a half a length behind West. Victoria had improved their position, and at the half mile mark led by a length from Queensland, West Australia, followed by New South Wales, Tasmania, South Australia. At this stage, it looked an easy victory for Victoria, who were gradually drawing away from Queensland.

About the mile and a quarter mark, New South Wales, who were over a length and a half behind Victoria, commenced a brilliant sustained run, which gradually but surely decreased the Victorian advantage. At two miles the light blues had drawn up to within nearly half a length of Victoria and at 2 1/2 miles there was less than a third of a length between the crews.

The rowing of both crews under pressure was excellent. New South Wales continued to gain slightly till within 400 yards of the finish, when a canvas was the margin for Victoria. From this stage to the finish, Victoria appeared to hold their tenacious rivals, and fully extended after the gruelling race, neither crew could increase or decrease the narrow margin that meant victory for Victoria by three feet. As mentioned before, the rowing of Victoria and New South Wales was of the highest order and a tribute to the respective coaches."

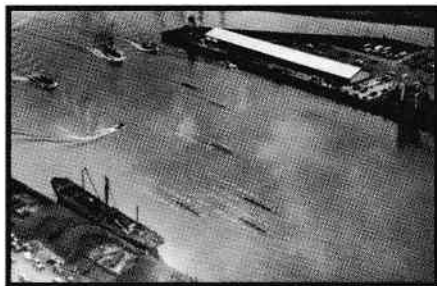

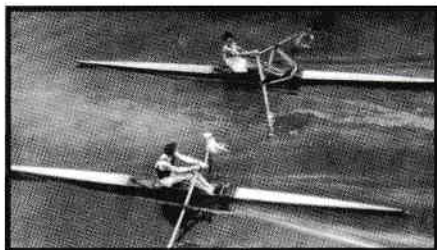

The History of the National Championships

Brief History

Whilst Interstate and Intercolonial Championships were conducted between crews and scullers representing their States in various forms from 1862, and test races were conducted amongst crews across Australia for national selection, the National Inter-Club Championships only commenced in 1962.

The first proposal for a National Championship was submitted by NSW at the AARC meeting in 1946 and it failed to gain support outside NSW. A second proposal was submitted by NSW to the AARC on 21st April 1948 in Tasmania. Kevyn Webb of NSW was the person behind these proposals. He recorded in 1982: Following the 1948 Olympic trials, I gained another important supporter in Ray Todd, famous oarsman and coach, and Melbourne Herald rowing writer, who by his support in Victoria, drew attention to the fact that Australia, unlike the rest of the rowing world, still did not have a National Open Rowing Championship. The 1948 proposal was supported only by NSW and Victoria and so was lost. The proposal suggested 2000 metre racing over two days in single and double sculls, coxed and coxless pair, coxed four, eight, lightweight four, lightweight single and lightweight maiden eights – all men.

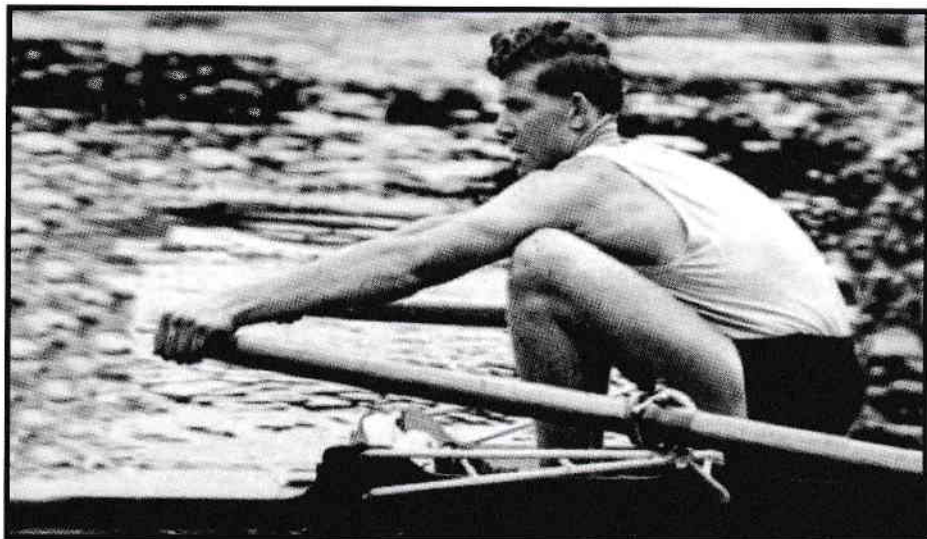
In 1982 Kevyn Webb then described the process through to eventual success in 1961: Notices of motion to conduct such an Open Championship, appeared on the Agenda of the Australian Rowing Council, at each of its meetings up to 1960. During this period, all of the States voted in favour of the National Regatta's introduction, however, in any one of those years, only three of the six States voted "yes" at one time. There

was never a clear majority. My greatest disappointment came at one Australian Rowing Council meeting when the Regatta's introduction seemed certain, with a 3:2 majority, and N.S.W. to vote, the N.S.W. delegate claimed he had no instructions on how to vote from his State and cast a negative vote, to maintain the "Status Quo". As Captain of the Olympic Rowing Team in Rome in 1960, I had the opportunity to "corner" the Australian Team Manager, Reg Blundstone, (who was also Secretary of the Australian Rowing Council) and as a result, on our return to Australia, I was officially requested to prepare a comprehensive report for the A.R.C. on how a National Regatta could be introduced. That report was tabled at the 1961 Australian Rowing Council meeting, and following its adoption, the six States voted unanimously to hold the first National Championship Regatta on Lake Wendouree at Ballarat, in 1962.

In his extensive report, Kevyn Webb concluded that Australia needed a two day regatta every two years at Easter over 2000 metres comprising men's events in single and double sculls, coxed and coxless pairs, coxed and coxless fours and eights. Men's lightweight events in single sculls, coxed four and eights were also recommended.

The National Championships became an annual event in 1974.

The Australian Women's Rowing Council conducted their first National Championships events in 1968 and thereafter conducted the event annually. The men's and women's associations merged in 1979 but jointly conducted their Championships from 1976.

Ted Bromley Memorial Trophy

Men's Coxless Pair Championship

The Ted Bromley Memorial Trophy was first presented in 2006 in honour of the Late Ted Bromley. Ted was a 1948 Olympic rower who championed coxless pair oared rowing in Australia from pre WWII until his death in 2005. Through his generous benefaction in creating the Bromley Trust Fund in 1990, he continues to support Australian representative crews and in particular coxless pair oared crews.

The Bromley trophy is a bronze statue depicting James Tonkins, who is Australia's most successful pair oared rower. James was of course Olympic Champion in the pair at the Athens Games in 2004. Prior to that, James was a World Champion in the coxless pair in both 1999 and 2003.

Women's Pair Championship

The women's pair oared championship is raced for the Carlton & United Brewing Plate, which was first presented in 1968. The names of past winners are engraved on the reverse of the trophy.

The first four championships were raced over 500 metres in coxed tub boats. Then in 1972, like all women's senior races, the race was competed over over 1000 metres and also coxless. The next step was to coxless rowing and finally in 1984 to racing over 2000 metres

Bob Aitken Memorial Trophy

Men's Coxless Four Championship

This trophy was first presented in 2006 to recognise Rowing Australia's first life member and inaugural elected President of Rowing Australia.

Bob Aitken had a distinguished and successful rowing career as an oarsman, coach, selector and administrator and made a significant contribution to the sport in all these areas.

He was a skillful stroke who won the biggest races of his day. He had a good eye for rowing skill, how a boat should travel through the water and a good knowledge of training. He was therefore for many years a successful school, club, state and national coach and selector.

In addition to his deep understanding and knowledge of the sport, he had a considerable intellect, unqualified integrity and impartiality and a great sense responsibility. These qualities made him a respected administrator and of course an obvious choice as President of Rowing Victoria and President of Rowing Australia. He was also the inaugural Chairman of both the Victorian and Australian umpires' panel.

Women's Four Championship

This trophy was first presented in 1968 for the Women's Junior Four Championship. This was not an Under 19 event, but a non-senior event.

It then became the senior four event championship trophy in 1977.

The race was conducted over 1000m until 1984.

The women's four was raced as a coxed four until 1987.

As this was an Interstate event, there was no need for a National Championship event. A Jubilee four event was created 1972 and continued until 1976.

In 1973 there was an inter dominion series between Australia and New Zealand including a race at the Interstate Championships.

This event was a senior four event until 1979 when it became an open four event.

Florence Eaton Trophy

This trophy was first presented in 1978 by Florence Eaton, the then President of the Australian Amateur Women's Rowing Council.

Due to the nature of the event, it has nearly always been won a composite crew.

The Australian Institute of Sport dominated women's rowing for a lot of the 1980-90s and so figure strongly in the results. The other clubs who have figured strogly are Melbourne University and Mercantile from Victoria.

The race was conducted over 1000 metres until 1985 when it was converted to a 2000 metre race.

Thomas Keller Memorial Trophy was presented by the Tasmanian Rowing Council to Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1990 for the Men's Championships Junior Scull in honour of the Late Thomas Keller, President of FISA.

Thommi Keller had been instrumental in both the development of the Lake Barrington course in Tasmania and the granting of the 1990 World Championships to Australia and the Lake Barrington course. The trophy is presented by the most senior FISA representative at the event.

This event commenced in 1982 and should not be confused with the old junior category which was the category before open and had no age restriction.

Many scullers from this event have gone onto win Olympic and World Championships medals. It is good indicator of future success.

The Tim Hawkins Memorial Trophy

The Tim Hawkins Memorial Trophy was presented in 2003 by the family of Tim Hawkins in his memory. The base of the trophy contains his photograph and the following words:

Timothy Leigh Hawkins

(Juper)

(14/11/1973 – 12/10/2002)

Tim commenced his rowing career at the age of 10 as a coxswain at the Lindisfarne Rowing Club and Geilston Bay High School in Tasmania. He represented Tasmania on several occasions winning the Australian Junior Double Scull Championship in 1991 and went on to represent Australia in the double scull at Under 23 and Senior World Championships. Tim retired from competitive rowing at the age of 23 having been to 16 National Championships, to concentrate on doing Commerce/Law degrees at the University of Tasmania which he successfully completed with Honours in Law. Tim still remained a keen supporter of rowing and an active member of the Lindisfarne Rowing Club giving many voluntary days work to rebuild the rowing club after it was burnt to the ground in 1997. He would help the younger rowers at the club and local schools with coaching and advice whenever he could. Tim tragically died at the age of 28 by a terrorist bomb in Bali on 12 October 2002.

The Sydney Cup was donated to Rowing Australia by the NSW Government and was first presented in 2005 by the NSW Minister for Women, The Hon. Ms Sandra Nori. The trophy was engraved with all previous winners since the commencement of the event in 1994.

Bob Blake Shield



The Bob Blake Perpetual Shield was donated by 'Freedom on the River', the Western Australian disabled rowing group and contested for the first time in 2001. It is awarded to the State earning the most points overall in the adaptive rowing events at the Australian National Rowing Championships. Points are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd placed rowers and the total points divided by the total number of entries per State. The Shield is named for Bob Blake who has worked for disabled rowing nationally as well as in his home state of Tasmania since 1989. Bob's contribution and commitment to disabled rowing is immense.

Team Facilities At The Venue

Athletes Lounge

The Athletes Lounge is located in the boat park in the boat shed.

Changing rooms

Change rooms are located in the main Boatpark and adjacent to the boat storage and athletes lounge area.

Toilets & Showers

Toilets are located along the peninsular and in the boat park.

Showers are located in the boat park

Boat storage and racking

Boat Racking will be provided within the boat park. Once allocated, crews are requested to respect each others positioning. Racking issues or safety hazards should be directed to the Boat Park Coordinator or representative. Once all of the racks are used, trailers may be kept within the compound for boat storage. The Boat Park Manager will coordinate this.

A map outlining which boat types are to be allocated to which racks is included in this program.

Boat washing

The Goulburn River is in very close proximity to the Lake. Rowing Australia has recently developed its 'Clean & Green' guidelines and formed a partnership with 'RiverSmart' organisation to devote our efforts into looking after our precious water and river resources. As such, teams are requested to use minimal soap in cleaning their boats and to wash their boats in the dedicated areas.

Storage and equipment security

Competitors are responsible for the security of their personal belongings. Valuables should not be left unattended in team tents at the venue. Suspicious behaviour should be reported to an organising committee representative.

Boat Trailer Storage

Once unloaded at the venue, trailers will be relocated outside the venue at the direction of organising committee staff. Trailers will be allowed back into the venue for re-loading 1 hour after the last race of each day. Prior to bringing your trailer into the venue, please consult with the Boat Park Manager at the Regatta office. Events staff will manage the safe entry and exit of trailers.

Equipment Repair

Boat builders shall be on site to provide their services and repair rowing equipment at your own cost

Ergometers

Ergometers will not be provided at the venue for warm up and cool down. The safe storage and operation of the ergos is the responsibility of each Team.

Regatta Information – Regatta Administration Office

The Regatta Office is located in a separate building located on the peninsula near the entrance of the Boat Park.

Spectators and competitors are able to access results and draws etc from the Regatta Office

Athlete Services

The Organising Committee is available to help with any issue you may face as a competitor. In the first instance approach any member of the Staff or Volunteer. They will attempt to solve the issue. If not, they will direct you to the relevant staff or Official.

Medical and Emergency action

A medical team will be in operation at all hours the venue is open for training and racing. A Venue Medical Manager will also be on site for emergencies and for advice.

A list of emergency telephone numbers will be placed on all notice boards and available in the Regatta Office. In all cases you should approach members of the Organising Committee or an Official for assistance if required.

Emergency Medical points are located at the Medical Centre (main building near the finish line)

Catering & Merchandise

A large Marquee is located along the regatta course towards the finish supplying a range of products for sale including food and beverages

Drinkable water is available along the peninsular and in the boat park.

Club and Team Tents

Club and Team tent sites have been allocated via prior arrangement. These sites will be marked prior to the regatta. The organising committee has the right to remove or move tents which have been erected in the incorrect position.

Parking (Teams and Spectators)

Parking from Monday to Thursday will be located within the Regatta Centre and behind the finish line. Additional

parking for Friday to Sunday will be located in "Morans Paddock" off the Heathcote – Nagambie Road and in "Loddings Paddock" off Loddings Lane.

Pre – Competition Information

Venue Orientation

Upon arrival at the Nagambie Lakes venue, Team managers, coaches and athletes should familiarise themselves with the training maps located in the Boat Park to become familiar with the safety and training issues specific to Nagambie. Whilst safety Marshals and an Emergency Medical response team will be located at the venue, your own safety on the water is your responsibility.

Preliminary Team Managers and Coaches Meeting
The preliminary Team Managers and Coaches Meeting (open to interested) athletes will be held on Sunday 28 February at 3pm in the Athletes Lounge

School crews and athletes briefing

School Masters, Coaches and athletes are required to attend a separate compulsory meeting/briefing on Friday 5th March at 10am in the Athletes Lounge

Other Team Managers and Coaches Meetings
From time to time, further Team Managers and Coaches meetings may be required. In that case, as much notice as possible will be given to all Managers and Coaches via the public address system

Draw

The draw will be conducted by RA Technical Delegates in consultation with the Organising Committee and the National Selectors (where relevant).

Team managers are required to make any withdrawals or crew changes at latest 1 hour before the first race of the event. No replacements are permitted for single scullers (except in the interstate race, where 1 hours notice to the Regatta Secretary is required). Other rules apply to the crew changes after the first heat of each event. (See RA Rule 53).

Crew changes can be made at the Regatta Office located near the entrance of the Boat Park. The draw will be made available no later than 60 minutes prior to each round of racing

Access to the Draw and Results

The Draw and Results will be posted on notice boards around the venue and will be available online. Copies of draws and results will be available at the Regatta Office 2 hours after the completion of each day. Copies of draws and results will be free on presentation of a regatta program.

Training Schedule

The Nagambie Lake is open for training between 6am and 8pm each day, the Goulburn River is not available for training.

Water Traffic Rules

The Traffic Rules maps for training and competition are available in this Program. Copies will be made available at the venue in the Regatta Office and outlined in detail at the Preliminary Team Managers and Coaches Meeting.

Accreditation & Crew Photographs

Team, Coach, Competitors and Support staff accreditation passes can be collected by the Team Manager or representative can collect the accreditations from the Regatta Office. You will be required to wear and show these passes to enter the venue from Friday. No photographs are required for this regatta.

Coaching

Facilities for coaching at Nagambie are limited. No coaching is permitted from the water in motor boats on the lake. The Goulburn River is also closed for safety reasons. As such, coaches will only be able to observe their crews in the last 1,000m of racing.

The Organising Committee has planned several TV's to observe racing on-course during the event broadcast by WCSN (planned for finals days)

Weather reports

Long term and daily weather reports will be posted around the venue on the Notice Boards and will be available in the Regatta Office.

Competitors are reminded that safety is of paramount concern to RA and the Organising Committee. When directed by officials to leave or evacuate certain parts of the venue or water, please obey those directions.

Status of Competitors

School Competitors

A school competitor is one who: Qualifies as Under 21 (Youth) under the provisions of these Rules; and Is attending a secondary school as a full time day student.

All members of a school entry must be from the same school

Under 17

A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 17 rower until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches the age of 16.

Under 19

A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 19 rower until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches the age of 18.

Under 21 (Youth)

A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 21 rower until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches the age of 20.

Under 23

A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 23 rower until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches the age of 22.

Seniors

Senior rowing events are open to rowers of all ages.

Adaptive

A rower may compete in an Adaptive rowing event if his disability meets the criteria set out in the RA Classification Policy (Appendix 7).

Lightweights

A rower may compete in Lightweight rowing events if he meets the following criteria:

A Lightweight men's crew (excluding coxswain) shall have an average weight not exceeding 70 kg. No individual Lightweight male rower may weigh more than 72.5 kg. A Lightweight male single sculler (male) may not weigh more than 72.5 kg.

A Lightweight women's crew (excluding coxswain) shall have an average weight not exceeding 57 kg. No individual Lightweight female rower may weigh more than 59 kg. A single sculler (female) may not weigh more than 59 kg.

Lightweight rowers shall be weighed wearing only their racing uniform on tested scales not less than one hour and not more than two hours before their first race of each lightweight event in which they are competing, each day of the competition. They shall present themselves as a crew at the weighing centre already wearing their racing uniform. The weighing scales should indicate the weight of the rower to 0.1 kg.

If a rower has races in other events on a day of racing, the weight recorded for the first event may be applied to qualify for subsequent events.

Rowers may re-weigh for other events after their weigh-in for their first event on a day of racing, within the time limits applicable to that event. This weight may also be carried forward for any other races in which the rower competes on that day of racing.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if two rounds of the same event takes place on the same day of competition and some rowers in the second round do not have to race in the first round of that day, then these rowers in the second round shall be weighed at the same time as the rowers in the first round.

The Organising Committee may require on the occasion of the first weighing or subsequently the deposit of an official identity card with photograph.

If the first race is subsequently postponed or cancelled, the lightweight rower is not required to be weighed later on the same day for that event.

Any rower who has been re-hydrated intravenously between the weigh-in and the respective race shall not be allowed to start.

If a rower exceeds the required weight or a crew exceeds the required average weight by the expiry of the time permitted for weighing, the rower (and the crew of that rower) or the crew concerned are no longer eligible and shall be excluded from the event.

Coxswains

Coxswains are members of the crew. However, a women's crew may be steered by a man, a men's crew may be steered by a woman.

Age categories shall apply to coxswains, except in Under 23 and masters categories.

The minimum weight for a coxswain (wearing racing uniform) is 55kg. for men's Open, men's Masters, men's Under 23, men's Under 21 (Youth) and Under 19 (junior) men's crews, and 50 kg for women's Open, women's Masters, women's Under 23, women's Under 21, women's Under 19, Schoolboy, Schoolgirl, Under 17 (men and women) and adaptive and masters mixed crews. The weighing scales shall indicate the weight of the coxswain to 0.1 kg.

To make up this weight, a coxswain may carry deadweight in a sealed bag which shall be placed in the boat as close as possible to his/her person. No article of racing equipment shall be considered as part of this deadweight. At any time, before or until immediately after the race, the Control Commission may require the deadweight to be reweighed.

These provisions shall also apply to coxswains in lightweight races. Notwithstanding the provisions of RULE 12.6, a coxswain may steer for any number of Clubs or Institutes at a regatta.

Athlete weighing

The weighing of athletes and coxswains will take place in the main building in the Boat Park. Test scales will be available during all the times that the course is officially open. For further information please refer to the RA Rule Book – viz maximum 2hrs and minimum 1hrs before the advertised start time of that event.

Drug Testing

Drug testing may be carried out during the Nationals and Interstate Regatta. Competitors and Coaches are required to be fully aware of your requirements under these rules and guidelines.

Doping Control following racing will be located in the Boat Park in the main building, next to the athlete weighing area.

Rowing Australia will also have an *Anti Illicit Drugs Education Program* at the venue (Thurs pm – Sun). More information on this new and important initiative will be distributed at the venue throughout the event. Athletes, Coaches and Parents are welcome to visit the Merchandisers tent to view the promotional DVD and obtain promotional items.

Banned Substances – Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) process

If an athlete suffers a medical condition that a doctor can only treat with a therapeutic substance, he or she must check whether the legitimate therapeutic use of the prohibited substance is permitted under the Rowing Australia Anti-Doping Policy and with ASADA. Legitimate use of a prohibited substance may be granted what is known as a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE).

Notice to Competitors cont'd...

Athletes, coaches and parents should ensure that they are familiar with the Rowing

Australia Anti Doping Policy, which can be found on the Rowing Australia Website:

http://www.rowingaustralia.com.au/about_ra_policies_anti-doping.shtm

Article 9 of the Policy refers to 'Therapeutic use'. The ASADA Hotline 1800 020 506 or ASADA Website (www.asada.gov.au) will outline whether the medication is prohibited and whether a TUE is required. It is important that athletes also remember to check medications each year. The World Anti Doping Agency's (WADA) Prohibited List changes on the 1st of January each year, so a medication that was permitted last year, may not be next year. Visit www.rowingaustralia.com.au/hp_anti-doping_wada.shtm for full details of the World Anti-Doping Code 2010 Prohibited List.

NOTE: Any athlete may be Drug tested - whether on the FISA's or ASADA's Registered Testing Pool, Domestic Testing Pool - or not on any list. If an athlete needs to use a prohibited substance or a prohibited method for a medical purpose, to avoid an Anti Doping Rule Violation, the athlete needs to obtain a ASDMAC Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). These TUE forms are required to compete at events of significance within Australia such as State Championships, National Championships, Selection regattas/trials, Youth Olympics and Youth Cups.

Athletes and their Doctors are now required to complete an ASDMAC form (Australian Sports Drug Medical Advisory Committee). This form can only be approved by ASDMAC. The form, once approved is accepted by ASADA as a valid domestic TUE.

NOTE: The submission of FISA forms will not be accepted by ASDMAC. Please ensure you have the correct TUE form. Athletes should always carry copies of any documentation (TUE's, or other) to every regatta.

Crew Changes

Team managers are required to make any withdrawals or crew changes at latest 1 hour before the first race of the event. No replacements are permitted for single scullers (except in the interstate race, where 1 hours notice to the Regatta Secretary is required). Other rules apply to the crew changes after the first heat of each event. (See RA Rules 50-53).

Crew Changes can be made at the Regatta Office located near the entrance of the Boat Park.

Late scratchings, or crews who do not present to the starter, may incur a \$250 fine

Bow Numbers

Bow Numbers will be available for collection at the Administration Office on the peninsula adjacent to the Boat Park gate. A \$10 deposit is payable on all numbers and is refundable on their return. We ask that when paying your deposit you do so with \$10 notes or smaller denominations. Larger denominations may be retained and repaid on return of your number.

Immediately after the end of the race bow numbers must be returned to the same office

Equipment Check

The Control commission will check equipment to secure compliance with all relevant rules of safety and racing.

Boat Weighing

Boat weighing will take place in the Boat Park adjacent to the main building. It is the responsibility of the crews that the weight of their boats is in accordance with the RA Rules of Racing (Rule 34). Scales will be available for crews to test the weight of their boats from Sunday 28th February.

Minimum weights for boats are the following:

Width of Boats - Minimum width of Adaptive racing boats - The minimum width of an adaptive racing boat shall be 370 mm. This will be a horizontal measurement of the inside of the hull at the level of the rails. This restriction will only apply to the following adaptive boat classes:

- ASM1x (Div I & II)
- ASW1x (Div I & II)
- TAM1x
- TAW1x
- LTAM1x Div 2
- LTAW1x Div 2

Adaptive training

Safe arrangements have been made for adaptive training prior to the first day of racing and during competition. These will be outlined at the Preliminary Team Managers and Coaches Meeting on Sunday 28th Feb.

Written copies of the adaptive training arrangements will be available in the Regatta office following this meeting.

Adaptive Classifications

All adaptive athletes racing at the 2010 Australian Rowing Championships will be required to hold a valid classification prior to the start of racing. Athletes requiring classification should contact Matt Bialkowski at the NRCE to conform a booking time

If you have an Intellectual Disability, you will be required to provide the classifiers with your INAS-FID or AUSRAPID classification documentation to be classified by

Rowing Australia. If you have a Visual Impairment, you will be required to provide the classifiers with a completed FISA Adaptive Rowing Vision Qualification Form, which can be downloaded from the Rowing Australia website as an inclusion in the Rowing Australia Classification Policy, ensuring that it is signed and stamped by a qualified Ophthalmologist to certify your classification.

The classification session will be conducted on Tuesday 2 March, 2010 in the medical room in the main building near the finish line.

Start and Results Lists

Start and results lists will be available at the Regatta Office. They will also be posted on notice boards around the venue

Competition Rules

The 2010 updated RA Rules of Racing are in force during the 2010 Australian Rowing Championships. Team managers should refer to the RA Rule Book anytime they are not sure about procedures that may influence their team. Rule Books will be available at the Regatta Office.

Coaches and Managers are required to attend all information briefings. Technical Delegates/President of the Jury/Organising Committee may require

Racing Uniform

All clothing must also be in accordance with the requirements of Rule 44 concerning athlete's uniform.

Each member of a Club or School, or of a composite crew in the case of a Club or Institute crew competing in a RA Event, shall wear the registered racing colours of such crew member's Club, Institute or School when racing in regattas under the auspices of RA.

Each member of a Club or school competing in an RA Event shall wear the racing uniform of their Club or school. Except as provided for composite crews, members of the same crew shall compete in identical racing uniform.

If any member of a crew wears visible garments under their racing uniform, then the garment worn by those crew members must be identical in colour except for permitted sponsor identifications which shall nonetheless be identical within each crew. Where an

athlete chooses to wear a garment, the remainder of the crew will have to option on whether to wear that garment. The sleeve or leg length of the garment may vary between crew members.

If any members of a crew wear headwear, then the headwear worn by those crew members shall be uniform.

Note: For the Finals races (Fri/Sat/Sun), special requirements may be enforced to enhance the Live Internet WCSN coverage. Information will be distributed widely closer to the event and at the venue.

Nationals Media Coverage

Rowing Australia and WCSN are delighted to announce that athletes, coaches and supporters will be able to view and record all races on Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th March, LIVE and absolutely FREE. All events, including the Interstate Regatta and Kings' Cup, will be streamed live over the Internet, as part of WCSN's free subscriptions for the entire month of March.

Media Catamaran

Competitors and Coaches take note that on the Finals days, a media Catamaran from WCSN (World Championship Sports Network) will be following races in the first 1000 meters of racing – off the course.

Progression to the final

Athletes and Coaches are cautioned to take note of the progression to the next round of racing prior to the start of each race. Certain weather conditions or circumstances may alter the progression from round to round.

**Generally, athletes are recommended to give their best performance each race to ensure their best position should conditions require the system to be altered. In such case, the Organising Committee will give competitors ample notice before changes are made.*

RA Rules of Racing will apply, (see rules 76)

Medal Ceremonies

The Medal Ceremony will take place near the finish line on land, immediately after the end of each A Final in a pre-determined pattern. First, second and third place finishers will participate in the Medal Ceremony.

Copies of the Medal Ceremony procedure will be distributed to Team Managers and coaches and available in the Regatta Centre.

Protocol:

The Medal winners participating in the Medal Ceremony are required to be neatly dressed in their official racing uniform, or Club/State tracksuit.

Finals days will be televised

Water Traffic Rules

These directions should be read in conjunction with the Maps displayed in this program and at the venue on Notice Boards throughout the Boat Park.

The Goulburn River is closed to all rowers for the duration of the Nationals. Crews may train on the Lake only.

Training

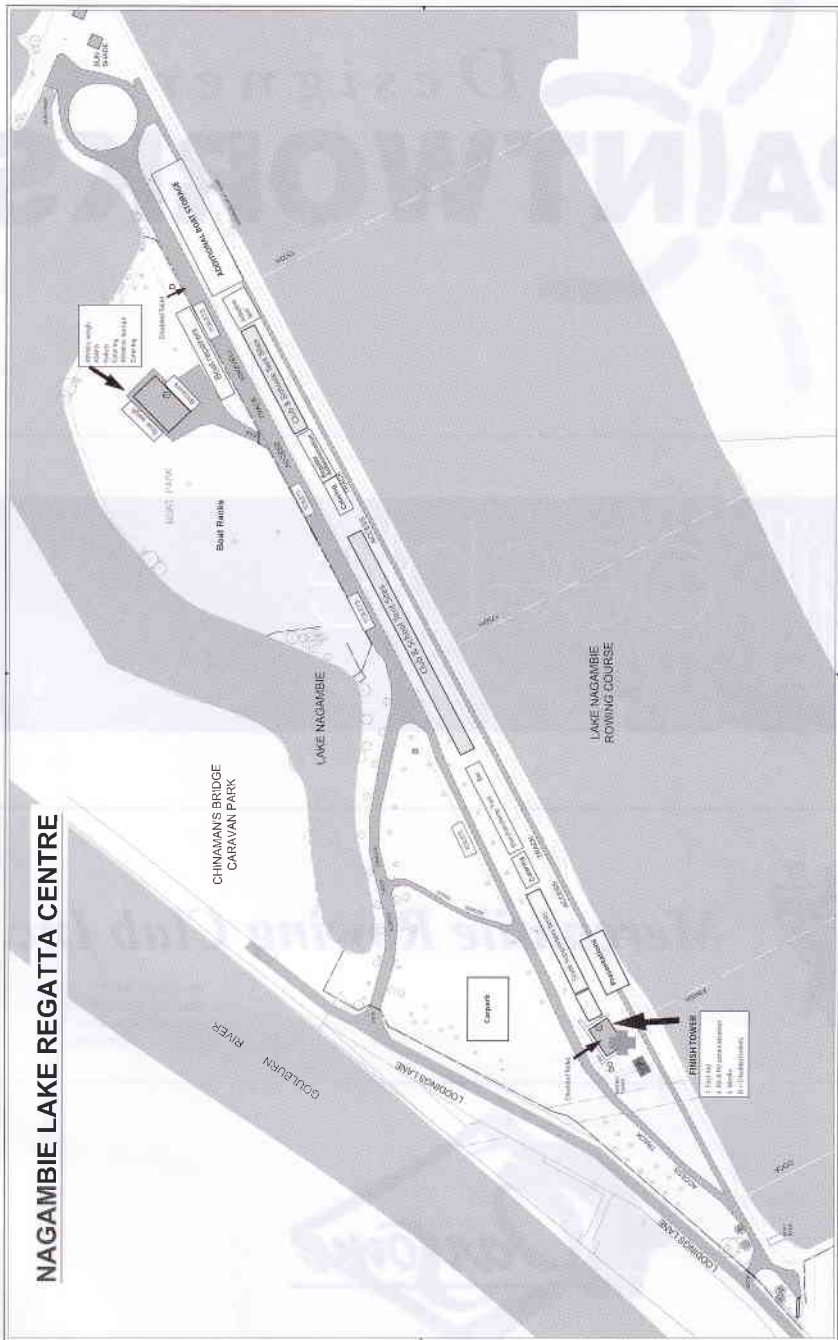
- During racing training is permitted on the warm up circuit
- During the training periods (before and after racing) training is only permitted on the course itself.
- On competition days the course will be closed for training from 30 minutes prior to the starting time of the first race and for 30 mins after the final race but is permitted in the warm up zone.
- Traffic flow on the competition course generally follows a 'clockwise' direction.
- The start is at the Nagambie end of the lake.
- Once departing from the boat park, crews shall travel to the start off the course proper until they reach the 100m mark from the start
- A safety marshal will then direct crews onto the course to return to the finish.

- Travel from the start to finish is in lanes 1 - 4
- Return to the start on the northern side of the course in lanes 6 - 8 (or when returning to the boat rack area).
- Lane 5 is a 'no row' or neutral safety lane
- Crews must turn beyond the finish line around the turning buoy
- Crossing the course into a lane will only be permitted in the first 100 metres from the start platform

Traffic Rules During Competition Periods

- On competition days the course will be closed for training from 30 minutes prior to the starting time for the first event and for 30 minutes after the final race.
- Traffic traveling towards the start from launch area will follow the line of buoys towards the start and warm-up area; note the 'wreck' which is marked by hazard buoys The 'warm up' area, north of the course, is a busy area.
- Crews must move in an anticlockwise direction around the warm-up triangle.
- The area adjacent to the starting pontoon in front of Nagambie Rowing Club is out of bounds for training and warming up
- Once crews proceed into the start area they cannot return to the 'warm up' area
- Crews must wait for the previous race to clear the 100m zone and at the direction of the starter move into their lanes
- Crews may practice in their own lane before the start of their race between the start and the 500m mark provided there is adequate time before the start and provided they obtain approval from the starter
- Crews should be at the 100 metre zone at least five (5) minutes prior to the start time of their race. They must be attached to their boat holder at the start two (2) minutes prior to the start time of their race. Failure to do so will result in the issue of a "yellow card"
- Crews preparing for a race shall have absolute priority of launching areas over crews proceeding out for a training row
- Once the race is complete all crews must go around the yellow buoy at the finish line and return along the transit lane between lane 1 and the land in front of the spectator area. (pay attention to on-coming races and to the adaptive rowing pontoon at the 1500m mark)

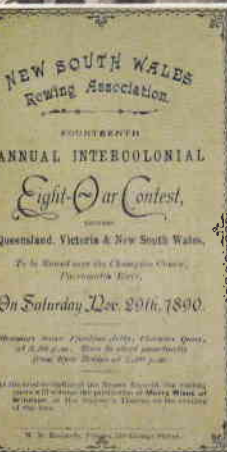
