To those who represent Australia in our powerful crews at the London Olympics later this year, good luck in your endeavours for rowing glory.

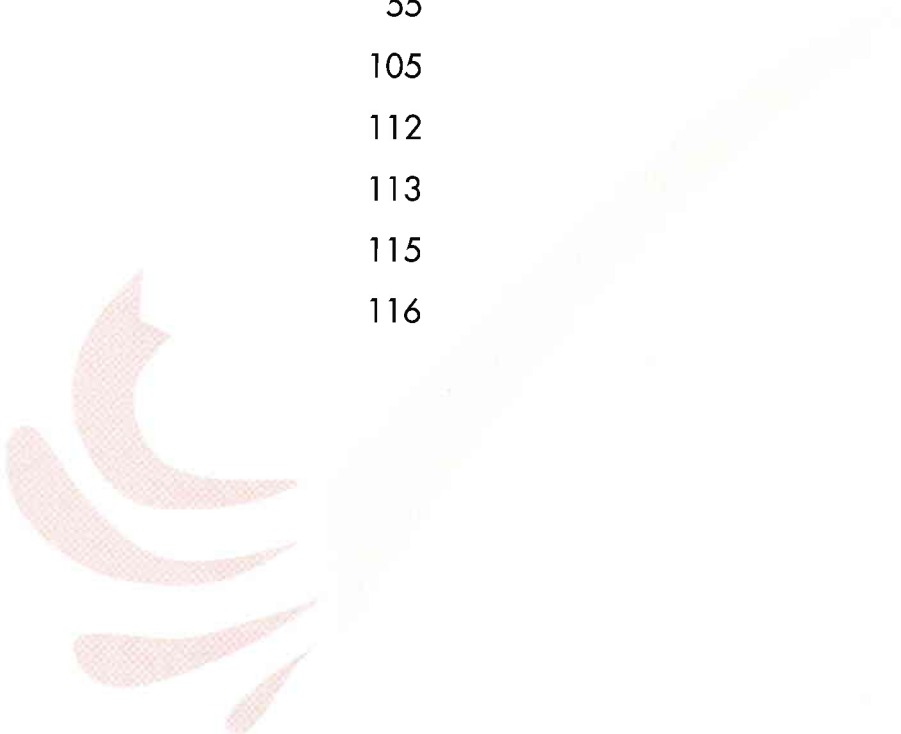

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ROWING WA WELCOME



The Western Australian Rowing fraternity welcomes competitors, coaches, officials, supporters and spectators to the 2012 Australian Rowing Championships. This is the first Australian Rowing Championships to be held in Western Australia since 1995, and the first in the Perth metropolitan area since 1983.

Rowing WA is pleased to host an Open Australian Rowing Championship on Champion Lakes, Armadale for the first time, the fourth site in this State used for the Event. The sites of previous events over the past 106 years have been the Swan River three mile (Applecross - Narrows) course, the Canning River, and Wellington Dam, Collie.

In excess of \$34 million has been spent by the Western Australian Government on the Champion Lakes Regatta Centre developed by the Armadale Redevelopment Authority in part as an exercise in urban renewal. The Centre has been built to World Rowing's specifications.

To mark the occasion of the first Open Australian Rowing Championships at the venue, a commemorative medallion has been struck and will be presented to each athlete

registered to compete at the Event and named coach. Thanks to Armadale Redevelopment Authority and its successor the Metropolitan Redevelopment Authority for sponsorship of the medals.

To our many sponsors and volunteers, thank you for your support which has assisted the conduct of the Event without greater financial impost on competitors and spectators.

I extend thanks to my fellow Rowing Australia Councillors for the encouragement and support they have offered to the return of the Event to Western Australia. The Organising Committee has been gratified by the willing support, advice and access to resources it has received from many of the State Rowing Offices, as well as the generosity of those who have travelled from New Zealand, Tasmania, Queensland, Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia and the ACT to offer their expertise or services to the Event

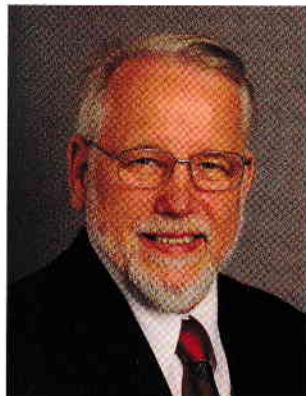

Champion Lakes in Armadale is a spectacular water course of international-standard.

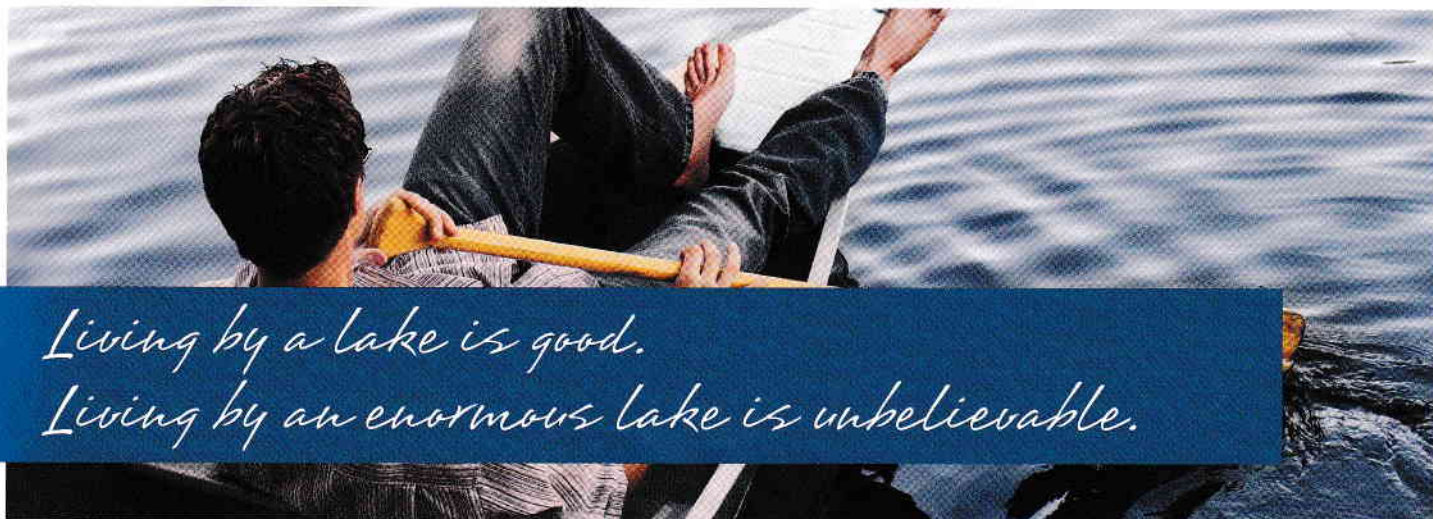

This is an exciting time for Australian Rowing, both on and off the water. The event will be named the Sydney International Rowing Regatta and I am delighted that we will be able to incorporate elite International races, Australian title races and National school titles into the one event. It will be the first time in the history of world rowing a Samsung World Rowing Cup will be held in the Southern Hemisphere. Furthermore, Rowing Australia was also awarded the right to host the 2014 FISA World Masters Regatta at Lake Wendouree, Ballarat, home of the rowing regatta for the 1956 Olympic Games. We are very excited at what lies ahead and we look forward to delivering these wonderful events to the Australian rowing community.

The continued growth and success of our sport could not occur without the support of our corporate partners. In particular I would like to thank the Australian Sports Commission, Australian Olympic Committee, State Institutes and Academies of Sport, State Associations, the rowing clubs throughout Australia and all rowers young and old for their ongoing commitment to Australian rowing.

THE ROSS BROWN REPORT

In March 2012, Champion Lakes plays host to the Interstate Regatta for the first time and the standard of racing will be second to none as Australia's leading athletes gear up for the London Olympics. Following Australia's most successful World Championships at Lake Bled in 2011, it will be an amazing opportunity to watch a host of World and Olympic champions battle it out to lead their State to victory.

- **The Nell Slatter Trophy – Women's Single Scull**

Featuring Kim Crow (VIC) and Kerry Hore (TAS) from the World Silver Medal Double Scull pitted against one another, the first race of the Interstate regatta, the Women's Single Scull, will start racing off with a bang. They won't have it all their own way though, with previous winner Sally Kehoe (QLD) hoping to extend Queensland's five year winning run. Form from recent regattas would suggest Crow will start as a slight favourite.

- **The President's Cup – Men's Single Scull**

The depth of Australia's men's sculling squad will be on show in the President's Cup. Beijing Olympic Gold Medalist David Crawshay (VIC) has taken the title on three previous occasions for Victoria, but Crawshay will have to overcome his crewmate [from the men's double scull] Scott Brennan (TAS) and World Champion Chris Morgan (SA). The race is bound to be a great battle of the big men, with a fourth win for Crawshay.

- **The Victoria Cup – Women's Lightweight Quad Scull**

The lightweight events are the best chance of a big result for the home crowd. After a strong showing in 2011, the Western Australian girls have a great chance to take out the Victoria Cup, but they will need to overcome last year's winners, Queensland, whose crew includes super-mum Hannah Every-Hall. Some great talent in the Tassie quad, Alice McNamara lining up for Victoria and Bronwen Watson out of retirement for New South Wales, means the field will be tightly bunched.

- **The Penrith Cup – Men's Lightweight Coxless Four**

The Penrith Cup will see another edition of the Tasmania v Western Australia rivalry that has produced some exceptional racing in recent memory. No fewer than nine current World Champions will line up in the race this year. Tassie will start as favourites, but the Western Australian crew have some new blood on board and nothing to lose in front of a home crowd. Again, the depth of the field will make the fight to get on the dias a tight one, with Queensland my tip to take Bronze.

- **The Bicentennial Trophy – Women's U21 Eight**

The Youth 8 events can be difficult to pick a winner, but after a strong performance last year and a crew full of National representatives, the Queensland crew look hard to beat in the Bicentennial Cup. New South Wales are likely to improve on last year's performance to take a medal with WA not far behind.

- **The Wilkinson Cup – Men's U21 Eight**

Victoria have an impressive record in the Wilkinson Cup, but NSW have plenty of talent on board this year. A number of past national junior team members will give them the depth to take the win. South Australia finished fourth last year with a young crew and could be the big improvers this year. A tailwind will bring the Western Australian crew into the mix with some talented lightweights in their boat.

- **The Queen's Cup – Women's Eight**

It is hard to go past Victoria to take out the Queen's Cup for the 8th straight year. With plenty of experience, they will be hard to beat. Queensland has closed the gap in recent years and should provide some solid opposition.

- **The King's Cup – Men's Eight**

The King's Cup will be a two horse race. The New South Wales and Victorian combinations are loaded to the brim with talent - it is hard to make a call either way. New South Wales have been impressive in their past four wins with great boat moving ability, while Victoria has a host of Olympic Medalists in their line-up. This one should be a nail biter! My tip - New South Wales by a canvas.

The National Rowing Centre for Overview of the Australian Senior Team in 2011 and Hopes for 2012

ANDREW MATHESON, NATIONAL HIGH PERFORMANCE DIRECTOR:

- Five months to the Olympic Games
- 6 Months to the Paralympic Games
- 2011 strongest showing every of an Australian Senior A team at the World Championships with 2nd overall on the medal table.
- Total of 10 medals; 5 Olympic class medals, 2 Paralympic class medals and 3 non-Olympic class medals
- Additionally qualified 10 boats for the London Olympic Games and 2 for the Paralympic Games.
- Most outstanding boats were the LM4- with a very dominant display winning the event for the first time in decades, the M4x being the first time this event has been won by a Australia (and first time for a non-European nation), and an exciting race by the LM8+ to push past the Italians to snatch victory.
- The lightweight men created a very unique double; winning the LM4- and the LM8+
- M4- bronze and saw the successful return of one of Australia's most successful rowers Drew Ginn return to the team and onto the podium
- M8+ trading blows with the top crews throughout the regatta, and now within striking distance of dais
- Strong showing from the women's program; with silver in W2x and getting ever closer to the gold medal, the bronze in W2- was a great effort with a late change in the crew due to medical reasons, 4th in W4x and 5th in LW2x also places us within medal striking distance
- Non-Olympic silver in W4- with good fight against eventual winners USA
- Performance of the team clearly demonstrates not only the athletic talent we have but equally the world class coaching talent driving these results
- Critical time now for us working through the Olympic

and Paralympic selection process; athletes in good physical shape and selectors with the help of the respective category coaches working through the final crew configurations.

- Our Under 23 and Junior teams continue to be a strong focus in ensuring our talent continues to train and develop effectively and ultimately grow in line with international performance standards
- We continue to push hard with identifying and effectively developing our future talent; both athletes and coaches. This is enhanced by creation of state based HP Development Coordinators, and more recently with the employment of Jaime Fernandez as the National Coaching Development Manager tasked with driving coaching development to a new level.
- We continue to benefit from the strong backing from the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Institute of Sport, and all our State Institute and State Academy partners – our program just couldn't operate without this.
- An additional note of thanks must go to all the NRCE team from administration, to sports science and sports medicine, plus our touring personal such and team managers and medical and sports science personnel – they are all critical to our success.

LYALL MCCARTHY, NATIONAL WOMEN'S HEAD COACH:

Australian Women's Olympic Shadow team report.

- The strong 2011 performance at the world championships in Bled by the Heavyweight Women's sculling squad winning silver in the Women's Double Scull of Kim Crow and Kerry Hore, and a fourth in the Women's Quad scull of Sally Kehoe, Brooke Pratley, Sarah Cook and Amy Clay form the base of a solid campaign in London. Added to the squad, strong performances by Dana Faletic (2003 world quad sculling champion, and Olympic Bronze medalist), Pippa Savage returning to form, previous World Champions in sweep Pauline Frasca and Robyn Selby

Smith have all pushed their way into contention for seats in the boats for London giving our team a healthy boost.

- Similarly our Lightweight squad has grown and with LW4x gold medalist Bronwen Watson back on the scene along with up and coming U23 medalist Ella Flecker from Tassie pushing the 2011 double that came 5th in Bled of Hannah Every Hall and Alice McNamarra. We should see a great crew emerge from trialling to fight for the medals in Eton.
- The Women's pair squad comprises last years Bronze medal crew of Sarah Tait on bow side and Kate Hornsey and Phoebe Stanley fighting it out for the stroke seat. The boat has had a solid preparation to date and looks on track for a strong Olympics.

NOEL DONALDSON, NATIONAL MEN'S HEAD COACH:

Australian Men's Olympic Shadow team report.

- As a very positive lead in to the London Olympic Games the male rowers in our Senior A Team had an excellent World Championships at Lake Bled, Slovenia in 2011.
- Two firsts occurred for two of our crews who came first! The Lightweight Men's Coxless Four were the first Australians

to win this event since it became a World Championship event. The Men's Quad were the first non European crew to win this event in its history. With a Gold Medal to our Lightweight Men's eight we now have 12 new lightweight World Champions, a remarkable achievement. The Men's Coxless Four won Bronze, The Men's Coxed Pair won silver. 23 men were on the podium and 11 more were in 4th place giving us good depth to work with in 2012.

- Six of the available eight boats qualified for the London Olympics with a chance that the remaining two may also be in our sights at the Qualification Regatta in Lucern in May.
- Currently there are 36 men on the Shadow Team list. They are all training very hard and at the end of March they will compete for a place in the final team where the maximum number of Olympic places is 28 men. No doubt there will be pressure to make the team.
- Our targeted boats for this Olympiad have remained consistent – the M2x, M4x, LM4-, M4- and M8+. All are aiming for the high point on the Olympic podium and from recent camps and competition all are heading in the right direction.



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AUSTRALIAN ROWING HISTORY

Rowing in Australia has a rich and exciting past. We are committed to the recording, preservation and honouring of this rich history. In partnership with Rowing Australia, we are seeking to establish a national rowing archive as a precursor, hopefully, to a national rowing museum.

We are aware that there exists in Australia a comprehensive range of invaluable resources in the form of documents, journals, reports, programs, books, photographs, audio-visual materials, artifacts, equipment, clothing and memorabilia that needs, before not too much longer, to be catalogued and collected for posterity lest, potentially, it is lost forever. We have therefore begun an audit of all rowing materials and artifacts that not only state associations, rowing clubs and aficionados but also the public at large may currently have in their possession.

We are not at this stage specifically requesting donations of this material, but we are keen to create the opportunity for the national rowing fraternity to accurately list and record items that may either contain valuable information or be worthy of preservation and exhibition. It would then be our hope that in due course we can make such materials available for public presentation.

We are aware that there exists within the Australia rowing fraternity a significant number of history enthusiasts willing and able to assist us in achieving our aims. We look forward to hearing from as many of them as possible.

Essentially, we are embarking on a project that will provide not only a greater understanding and appreciation of the history of our sport, its culture and heritage, but also a valuable research resource that will ensure its many facets are appropriately recognised, accommodated and celebrated. Between us we have the opportunity to provide a much fuller picture of our past than currently exists. We hope this will encourage similar endeavours into the future and provide for generations to come greater insight, analysis and interpretation. We invite all members of Australia's rowing fraternity to be part of our quest. Those attending the National Regatta might like to visit a small display we have established at the course.

HISTORY OF THE AUSTRALIAN ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS

50th anniversary of the first World Championships

2012 marks two significant anniversaries, the 50th anniversary of the first World Championships and the 50th anniversary of the National Championships (as opposed to the Interstate Championships).

The idea of holding a World Rowing Championship had been discussed at an international level for some time before the first such championship was held in 1962. The annual European Championships conducted since 1892, were regarded as the unofficial world championships until that date. The idea of a World Championship was conceived by a former President of FISA, Gaston Mullegg (SUI) during his presidency from 1949 until his untimely death in 1958.

At the 50th FISA Congress in Amsterdam in 1954, the President of the American federation expressed the hope that the World Championships would be instituted by 1958. In 1955, at the FISA Congress, it was suggested that the championships be organised within the following four years, and the delegates unanimously instructed FISA to pursue the feasibility of this proposal.

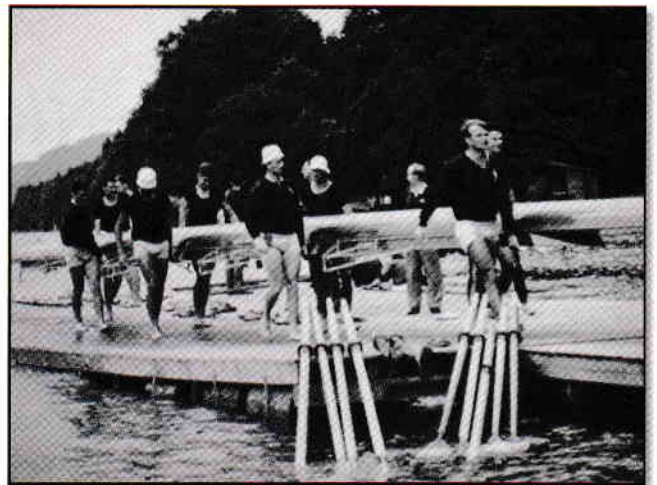
More discussion was held in 1956 at the 52nd FISA Congress and the Americans proposed they hold the first world championship in Philadelphia in 1958, inviting the first two place getters in each event from the European championships. The Romanian and Soviet federations, however, hoped that every nation would have the opportunity to enter, irrespective of its European championships performance. Agreement was not reached and the debate adjourned.

The Americans withdrew from organising the 1958 World Championships at the 53rd FISA Congress in 1957. FISA was to draw up contingency plans, but they were put on hold following the tragic death of Gaston Mullegg, FISA President, in an aeroplane accident on 3rd August 1958. He never lived to see

the inauguration of the world championships which he had so strongly supported. Eventually, at the FISA Congress on 23rd November 1958 in Vienna, it was agreed that World Championships would be conducted. Final approval for the holding of such championships every four years was postponed until 1961 to give all federations the opportunity to make their views known.

The 1958 Congress saw the election of Thomas Keller to the FISA Presidency, which he retained until his death in 1989. In his book, *The Story of World Rowing*, Christopher Dodd writes, "Chance put Keller into the chair at a time when survival, let alone expansion, of the sport and the future shape of competitive and amateur rowing required some hard decisions."

At the 55th FISA Congress in 1959 held in Macon, France, it was decided that the first World Rowing Championships would be held in 1962. Australia, Denmark and Switzerland offered to conduct the event. Switzerland was the successful bidder for the inaugural World Championships, having the event awarded to it at the 56th FISA Congress in 1960. The venue was to be the Rotsee in Lucerne.



The Australian Eight in Lucerne in 1962

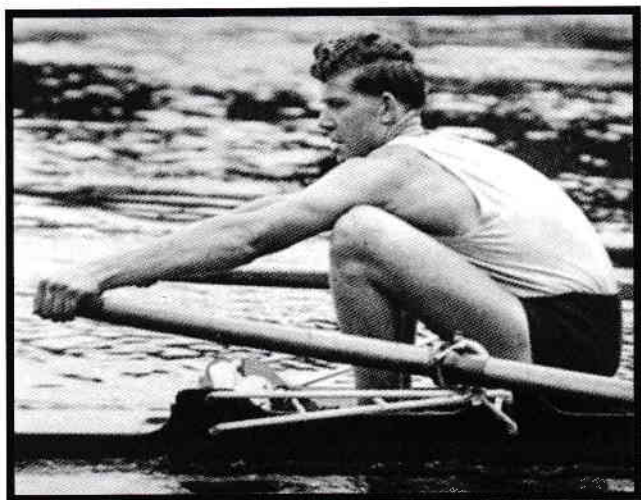
In 1961 the FISA Congress decided that the World Championships would be held every four years. The Championships for open men were conducted every four years from 1962 until 1974 when, thereafter, they were held annually, except for Olympic years. World Championships for women commenced in 1974 and have likewise been conducted every year except in Olympic years.

World Championships for lightweight men and women were first conducted in 1985 and have been held annually since then. FISA Championships were held annually for lightweight men from 1974 to 1984.

50th Anniversary of the first National Championships

Whilst Interstate and Intercolonial Championships were conducted between crews and scullers representing their States in various forms from 1862, and test races were conducted amongst crews across Australia for national selection, the National Inter-Club Championships only commenced in 1962.

The first proposal for a National Championship was submitted by NSW at the AARC meeting in 1946 and it failed to gain support outside NSW. A second proposal was submitted by NSW to the AARC on 21st April 1948 in Tasmania. Kevyn Webb of NSW was the person behind these proposals. He recorded in 1982: *Following the 1948 Olympic trials, I gained another important supporter in Ray Todd, famous oarsman and coach, and Melbourne Herald rowing writer, who by his support in Victoria, drew attention to the fact that Australia, unlike the rest of the rowing world, still did not have a National Open Rowing Championship.* The 1948 proposal was supported only by NSW and Victoria and so was lost. The proposal suggested 2000 metre racing over two days in single and double sculls, coxed and coxless pair, coxed four, eight, lightweight four, lightweight single and lightweight maiden eights – all men.

In 1982 Kevyn Webb then described the process through to eventual success in 1961: *Notices of motion to conduct such an Open Championship, appeared on the Agenda of the Australian Rowing Council, at each of its meetings up to 1960. During this period, all of the States voted in favour of the National Regatta's introduction, however, in any one of those years, only three of the six States voted "yes" at one time. There was never a clear majority. My greatest disappointment came at one Australian Rowing Council meeting when the Regatta's introduction seemed certain, with a 3:2 majority, and N.S.W. to vote, the N.S.W. delegate claimed he had no instructions on how to vote from his State and cast a negative vote, to maintain the "Status Quo". As Captain of the Olympic Rowing Team in Rome in 1960, I had the opportunity to "corner" the Australian Team Manager, Reg Blundstone, (who was also Secretary of the Australian Rowing Council) and as a result, on our return to Australia, I was officially requested to prepare a comprehensive report for the A.R.C. on how a National Regatta could be introduced. That report was tabled at the 1961 Australian Rowing Council meeting, and following its adoption, the six States voted unanimously to hold the first National Championship Regatta on Lake Wendouree at Ballarat, in 1962.*

In his extensive report, Kevyn Webb concluded that Australia needed a two day regatta every two years at Easter over 2000 metres comprising men's events in single and double sculls, coxed and coxless pairs, coxed and coxless fours and eights. Men's lightweight events in single sculls, coxed four and eights were also recommended.

The National Championships became an annual event in 1974. The Australian Women's Rowing Council conducted their first National Championships events in 1968 and thereafter conducted the event annually. The men's and women's associations merged in 1979 but jointly conducted their Championships from 1976.



History of the Interstate Championships

Early History of the Intercolonial Four-Oared Racing

Although earlier international races were conducted between crews from ships visiting Australia, the first inter colonial amateur racing took until 1833. The following early history of intercolonial competition is provided by John Lang in his book *The Victorian Oarsman* published in 1919:

Before 1878, various boat races between the Australian Colonies had taken place in four-oared gigs, but in the year 1878 the first boat race in eights, between any of the Colonies, was rowed when Victoria defeated New South Wales.

The earliest race recorded between crews of different colonies was conducted on 9 November 1833 when a Sydney crew defeated a Hobart Town crew in whalers. The race was very popular and caused quite a stir.

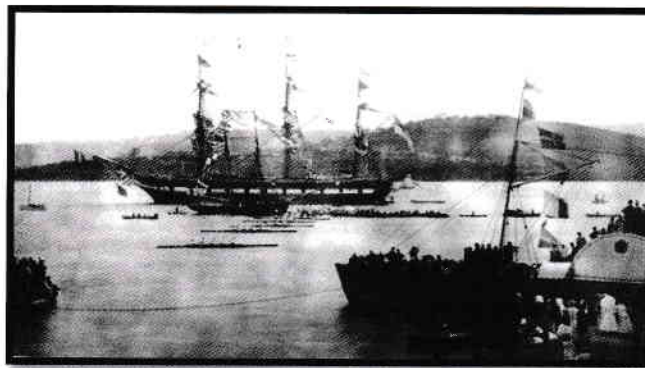
However the earliest Intercolonial amateur boat race with a distinct Intercolonial character was rowed in 1863 in gigs over a three-mile course on the Parramatta River, N.S.W. The N.S.W. four defeated Victoria (time, 19 min. 25 sec.). In this race the crews were of a representative character, and each crew bore the name of its colony. The Victorian crew was made up of members from the Elswick, Melbourne, and Melbourne University Clubs.

After the race the differences about the amateur status of oarsmen in the two Colonies became accentuated, Victoria alleging the New South Wales crew was to all intents and purposes watermen, having rowed against watermen and for money prizes. The Victorian definition excluded both sorts of oarsmen from amateur competition.

For some years this break continued, preventing competition by crews really representing the Colonies, though club crews frequently raced in Intercolonial matches, the crews being club crews charged more or less with a mission to win the honours for their Colony.

In 1870 a race took place at the Balmain Regatta, N.S.W., which the New South Wales crew won against Tasmanian crews, Victoria not being represented.

In 1872 a race was rowed over a five-mile course on the Derwent River, Tasmania, the Sydney Rowing Club winning against the Parramatta Rowing Club, some Hobart Club crews, and one from the Barwon Rowing Club, the time for, the course being 36 min. 30 sec.

The same year over a 7,000-yard course on Sydney Harbour, two crews from the Sydney Rowing Club beat a Victorian crew (of an Intercolonial character, the crew being composed of members of various clubs, among whom were members of the Civil Service, University, and Melbourne Rowing Clubs). The 1872 regatta was a highlight of early colonial life with some 20,000 spectators watching the event and much press coverage.

Next year (1873) Victoria secured the first win with another non-club four (Melbourne, Melbourne University and Warehousemen). The other crews in the race were club crews, comprising two from Ballarat, a Sydney Rowing Club crew, and crews from Hobart Town and Geelong. The race was rowed over about four miles on the Lower Yarra — time, 25 min. 30 sec. This race is generally recognised as the first "official" Intercolonial match.

After much debate between Victoria and New South Wales over the amateur definition, a race was organized in 1874 over the Parramatta championship course, 3 miles 300 yards; time, 21 min: 59 sec. New South Wales won easily before a crowd of some 15,000 spectators and much press coverage.

For some years after this no such meetings took place until, at the New South Wales Regatta, 1888, a Victorian four, which Mr. George E. Upward stroked, beat New Zealand, New South Wales, and Tasmania in that order. The last of the Intercolonial four-oared races was rowed (in outriggers) on the Parramatta in 1896, over 2.25 miles; Victoria first, New Zealand second, New South Wales third.

John Lang writes that:

The 1873 and 1874 gig races were the first races of a character where the crews were representing their respective colonies, the other events before this date being more or less competitions between clubs or combination crews from the various colonies.

Early History of the Event

The following early history of this event is related in John Lang's Book *The Victorian Oarsman* published in 1919: *In October, 1877, the year in which eight-oared boats may be said to have first come into general use in many of the rowing centres in Australia, a challenge was sent by the Victorian Rowing Association to the Sydney and Mercantile [now Mosman] Clubs in New South Wales. This was taken up with spirit by the last-named club, and the first eight-oared race took place on the 6th March, 1878, over about four miles on the Lower Yarra, from Stony Creek up round what is now "The Old River" to the Gas Works.*

For about two-thirds of the distance the race was very interesting. At a quarter-mile Victoria was leading by a half-length. At the Sugar Works Victoria led by a clear length. Rounding the bend at the junction of the Saltwater River the New South Wales crew came up like a racehorse, and looked as if they would go right away. Victoria spurted, and for half a mile the boats rowed level. After that the Victorians

went, gradually ahead, the pace having told more on the other crew. The New South Wales men pressed Victoria again half a mile from the finish, but were unable to catch up, and Victoria won by two lengths. No official or reliable time was taken.

The Intercolonial Boat Race, rowed regularly every year until war broke out, is one of the chief rowing championships of the world. In no other country is there regular annual competition in rowing between six great centres so far separated as Brisbane and Perth, with 3476.25 miles of railway between them: Victoria has got a great proportion of the wins, and until recent years time after time brought home the Australian Championship. Lately the Victorian flag has been displaced by the colours of Tasmania (1906, 1909, 1914), New South Wales (1908, 1910, 1911), and South Australia (1913).

The 1906 Interstate programme the writer provides some suggestions why the race is so great. "The word 'greatest' is used advisedly. Rowing never has been able to get a 'gate', and the rowing associations throughout Australia are poor — terribly poor — so that to send crews thousands of miles every year is a tremendous achievement.

If determination and enthusiasm makes a thing great, then the Interstate eight race must be so counted. If the severe training, and personal sacrifice of the 40 or 50 athletes in the race, without any hope of reward — not even a 'tin pot' — make a contest great, then the Interstate is again so.

And if strength and skill, combined with grit and gentlemanly attributes, characterize a set of sportsmen and make their competition great, assuredly is the championship race great.

The history of it is a record of clean sport, and a monument to the survival of pure amateurism. The breadth of scandal has never tarnished the bright escutcheon of amateur rowing in Australia, and the Interstate race holds the proudest place among the many proud records emblazoned on the banner. And long may it so continue.

May the best crew always win and may rowing and the Interstate contests last as long as Australia is a land of sport."

Interstate Men's Eight Oared Championship for the King's Cup



First won in 1919 at the Henley-on-Thames Regatta held on 2nd to 4th July of that year, this handsome trophy, a substitution for the Grand Challenge Cup race for that year, was presented by His Majesty King George V to the successful AIF No 1 crew which, along with seven others, contested the eight-oared race for competition between crews from the armies of the Allies in the 1914 -18 War.

"The successful crew defeated the AIF No 2 crew in the first heat, Cambridge University in the semi-final and Oxford University in the final by a margin of one length in a time of 7 minutes 7 seconds, the other competitors being Canada, France, New Zealand and United States

"The famous trophy was left in the custody of the Australian Military Authorities, and was later handed over to the Australian War Memorial Council and placed in the Australian War Museum.

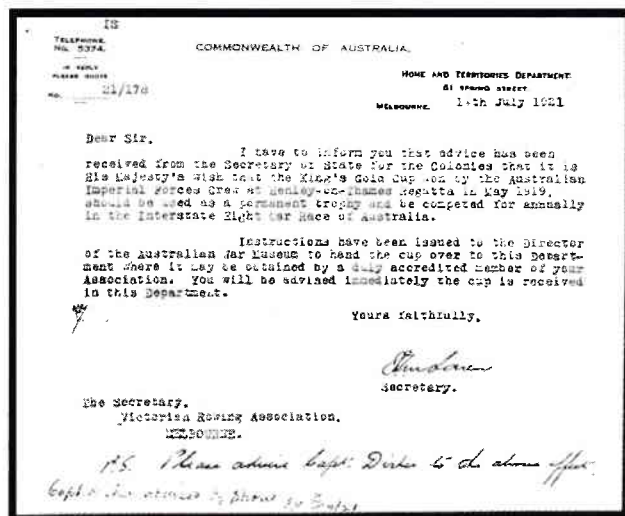
"On 14th May, 1920, at a conference of delegates of the Australian Rowing Associations held in Brisbane, it was decided to ask the Australian War Memorial Council for the Cup as a perpetual trophy for the Australian Eight-Oared Championship. This request

was refused, and on 12th October of the same year a further request was made by the Victorian Rowing Association for the Cup with the suggestion that it be kept in the Australian War Museum of the State which won the race each year. This request was also refused.

"The second refusal precipitated further action by the Victorian Rowing Association, and a petition to the King prepared by it dated 30th October 1920, and signed by Captain H C Disher, was sent to his Majesty with the request that he make known his wishes with regard to the disposal of the trophy.

"A reply dated 13th May 1921 received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr Winston Churchill, stated that, 'His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Race of Australia'.

The letter below formalized the transfer in July 1921.



The first Interstate Men's Eights Championship raced for the King's Cup was in 1922. However for the record, the sport and the trophy itself have recorded that crews raced for the Cup from 1920.

Interstate Women's Eight Oared Championship for the Queens Cup

The commencement of Interstate Women's competition is unclear but is thought to have started in 1912. However the first recognized championships occurred in 1920 when the Interstate Women's Four Championship was conducted in conjunction with the Interstate Men's Championships.

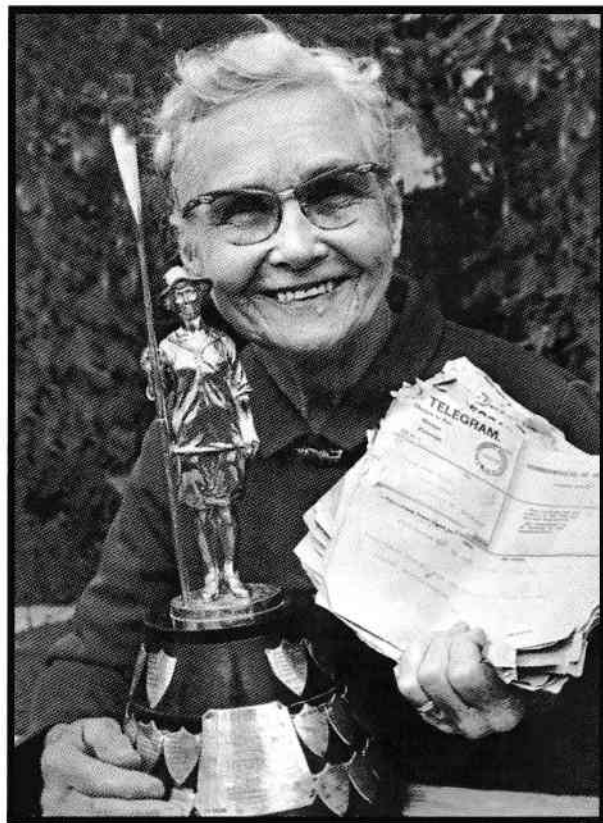
The Australian Women's Rowing Council was also established at these Championships. It is worth noting that the Australian Amateur Rowing Council was not formed until 1927.

ULVA Trophy

The 1920 Interstate Women's Four Championship was won by South Australia represented by a Mannum Rowing Club crew stroked by Dorothy Arnold. The United Licensed Victuallers Association (ULVA) of Queensland presented to the Australian Women's Rowing Council this unique sterling silver trophy. The trophy was crafted by London silversmiths to

depict Dorothy Arnold, the petite girl from Mannum who stroked the winning crew. She is holding her oar and dressed in the rowing garb of her time, namely a floppy hat, sailor top and billowing bloomers. The trophy is inscribed with the following words: *Interstate Ladies Four-Oared Championship*

Trophy Presented by Queensland Licensed Victuallers Association E H Ruddle Esq. President 1920.

The trophy is affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as *Bertha*. However in 1941, on the motion of NSW, the Australian Womens Rowing Council resolved to drop the name *Bertha* and that it be officially known as the ULVA Trophy. This change occurred only officially with the name *Bertha* still used by oarswomen.

In 1958, there was a brief discussion at the Australian Womens Rowing Council about the outmoded appearance of the trophy. Fortunately the majority of members disapproved of any alteration to modernise the dress of the model of the trophy.

In 2003, the trophy became officially known as the Queen Elizabeth II Trophy, or the Queens Cup. The original ULVA trophy remains the perpetual trophy.

There was an interesting lead up to the allocation of Queens Cup to the women’s eight oared Championship with the Queens Cup originally being destined for an international schoolboy regatta.

In 1993, Brisbane Boys’ College raced Eton in the final of the Princess Elizabeth Cup at Henley and won. This was the first time that an Australian Schoolboy Crew had won this prestigious event. In 1997 Simon Newcomb approached Dr Steve Hinchy (President of Rowing Australia) and asked for permission to approach Buckingham Palace and the Queen’s Private Secretary Sir Robert Fellowes as to whether Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II would be prepared to provide a trophy to be known as the Queen’s Cup for an annual International Schoolboy Race. The first race should take place to coincide with the centenary of Brisbane Boy’s College in 2002.

Simon Newcomb OAM of Brisbane continued to correspond with the Queen’s Private Secretary Sir Robert Fellowes, Buckingham Palace, Rowing Australia, Government House in Brisbane and also in Canberra. On 26th November 1999, the following response was received from Kevin Davidson, Senior Adviser to the Governor General:

Dear Dr Hinchy [then President of Rowing Australia],, I refer to your letter of 19th April 1999 to the official Secretary requesting Her Majesty The Queen’s consent to donate a perpetual trophy for an annual International schoolboy rowing event to be held in Australia. The Official Secretary has recently received formal advice that her majesty has consented to a Royal trophy to be called ‘The Queen Elizabeth Cup’ to be raced for in Australia by schoolboy crews from all over the world on an annual basis. Her Majesty is content for the first event to be held in Brisbane to coincide with the centenary celebrations of the Brisbane Boys’ College in 2002.

Rowing Australia subsequently determined that the trophy would be best allocated to the women’s eight event to provide some equity of regal trophies for men’s and women’s interstate eight oared championships and thus provide synergy with the Kings Cup.

In early 2001 approaches were made by Rowing Australia to the Governor General to have the trophy changed from an International Schoolboy Race to the Women’s Interstate Eight Oared Championship. The Queen provided her consent to this change which occurred in 2003.

Interstate Men's Sculling Championship for the President's Cup

Following the formation of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1925, the first President Mr EC Watchorn, a trustee of the Geo. Adams Estate controlling Tattersall's Sweep Consultations, donated the President's Cup as the perpetual trophy for the annual Australian Interstate Single Sculling Championship.

First competed for in 1926 and won by the Late A A Baynes of Queensland, some famous Australian Olympians have been the holders of this trophy. The records of these, all representing NSW, are well known:

- Henry (Bobby) Pearce, holder of the Cup on three occasions and Olympic Gold Medallist in 1928 and 1932,
- His cousin C A (Cecil) Pearce four times holder,
- Duncan Free six times holder and Olympic medallist in the quad scull, and
- M T (Mervyn) Wood, holder on eight occasions and Olympic gold, silver and bronze medallist in 1948, 1952 and 1956 respectively.

Perhaps the most unlucky sculler was G Squires from Tasmania who was placed second on seven

occasions, third on another and won the race only once in 1963.



The President's Cup

Interstate Women's Sculling Championship for the Nell Slatter Trophy

Dating back to 1901 at the Great Federation Regatta staged on Albert Park Lake, Cassie Woolly McRitchie representing Victoria and using a skiff loaned to her by the then Governor of Victoria, Lord Brassey, defeated her challenger from Sydney, Elizabeth Messenger, and was presented with a magnificent pearl and ruby bracelet by the Duke of Gloucester. So great was the public interest in the female scullers that police were required to keep the inquisitive spectators at bay.

Cassie McRitchie is justifiably known as the "mother" of Victorian women's rowing and as the founder of the first all women's rowing club at Albert Park in 1907. In 1973 at the great age of 96, she passed away.

Despite this great start to women's interstate sculling in 1901, the first interstate championship was not conducted until 1963 in Brisbane and has

continued annually since that date.

The Nell Slatter Trophy was presented by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association in 1963 to be the perpetual trophy for the Championship as a tribute to the then Queensland President Nell Slatter.

Interstate Men's Lightweight Four Championship for the Penrith Cup

The Interstate Lightweight Four Championship was introduced in 1958 after a long history of lightweight rowing within Australia.

The original weight restriction was for athletes who weighed no less than 140 lbs (63.6 kg). The weight limits have changed over time but since 1974 have mirrored those of FISA namely 72.5 kg maximum and 70 kg crew average.

The Penrith Cup was presented to the Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1958 by the Penrith City Council as the perpetual trophy for the event. The event was the pinnacle of a lightweight oarsman's career until 1974 when the first FISA Championships were conducted. The strength and depth of Australian lightweights was shown by a gold medal at the 1974 FISA Championships in the fours and the considerable success achieved by Australian lightweights ever since that time. The quality of winning crews of the Penrith Cup is consistently very high.

Interstate Women's Lightweight Quad Scull for the Victoria Cup

The first Women's Interstate Lightweight Four-Oared Championship was contested on the Yarra River in Melbourne on 28th April, 1968. The victory was recorded by Victoria with a crew stroked by one of Australia's best known oarswomen, Margaret Agnew Mackenzie, whose efforts in negotiating with the Women's Rowing Council, secured lightweight rowing as an annual event on the women's Interstate rowing programme.

The Victoria Cup, presented by the Victorian Ladies' Rowing Association, is the perpetual trophy for this event.

Lightweight women have recorded many international victories, the first being at the inaugural competition between the United States of America, Canada and Australia at St. Catherines, Canada, in 1979, when Australia was successful in

the two events for which crews were entered — Lightweight Four with Cox and Lightweight Pair.

From 1996, the event became coxless. In 1999, the change was made from coxless four to quad scull as most lightweight women's rowing was in sculling boats due to the introduction of an Olympic women's lightweight double sculling event.

Interstate Men's Youth Eight Championship for the Noel Wilkinson Trophy

Recognising the necessity to introduce a class of rowing in which Australian youth oarsmen could compete, the Australian Rowing Council initiated the Interstate Youth Eight-Oared Championships at an age limit some 18 months older than the internationally accepted junior age limit.

The first Championship was conducted in Victoria in 1974, and in that same year, the Council accepted an offer by Noel Wilkinson to provide a perpetual trophy for the event. Noel was a great fundraiser for both Australian rowing teams and also for Australian Olympic teams. He was also a long serving Treasurer of the Australian Rowing Council.

The Youth Championships, combined with the junior events conducted in other boat classes at the National Championships, fulfills the original purpose of Council and the donor, namely to provide an incentive for young oarsmen to continue in the sport following completion of their secondary school education and a development step to higher classifications.

Interstate Women's Youth Eight Oared Championships for the Bicentennial Cup

A women's youth event was commenced in 1988 in coxed fours. The event became an eight oared event in 1994 due the continued growth in women's rowing and the need to provide more opportunities for these athletes.

The Cup was presented by the New South Wales Rowing Association and has the following words engraved on the Cup:

*For competition between Women's Interstate
Women's Fours.*

Rowing Australia Cup

This trophy was presented to Rowing Australia in 1999 by its then principal sponsor Zurich Financial Services for presentation to the State with the highest points scored from racing in each Interstate Championship.

- States are awarded points in each Interstate event on the following basis:
- First place: 8 points
 - Second place: 6 points
 - Third place: 5 points
 - Fourth place: 4 points
 - Fifth place: 3 points
 - Sixth place: 2 points
 - Seventh place: 1 point

The cup itself is one of only 500 in the world that were made from the sands collected by Olympians from every Olympic country in the world.

Naturally the cup is presented after the last Interstate Championship each year to the Councillor of the winning State.

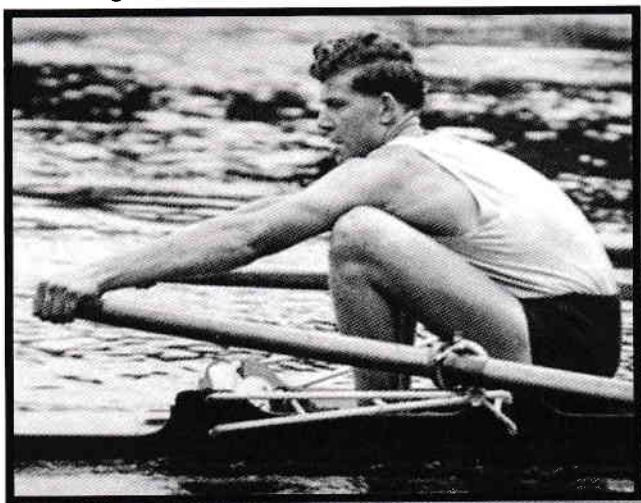

The History of the National Championships

Brief History

Whilst Interstate and Intercolonial Championships were conducted between crews and scullers representing their States in various forms from 1862, and test races were conducted amongst crews across Australia for national selection, the National Inter-Club Championships only commenced in 1962.

The first proposal for a National Championship was submitted by NSW at the AARC meeting in 1946 and it failed to gain support outside NSW. A second proposal was submitted by NSW to the AARC on 21st April 1948 in Tasmania. Kevyn Webb of NSW was the person behind these proposals. He recorded in 1982: *Following the 1948 Olympic trials, I gained another important supporter in Ray Todd, famous oarsman and coach, and Melbourne Herald rowing writer, who by his support in Victoria, drew attention to the fact that Australia, unlike the rest of the rowing world, still did not have a National Open Rowing Championship.* The 1948 proposal was supported only by NSW and Victoria and so was lost. The proposal suggested 2000 metre racing over two days in single and double sculls, coxed and coxless pair, coxed four, eight, lightweight four, lightweight single and lightweight maiden eights – all men.

In 1982 Kevyn Webb then described the process through to eventual success in 1961: *Notices of motion to conduct such an Open Championship, appeared on the Agenda of the Australian Rowing Council, at each of its meetings up to 1960. During this period, all of the States voted in favour of the National Regatta's introduction, however, in any one of those years, only three of the six States voted "yes" at one time. There was never a clear majority. My greatest disappointment came at one Australian Rowing Council meeting when the Regatta's introduction seemed certain, with a 3:2 majority, and N.S.W. to vote, the N.S.W. delegate claimed he had no instructions on how to vote from his State and cast a negative vote, to maintain the "Status Quo". As Captain of the Olympic Rowing Team in Rome in 1960, I had the opportunity to "corner" the Australian Team Manager, Reg Blundstone, (who was also Secretary of the Australian Rowing Council) and as a result, on our return to Australia, I was officially requested to prepare a comprehensive report for the A.R.C. on how a National Regatta could be introduced. That report was tabled at the 1961 Australian Rowing Council meeting, and following its adoption, the six States voted unanimously to hold the first National Championship Regatta on Lake Wendouree at Ballarat, in 1962.*

In his extensive report, Kevyn Webb concluded that Australia needed a two day regatta every two years at Easter over 2000 metres comprising men's events in single and double sculls, coxed and coxless pairs, coxed and coxless fours and eights. Men's lightweight events in single sculls, coxed four and eights were also recommended.

The National Championships became an annual event in 1974.

The Australian Women's Rowing Council conducted their first National Championships events in 1968 and thereafter conducted the event annually. The men's and women's associations merged in 1979 but jointly conducted their Championships from 1976.

National Championships Perpetual Trophies

Ted Bromley Memorial Trophy

Men's Coxless Pair Championship

The Ted Bromley Memorial Trophy was first presented in 2006 in honour of the Late Ted Bromley. Ted was a 1948 Olympic rower who championed coxless pair oared rowing in Australia from pre WWII until his death in 2005. Through his generous benefaction in creating the Bromley Trust Fund in 1990, he continues to support Australian representative crews and in particular coxless pair oared crews.

The Bromley trophy is a bronze statue depicting James Tonkins, who is Australia's most successful pair oared rower. James was of course Olympic Champion in the pair at the Athens Games in 2004. Prior to that, James was a World Champion in the coxless pair in both 1999 and 2003.

Women's Pair Championship

The women's pair oared championship is raced for the Carlton & United Brewing Plate, which was first presented in 1968. The names of past winners are engraved on the reverse of the trophy.

The first four championships were raced over 500 metres in coxed tub boats. Then in 1972, like all women's senior races, the race was competed over over 1000 metres and also coxless. The next step was to coxless rowing and finally in 1984 to racing over 2000 metres

Bob Aitken Memorial Trophy

Men's Coxless Four Championship

This trophy was first presented in 2006 to recognise Rowing Australia's first life member and inaugural elected President of Rowing Australia.

Bob Aitken had a distinguished and successful rowing career as an oarsman, coach, selector and administrator and made a significant contribution to the sport in all these areas.

He was a skillful stroke who won the biggest races of his day. He had a good eye for rowing skill, how a boat should travel through the water and a good knowledge of training. He was therefore for many years a successful school, club, state and national coach and selector.

In addition to his deep understanding and knowledge of the sport, he had a considerable intellect, unqualified integrity and impartiality and a great sense responsibility. These qualities made him a respected administrator and of course an obvious choice as President of Rowing Victoria and President of Rowing Australia. He was also the inaugural Chairman of both the Victorian and Australian umpires' panel.

This trophy was first presented in 1968 for the Women's Junior Four Championship. This was not an Under 19 event, but a non-senior event.

It then became the senior four event championship trophy in 1977.

The race was conducted over 1000m until 1984. The women's four was raced as a coxed four until 1987.

As this was an Interstate event, there was no need for a National Championship event. A Jubilee four event was created 1972 and continued until 1976.

In 1973 there was an inter dominion series between Australia and New Zealand including a race at the Interstate Championships.

This event was a senior four event until 1979 when it became an open four event.

Florence Eaton Trophy

Women's Eight Championship



Florence Eaton Trophy

This trophy was first presented in 1978 by Florence Eaton, the then President of the Australian Amateur Women's Rowing Council.

Due to the nature of the event, it has nearly always been won a composite crew.

The Australian Institute of Sport dominated women's rowing for a lot of the 1980-90s and so figure strongly in the results. The other clubs who have figured strongly are Melbourne University and Mercantile from Victoria.

The race was conducted over 1000 metres until 1985 when it was converted to a 2000 metre race.

This trophy was presented by the Herald & Weekly Times Ltd to the Australian Women's Rowing Council in 1968.

This Championship was contested over 1000 metre until 1985 when it became a 2000 metre event.

Federation of Old Oarsmen Trophy

This Trophy was first presented for under 23 men's eight crews in 1982 when this event commenced. It is usually presented by a representative of the host state Old Oarsmen Association

The Thomas Kellar Memorial Trophy

Men's Under 19 Scull Championship



The Thomas Kellar Trophy

Thomas Kellar Memorial Trophy was presented by the Tasmanian Rowing Council to Australian Amateur Rowing Council in 1990 for the Men's Championships Junior Scull in honour of the Late Thomas Kellar, President of FISA.

Thommi Kellar had been instrumental in both the development of the Lake Barrington course in Tasmania and the granting of the 1990 World Championships to Australia and the Lake Barrington course. The trophy is presented by the most senior FISA representative at the event.

This event commenced in 1982 and should not be confused with the old junior category which was the category before open and had no age restriction.

Many scullers from this event have gone onto win Olympic and World Championships medals. It is good indicator of future success.

The Tim Hawkins Memorial Trophy

Men's Under 19 Double Scull Championship

The Tim Hawkins Memorial Trophy was presented in 2003 by the family of Tim Hawkins in his memory. The base of the trophy contains his photograph and the following words:

Timothy Leigh Hawkins
(Juper)
(14/11/1973 – 12/10/2002)

Tim commenced his rowing career at the age of 10 as a coxswain at the Lindisfarne Rowing Club and Geilston Bay High School in Tasmania . He represented Tasmania on several occasions winning the Australian Junior Double Scull Championship in 1991 and went on to represent Australia in the double scull at Under 23 and Senior World Championships. Tim retired from competitive rowing at the age of 23 having been to 16 National Championships, to concentrate on doing Commerce/Law degrees at the University of Tasmania which he successfully completed with Honours in Law. Tim still remained a keen supporter of rowing and an active member of the Lindisfarne Rowing Club giving many voluntary days work to rebuild the rowing club after it was burnt to the ground in 1997. He would help the younger rowers at the club and local schools with coaching and advice whenever he could. Tim tragically died at the age of 28 by a terrorist bomb in Bali on 12 October 2002 .

The Barrington Cup was donated by the Tasmanian Rowing Council to the Australian Rowing Council in 1984 to commemorate the first National Championship Regatta at Lake Barrington International rowing course.

The Sydney Cup Schoolgirl Eight Championship



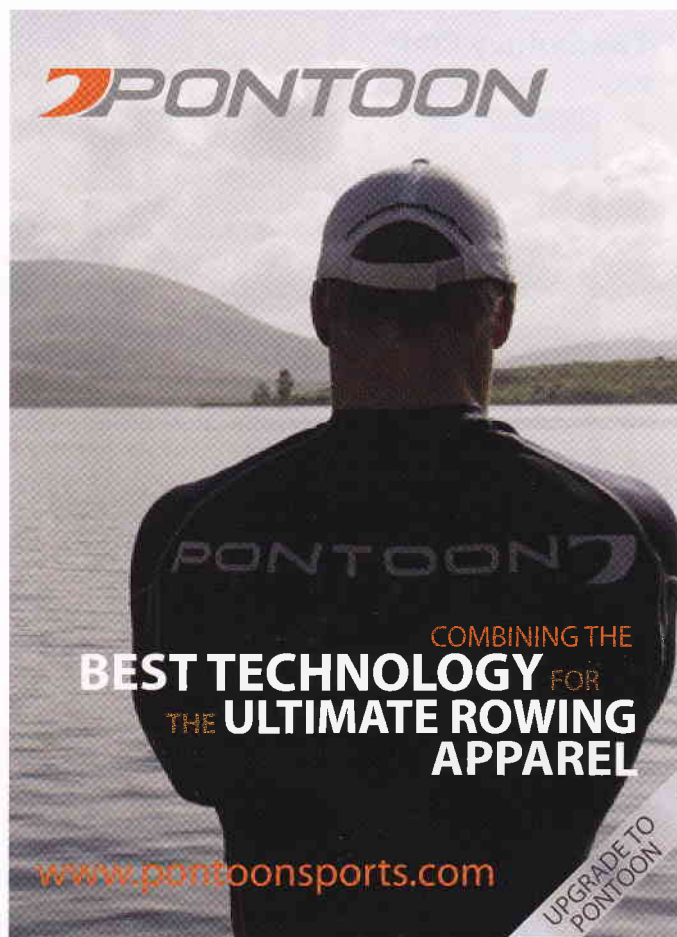
The Sydney Cup

The Bob Blake Perpetual Shield was donated by 'Freedom on the River', the Western Australian disabled rowing group and contested for the first time in 2001. The Shield is named for Bob Blake who has worked for disabled rowing nationally as well as in his home state of Tasmania since 1989. Bob's contribution and commitment to disabled rowing is immense.

ATHLETE FACILITIES

Athletes Lounge

The Athletes Lounge is located in Building C, closest to the boat park and will be open from 8.00am – 6.00pm each day during the regatta. WI-FI will be available in the Lounge area.

Changing Rooms / Toilets / Showers

Change rooms, toilets and showers are located to the rear of the main club house, with toilets also located throughout the boat park and near the start line.

Catering and Drinking Water

A large range of food and beverage options will be available in the amenities area between building B & C. Bags of ice will be available for purchase on site, and filtered cold water will be available free of charge from the Athletes Lounge.

Club and Team tents

Tent site maps will be shown at Regatta Control. These sites will be marked prior to the regatta and due to the space restrictions are a maximum of 6m x 3m. Tents may be hired from Marquee Men and can be arranged by contacting them directly on 1300 688 200.

Regatta Information—Regatta Control

Regatta Control will be located in a separate demountable hut in the boatpark. Patrons will be able to access draws, results, etc from Regatta Control (refer to the Venue Map). Crew changes/withdrawals must be made at Regatta Control.

Medical and Emergency Action

A Medical Centre will be in operation throughout the regatta from 6.00am – 7.00pm each day. A venue medical manager will also be onsite for emergencies and for advice. Emergency numbers will be placed on all notice boards throughout the Regatta Centre. The Medical Centre will be located at the Eastern end of the Island adjacent to building A (refer to venue map).

Ergometers

Ergometers will NOT be available at the venue for warm up and cool down. The safe storage and operation of teams' ergos are the responsibility of each team.

Training times

The venue will open for training at 2pm, Saturday 3 March. During the Regatta the course will be open for training from:

- 6.00am until 30 minutes before the first race on each day
- From 30 minutes after the last race is completed until 7.00pm

The Regatta Centre will be locked from 7.00pm – 6.00am each day.

Boat Storage and Racking

Boat racking will be provided within the boat park. Racking is by boat category and is extremely limited, therefore it is essential that coaches and managers maintain the integrity of the system and the allocated racks. The Organising Committee reserves the right to relocate boats that are not racked in accordance with the designed system.

Boat Washing

The Champion Lakes Regatta Centre is slightly saline. Boat wash down facilities will be provided in a designated area (refer to venue map). Washing down in other areas is strictly prohibited.

The use of detergent is also strictly prohibited as the detergent will leach directly into the lake causing environmental issues and offenders will be sanctioned.

Equipment Repair

Boat manufacturers and equipment suppliers will be available on site to provide their services and repair rowing equipment at your own cost.

Storage and Equipment Security

Security staff will be patrolling the Regatta Centre throughout the Championships and overnight. Ultimately patrons are responsible for their own belongings and valuables should not be left unattended.

Boat Trailer Storage

Once boats have been unloaded on the Island, trailers are to be stored at the reserved area off Henley Drive to the South of the entrance to the Island. A secondary boat trailer area will be located adjacent to the start line with entry via Champion Drive. (refer to venue map).

Parking

Free car parking will be available on the Northern side of the course, enter via Champion Drive (refer to venue map). A free shuttle service will assist in ferrying spectators and athletes to the Island during the finals days.

PRE-COMPETITION INFORMATION

Venue Orientation

Upon arrival at the Champion Lakes venue, team managers, coaches and athletes should familiarise themselves with the venue maps located on notice boards throughout the centre to become familiar with the safety and training issues specific to the venue. Whilst safety marshals and an emergency medical response team will be located at the venue to support and guide athletes, you are responsible for your own safety on the water.

Preliminary Team Managers and Coaches Meeting

The preliminary team managers & coaches meeting (also open to interested athletes) will be held at 3pm on Sunday 4 March in the Athletes Lounge (Building C).

School Crews and Athlete Briefing

School masters, coaches and athletes are required to attend a separate compulsory meeting/briefing at 11.00am on Thursday 8 March in the Athletes Lounge (Building C).

Water Traffic Rules

The traffic rules and maps for training and competition are attached to this Bulletin and included in the souvenir program. Copies will also be made available at the venue at Regatta Control and outlined in detail at the preliminary team managers and coaches meeting.

Coaching

Champion Lakes Regatta Centre has a dedicated event path, which can be used by coaches with bicycles. Helmets are a legal requirement of riding bicycles in WVA and there are no exemptions at the Champion Lakes Facility. Bicycles may also be hired from nearby cycle shops. Please note traffic directions are strictly one way around the lake (clockwise) during racing. There is strictly no riding on the island or bridges for safety reasons.

Weather reports

Long term and daily weather reports will be posted around the venue on the notice boards and will be available at Regatta Control. Temperatures in Perth in March can be extreme [average daily maximums can range between 25-35°C] Competitors are reminded that safety is of paramount concern to RA and the Organising Committee. When directed by officials to leave or evacuate certain parts of the venue or water, please obey those directions.

COMPETITION INFORMATION

Competition Format

Please refer to outline of racing enclosed in this Bulletin. Draw sheets of each days racing will be available following the close of the previous round of racing. Start lists will be available as soon as practical and at the start of each day's racing. An indicative competition schedule is attached.

Competition Rules

The 2010 updated RA Rules of Racing are in force during the 2012 Australian Rowing Championships. Team managers should refer to the Rowing Australia Website anytime they are not sure about procedures that may influence their team. Please note the changes to Open Club Races.

Access to the Draw and Results

The Draw and Results will be posted on notice boards around the venue and will be available online through ROMS (<https://roms.rowingaustralia.com.au>). Hard copies of draws and results will be available at Regatta Control two hours after the completion of each day. Copies of draws and results will be free on presentation of a regatta program or at a cost of \$1 per item.

We encourage all members of the rowing community to be environmentally conscious and access draws and results via ROMS electronically wherever possible to reduce paper use. WIFI will be provided for tablet and laptop connections in the Athletes Lounge. All paper used at the ARC 2012 will be from sustained plantations or recycled.

Boat weighing

Boat weighing will take place in the middle bay of the building B. It is the responsibility of the crews that the weight of their boats is in accordance with the RA Rules of Racing (Rule 34). Scales will be available for crews to test the weight of their boats from Saturday 5 March.

Crew Changes

Team managers are required to make any withdrawals or crew changes at least one hour before the first race of the event. No replacements are permitted for single scullers (except in the Interstate Regatta, where one hour's notice to Regatta Control is required). Other rules apply to the crew changes after the first heat of each event (see RA Rules 50-53). Crew changes can be made at the Regatta Control in the middle of the boat park. Late scratching, or crews who do not present to the starter, may incur a \$250 fine.

Note: If you make a crew change, you will be given a carbon copy of the change form, which you will be required to keep as proof of change.

Bow Numbers

Bow numbers will be available for collection from Regatta Control. A \$20 deposit will be required for all bow numbers. We request that \$10 or smaller denomination notes are used. Non return of a bow number will incur a \$20 fine. Bow numbers should be returned to Regatta Control immediately after the end of a race.

Equipment Check

Regatta Control will check equipment throughout the regatta to secure compliance with all relevant rules of safety and racing.

Width of Boats—Adaptive

The minimum width of an adaptive racing boat shall be 370mm. This will be a horizontal measurement of the inside of the hull at the level of the rails. This restriction will only apply to the following adaptive boat classes:

ASM1x (Div I & II)
ASW1x (Div I & II)
TAM1x
TAW1x
LTAM1x Div 2
LTAW1x Div 2

Adaptive Training

Safe arrangements have been made for adaptive training prior to the first day of racing and during competition. These will be outlined at the preliminary team managers and coaches meeting on Sunday 6 March. Written copies of the adaptive training arrangements will be available at Regatta Control following this meeting.

Adaptive Classifications

All rowers competing in adaptive rowing events must have a current classification for adaptive rowing prior to the commencement of their first race, as set out in the RA classification policy (appendix 7). Any rower who has not yet been classified as an adaptive rower must make a booking for an adaptive rowing classification. Classifications will be done on Monday 7 and Tuesday 8 March. Bookings for classifications will close on Friday 18 February at 5pm. Contact Pamela Hubert by email phubert@rowingaustralia.com.au to book a classification time.

Progression

Entry in some events may be limited - either by limiting the maximum number of entries allowable in an event, the progression system used, or other measures as required. In heats, and some repechages, 7 lanes will be used (apart from any National Selection requirement races). Finals will race over 6 lanes.

Progression to Finals

Athletes and coaches are cautioned to take note of the progression to the next round of racing prior to the start of each race. Certain weather conditions or circumstances may alter progression from round to round. Therefore athletes are highly recommended to give their best performance each race to ensure their best finishing position. Should conditions require the system to be altered, the Organising Committee will give as much notice as possible before changes are made. A copy of the progression system is posted on the event website.

Races for Lanes

As there is minimal flexibility to move lanes in the case of unfair weather conditions, races with only 5, 6 & 7 entries will have a race for lanes' in the program (finishing order in that race will determine lane allocations for the final). This ensures that the fastest crews are allocated the middle lanes. Races with 4 or less entries, will be a 'straight final' as we are able to move lanes if required.

Racing Uniform

All clothing must also be in accordance with the requirements of Rule 44 concerning athlete's uniform. Each member of a club or school, or of a composite crew in the case of a club or institute crew competing in a RA Event, shall wear the registered racing colours of such crew member's club, institute or school when racing in regattas under the auspices of RA.

If any member of a crew wears visible garments under their racing uniform, then the garment worn by those crew

members must be identical in colour except for permitted sponsor identifications which shall nonetheless be identical garment, the remainder of the crew will have the option whether or not to wear that garment. The sleeve or leg length of the garment may vary between crew members. If any members of a crew wear headwear, then the headwear worn by those crew members shall be uniform.

Note: Competitors and coaches are requested to present themselves for medal ceremonies in an appropriate fashion.

POST COMPETITION INFORMATION AND PROTOCOLS

Interviews

Requests for media interviews with athletes or crews may be made by media outlets from the Media Centre. The venue media manager will liaise with the relevant Team Managers from each state. Interviews can be conducted at the competition venue, in the Media Centre.

Objections, Protests and Appeals RA Rules of Racing will apply (see rules 76).

Medal Ceremonies

The medal ceremony will take place near the finish line on land, immediately after the end of each A Final in a pre-determined pattern. First, second and third place finishers will participate in the medal ceremony. Copies of the medal ceremony procedure will be distributed to Team Managers and Coaches and available at Regatta Control.

Protocol

The medal winners participating in the medal ceremony are required to be neatly dressed in their official racing uniform, or club/state tracksuit.

CLASSIFICATIONS

Status of Competitors

Refer to Part II of the RA rule book

School Competitors: A school competitor is one who: Qualifies as under 21 (youth) under the provisions of these rules and; Is attending a secondary school as a full time day student. All members of a school entry must be from the same school.

Club Competitors: The athlete qualification rules for entry in these events are:

1. No composite crews between clubs allowed.
2. Athletes are not eligible if they have been a member of either the National Senior A or National Under 23 team in the current or previous year.
3. No athlete shall be nominating for National Selection in the year of competition.

Under 17: A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 17 race until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches 16 years of age.

Under 19: A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 19 race until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches 18 years of age.

Under 21 (Youth): A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 21 race until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches 20 years of age

Under 23: A rower or coxswain may compete in an Under 23 race until 31 December of the year in which the rower reaches 22 years of age.

Seniors:

Senior rowing events are open to rowers of all ages.

Interstate Regatta Lightweights: Please be advised that Rowing Australia has approved a change to the Lightweight Rules for the 2012 Interstate Regatta. As you may be aware the Final Olympic Selection Trial at SIRC is only 12 days after the conclusion of the 2012 ARC. RA has received advice that prospective athletes should not remain at FISA weight for a period of this length.

As such, and to ensure the lightweight athletes are able to compete in both the Interstate Regatta and the Olympic Selection Trials the Board has approved changes to the lightweight rules for the 2012 Interstate Regatta as follows:

There shall be no average weight restrictions on a men's

crew, however no individual oarsman shall weigh more than 72.5 kg.

There shall be no average weight restrictions on a women's crew, however no individual oarswoman shall weigh more than 59kg.

Please note that this rule change will only apply to the 2012 Interstate Regatta given the special circumstances created by Olympic Selection trials. The rule will return to its previous wording for the 2013 and subsequent Interstate Regattas.

Lightweight Events:

A rower may compete in lightweight rowing events if he/she meets the following criteria:

A lightweight men's crew (excluding coxswain) shall have an average weight not exceeding 70kg. No individual lightweight male rower may weigh more than 72.5kg. A lightweight male single sculler (male) may not weigh more than 72.5kg.

A lightweight women's crew (excluding coxswain) shall have an average weight not exceeding 57kg. No individual lightweight male rower may weigh more than 59kg. A lightweight male single sculler (male) may not weigh more than 59kg.

Lightweight rowers shall be weighed wearing only their racing uniform on tested scales not less than one hour and not more than two hours before their first race of each lightweight event in which they are competing, on each day of the competition. They shall present themselves as a crew at the weighing centre already wearing their racing uniform. The weighing scales should indicate the weight of the rower to 0.1 kg. If a rower has races in other events on a day of racing, the weight recorded for the first event may be applied to qualify for subsequent events. Rowers may re-weigh for other events after their weigh-in for their first event on a day of racing within the time limits applicable to that event. This weight may also be carried forward for any other races in which the rower competes on that day of racing. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if two rounds of the same event takes place on the same day of competition and

some rowers in the second round do not have to race in the first round of that day, then these rowers in the second round shall be weighed at the same time as the rowers in the first round.

During the first weigh, the Organising Committee may request the athlete to present an official identity card with photograph. If the first race is subsequently postponed or cancelled, the lightweight rower is not required to be

weighed later on the same day for that event. Any rower who has been re-hydrated intravenously between the weighing and the respective race shall not be allowed to start.

If a rower exceeds the required weight by the expiry of the time permitted for weighing, the rower (and the crew of that rower) or the crew concerned are no longer eligible and shall be excluded from the event.

Coxswains

Coxswains are members of the crew, however, a women's crew may be steered by a man, and a men's crew steered by a woman. Age categories shall apply to coxswains, except in Under 23 and masters categories.

The minimum weight for a coxswain (wearing racing uniform) is 55kg for men's open, men's masters, men's under 23, men's under 21 (youth) and under 19 (junior) men's crews, and 50kg for women's masters, women's under 23, women's under 21, women's under 19, schoolboy, schoolgirl, under 17 (men and women) crews. The weighing scales shall indicate the weight of the coxswain to 0.1kg.

To make up this weight, a coxswain may carry deadweight in a sealed bag which shall be placed in the boat as close as possible to his/her person. No article of racing equipment shall be considered as part of this deadweight. At any time, before or until immediately after the race, the Control Commission may require the deadweight to be reweighed. These provisions shall also apply to coxswains in lightweight races. Notwithstanding the provisions of RULE 12.6, a coxswain may steer for any number of clubs or institutes at a regatta.

Athlete Weighing

The weighing of athletes and coxswains will take place in the middle bay Building B. Test scales will be available during all times that the course is officially open. For further information please refer to the RA Rule Book. Official weights must be recorded a maximum of 2 hours and a minimum of 1 hour before the advertised start time of that event.

ANTI-DOPING

The Australian Sports Anti Doping Agency (ASADA) is likely to conduct drug testing at the National Championship and Interstate Regatta. Competitors and coaches are urged to take note of the following requirements in respect of banned substances for therapeutic use and act accordingly in achieving exemptions for appropriate athletes.

Banned Substances

Therapeutic Use Exception process .

If an athlete suffers a medical condition that a doctor can only treat with a therapeutic substance, he or she must check whether the legitimate therapeutic use of the prohibited substance is permitted under the Rowing Australia Anti-Doping Policy and with ASADA. Legitimate use of a prohibited substance may be granted a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). It is the responsibility of athletes, coaches and parents to ensure that they are familiar with the Rowing Australia Anti Doping Policy, which can be found on the Rowing Australia Website: http://www.rowingaustralia.com.au/about_ra_policies_anti-doping.shtml

Article 9 of the Policy refers to therapeutic use'. The ASADA Hotline 1800 020 506 or ASADA website (www.asada.gov.au) will outline whether the medication is

prohibited and whether a TUE is required. It is important that athletes also remember to check medications each year. The World Anti Doping Agency's (WADA) Prohibited List changes on 1 January each year, so a medication that was permitted last year, may not be this year.

Visit http://www.rowingaustralia.com.au/hp_anti-doping_wada.shtml for full details of the World Anti-Doping Code 2010 Prohibited List.

NOTE: Any athlete may be Drug tested - whether on the FISA's or ASADA's Registered Testing Pool, Domestic Testing Pool - or not on any list. If an athlete needs to use a prohibited substance or a prohibited method for a medical purpose, to avoid an anti doping rule violation, the athlete needs to obtain a ASDMAC Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). These TUE forms are required to compete at events of significance within Australia such as State Championships, National Championships, selection regattas/trials, Youth Olympics and Youth Cups. Athletes and their doctors are now required to complete an ASDMAC form (Australian Sports Drug Medical Advisory Committee). This form can only be approved by ASDMAC. The form, once approved is accepted by ASADA as a valid domestic TUE. The ASDMAC Forms can be found on the RA Website: http://www.rowingaustralia.com.au/hp_anti-doping_forms.shtml.

NOTE: The submission of FISA forms will not be accepted by ASDMAC. Please ensure you have the correct TUE form. Athletes should always carry copies of any documentation (TUE's, or other) to every regatta.

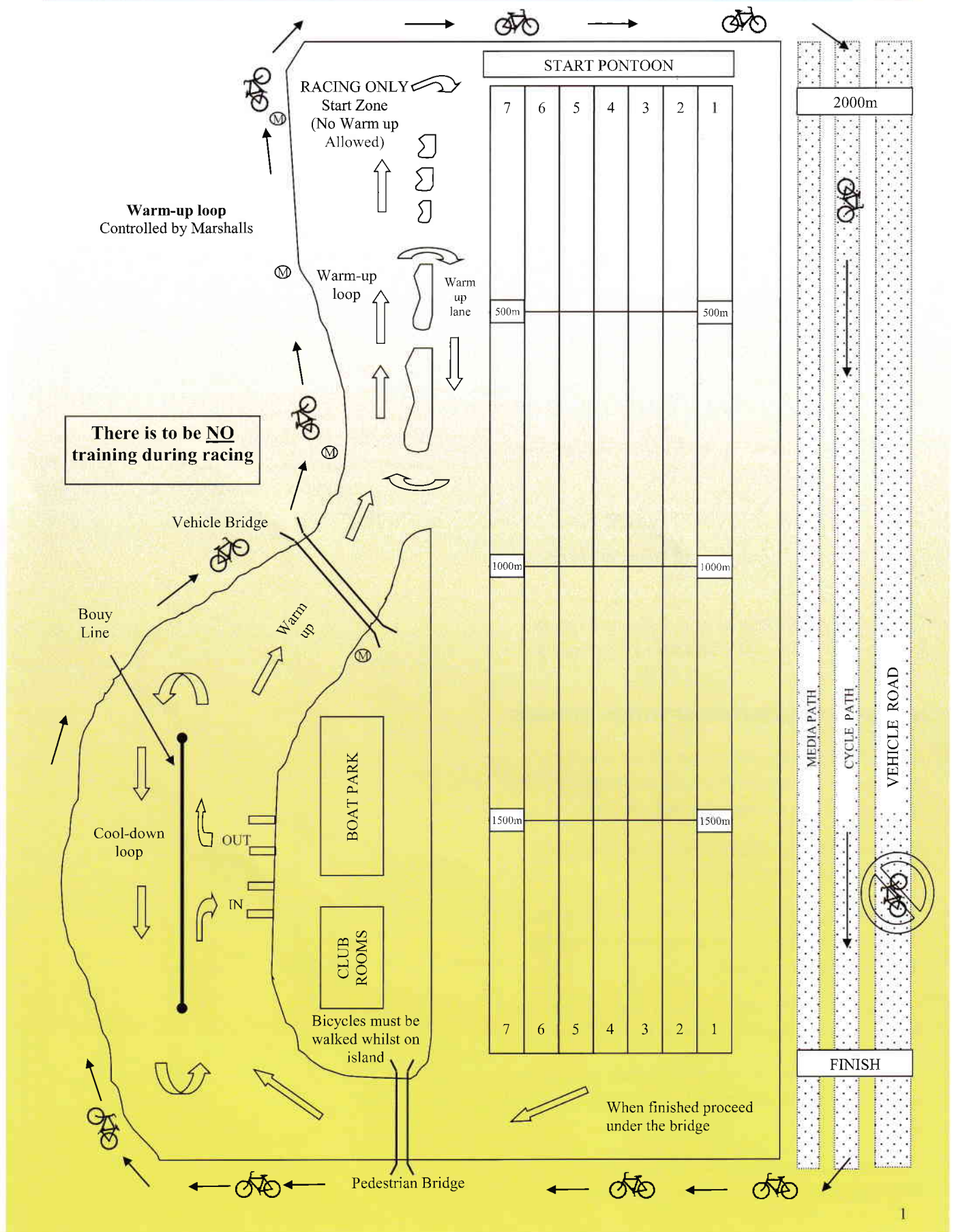
TRAFFIC RULES DURING TRAINING

- During the Training Periods (before and after racing) training is to be only on the course itself.
- On Competition Days the course and lake will be closed for training from 30 minutes prior to the starting time of the first race and for 30 minutes after the final race.
- Traffic flow on the competition course generally follows an anti-clockwise' direction.
- The finish line is at the Clubhouse end of the lake.
- Once departing from the Boat Park, crews shall travel to the start of the course using the off course channel. There is to be no entry onto the course at any other point.
- A safety marshal will then direct crews onto the course to return to the finish.
- Travel from the start to finish is in lanes 5,6,7.
- Return to the start on the Western side of the course in lanes 1-3 (unless returning to the boat park).
- Lane 4 is a 'no row' or neutral safety lane.
- Crews must turn beyond the finish line around the large turning buoy.
- Crossing the course from lanes 1,2 & 3, will only be permitted in the first 100 metres from the start platform.
- Crews must wait for the previous race to clear the 100m zone and then, at the direction of the starter, move into their lanes. Crews must take directions from the Marshall before the start and following completion of their races.
- Crews may practice in their own lane before the start of their race between the start and the 250m mark provided there is adequate time before the start and provided they first obtain approval from the starter.
- Crews should be at the Start Marshall at least five (5) minutes prior to the start time of their race. They must be attached to their boat holder at the start two (2) minutes prior to the start time of their race. Failure to do so may result in the issue of a yellow card.
- Once the race is complete, all crews must return through the bridge into the lake, except if going to a medal ceremony.
- Crews may cool-down on the lake following the designated safety traffic pattern. Once entering the lake, take extreme caution of crews entering or leaving the launching areas. No cooling down is permitted on the Competition Lake.

TRAFFIC RULES DURING COMPETITION PERIODS

- On Competition Days the course will be closed for training from 30 minutes prior to the starting time for the first event until 30 minutes after the final race.
- Traffic travelling towards the start from the launching area through the off-course channel.
- To warm up prior to the start, move to the 500m mark, where a water Marshall will direct crews through the islands to the warm-up lane.
- You are permitted to warm up in the warm up lane (lane 9) off the course, from the 500m to the 1000m mark.
- Once receiving the OK from the Marshall, you may then re-enter the channel and move back towards the starting area.
- Once crews proceed past the 500m mark, they will NOT be permitted to use the warm up' lane.

ON WATER - RACING MAP



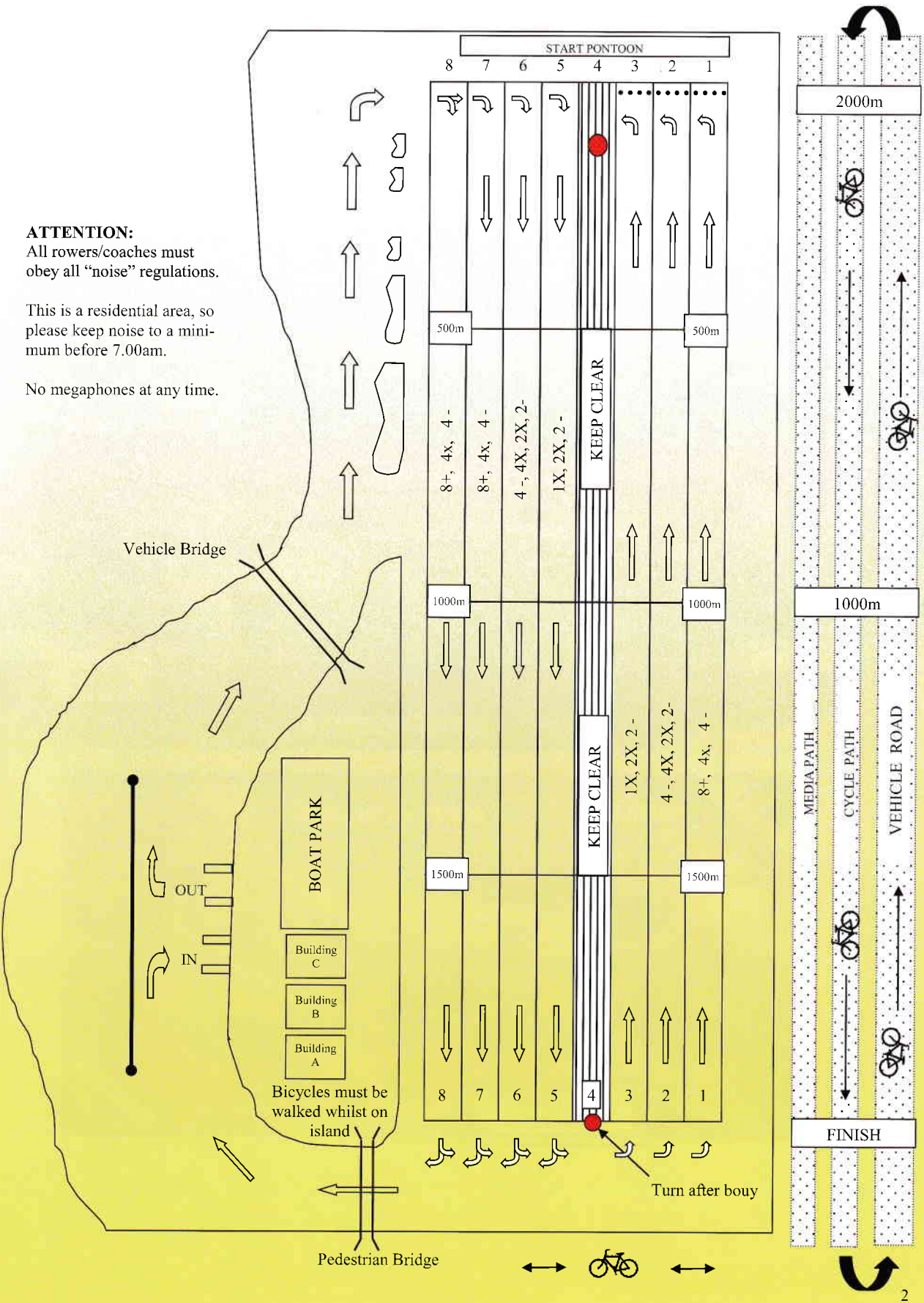
ON WATER - TRAINING MAP

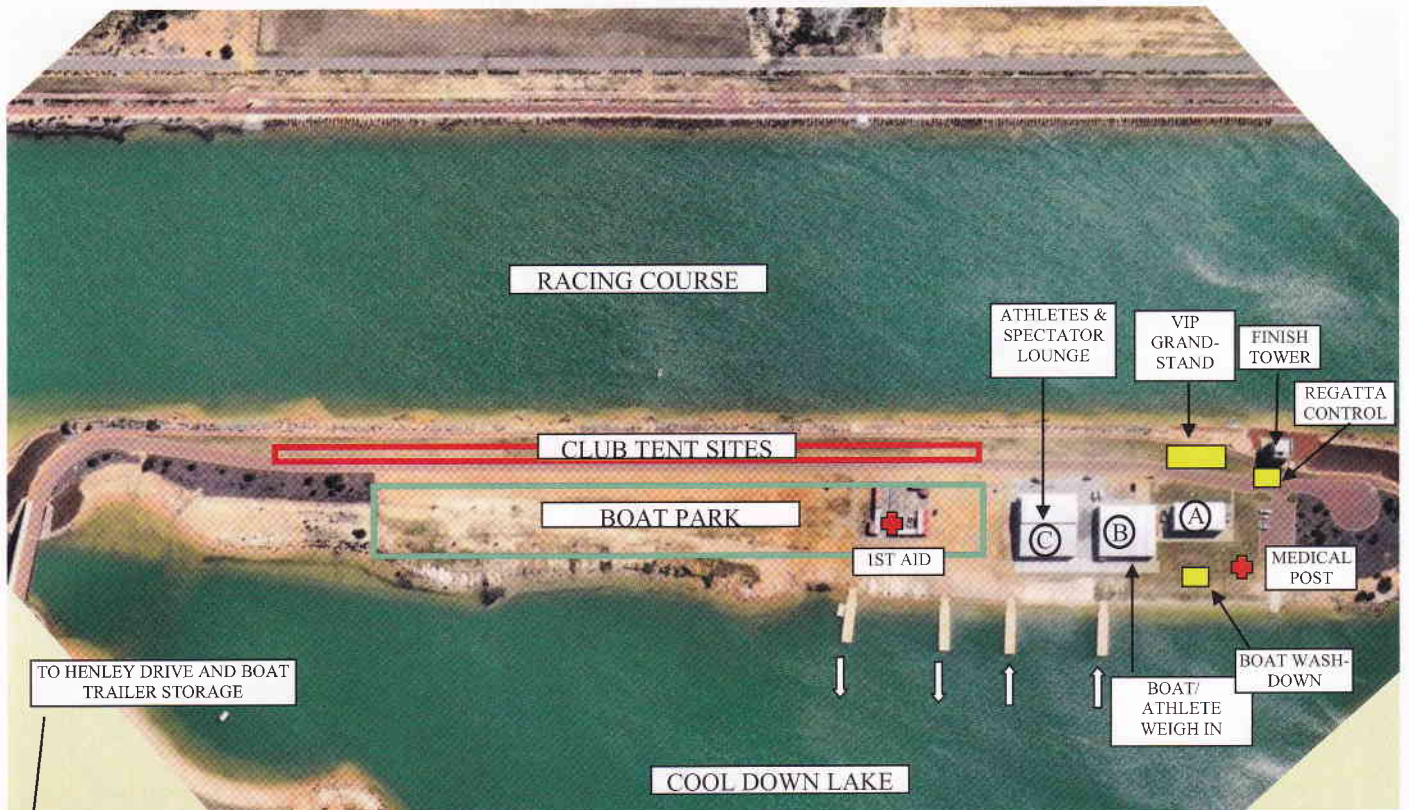

VENUE MAP

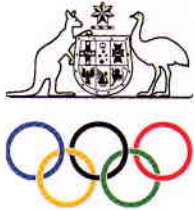

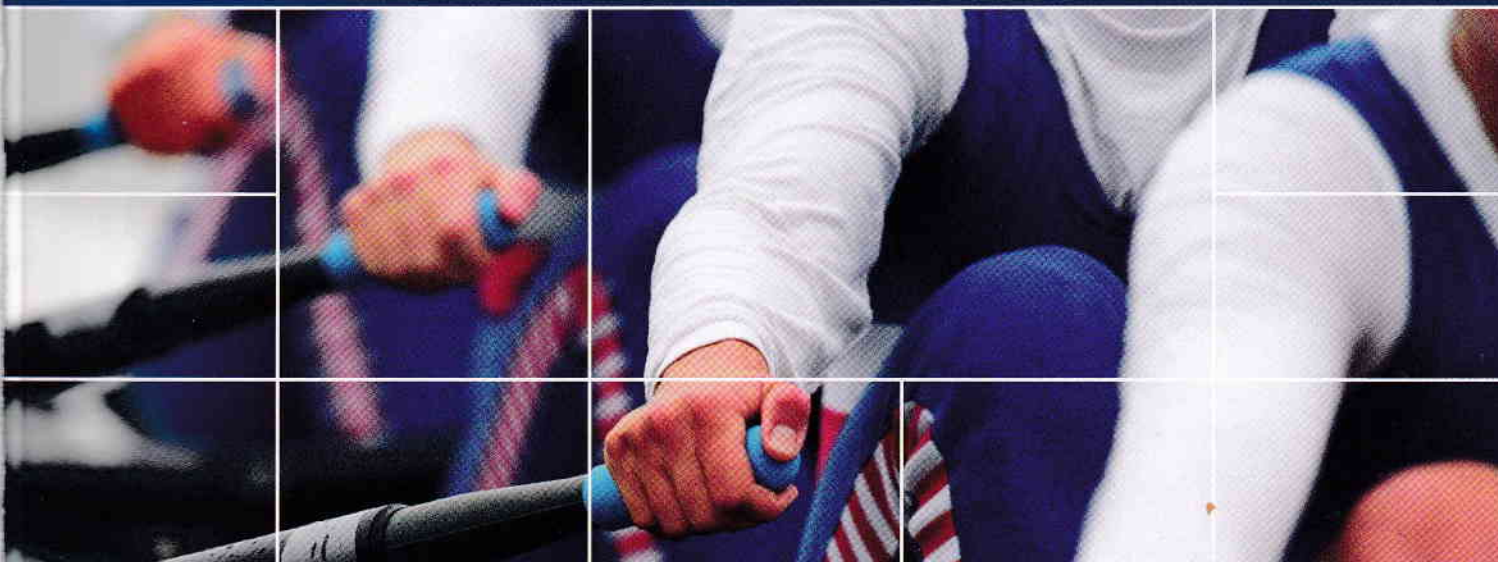
