Should the actual weight of the coxswain be less than that specified above, sufficient dead weight in sealed bags to make up the required weight shall be carried between the coxswain's thwart and the stroke's stretcher. The winning coxswain shall be weighed by some person duly authorised by the Committee immediately after the race, with the dead weight (if any) carried with him.”

NEW REGATTA REGULATION.

The following Regatta Regulation, to be numbered 11A, has been adopted during the year:—

11a. Notwithstanding anything in the preceding regulation in all races rowed on the Upper Yarra course no boat shall cross in front of any competing boat and any boat that does so cross and thereby gains any advantage in distance or impedes the progress of any other competing boat by its wash or otherwise shall be disqualified. The umpire shall be the sole judge of whether a boat so gained an advantage or has impeded any other competing boat and his decision shall be final and without appeal.
