## ALTERATION REGATTA REGULATION 19.

At the last Annual Meeting Regulation 19 was altered to read as follows :—

“ All coxswains shall be amateurs, and for pair-oared and best four-oared boats shall be not less than 7st. in weight, and for clinker four and all eight-oared boats not less than 8st. in weight. Should the actual weight of the coxswain be less than that specified above, sufficient dead weight in sealed bags to make up the required weight shall be carried between the coxswain's thwart and the stroke's stretcher. The winning coxswain shall be weighed by some person duly authorised by the Committee immediately after the race, with the dead weight (if any) carried with him.”
