To the Members of the Victorian Rowing Association.

GENTLEMEN—

Your Committee has pleasure in presenting to you the Twenty-Ninth Annual Report and Balance Sheet.

OPENING OF THE SEASON.

The formal opening of the season took place at Albert Park on October 1st, 1904, when combined eight-oared races were held, in which thirteen crews competed. The winning crew consisted of:— W. Judd (bow), C. Fawcett (2), B. Cunningham (3), W. Constantine (4), L. Reid (5), W. Righetti (6), C. McDonell (7), J. Williams (stroke), Cooper (cox.).

INTERSTATE RACES.

The Annual Interstate Eight Race was held at Sydney, on the Parramatta River, on May 14th last. All six States of the Commonwealth of Australia were represented. The Victorian crew was selected by Messrs. E. R. Ainley, J. M. Macfarlane, and T. Davies. Your representatives won after a splendid contest with Tasmania by a length. New South Wales, some six lengths away from the leaders, beat West Australia for third place by a quarter of a length; South Australia, fifth, by half a length, Queensland were last. This was the twelfth win in succession for your representatives. The time was 16 min. 25 sec. The crews were as follow:—
