# THIRTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE  
VICTORIAN ROWING ASSOCIATION.

TO THE MEMBERS.

GENTLEMEN,—

In presenting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet, your Committee desires to congratulate the members on the fact that the season just ended has been a most successful one, despite the unprecedented conditions arising out of the great war and the drought.

The outstanding feature of the period under review is the magnificent manner in which the oarsmen of Victoria, in common with oarsmen of the other States, have responded to their country's call, and your Committee feels proud of the part being played by oarsmen in the present great fight for liberty.

Despite the great depletion caused by so many members enlisting, all events held during the year were a success, and it is pleasing to know that the financial position has greatly improved during the past twelve months, chiefly on account of the Interstate races having been abandoned during the war.

## OPENING OF THE SEASON.

As usual, the season was officially opened with the Henley Regatta on the 24th October, 1914, though the extreme heat and strong wind made the event less enjoyable than in former years. The regatta was very successful, 45 crews and 5 scullers taking part, including a crew from Leichhardt, N.S.W., for the Grand Challenge Cup, this being the first Interstate crew to enter for that event.

## AUSTRALIAN EIGHT-OARED AND SCULLING CHAMPIONSHIPS.

For the first time since the Interstate contests were inaugurated in 1878, there is a blank year in the record, the various Associations unanimously deciding that these contests should not be renewed until after the termination of the war.



### CHAMPION EIGHT-OARED RACE.

Lower Yarra, 20th March, 1915.

This event attracted the fine entry of six crews, and resulted in a magnificent race. Corio Bay held a slight lead to within a few lengths of the finish, when a fine sprint by Albert Park deprived the Geelong crew of victory (and the senior premiership) by the narrow margin of three feet. The winners are congratulated on their seventh consecutive victory in this event. The crew comprised—C. P. Leslie (bow), R. T. Leslie (2), W. Loud (3), L. H. M'Brien (4), J. Stewart (5), W. Steinle (6), J. Hale (7), D. Laird (stroke), R. Duncan (cox.). Civil Service finished third with Essendon, South Melbourne, and Footscray in the order named.

## ANNUAL REGATTA.

Upper Yarra, 5th December, 1914.

In view of the necessity for curtailing expenditure as much as possible, it was decided to slightly modify the programme for the Annual Regatta. The result was that the loss, despite smaller entries, was reduced to £18 6s. 1d., as compared with an average loss of £33 6s. 11d. for the preceding seven years. The programme comprised 28 events, and the various races were won as follows:—Maiden Pairs, Civil Service; Maiden Sculls, Barwon (C. Collyer); Maiden Fours, Footscray; Maiden Eights, Banks; Junior Pairs, Footscray; Senior Pairs, Ballarat; Senior Fours, Essendon. By their win in the Maiden Eight, Banks become the first holders of the new "Buchan" Cup, which was generously presented by your Vice-President, Mr. John I. Buchan, at the beginning of the season, for competition in the Maiden Eights, the previous "Buchan" Cup having been finally won by the Albert Park Club.

The following public regattas were also held, and, though entries were necessarily not so numerous as in previous seasons, the regattas were all successful:—

Henley (24/10/14), Nagambie (26/12/14), Colac (1/1/15), Murray Rowing Association (1/1/15), Upper Yarra (30/1/15), Albert Park (1/2/15), Ballarat (13/2/15), Barwon (20/2/15), Bairūsdale (3/4/15), Sale (5/4/15). Seymour Regatta was abandoned owing to the low state of the river. Approval was also given for a regatta at Warrnambool on Boxing Day, open only to Western District Clubs, but, owing to the war and the drought, the regatta was not held.

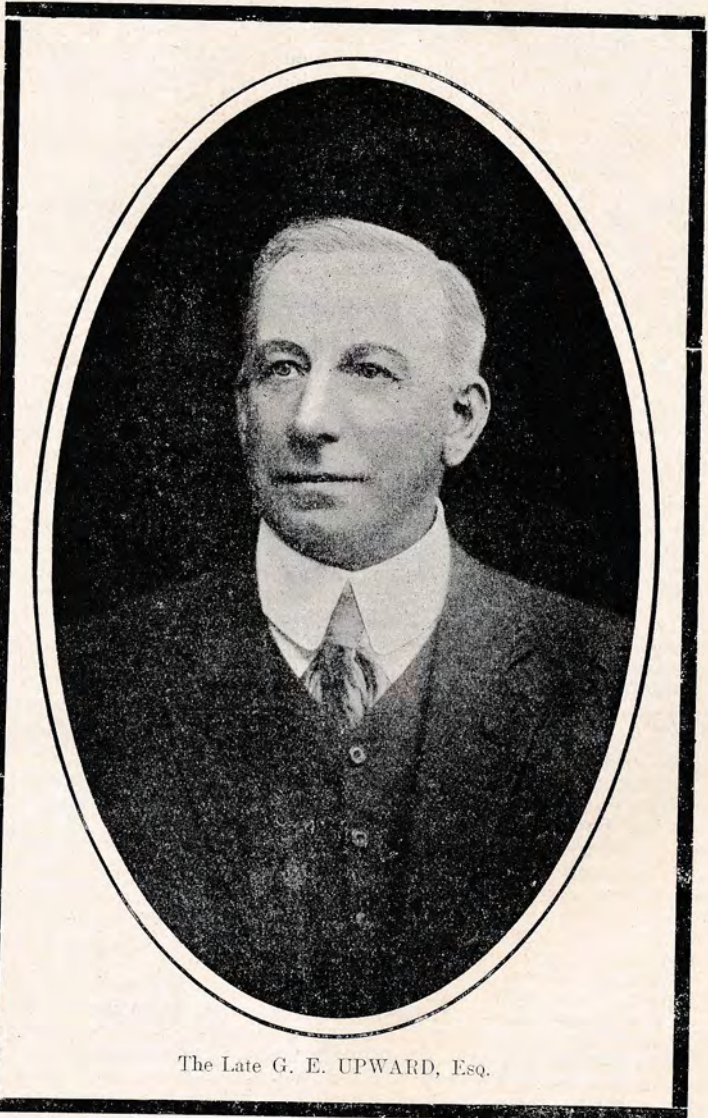
In addition to these regattas, the following races were also held:—

Banks (13/3/15), won by the State Savings Bank; Public Schools (8/5/15), won by Wesley College; Inter-Collegiate (23/4/15), won by Ormond College. The University Eight-oared race was abandoned, owing to the war.

## OBITUARY.

With feelings of the deepest regret, your Committee records the death, which occurred in Sydney on the 3rd October, 1915, of Mr. George E. Upward, Senior Vice-President and Chairman of the Association. No name is better known in Australian rowing than that of George Upward. He has done more for the sport in Victoria than any other man, and was responsible for introducing, in 1880, the style of rowing (based on Woodgate) which resulted in Victoria's long list of successes in the Australian Eight-oared Championships. It can be truly said that he has left a mark on Australian rowing that will never be effaced. Coming from Geelong, where he had his first successes with the Corio Bay Rowing Club, deceased first took his seat on the Committee of the V.R.A. as a representative of the Civil Service Rowing Club on 3rd October, 1881, was elected Hon. Treasurer in 1887, and vice-President in 1891. As showing the keen interest he took in the administration of the Association during the last 34 years, it might be mentioned that he attended 407 meetings of the Committee for that period. He stroked the successful Victorian Eight-oared crews of 1880, 1881, and 1883, and the Victorian crew

which won the Intercolonial Four-oared Race of 1888. Of a genial disposition, and taking a wonderfully keen interest in rowing in all the States, your late Vice-President made a host of friends throughout

the Commonwealth, and he will, indeed, be sadly missed. To his widow and son your Committee extends the deepest sympathy of all oarsmen.



Your Committee also regrets to record the death, which occurred suddenly, of Mr. Harry Lindgren. The deceased oarsman, who was 47 years of age, had a fine career, and won many races, including the Interstate Eights of 1894, 1895, and 1896, and the Interstate Fours Fours of 1896. His enthusiasm for the sport was well known, and is amply demonstrated by the fact that he won three champion eights and ten senior eights after attaining the age of forty years. To his widow and children your Committee desires to express its deepest sympathy.

### **AFFILIATED CLUBS.**

Owing to the fact that Lake Weeroona dried up at the early part of the season, the Sandhurst Club has temporarily withdrawn from the Association, but, after an absence of many years, the Echuca Club has again affiliated.

### **ROLL OF HONOUR.**

As an appendix to the Report, your Committee is publishing the names of all present members of the Association who have enlisted with the Australian Imperial Forces. From this it will be seen that the excellent number of 798, out of a total membership of 2117, has responded to the Empire's call.

Although the response of every Club has been excellent, perhaps it would not be out of place to specially mention the case of the Colac Club. Out of that Club's membership of 25, there were 24 volunteers, 22 of whom were accepted.

Many, unfortunately, have made the final sacrifice, and to their relatives your Committee desires to convey the deepest sympathy of the members of the V.R.A., and, at the same time, to express admiration of the noble action and supreme sacrifice of our fallen comrades in giving their lives for their country. Your Committee sincerely trusts that those who are still spared may meet with every success and have a safe and speedy return. In addition to the names published, many ex-members of your Association are now serving in the firing line, and to these, also, your Committee extends its best wishes.

It is with feelings of deepest regret that your Committee has to record the death of Major J. W. Hamilton who was killed in the landing at Gallipoli. Up to the time of his departure for the front, the late Major Hamilton was Honorary Auditor of your Association, and for some years held the position of Honorary Treasurer. To the widow and relatives of the deceased, with deep feeling your Committee extends its sincere sympathy.

### **FINANCE.**

In view of the fact that the funds of your Association were getting lower each year, your Committee appointed a Sub-committee to investigate the finances and make a recommendation for placing them on a sound basis. A thorough investigation, covering the previous six years, showed that the ordinary expenditure of the Association was kept well in hand, but the decline in contributions towards the cost of sending crews to compete in Interstate contests resulted in a heavy drain on the funds. Contributions to the Interstate races dropped from £375 4s. 11d. for the six years ended with the season 1907-8, to £24 3s. for the six years ended with the season

1913-14. The total loss on these contests for the six years ending 1913-14 was £658 16s. 10d., and, to provide against this deficit in the future, the Sub-committee recommended the following:—

- “1. Cancel present charges under Rules XIII. and XV. (affiliation fees and seat fees for representatives in Interstate races).
- “2. Impose annual registration fee of 4s. per member for metropolitan members (except University), and 1s. per member for country and University members.”

Many of the clubs expressed themselves in favour of the revised charges, but as the Interstate races have been abandoned during the war, your Committee has postponed further consideration of the Sub-committee's recommendations until August, 1916.

### **RACING DURING THE WAR.**

Your Committee has decided not to award premiership points for any races during the coming season, and also not to hold any Championship events.

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

At a Committee meeting held on the 14th April, 1915, Regatta Regulation No. 1 was amended by the insertion of the following after the words “. . . before the date of regatta or race” (line 10):—

“No entry shall be received after the time fixed for closing, excepting where the non-receipt of the entry is due to an accident, fault, or omission of the Postal Department during its transmission, in which case the Regatta Committee may, after obtaining a memorandum from the Postmaster certifying that the envelope, as evidenced by the date stamp thereon, containing the entry, was posted in time for delivery before entries closed, accept such entry, but shall, immediately on doing so, forward the envelope in which it was received, together with the memorandum from the Postmaster and also a declaration by the Secretary of the Club setting forth the facts relating to any such late entry, to the Association. The Association shall have power under this rule to appoint a Sub-committee to review the evidence adduced, and if, in its opinion, the entry is not in order, it shall have the right to order the Regatta Committee to rescind the acceptance of such entry. In no other case shall an entry be accepted or entertained after the time fixed for closing.”

### **STAGING.**

The Alexandra Park Trust has taken over control of the staging at the boat sheds at Prince's Bridge. Delegates from your Committee waited on the Trust with reference to the maintenance of the staging, and that body has agreed to maintain it, subject to an annual contribution by the boat-builders and the Rowing Clubs.

### **RIVER TRAFFIC.**

A Sub-committee was appointed during the year to inquire into the question of proper regulation of river traffic, so as to reduce danger of accident to a minimum. As a result of recommendations made by the Sub-committee, the Ports and Harbours Department has caused amended regulations to be issued, which, if observed, should prevent accidents on the river. Printed copies of the regula-



tions have been forwarded to the Clubs, and your Committee has decided to bring under the notice of the Port Officer any breaches of these regulations. It is hoped, however, that, for their own safety, oarsmen will carefully observe the rules of the river in future.

### **BOATS FOR SCULLING RACES.**

At the instance of the Amateur Sculling Association, affiliated with the V.R.A., the question of allowing the use of best boats in maiden and junior sculling races was re-considered. The matter was thoroughly discussed from every aspect, and it was eventually decided that maiden and junior sculling races should be open to any class of boat.

### **THANKS.**

Your Committee tenders its sincere thanks to all those gentlemen who have assisted, by donations, officiating at races and regattas, or in any other way, during the past season; also to the press for the prominence given to any items of interest to oarsmen.

### **CONCLUSION.**

In view of the depletion in the membership of the Clubs and the strenuous times in which we are living, your Committee would like to urge on all those members, who, for various reasons, are unable to join their comrades in the firing line, the necessity for loyally supporting the Clubs and the Association, thus helping to keep the sport alive until better times return. The serious side of the sport, *i.e.*, premierships competitions and championships, has been abandoned, as such events involve considerable and careful preparation, thereby encroaching on time which could be better spent, in the present circumstances, in other directions. The Clubs, however, will provide their members with plenty of opportunities for healthy exercise in the shape of Club races, for which it is unnecessary to spend much time in preparation. It should be remembered that the sport is not intended as a means of passing time, its chief objects are to keep its followers in a sound state of health and mind, and to create a feeling of strong friendship amongst members, and there has never been a period in our history when the objects of our sport have been so essential to our national welfare. For these reasons your Committee desires to impress upon you the necessity for maintaining your active interest in the sport in order that you may be in a fit state to meet any situation which may arise.

**COMMITTEE MEETINGS.**

During the last year one Special and thirteen Ordinary Committee Meetings were held, the average number present at each meeting being 29. The attendances were as follow:—
