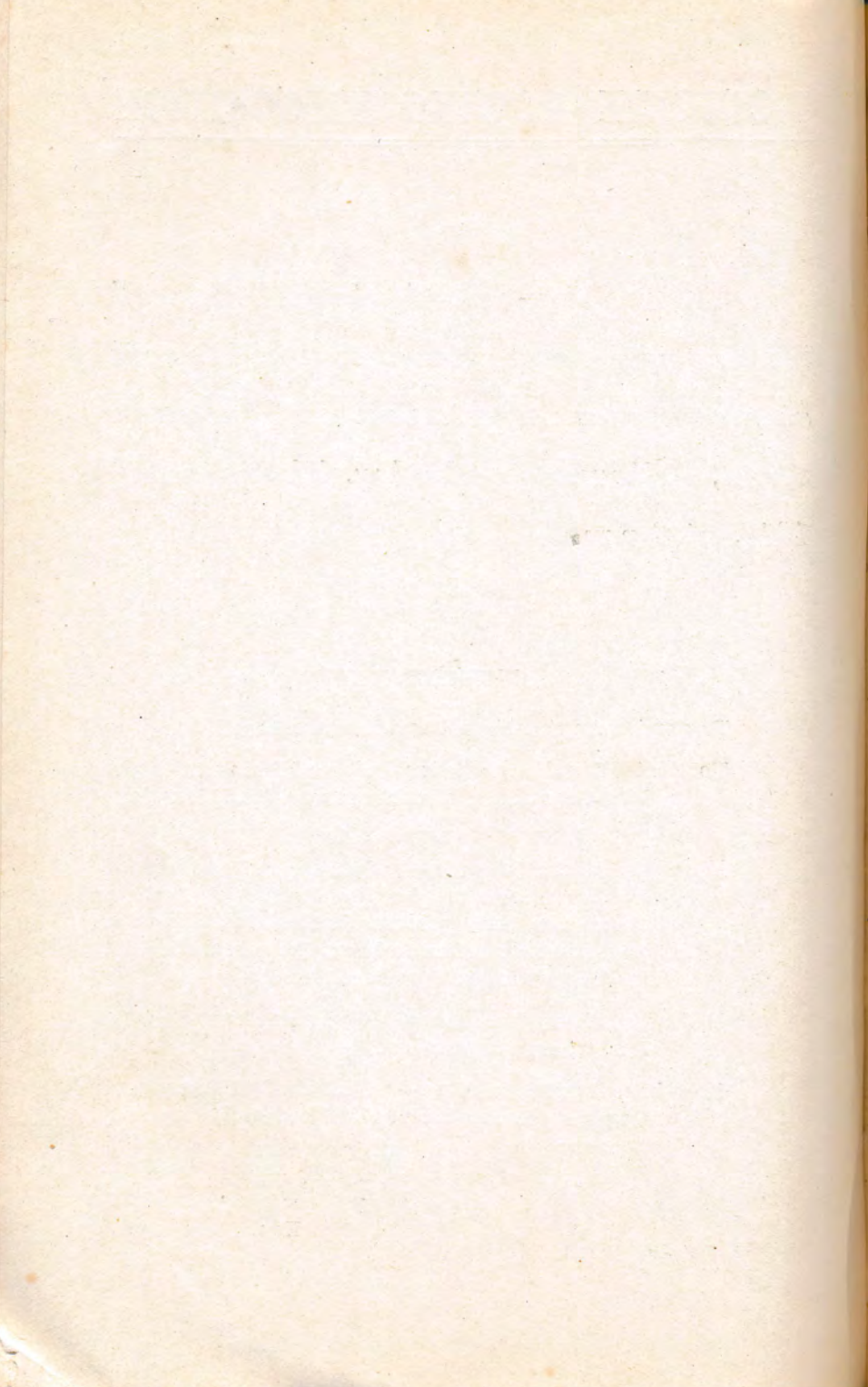

To the Members.

Gentlemen,—

Still another year has passed under war conditions, and your Committee is pleased to report that, despite the absence of competitive rowing, the Association and the Clubs remain in a sound position. The prospects of an early termination of the war, crowned with a lasting peace, are now brighter than ever, and it is hoped that ere our next Annual Meeting the Association will be in a position to again carry on the sport as in pre-war days, with our comrades returned from their arduous work on the battlefield. Only two Regattas were held during the past season, Colac and Rutherglen both being fairly well patronised, whilst the proceeds went to charitable and patriotic funds.

ROLL OF HONOR.

Since the last Annual Report was issued, 91 members have enlisted, making a total of 1231 since the outbreak of war, when the total membership of the affiliated clubs was 2117.

RACING.

Two Combination Eight-oared Races were held on the 19th January and 23rd March, 1918, for which entries of 13 and 15 crews respectively were received. The winning crews were:—E. Hales (E.) bow, J. Cruickshank (B.), A. Lang (Y.Y.), C. L. Webster (E.), T. Keogh (B.), D. F. Dwyer (B.), T. Gipton (F.) stroke. Combination Races were also held by several of the metropolitan clubs and Sculling Handicaps by the Amateur Sculling Association. All the events were reasonably well supported, and in this way interest has been maintained in the sport.

In order to provide for a number of young oarsmen who have taken up the sport during the past few years, your Committee has decided to hold Maiden Pair and Four-oared Races on 23rd November, 1918, and Maiden Eight-oared Races on 21st December, 1918, and 22nd February, 1919.

BOAT STAGING AT PRINCE'S BRIDGE.

The Alexandra Park Trust has decided to reduce the charge for maintenance of the staging at Prince's Bridge from £50, as proposed, to £30 for the present. Of this amount the University, Yarra Yarra, Banks, Richmond, Mercantile, Melbourne and Civil Service Clubs has each agreed to pay £3 3s. Your Committee has arranged to collect this charge from the clubs concerned and pay it over to the Alexandra Park Trust, which body will collect the balance from the boat-builders.

AFFILIATED CLUBS.

Owing to loss of members, the Eaglehawk and Shepparton Clubs are closed down. The Ballarat City Club, which has been closed down for two seasons, is being re-formed, and your Committee trusts that the club will again affiliate at an early date. In view of the fact that the Ballarat City, Shepparton, Eaglehawk, Wangaratta and Seymour Clubs had to close down owing to the enlistment of their members, your Committee decided to write off the amounts due by these clubs as shown in last year's Balance Sheet.

OBITUARY.

It is with feelings of deep regret that your Committee records the death of one of your patrons, the late Sir John Madden. The deceased gentleman was well known as one of the strongest supporters of amateur sport in the Commonwealth, and by his death the sport of rowing, as well as other amateur sports, has sustained a severe loss. To Lady Madden and her family your Committee extends its deepest sympathy.

Another enthusiastic supporter of rowing, Sir Edward Carlile, K.C., passed away during the year. The late Sir Edward was one of the founders of the Civil Service Rowing Club and the V.R.A., and for some years prior to his death was President of the Civil Service Club. To his widow and family your Committee extends its deepest sympathy.

Your Committee also regrets to record the death of Mr. E. Curnow, a member of the Corio Bay Rowing Club, who, whilst sailing a yacht on the Albert Park Lake, received fatal injuries as the result of a collision with a four-oared boat which was racing in the Albert Park Club's Combination Fours. Your Committee expresses its deepest sympathy with deceased's widow and relatives.

RECORDS OF ROWING.

Lady Carlile has handed over to your Committee some valuable news-cuttings and rowing records which the late Sir Edward Carlile had collected covering the period from 1868 to 1892. This collection will form a valuable addition to the record of the sport in Victoria which is being compiled. Your Committee has conveyed to Lady Carlile its appreciation of her courtesy in this matter.

The records of the results of the various Regattas of Victoria which have been compiled by the Sub-Committee, comprising Messrs. John Lang, E. A. Swindells, and E. Kenny, are now practically complete, and will be handed over to your Committee at an early date. A few outstanding matters have still to be cleared up, but these will be settled as soon as

possible. The compilation of these records has been a very onerous task upon which the Sub-Committee has been engaged for seven years, and the special thanks of your Committee is extended to the gentlemen who carried out the work, particularly Mr. John Lang, who has devoted an enormous amount of time to the matter.

FINANCE.

The financial position of the Association is highly satisfactory, as a glance at the Balance Sheet will show. Your Committee decided to purchase a war bond to the value of £100, and this is now held at the State Savings Bank. It has been decided by Parliament not to tax sporting clubs or associations, and the tax of £9 11s. 5d. paid last year has been refunded by the Federal Commissioner of Taxation.

MEMORIAL TO FALLEN OARSMEN.

Realising that oarsmen and supporters of rowing were anxious to show their appreciation of the bravery and noble sacrifices made by their fellow-members on the battlefield, your Committee has decided to erect a monument in the vicinity of the Henley Lawn, on which will be inscribed the names of all Victorian oarsmen who have fallen in the great fight for liberty. It is thus hoped to perpetuate the memory of these brave men, and it is desired that every person interested in the sport will subscribe to the fund which has been opened. Circulars have been issued to members and many ex-members of the clubs inviting contributions, and up to the present a satisfactory response has been received. The list of subscriptions received up to 30th September, 1918, is published at the end of the report.

GENERAL.

Mr. Harold Mortensen, having removed to Sydney during the year, resigned his position as Hon. Auditor, the vacancy being filled by the appointment of Mr. W. C. Harvey.

In connection with its last Regatta, the Colac Regatta Committee proposed to make entries for races free, with a view to making the arrangement permanent should it prove a success. Your Committee decided that, whilst not objecting to free entries for the last Regatta, it did not favour any proposal to make such arrangement a permanent one.

HON. TREASURER.

Increased business responsibilities having made a bigger demand on his time, your Honorary Treasurer, Mr. A. W. Massina, finds it necessary to tender his resignation. When Lieut.-Colonel G. I. Stevenson, C.M.G., resigned from the position at the outbreak of war, Mr. Massina took over the duties, and has proved an able official. During his four years of office he has never spared himself in the interests of the Association, and the special thanks of the members are due to him for his efforts on behalf of the sport during an anxious period.

Mr. S. F. Chubb, Hon. Secretary and Treasurer of the Civil Service Rowing Club, has accepted nomination for the vacant office.

CONCLUSION.

It seems reasonable to believe that the coming season will be the last under war-time conditions, and your Committee feels confident that members will maintain that keen interest in the sport which has been the means of keeping the clubs going during the past four years under such unfavourable circumstances.
