TO THE MEMBERS.

GENTLEMEN,

Submitted herewith for your consideration the Fifty-seventh Annual Report of the Victorian Rowing Association.

The season concluded cannot be deemed as satisfactory, as the State has lost the title of the premier rowing State of the Commonwealth, by virtue of defeat in the Australian Eight-oared Championship at Brisbane. Nevertheless, it should be possible to learn a lesson from the defeat—that is, to regain the title the wholehearted co-operation of all clubs is essential in order to develop the type of young, vigorous oarsmen required to be boated to win the Australian Eight-oared Championship. The preceding two successive victories may have lulled Victorian oarsmen into a state of superiority complex against other State crews.

Club membership figures and number of competitors show a slight decrease, though nothing outstanding in view of the times. The greatest deficit in competitors for the season was at the New Year regattas, Colac and Rutherglen. The Gippsland regattas were again abandoned owing to the poor entries; in only two events were three entries received. Bairnsdale Regatta Committee made every effort to conduct the regatta, and as the course is recognised as the premier river course in Victoria the obvious solution to the poor support is the expense to competitors and cost of freight to clubs.

INTERSTATE EIGHT-OARED RACE (King's Cup).

With the exception of Western Australia, all States were represented in the Australian Eight-oared Championship, rowed over a three-mile course on the Hamilton Reach, Brisbane River, on 6th May, 1933. The race was won by New South Wales, with Queensland second; Victoria, Tasmania and South Australia finished in the order named. The race from the start was a contest between New South Wales and Queensland, the Northern State putting up a great fight to the finish. New South Wales rowed the race in the remarkably fast time of 14 minutes 30 seconds, the first mile being covered in 4 minutes 24 seconds. Tidal conditions and a following wind assisted the crews over the course. To New South Wales the Committee tender their heartiest congratulations on the splendid victory.

Victoria was represented by the following crew:—F. Ruglin (Hawthorn), bow; M. Gardner (Richmond), 2; S. V. Elder (Hawthorn), 3; D. K. Wilson (Hawthorn), 4; J. South (Mercantile), 5; L. J. Thompson (Richmond), 6; B. S. Thompson (Richmond), 7; A. W. McLiesh (Albert Park), stroke; C. Brennan (Hawthorn), coxswain; G. Anderson (Hawthorn), coach; C. Bain (Hawthorn), emergency; R. W. B. Todd, manager; C. Bucknell, trainer.

The crew left Melbourne for Brisbane on the 26th April, 1933, and whilst at Brisbane were quartered at Hamilton, leaving on return to Melbourne on the 9th May, 1933. The manager (Mr. R. W. B. Todd) reported that all members of the crew trained conscientiously and did their best for the State. Owing to the financial position of the Association it was necessary for the crew to travel second-class, and in this respect the manager (Mr. R. W. B. Todd) has reported that it would be advisable in future to endeavour to provide sleeping berths on the forward journey.

The Committee desire to record their thanks to the crew, coach, manager and trainer for their efforts on behalf of the State, and also to express appreciation to the following who helped to make the crew's stay in Brisbane and en route enjoyable:—Queensland Rowing Association (President, Mr. Roland; Honorary Secretary, Mr. Smith); Mr. H. Watson, Brisbane; Mr. H. G. Alderson, Sydney; and the Manly Surf Club.

The selectors of the Interstate crew were Mr. G. Anderson and Mr. W. N. Ricketts, who selected the coach on the 6th March, 1933. Mr. G. Anderson was selected as coach, and the Executive appointed Mr. R. W. B. Todd as the third selector.

Kenny; Delegates to Olympic Federation: Messrs. H. G. Alderson and E. Kenny; Honorary Auditor: Mr. A. W. Massina.

Alteration and Addition to Rules. Resolved by Council that Rule 53 be amended by adding the following: "The course selected, or any alternate course, to be subject to the approval of the Council."

Races on Same Day as King's Cup. Resolved that the following clause be inserted in the Rules: "Unless Council in meeting otherwise determine, no race other than the eight-oared championship for the King's Cup and the sculling championship for the President's Cup, shall be rowed on the same day."

Olympic Games Levy. Resolved: "That the Council strenuously recommends to States to impose the levy of 6d. per oarsman, other than junior and schoolboy oarsmen, in view of the decision of the Olympic Council that only those sports which contribute the levy or an amount equivalent to the levy will be represented in the next team to the Olympic Games. It was suggested that the levy should be added to the capitulation fees already charged by Associations.

Levy. The Council increased the levy on State Associations from £3 3s. to £5 5s. per year.
