OF THE

VICTORIAN ROWING ASSOCIATION.

TO THE MEMBERS.

GENTLEMEN,

Your Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration the Fifty-ninth Annual Report of the Victorian Rowing Association.

Club membership figures show a decrease of 301 on last year's figures. This is, however, largely accounted for by the reduction in the figures for the Melbourne University Boat Club. In the past it has been customary to show the membership of that Club as 360, but, in view of the then constitution of the Club, not all of these were rowing members, and it was really only a paper strength. This year the University Club has been re-constructed and the actual membership has been reduced to a true figure of 110.

The number of competitors, Senior, Maiden and Junior, shows a substantial increase, being 3401, as against 2616 last year.

A very pleasing feature of the season was the revival of the Gippsland Regattas, after a lapse of four years. The entries at these regattas were very satisfactory, and great credit is due to the Bairnsdale and Sale Regatta Committees for the very efficient way in which the functions were carried out at each centre under very difficult conditions, due to the heavy rains and floods which prevailed throughout the Easter holidays. It is hoped that future years will see a continuation of these regattas and that they will be well supported.

The outstanding event in Victorian rowing during the season was the visit of the London Rowing Club's Eight. The visit of this crew caused a good deal of interest, and many and varied have been the arguments since in regard to styles of rowing. The London oarsmen easily won the Grand Challenge at Henley-on-Yarra and the Victorian Eight-oared Championship.

It is evident that, in the majority of the Metropolitan Clubs, the membership is increasing, and taken generally the outlook is promising.

Whilst regretting that Victoria did not succeed in winning the King's Cup Race, your Committee feels that the year has been satisfactory and looks forward to further improvement during the forthcoming year.

INTERSTATE EIGHT-OARED RACE (King's Cup)

All States were represented in the Australian Eight-oared Championship, rowed over a three-mile course on the Nepean River at Penrith, New South Wales, on 11th May, 1935. The race was won by New South Wales, with West Australia second, South Australia third, Victoria fourth, Queensland fifth, Tasmania sixth. The Nepean is a magnificent course, being practically straight for the full three miles, and with plenty of room for all the competing crews. The race was rowed under ideal conditions.

To New South Wales the Committee tender their heartiest congratulations on its fine win, and also on the record achieved in being the first State to win the coveted King's Cup three times in succession. The very highest praise is due to the West Australians—the lightest crew in the race—for their plucky effort.

Butler (Melbourne), manager; C. Bucknell, trainer.

C. F. W. Peppler (Yarra Yarra) represented Victoria in the Australian Sculling Championship (President's Cup), which was rowed prior to the King's Cup Race, but had to be content with second place to H. J. Turner (N.S.W.), who won for the fourth year in succession, with C. E. Slaughter (Q.) third, and H. A. Wilkinson (T.) fourth. To Mr. Turner the Committee extends sincere congratulations on his win.

The Committee records its thanks to the crew, coach, manager and trainer for their efforts on behalf of the State, and also to express appreciation to the following who helped to make the crew's stay in Penrith enjoyable:—

M. Hutton being appointed. Mr. G. W. Smith was appointed as the third selector.

VICTORIAN EIGHT-OARED CHAMPIONSHIP.

The 43rd Annual Eight-oared Championship was rowed on Saturday, 10th November, 1934, over a 2½-miles course on the Lower Yarra. This particular race was made historic by the fact that an English crew (The London Rowing Club Eight) competed for the first time in a Victorian Championship.

Weather conditions for the race were far from ideal, as a heavy stream was running and a strong wind made the water very rough.

The event attracted an entry of seven crews, and was won by the London Rowing Club crew by eight lengths from the Melbourne University Boat Club, in 14 min. 20 secs. Mercantile, Hawthorn, Nagambie and Essendon finished in the order named. Unfortunately, the Richmond Eight was unable to finish as its boat was sinking and the members were compelled to row to the wharf.

After the race the Championship Eight Pennant was presented to Mr. E. G. L. Howitt, captain of the London Rowing Club, and the Championship Medals to each member of the crew.

The Committee sincerely congratulates the London Rowing Club on its win.

VICTORIAN FOUR-OARED CHAMPIONSHIP.

Rowed on the Lower Yarra on Saturday, 15th December, 1934, the Victorian Four-oared Championship attracted an entry of six crews and was rowed under fair weather conditions. The race was one of the finest Championship races seen on the Yarra for many years, and resulted in a win for the Nagambie Rowing Club Four by two lengths from the Preston Rowing Club, in 16 min. 32 secs. Richmond, Melbourne, Melbourne University and Hawthorn finished in the order named.

In extending the warmest congratulations to the Nagambie Rowing Club on its second successive win in this event, the Committee feels that the Preston Four is deserving of the highest commendation for the magnificent race it put up in this, its first entry into Championship rowing. The experience gained by Preston will stand it in good stead during the forthcoming season.

VICTORIAN PAIR-OARED CHAMPIONSHIP.

Ten crews competed in this event, which was rowed over a mile course on the Lower Yarra on Saturday, 6th April, 1935. Preston Rowing Club won by two feet from the Wahgunyah Rowing Club, in 6 min. 32 secs. Mercantile, Melbourne University, Albert Park, Nagambie, Ballarat City, Wendouree, Hawthorn and Ballarat finished in the order named. It is pleasing to be able to heartily congratulate the Preston Rowing Club on its win in this event, the first Championship race the Club has won.

VICTORIAN SCULLING CHAMPIONSHIP.

C. F. W. Peppler (Yarra Yarra), M. Hansen (Footscray City), R. Jelbart (Melbourne University) and W. G. Davis (Richmond) contested the 43rd Victorian Sculling Championship over a 2½-mile course on the Lower Yarra on Saturday, 16th March, 1935. C. F. W. Peppler won from M. Hansen in 19 min. 4½ secs.; R. Jelbart was third and W. G. Davis fourth. The race was unfortunately marred by an eight-oared boat on the course interfering with some of the scullers. Mr. Peppler is warmly congratulated on his fourth successive victory in the Victorian Sculling Championship.

Rorke; London Representative, Major S. A. Middleton.

Alterations and Additions to Rules.—

Rule 31.—After the words “Representative of each State” insert the words “not less than seven clear days prior to such race.”

Rule 27.—Amended to provide as follows:—

“In the President’s Cup Race two or more scullers from the State in which the race is held will be permitted to compete in the event of there being no entries from the other States.”

Rule 28.—Amended to permit of the South Australian registered colours (blue and brown being re-arranged as follows):—“Chocolate with turquoise blue trimming on arms and neck, with a blue piece half-way down the centre on a white singlet. The maltese cross on the front to be eliminated and replaced by the figure of a magpie on the left side.” (Previously the colours were:—White jerseys with maltese cross on breast outlined in brown, with blue S.A. in centre and brown and blue facings.)

Olympic Selectors.—It was resolved that Messrs. B. S. Williams (N.S.W.), P. J. Ryan (W.A.) and E. Kenny (Vic.) be the Council’s Selection Committee to select rowing or sculling representatives for recommendation to the Olympic Council for the 1936 Olympic Games, and that Mr. E. Kenny be the Council’s representative on the Olympic Selection Committee.

Levy.—It was resolved that the Levy for 1935-1936 be fixed at £5 5s.

COMMITTEE DECISIONS.

Monthly Meeting.—That the monthly meeting night of the Committee be altered from the first Monday in each month to the first Wednesday in each month. (7/11/1934.)

Affiliation Fees.—That the Melbourne University Boat Club be placed on the same basis as country Clubs—i.e., the Club pay an Affiliation Fee of two shillings (2s.) per capita on the full membership. (7/8/1935.)

Christmas Regattas.—That the Regattas at Nagambie, Shepparton and, alternatively, Rutherglen or Colac, be taken as a treble. (4/9/1935.)

Increase in Affiliation Fees.—That it be a recommendation to the Annual General Meeting that the Affiliation Fees be increased by one shilling (1s.) per capita. (4/9/35.)
