The Sixty-fifth Annual General Meeting of the above Association will be held at the Amateur Sports Club, McEwan House, 343 Little Collins Street, Melbourne, on Monday, 6th October, 1941, at 8 p.m.

BUSINESS.

1. To confirm the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 7th October, 1940.
2. To receive Annual Report and Balance Sheet.
3. To elect Office-bearers, viz.: Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents and two Honorary Auditors.
4. To consider the following recommendations from the Committee in regard to control of Competitive Rowing for season 1941-1942:—

(a) That Divisions be instituted as under, viz.:

Division "A."—For all oarsmen who have won a Senior Race with oars, or a race described on a Regatta Programme as a Senior Race. Also for those who have won all their Junior Races. Those who have won a Junior Eight or Junior Four or Junior Pair to compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Juniors.

Division "B."—For all those who have won all their Maiden Races, or races described as Maiden Races on a Regatta Programme. Those who have won a Maiden Eight or Maiden Four or Maiden Pair to also compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Maidens.

Division "C."—For oarsmen who have not won a Maiden Race of any kind, or who still may have a particular Maiden Race, such as Eight or Four or Pair to win.

Division "D."—For all those who are starting in a Regatta Race as purely Novice Oarsmen.

- (b) The Executive to have power to suspend these Rules for any particular Regatta and to substitute for them any conditions they think fit.
- (c) All events to be rowed over a half-mile course instead of a mile.

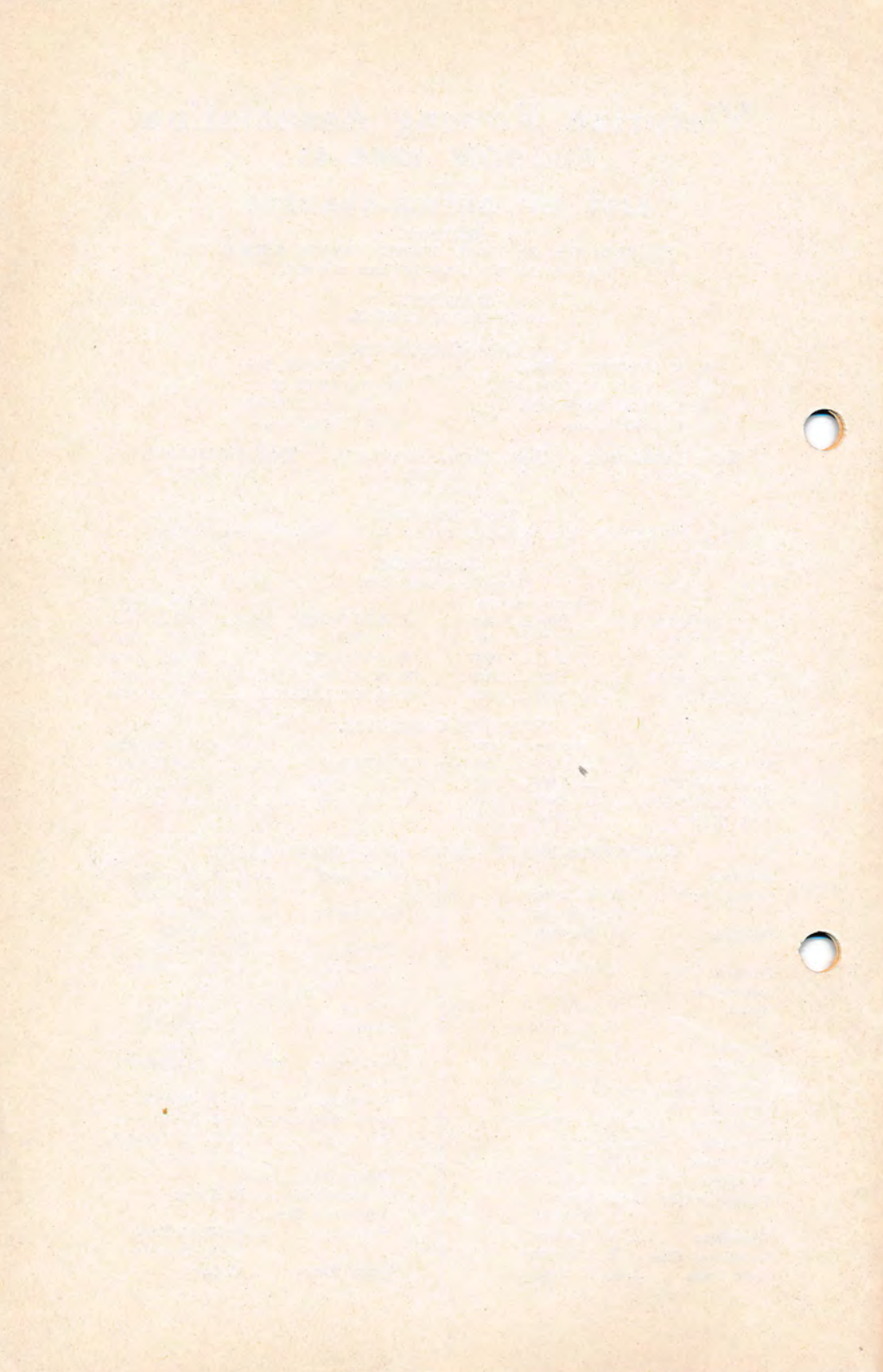

TO THE MEMBERS.

GENTLEMEN,

Your Committee submits for your consideration the Sixty-fifth Annual Report of the Victorian Rowing Association.

The season just concluded has witnessed a great change in the fortunes of rowing due to the steady enlistment of oarsmen for service overseas, the call-up of the various age groups to undergo military training, and the new aspect which has come into being over the last few months of units in which many oarsmen who had joined the Militia Forces were serving, being called up for full-time military service for the duration of the war. All these phases have been the cause of a good deal of worry and anxiety to Club Executives. However, taking everything into consideration, Clubs have carried on splendidly under very disheartening circumstances, and your Committee desires to record its appreciation of the excellent way in which the majority of Clubs has co-operated with it in keeping the sport afloat. It may be that, in common with all other sports, there are many dark days ahead of us, but stout hearts and a determination to carry on whatever the odds will see the sport so dear to us emerge triumphant. When we are inclined to become pessimistic let us cast our thoughts back to the words spoken by a famous statesman, who to-day is the Empire's Leader, when, addressing the British Parliament during the dark days of the war of 1914-1918, he said:—

“There is no reason to be disheartened about the progress of the War. We are passing through a bad time now, and it will probably be worse before it is better. But that it will be better, if we only endure and persevere, I have no doubt whatever.”

Your Committee feels that if this statement is taken as an incentive, and if we adopt the concluding sentence as our watchword, then we need not fear for the future of rowing.

Enlistments of oarsmen for service overseas continue to grow, and the total has grown from 225, as shown in the last report, to 454. As oarsmen we are proud to see our comrades prepared to take their part in the defence of our Empire, although, naturally, such feelings of pride are somewhat tinged with regret that necessity for such sacrifice should exist in a civilised world.

As could only be expected, casualties have occurred amongst our oarsmen in the Fighting Forces but, happily, the loss of life has been slight. The names of oarsmen figure amongst the awards for gallant and distinguished conduct, and there is no doubt but that they will figure more prominently as the war goes on.

During the year a good deal of trouble and inconvenience has been experienced through the failure of various Club Secretaries to reply to correspondence sent to them. It is realised that enlistments, etc., have caused a good deal of upset in the executive work of Clubs, but at the same time there must surely be someone in the towns where the Clubs are situated who is interested in rowing and who would be able to reply to communications. Should a Club be unable to carry on consequent on decrease in membership caused by enlistments and other military demands, the Honorary Secretary of the Association should be advised, when steps can be taken to place such Club on a suspense list for the duration of the war. Your Committee is most anxious to extend every consideration to Clubs so situated, but cannot do so unless those Clubs co-operate. Apart from any other consideration, failure to reply to correspondence, no matter from whom it may emanate, can only be regarded as being most discourteous to the Association.

The position in regard to information concerning enlistments is not altogether satisfactory. Clubs have to be repeatedly reminded in regard to this matter. Despite repeated reminders and requests, some Clubs have not yet furnished any lists. Your Committee appeals to all Clubs to keep the Honorary Secretary of the Association posted with the latest information in this regard, and suggests that each Club appoint a member of its Executive to collect the information and furnish it to your Committee at regular intervals, say in January, April, July and September each year.

Your Committee regrets it is not possible to give complete Club Membership figures for the year, owing to the fact that twelve Clubs have not supplied these lists as required by Rule XXII.

As could only be expected, the number of competitors at Regattas, etc., held during the year showed a very large decrease. They were as follow:—
