The Sixty-sixth Annual General Meeting of the above Association will be held at the Amateur Sports Club, McEwan House, 343 Little Collins Street, Melbourne, on Monday, 5th October, 1942, at 8 p.m.

BUSINESS.

1. To confirm the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 6th October, 1941.
2. To receive Annual Report and Balance Sheet.
3. To elect Office-bearers, viz.: Patrons, President, eight Vice-Presidents, two Hon. Auditors.
4. To consider the following recommendation from the Committee, viz.:
"That the same Rules as applied for the control of Competitive Rowing during season 1941-1942 remain in force for the season 1942-1943."

These Rules were:—

- (a) That Divisions be instituted as under, viz.:

Division "A."—For all oarsmen who have won a Senior Race with oars, or a race described on a Regatta Programme as a Senior Race. Also for those who have won all their Junior Races. Those who have won a Junior Eight or Junior Four or Junior Pair to compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Juniors.

Division "B."—For all those who have won all their Maiden Races, or races described as Maiden Races on a Regatta Programme. Those who have won a Maiden Eight or Maiden Four or Maiden Pair to also compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Maidens.

Division "C."—For oarsmen who have not won a Maiden Race of any kind, or who still may have a particular Maiden Race, such as Eight or Four or Pair to win.

Division "D."—For all those who are starting in a Regatta Race as purely Novice Oarsmen.


- (b) The Executive to have power to suspend these Rules for any particular Regatta and to substitute for them any conditions they think fit.
- (c) All events to be rowed over a half-mile course instead of a mile.

TO THE MEMBERS.

GENTLEMEN,

Your Committee submits for your consideration the Sixty-sixth Annual Report of the Victorian Rowing Association.

The season just concluded has seen a great depletion in the membership of Clubs, which has resulted in some having to "shut up shop" for the duration of the War. Despite this, your Committee feels that there is every reason to be confident that the sport will be carried on. Admittedly, we are facing difficult times, which may become more difficult before the present pitiful state of international affairs ends and the glorious days of peace on earth and goodwill towards all will again be the order of the day. That our Divine Master may see fit to bring this about at an earlier date than appears possible at present must surely be the most earnest prayer of each and every one of us.

The outstanding event of the year has been the return to their native shores of so many of our oarsmen comrades who have been serving overseas. That we were all delighted to again see and welcome them goes without saying, although such delight was tinged with regret when we realised they could only be with us for such a short period before again moving off to battle stations. That their interest in the sport is still keen was evidenced by the fact that they all found their way to the River at the first opportunity.

The way in which the returned men found their way to the river should be a stimulus to those of us left to carry on to put our shoulders sturdily to the wheel and determine to keep the sport swinging until such time as they come back for good.

Enlistments of oarsmen for active service has grown from 454 to 542. The list of enlistments included in this report cannot be asserted as being correct, owing to the regrettable failure of many Clubs to furnish up-to-date lists.

As can only be expected, further casualties have occurred, but fortunately the loss of life has been slight. Additional awards for gallantry have been made.

It is not possible to give complete Club Membership figures for the year, as only 10 Metropolitan Clubs and 4 Country Clubs have furnished the lists required by Rule XXII. The Membership figures supplied by these Clubs are 461 Metropolitan and 54 Country, as compared with 799 and 204 respectively for season 1940-41.

REGATTAS.

The Association conducted only one organised Regatta during the season, viz.: the Special Fixture on 6th December, 1941. The programme for this event comprised Challenge Eights, Open Fours, Junior Fours, "B" and "C" Fours, Novice Fours, Open Pairs, Lightweight Maiden Fours, and Handicap Sculls.

One hundred and twelve entries were received, and the winning crews were: Challenge Eights, Richmond; Open Fours, Footscray City; Junior Fours, Mercantile; "B" and "C" Fours, Footscray City; Novice Fours, Mercantile; Open Pairs, South Melbourne; Lightweight Maiden Fours, Mercantile; Handicap Sculls, no race, as one of the competitors withdrew.

The Upper Yarra Regatta Association modified its programme to the extent that it comprised only Challenge Pairs (won by Melbourne Rowing Club) and Combination Fours.

The South Melbourne Rowing Club conducted a Regatta on the River on Saturday, 31st January, 1942. The programme was Challenge Pairs (won by Banks Rowing Club) and Combination Fours. The trophies were donated by the President of the Club (Mr. A. Casey) and Vice-President (Mr. C. Heath). The proceeds, amounting to £7 10s., were donated to the "Sporting Globe's" "Fags for Fighters Fund."

The thanks of your Committee are extended to the South Melbourne Rowing Club for its initiative in staging this Regatta. Also to the donors of the trophies for their generous action.

Only one country Regatta was held during the season, viz.: the Dimboola Rowing Club's Regatta on 6th November, 1941. Good entries were received and a very successful day eventuated. A pleasing feature of this Regatta was the success of the Antwerp Rowing Club in winning two events. It is hoped that the success of the Antwerp Club foretells its return to the winning fold after the War.

OPEN EIGHTS.

To compensate in some degree for the absence of Championship Races, arrangements were made for an Open Eight-oared Race to be held on the 18th April, 1942, over a two-mile course on the Lower Yarra, such race to be open to all classes of oarsmen. There was an entry of five crews. The event was won by the Footscray City Rowing Club (W. Hayes, 10 st. 7 lbs., bow; K. Longton, 10 st. 7 lbs., 2; R. Boynton, 11 st. 7 lbs., 3; G. Reynolds, 11 st. 0 lbs., 4; P. Morgan, 13 st. 0 lbs., 5; L. Wilkinson, 12 st. 7 lbs., 6; G. Draper, 11 st. 10 lbs., 7; S. Fraser, 11 st. 5 lbs., str.; F. O'Donahue, cox; T. Gipton, coach).

Congratulations are extended to the Footscray City Rowing Club on its win in this event.

TIME TRIAL EVENTS.

A Four-oared Time Trial, for which five crews entered, was held on 2nd May, 1942, from a point between the Melbourne and Mercantile sheds around Como Island and back to the starting point. The event was won by Banks Rowing Club (33 mins. 47 secs.), with Footscray City No. 1 (33 mins. 51 secs.), second; Melbourne (34 mins. 20 secs.), third; Mercantile (35 mins. 40 secs.), fourth, and Footscray City No. 2 (37 mins. 20 secs.), fifth.

METROPOLITAN ROWING COMMITTEE.

The Metropolitan Rowing Committee conducted its Fourteenth Annual Regatta on the 15th November, 1941. As was done last year, the Committee again decided not to restrict the programme to events for Novices and Lightweight Oarsmen, and included Challenge Eights, Open Pairs, and "B" and "C" Fours.

The Regatta attracted an entry of 92 competitors, this being 53 less than those received for the previous year's Regatta. Winning crews were: Challenge Eights, Richmond; "B" and "C" Fours, Essendon; Novice Fours, Richmond; Open Pairs, Footscray City; Novice Sculls, Richmond.

This Committee held another Regatta on 14th March, 1942, with a programme which comprised Challenge Fours, Junior Pairs, and Novice Pairs. This attracted an entry of 50 competitors. Winning crews were: Challenge Fours, Banks; Junior Pairs, Melbourne; Novice Pairs, Footscray City.

UNITED SERVICES REGATTA.

The United Services Regatta Association held a Regatta for Service crews on 13th June, 1942. The programme comprised Eights, Fours, Pairs, and Sculls. The Regatta attracted an entry of 42 competitors. Although this was a disappointing entry when one considers the number of oarsmen serving in the various services, it must be borne in mind that many of the units were on their battle stations, and it was not possible for the men to get leave because of interference with training.

For security reasons it is not possible to give the titles of the winning units.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

Only one General Meeting was held during the year, viz.: the Annual General Meeting on 6th October, 1941. At this meeting the following Rules for the control of Competitive Rowing for the season 1941-42 were approved:—

(a) Divisions be instituted as under, viz.:

Division "A."—For all oarsmen who have won a Senior Race with oars, or a race described on a Regatta Programme as a Senior Race. Also for those who have won all their Junior Races. Those who have won a Junior Eight or Junior Four or Junior Pair to compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Juniors.

COMMITTEE DECISIONS.

Meetings of Committee.—At the April meeting of the Committee it was decided that—

- (a) The next meeting be held in July and that thereafter the meetings be held each alternate month.
- (b) The Executive be authorised to deal with any urgent business arising between meetings.
- (c) The Honorary Secretary be authorised to call a meeting of the Committee at any time he may deem necessary (C. 1/4/42).

Your Committee acknowledges with sincere thanks a donation of £2 2s. from Mr. S. R. Bell, one of your Vice-Presidents.

The Honorary Auditors (Messrs. R. L. Thwaites and A. R. Duncan) continue to carry out sterling work in the interests of the Association. To them your Committee extends thanks.

To the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association (Melbourne Henley) sincere thanks are extended for its generous donation of £25 towards the cost of trophies for the Regatta held on 6th December, 1941.

Your Committee also desires to express thanks to all members who acted as officials at the Regattas conducted by the Association during the year. To the splendid assistance given by these members is due the smooth running of the events.

To the Town Clerk of Melbourne and the City Council, also the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the thanks of your Committee are extended for the whole-hearted assistance and co-operation they have given during the year.

Press publicity, for various reasons, is very restricted these days. In this connection your Committee feels that it owes a deep debt of gratitude to Mr. Ray Todd for what he has done in this direction. He has been most untiring in his efforts to gain publicity for the sport, and the items which have appeared in the Daily Press from time to time have been entirely due to his good work.

OBITUARY.

It is with feelings of the deepest regret that your Committee records the decease during the year of Messrs. E. T. Bradshaw, W. Joseph, R. Johnston, and C. Suffren, all of whom rendered sterling service to rowing.

The following oarsmen have been reported Killed in Action or Died on Service Overseas, viz.: W. Belltowers (Mercantile), J. G. Murphy (Heidelberg City), W. T. Owen (Banks), M. Whiteside (Wendouree), H. W. Nevett (Wendouree), A. C. Stewart (Richmond), and R. E. Andrews (Dimboola).

To those relatives of the foregoing who are left to mourn their passing, the sincere sympathy of your Committee is extended.
