*The Sixty-seventh Annual General Meeting of the above Association will be held at the Amateur Sports Club, McEwan House, 343 Little Collins Street, Melbourne, on Monday, 4th October, 1943, at 8 p.m.*

## BUSINESS.

1. To confirm the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 5th October, 1942.
2. To receive Annual Report and Balance Sheet.
3. To elect Office-bearers, viz.: Patrons, President, eight Vice-Presidents, two Hon. Auditors.
4. To consider the following recommendation from the Committee, viz.:

“That the same Rules as applied for the control of Competitive Rowing during season 1941-1942 and 1942-1943 remain in force for the season 1943-1944.”

These Rules were:—

- (a) That Divisions be instituted as under, viz.:

Division “A.”—For all oarsmen who have won a Senior Race with oars, or a race described on a Regatta Programme as a Senior Race. Also for those who have won all their Junior Races. Those who have won a Junior Eight or Junior Four or Junior Pair to compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Juniors.

Division “B.”—For all those who have won all their Maiden Races, or races described as Maiden Races on a Regatta Programme. Those who have won a Maiden Eight or Maiden Four or Maiden Pair to also compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Maidens.

Division “C.”—For oarsmen who have not won a Maiden Race of any kind, or who still may have a particular Maiden Race, such as Eight or Four or Pair to win.

Division “D.”—For all those who are starting in a Regatta Race as purely Novice Oarsmen.


- (b) The Executive to have power to suspend these Rules for any particular Regatta and to substitute for them any conditions they think fit.
- (c) All events to be rowed over a half-mile course instead of a mile.

# SIXTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

## OF THE VICTORIAN ROWING ASSOCIATION

TO THE MEMBERS.

GENTLEMEN,

Herewith your Committee submits for your consideration the Sixty-seventh Annual Report of the Victorian Rowing Association.

It is pleasing to record that after four years of war the sport is still being carried on, although, naturally, the membership of the Association has been greatly depleted. Many Clubs are unable to function because of lack of members, whilst many are still making the best of things with greatly depleted memberships, and are doing everything possible to keep afloat.

Provision for those Clubs which are unable to function for the reasons stated was made by your Committee at its meeting on 4th August, 1943, by a Resolution which is referred to later in this report under "Committee Decisions."

To those Club Executives who are doing so much to keep the flag flying your Committee desires to express, on your behalf, the sincerest appreciation. There is not the slightest doubt but that their efforts will help the sport to flourish after the war.

Enlistments of oarsmen for active service has grown from 542 to 779. Unfortunately, the list published in this report cannot be accepted as complete owing to the regrettable failure of many Clubs to furnish up-to-date lists. In this connection your Committee urges Club Executives to make a special endeavour to bring the lists up to date, so that a complete record of all enlistments may be obtained.

No true reflection of the Association's membership can be furnished, as only 10 Clubs (nine Metropolitan and one Country) have furnished the lists required by Rule XXII.

### REGATTAS.

The only organised Regatta conducted by the Association during the season was the one held on 20th February, 1943. The programme comprised Novice Pairs, Novice Fours, Challenge Pairs and Challenge Fours.

Sixty-six competitors participated in the racing, the winning crews being: Novice Pairs, Banks; Novice Fours, Footscray City; Challenge Pairs, Banks; Challenge Fours, no race, as both the crews who were to compete in the final were disqualified for being late at the start.

The Upper Yarra Regatta Association conducted its Annual Regatta on 10th April, 1943, with a programme which comprised Novice Pairs, Novice Fours, Challenge Pairs, Challenge Fours.

Ninety-four entries were received, and the winning crews were: Novice Pairs, Essendon; Novice Fours, Banks; Challenge Pairs, Banks; Challenge Fours, Melbourne.

No Country Regattas were held during the season.

### OPEN EIGHTS.

Held over a mile course on the Lower Yarra on 15th May, 1943, and open to all classes of oarsmen, this event attracted an entry of three crews. It was won by the Melbourne Rowing Club (F. Jessett, bow; J. Lord, 2; T. Hoffman, 3; W. Keetley, 4; R. Rawlins, 5; J. Goddard, 6; A. Anderson, 7; K. Grant, str.; B. Hill, cox).

Congratulations are extended to the Melbourne Rowing Club on its win in this event.

### TIME-TRIAL EVENTS.

The Association conducted two series of Time Trials for Four-oared and Pair-oared crews over the following courses:—

**Four-oared.**—From a point between the Melbourne and Mercantile Sheds around Como Island and back to the starting point.

**Pair-oared.**—From a point between the Melbourne and Mercantile Sheds to Punt Road Bridge, going up through one arch and coming down through the other arch.

The results were:—

#### First Series (from 20/9/42 to 20/12/42).

**Four-oared.**—Seventeen crews competed. Won by Footscray City Rowing Club (32 mins. 15 secs.); Melbourne Rowing Club (32 mins. 16 secs.) were second, and Richmond Rowing Club (32 mins. 32 secs.) third. The winning crew was: H. Tribe, bow; L. Byrne, 2; P. Morgan, 3; L. Wilkinson, str.; E. Bunce, cox.

**Four-oared (Mixed Division).**—Melbourne Rowing Club (A. J. Anderson, bow; E. J. Farrell, 2; E. T. J. Kerby, 3; K. Grant, str.; L. Smith, cox) was the only entry and rowed the course in 33 mins. 32 secs.

**Pair-oared.**—Thirteen crews competed. The event was won by Footscray City Rowing Club (P. Morgan, bow; L. Wilkinson, str.; F. Donohoe, cox) with a course time of 20 mins. 11 secs.; Melbourne Rowing Club filled second and third places, with crews which took 20 mins. 49½ secs. and 20 mins. 57 secs. to complete the course.

**Pair-oared Service Crews (for oarsmen members of the Forces).**—Nine crews competed. The winning crew was Lieut. E. T. J. Kerby, bow; Lieut. D. Fraser, str.; P. Judd, cox. This crew took 20 mins. 39 secs. to complete the course. Crews representing the Royal Australian Navy were second and third, with 20 mins. 50 secs and 20 mins. 54½ secs.

#### Second Series (from 21/12/42 to 16/5/43).

**Four-oared.**—Four crews competed. The event was won by a crew from the Footscray City Rowing Club, which did the course in 32 mins. 35 secs. Another crew from the Footscray City Rowing Club, with 33 mins. 15 secs., filled second place, whilst a crew from the Melbourne Rowing Club, with 33 mins. 47 secs., was third. The personnel of the winning crew was: W. Hayes, bow; G. Draper, 2; P. Morgan, 3; L. Wilkinson, str.; E. Bunce, cox.

**Pair-oared.**—Nine crews competed, and the winning crew (K. Field, bow; J. O'Connor, str.; J. Benain, cox) was provided by the Banks Rowing Club. The time taken was 20 mins. 1½ secs. Footscray City Rowing Club (20 mins. 29 secs.) were second, and Melbourne Rowing Club (20 mins. 48 secs.) were third.

To the winning crews in these events, hearty congratulations are extended.

### METROPOLITAN ROWING COMMITTEE.

The Metropolitan Rowing Committee held a Regatta on the 6th March, 1943, with a programme which included Novice Pairs, Novice Fours, Novice Lightweight Fours, Challenge Fours and Challenge Pairs.

The Regatta attracted an entry of 84 competitors. Winning Clubs were: Novice Pairs, Footscray City; Novice Fours, Melbourne No. 2 Crew; Novice Lightweight Fours, Mercantile; Challenge Fours, Footscray City; Challenge Pairs, Banks.

### UNITED SERVICES REGATTA.

The United Services Regatta Association held a Regatta for Service Crews on 1st May, 1943, with a programme consisting of Eight-oared, Four-oared, Pair-oared and Sculls events. The Regatta attracted an entry of 117 competitors, the outstanding feature being an entry of eight Eight-oared Crews.

Some excellent racing was witnessed, and it is regretted that, for security reasons, it is not advisable to give the titles of winning units.

Regatta; 4/3/44, Metropolitan Rowing Committee Regatta; 18/3/44, V.R.A. Open Fours (1 mile); 1/4/44, V.R.A. Open Eights (1 mile).

Time-Trial Events as under have also been arranged:—

- (a) **Time Trial Fours and Pairs**, under the same conditions as last year, commencing as from 5th August, 1943, and continuing until 30th November, 1943.
- (b) **Service Pair-oared Time Trial**, commencing 5th August, 1943, and continuing throughout the season. Such event to be confined to visiting Service Oarsmen.

**AUSTRALIAN AMATEUR ROWING COUNCIL.**

No meeting of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council was held during 1942-1943.

**GENERAL MEETINGS.**

Only one General Meeting was held during the year, viz., the Annual General Meeting on 5th October, 1942. At this meeting the following Rules for the Control of Competitive Rowing, which applied during season 1941-1942, were approved for 1942-1943:—

To those members who acted as officials at events carried out during the year your Committee is grateful. The splendid assistance given by these members helped considerably in the smooth running of these events.

To the Town Clerk of Melbourne and the City Council, also the Metropolitan Board of Works, the thanks of your Committee are extended for the wholehearted assistance and co-operation given during the year.

Messrs. R. Todd and W. G. Scates carried out patient and valuable work as Timekeepers for the various Time-Trial events which were held during the season. To these gentlemen your Committee owes a very deep meed of thanks.
