The Sixty-eighth Annual General Meeting of the above Association will be held at the Amateur Sports Club, McEwan House, 343 Little Collins Street, Melbourne, on Monday, 2nd October, 1944, at 8 p.m.

BUSINESS.

1. To confirm the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 4th October, 1943.
2. To receive Annual Report and Balance Sheet.
3. To elect Office-bearers, viz.: Patrons, President, eight Vice-Presidents, two Hon. Auditors.
4. To consider the following recommendation from the Committee, viz.:

“That the Rules to govern Competitive Rowing during Season 1944-1945 be as under:—

- (a) That Divisions be instituted as under, viz.:

Division “A.”—For all oarsmen who have won a Senior Race with oars, or a race described on a Regatta Programme as a Senior Race. Also for those who have won all their Junior Races. Those who have won a Junior Eight or Junior Four or Junior Pair to compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Juniors.

Division “B.”—For all those who have won all their Maiden Races, or races described as Maiden Races on a Regatta Programme. Those who have won a Maiden Eight or Maiden Four or Maiden Pair to also compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Maidens.

Division “C.”—For oarsmen who have not won a Maiden Race of any kind, or who still may have a particular Maiden Race, such as Eight or Four or Pair to win, provided that he will not be permitted to win more than one Pair, Four or Eight in this Division.

Division “D.”—For all those who are starting in a Regatta Race as purely Novice Oarsmen.

- (b) The Executive to have power to suspend these Rules for any particular Regatta and to substitute for them any conditions they think fit.
- (c) All events to be rowed over a half-mile course instead of a mile.

TO THE MEMBERS.

GENTLEMEN,

Herewith your Committee submits for your consideration the Sixty-eighth Annual Report of the Victorian Rowing Association. It is the fifth Report submitted under war conditions, and your Committee cannot but express the hope that it will be the last, a hope which is nurtured by the favourable developments which have taken place in all war zones over the recent weeks.

Although the season just completed is the fifth since the outbreak of war, your Committee feels that it is one which can be looked back upon with a good measure of satisfaction. All Combination events have been splendidly supported and Regattas have received encouraging support.

Taking everything into consideration, your Committee is confident that the sport of rowing is in a sound position, and feels that it will not experience any great difficulty in again picking up its swing when peace is again with us and the world resumes its normal mode of life.

To those Club Executives who have striven so hard to bring about the present satisfactory position your Committee is very grateful, and desires to express, on your behalf, sincere appreciation of their efforts.

The year has been notable for the number of our oarsmen comrades in the Services who have been able to visit their respective Clubs, and it is felt that the welcome which has been extended to them by their fellow-oarsmen cannot but assure them that we all deeply appreciate the sacrifices they are making on our behalf, and must make them feel that we are continually looking forward to the day when we will be able to welcome them home again.

Another very pleasing feature, which has been much in evidence during the year, is the number of members of Interstate Clubs serving in the Forces who have visited the various Clubs. Everything possible has been done to make these visiting oarsmen welcome and to encourage them to renew their visits whenever they have the opportunity.

The number of oarsmen who have enlisted for active service is now 1,051, an increase of 272 on the number shown in the Annual Report for 1942-1943. Unfortunately the number of those who have made the supreme sacrifice has increased. To those left to mourn the passing of these gallant lads your Committee, on your behalf, expresses sincere sympathy, mingled with a prayer that our Divine Master may soften their sorrow and comfort them with the knowledge that their loved ones were prepared to sacrifice everything to ensure that the world is made a better and securer one, not only for us, but for future generations as well, to live in.

As in previous years the list of enlistments published in this Report cannot be accepted as complete owing, firstly, to the fact that several Clubs have not furnished any list at all and, secondly, to the failure of some Clubs to bring their lists up to date, although requested to do so. In this connection your Committee again stresses the desirability for these lists being furnished and kept up to date without further delay, and urges Club Executives to take steps to attain this objective.

No true reflection of the Association's membership can be furnished, as only 12 Clubs (10 Metropolitan and two Country) have furnished the lists required by Rule XXII.

REGATTAS.

The only organised Regatta conducted by the Association was the one held on 19th February, 1944, with a programme comprising Novice Pairs, Richmond; Novice Fours, Essendon; Challenge Pairs, Footscray City; Challenge Fours, Melbourne; Handicap Sculls, Albert Park (J. Donald).

With an entry of 89 competitors the event proved very successful and some good racing was witnessed. The winning crews were: Novice Pairs, Richmond; Novice Fours, Essendon; Challenge Pairs, Footscray City; Challenge Fours, Melbourne; Handicap Sculls, Albert Park (J. Donald).

The final of the Novice Fours provided one of the most exciting finishes seen on the Yarra for some time, when Essendon defeated Mercantile No. 1 by two feet, with Footscray City one foot further back in third place.

The Upper Yarra Regatta Association conducted its Annual Regatta on 29th January, 1944. The weather was perfect and a very successful and enjoyable fixture resulted.

The programme comprised Novice Pairs, Novice Fours, Lightweight Novice Fours, Challenge Pairs, Challenge Fours and Handicap Sculls. One hundred and twenty-nine competitors participated in the racing, the winning crews being: Novice Pairs, Albert Park; Novice Fours, Richmond No. 1; Lightweight Novice Fours, Mercantile; Challenge Pairs, Essendon; Challenge Fours, Richmond; Handicap Sculls, Mercantile (J. Williams).

OPEN EVENTS.

Open Eight-oared, Four-oared and Pair-oared events were held over a mile course on the Lower Yarra as under:—

Open Eight-oared.—Rowed on 1st April, 1944, on water that was slightly choppy owing to cross winds. The event attracted an entry of six crews and was won by the Melbourne Rowing Club (A. J. Anderson, bow; L. Jackson, 2; T. Hoffman, 3; W. Furlong, 4; J. Mulcahy, 5; J. Goddard, 6; J. Riley, 7; K. Grant, str.; B. Hill, cox) from Richmond Rowing Club, by three-quarters of a length, with Footscray City Rowing Club three-quarters of a length further back in third place, whilst Mercantile, Banks and Essendon finished in that order.

Open Four-oared.—The weather was perfect when this event was rowed on 15th March, 1944. Eight crews competed. Melbourne Rowing Club (A. J. Anderson, bow; J. Goddard, 2; T. Hoffman, 3; K. Grant, str.; B. Hill, cox) defeated Footscray City Rowing Club (No. 1 Crew) by $1\frac{1}{2}$ lengths, whilst South Melbourne Rowing Club filled third place. Essendon, Richmond (No. 1 Crew), Mercantile, Footscray City (No. 2 Crew) and Richmond (No. 2 Crew) finished in that order.

Open Pair-oared.—Rowed on 29th April, 1944, in perfect weather. Six crews competed and the event was won by Footscray City Rowing Club (L. Wilkinson, bow; L. Byrne, str.; J. Oliver, cox) by one length from Melbourne Rowing Club, with South Melbourne Rowing Club in third place. Banks, Essendon and Albert Park Rowing Clubs finished in that order.

TIME-TRIAL EVENTS.

The Association arranged two series of Time Trials for Four-oared and Pair-oared crews over the following courses:—

Four-oared.—From a point between the Melbourne and Mercantile Sheds around Como Island and back to the starting point.

Pair-oared.—From a point between the Melbourne and Mercantile Sheds to Punt Road Bridge, going up through one arch and coming down through the other arch.

The results were:—

Four-oared (5/8/43 to 30/11/43).—The Clubs which competed were Footscray City Rowing Club (three times), Richmond Rowing Club (twice) and Melbourne Rowing Club (twice). The event was won by the Melbourne Rowing Club (32 mins. 17½ secs.), whilst Richmond (32 mins. 32 secs.) were second and Footscray City (33 mins. 41 secs.) were third.

The winning crew was: F. Jessett, bow; J. Goddard, 2; T. Hoffman, 3; L. Jackson, str.; P. Judd, cox.

Four-oared (1/12/43 to 31/7/44).—Clubs which competed were Melbourne (four times), Richmond (four times) and Footscray City (three times). The Melbourne Rowing Club filled first and second places with crews which recorded 32 mins. 52 secs. and 33 mins. 1 sec. respectively, whilst Richmond (33 mins. 3 secs.) occupied third place.

The winning crew was: B. Guaran, bow; T. Todd, 2; L. Austin, 3; N. Brennan, str.; P. Judd, cox.

Pair-oared (5/8/43 to 30/11/43).—Only one crew (Footscray City) went over the course.

Service Pair-oared (5/8/43 to 31/7/44).—This event was confined to visiting Service men. There were no competitors.

METROPOLITAN ROWING COMMITTEE.

The Metropolitan Rowing Committee held two Regattas during the season, viz., on 4th December, 1943, and 4th March, 1944.

The programmes comprised:—

Regatta on 4/12/43.—Novice Pairs, Novice Fours, Challenge Pairs, Challenge Fours and Handicap Sculls. The event attracted an entry of 91 competitors, the winning crews being: Novice Pairs, South Melbourne; Novice Fours, Albert Park; Challenge Pairs, Essendon; Challenge Fours, Richmond; Handicap Sculls, Footscray City (S. Banks).

Regatta on 4/3/44.—Novice Pairs, Novice Fours, Lightweight Fours, Challenge Pairs, Challenge Fours and Handicap Sculls. There were 96 competitors, the winning crews being: Novice Pairs, Richmond; Novice Fours, Melbourne; Lightweight Fours, Footscray City No. 2; Challenge Pairs, Footscray City; Challenge Fours, Melbourne; Handicap Sculls, Yarra Yarra (E. A. McDougall).

The Committee also held a Winter Regatta on 1st July, 1944. The programme comprised Beginners' Pairs, Beginners' Fours, Freshers' Lightweight Fours and Freshers' Fours. Forty-eight oarsmen participated in the racing, the winning crews being: Beginners' Pairs, Yarra Yarra (No. 2 Crew); Beginners' Fours, Richmond; Freshers' Fours, Melbourne. The Freshers' Lightweight Fours lapsed owing to scratchings.

OTHER EVENTS.

A Regatta organised by the Beaufort Division, Department of Aircraft Production, was held on 11th March, 1944, with a programme comprising Novice Pairs, Novice Fours, Open Fours, Open Eights and W.A.A.F. Fours. There were 90 competitors, the winners being: Novice Pairs, OTU (Sale); Novice Fours, OTU (East Sale); Open Fours, 7AD (Tocumwal); Open Eights, Beaufort Division; W.A.A.F. Fours, No. 1 OTU (East Sale).

This event was splendidly organised and proved one of the most enjoyable rowing functions held on the Yarra for some time.

The R.A.A.F. Station at Tocumwal staged a Regatta at that centre on Easter Saturday, 8th April, 1944. Crews from Richmond, Albert Park, Banks, Mercantile and Melbourne made the trip. These crews left Melbourne on Good Friday and returned on Easter Monday. During their stay at Tocumwal they were the guests of the R.A.A.F., and all concerned spoke very highly of the treatment they received and of the arrangements made for the Regatta and for their amusement.

To the R.A.A.F. at Tocumwal, and to Group Captain Connelly, in particular, your Committee, on your behalf, has expressed appreciation for the memorable holiday which they gave the visiting crews, and for the interest they are taking in rowing, an interest which cannot but be for the good of the sport, not only in Victoria but throughout the Commonwealth, because in the R.A.A.F. at such a large station as Tocumwal all States are represented. Your Committee sincerely hopes that Group Captain Connelly and his men will continue their good work for the sport.

Your Committee, on your behalf, has expressed its appreciation for the interest which the Beaufort-R.A.A.F. Committee is taking in rowing and realises that such interest can only be for the betterment and advancement of rowing. That it will continue its good work for the sport is the earnest wish of your Committee. That the Beaufort-R.A.A.F. Committee is keen to do so is evidenced by the fact that it proposes to conduct a function on 25th November, 1944, which it hopes to make a notable and memorable one.

AUSTRALIAN AMATEUR ROWING COUNCIL.

No meeting of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council was held during 1943-1944.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

The only General Meeting held during the year was the Annual General Meeting on 4th October, 1943. At this meeting the following decisions were made:—

(1) Rules for the Control of Competitive Rowing, 1943-1944:—

(a) That Divisions be instituted as under, viz.:

Division "A."—For all oarsmen who have won a Senior Race with oars, or a race described on a Regatta Programme as a Senior Race. Also for those who have won all their Junior Races. Those who have won a Junior Eight or Junior Four or Junior Pair to compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Juniors.

Division "B."—For all those who have won all their Maiden Races, or races described as Maiden Races on a Regatta Programme. Those who have won a Maiden Eight or Maiden Four or Maiden Pair to also compete in this Division in the particular type of race which they have won as Maidens.

Division "C."—For oarsmen who have not won a Maiden Race of any kind, or who still may have a particular Maiden Race, such as Eight or Four or Pair to win.

Division "D."—For all those who are starting in a Regatta Race as purely Novice Oarsmen.

(b) The Executive to have power to suspend these Rules for any particular Regatta and to substitute for them any conditions they think fit.

- (c) All events to be rowed over a half-mile course instead of a mile.
- (2) Provision of Equipment after the War. The Executive to consider the matter of providing boats, oars and equipment for the various Clubs after the war with a view to giving priority to those Clubs which are in want of equipment.

COMMITTEE DECISIONS.

Coxswains in Combination Races.—In Combination Races under the V.R.A. persons in control of those races should ensure that, as far as possible, each of the winning coxswains continue to steer the winning crew which he steers in the heat and semi-final, so that he will have the same crew right through (C.1/12/43).

Rules for Control of Competitive Rowing.—The following amendments be made in the Rules which operated during 1943-1944:—

- (a) At end of Division "C" the words "Provided that he will not be permitted to win more than one Pair, Four or Eight in this Division."
- (b) Para. (c) to read "All races to be over not more than half-a-mile." (C.2/8/44.)

THANKS.

Your Committee acknowledges with sincere thanks the donation of a trophy by Mr. A. W. Massina, an old-time member of the Hawthorn Rowing Club and a former Honorary Treasurer of the Association. With Mr. Massina's concurrence this trophy will take the form of a Cup in perpetuity, and will be attached to the Maiden Eights event at the Upper Yarra Regatta.

The donation of Five Pounds (£5) by the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association (Australian Henley) towards the repair of the Judge's Box is acknowledged with thanks.

The Honorary Auditors (Messrs. R. L. Thwaites and A. R. Duncan) still continue their sterling work for the Association. To them your Committee extends thanks.

To those members who acted as officials at events carried out during the year your Committee is grateful. The splendid assistance given by these members helped considerably in the smooth running of events.

To the Town Clerk of Melbourne and the City Council, also the Metropolitan Board of Works, the thanks of your Committee are extended for the whole-hearted assistance and co-operation given during the year.

Messrs. R. Todd and W. G. Scates again carried out patient and valued work as Timekeepers for the various Time-Trial events which were held during the season. To these gentlemen your Committee owes a very deep meed of thanks.

Mr. Todd deserves the thanks of all rowing men for the enthusiastic and untiring manner in which he strives to obtain publicity for the sport. Your Committee is grateful to Mr. Todd for his efforts in this direction.

OBITUARY.

With deepest regret your Committee records the death, on 6th July, 1944, of your President, Sir Stephen Morell, who had held this office with dignity and distinction since 1936. One of Melbourne's most successful business men, a distinguished member of the Melbourne City Council for many years and a former Lord Mayor of Melbourne, Sir Stephen Morell never lost his keen interest in the sport of rowing. In his younger days he was an active oarsman, winning champion four-oared and eight-oared events, in addition to sculling races. When he retired from racing he took a very active interest in the administrative side of the sport, and despite his many business and civic activities he was almost a daily visitor at the river bank, where he took the keenest personal interest in all oarsmen, novice and senior alike. He was a regular visitor at all Regattas in the Metropolitan area and at many country Regattas, and his party to the Ballarat Regatta each year was one of the delights of his sporting associations; in fact, only a few weeks before his decease he remarked that the picnic party would again visit Ballarat next February, even if the Regatta cannot be held. Sir Stephen Morell had a charming manner which made him most approachable, and he was noted for his delightful hospitality and generous donations to the sport. He was an ideal President and his lamented death is a severe blow to the sport, not only in Victoria, but throughout Australia.

The sport has also lost another great supporter by the death of Sir George Fairbairn, which occurred on 23rd October, 1943. Sir George Fairbairn was also a great oarsman and stroked the Victorian Eight which won the first Australian Championship in 1878. He was a founder of the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association (Australian Henley), of which he was President, from its foundation in 1904 until the time of his death, except for a few years when he was Agent-General for Victoria in London. He was President of the Victorian Rowing Association from 1921 to 1924, when he went to London, and was a Vice-President from 1929 to the time of his decease.

It is with feelings of the deepest regret that your Committee records the decease during the year of the following:—

Dr. L. O'C. Beyer, Messrs. H. A. Hearn, L. Lazarus, J. McDonald, F. Fleming, W. H. T. Davis and Major-General F. G. Hughes, all of whom were prominent in Victorian rowing.
