# THE ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT AND STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS OF THE VICTORIAN ROWING ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED

To the Members, Victorian Rowing Association,  
Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with pleasure that your Committee presents the One Hundred and Seventeenth Annual Report for the 1992-93 rowing season, together with the audited Balance Sheet and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1993.

The season has indeed been one of many highlights spread throughout all avenues of Association activity with involvement in the two Olympic Gold medals followed by the three Gold medals and three Silver medals won at the World Lightweight and Junior Championships which, together, raised Australia's ranking to No. 2 in the world in the sport of rowing, then the two new major sponsorships secured for your Association which have been of benefit to all members, the two Victorian crews continuing their long run of success at the Interstate level and the success of the World Cup event for scullers at the Australian Henley Regatta which all contributed to a most successful year.

We congratulate the all Victorian Men's Coxswainless Four of Andrew Cooper, Michael McKay, Nicholas Green and James Tomkins coached by Noel Donaldson and the Tasmanian and Victorian Men's Double Scull of Stephen Hawkins and Peter Antonie coached by Tim McLaren on their outstanding performances in winning Gold Medals at the Olympic Games. We also congratulate all other Olympic Rowing team members on their great performances.

Not to be overshadowed by the hype of the Olympic Games the World Lightweight and Junior Championships produced the greatest Australian result of all time and we congratulate the Men's Lightweight Double Scull, the Women's Lightweight Coxswainless Four and the Women's Junior Coxswainless Pair on their Gold Medal wins together with the Men's Junior Coxswainless Pair, the Men's Junior Double Scull and the Women's Junior Double Scull who all won Silver Medals. Special congratulations to Victorians Deirdre Fraser, Marina Cade and Brian Dalton of the Women's Lightweight Four and Duncan Ashby of the Men's Junior Pair on their success.

As an outcome of these wins Rowing was enjoying a high profile among sporting associations and following the efforts of Mr Colin Rawson your Association was delighted to accept an offer from Carlton and United Breweries Limited to sponsor the Association for a period of five years. This is a very significant event in respect of the future funding of the Association's activities and during the season funds have been allocated to the Interstate Team, Regatta Committees, Club Premierships and the conduct of both State Championships and National Selection Regattas.

Your Association was also delighted to receive sponsorship from the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation in association with the National Heart Foundation for the conduct of a regatta program and support for clubs to promote the sport through community open days. The Association is helping to promote a healthy lifestyle in a smoke free environment.

Your congratulations are extended to Mr Rawson, Sponsorship Co-ordinator, and members of the Sponsorship Committee on their success which has resulted in a major injection of funds and goods into rowing during the year.

Victoria maintained its premier position at the interstate level with continuing history making wins in the King's Cup and Victoria Cup events together with a win in the ULVA Trophy event at the Australian Championships conducted at Lake Wivenhoe, Queensland. Victorian Club and School crews also performed well in winning eleven of the forty-nine National titles contested and we congratulate those winning crews and individuals.

The Australian Interstate and National Championships Regatta at Lake Wivenhoe was an excellent regatta conducted in magnificent weather and we congratulate the Organising Committee on an enjoyable regatta.

The support from Sport and Recreation Victoria was once again of immense benefit to the Association in both financial assistance and guidance and for this we are most grateful. A salary subsidy was received for the Administration Officer and grants were also provided for individual oarspersons from the Country Travel Sports Training Scheme which are greatly appreciated by the recipients.

Sport and Recreation Victoria are also joint sponsors with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia of the Country Sports Education Scheme which provides assistance to conduct Coaching Courses in country areas and we thank both for their support of rowing.

The support and encouragement of our members and the sport of rowing by the Victorian Institute of Sport is greatly appreciated by the Association and the Rowing Program is now under the direction of Head Coach Mr N Donaldson following the departure for Canada of Mr B Richardson who, as the initial Head Coach, established the program during the past three years and we thank him for his services to Victorian rowing and extend our best wishes for success with his new position.

With the benefit of the priority funding from the Australian Sports Commission the Intensive Training Centre program has been conducted by Coaching Directors, Messrs B Richardson and N Donaldson and the Coaching Development Co-ordinator Mr P McGann. These funds also assist the Ballarat Talent Identification Program hosted by Ballarat City Rowing Club under the direction of Mr & Mrs Elliott with the support of Dr W Payne of Ballarat University College. Your thanks and congratulations are extended to these people for their work on these programs.

During the season there have been changes in the Australian Rowing Council Inc with the appointment of new Board members Messrs P Antonie and R Moore and the appointment of Mr D White as National Director of Coaching Education. We extend our thanks to both the Victorian and Interstate members and officials of Council for their time and effort spent in the management of Australian rowing.

Victorian members of Australian Rowing Teams are preparing for competition at the World Rowing Championships in Roudnice, Czech Republic, the World Junior Championships in Aarungen, Norway, and the Trans-Tasman Under 23 Challenge on Lake Karapiro, New Zealand, as this report is being written and we extend to all team members best wishes for success.

Your congratulations are extended to Messrs Nicholas D Green and Stephen M Hawkins on being honoured in the Australia Day Honours List with Medal of the Order of Australia awards for their service to sport as an Olympic gold medallist. They now join the other four Gold medallists each of whom were awarded the OAM for their 1986 World Championships.



We also congratulate Mr James Tomkins on being selected as the 1992 winner of the coveted World Trophy for the Oceania Region by the Amateur Athletics Foundation (formerly the Helms Foundation).

Congratulations are also extended to Mr Peter Antonie for receiving the 1992 V.I.S. Award for Excellence and the Vicsport Governor's Award for Sportsman of the Year.

Your congratulations are extended to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association for the successful conduct of a round of the FISA World Cup for scullers in conjunction with the Australian Henley Regatta.

It is pleasing to record the affiliation of a new club in Geelong and a new school in Shepparton in the further development of rowing in Victoria.

The Junior School regattas conducted by the Association to assist the development of school oarspeople were fully supported with members from twenty eight schools participating and your thanks are extended to the numerous people who assisted with the conduct of these regattas.

Also associated with the development of school oarspeople is the Juniors Regatta Officials Program which has met with such success that it is being copied by other State Associations and we thank the members of the program sub-committee for their efforts.

Over many years this Association has been indebted to the Victorian Oarsmen and Womens Association for their continued support of rowing in Victoria and again this season we are most grateful for their assistance and support. All members are urged to further their interests in rowing through membership of the Oarsmen and Womens Association which is available at a very nominal fee.

After repeated mentions in recent reports it is pleasing to record a vast reduction in the number of ineligible crews at regattas, however, the number of regatta fines being imposed is still a sad reflection on the administration of many clubs.

In an endeavour to assist club and school administrators the Association has installed a membership computer package, however, the development of a complete members register requires your co-operation for its success.

While enjoying participation in your sport we ask that you give consideration to other users of the waterways and nearby residents so that they also may enjoy your participation in rowing.

## FINANCE

The result for the year ended 30 June 1993 was a surplus of \$33,130 (1992 — \$41,101).

As detailed in the attached accounts the major factors which impacted the result for the year were:

- The Carlton and United Breweries Limited sponsorship of \$50,000. The sponsorship statement following the accounts details those activities which were funded by this sponsorship, the main activities being the sponsorship of the Interstate team to Queensland and 24 Victorian regattas. In addition the sponsorship of the State Championships and National Selection regattas helped defray the costs of these regattas which would have otherwise been borne by the Association.
- The Victorian Health Promotion Foundation sponsorship of \$20,000, all of which was expended.
- An increase in affiliation fees following an increase in the number of affiliated competitors in season 1991/92.
- A reduction in the level of interest received following the general fall in interest rates available for maturing debenture investments. As at 30 June 1993 the Association's debenture portfolio was yielding 10.6% per annum.
- An increase in Australian Rowing Council affiliation fees and the International Levy, which are levied on a per capita competitor basis.
- General increases in the cost of office and administration expenses.
- The receipt of a net \$5076 in respect of the 1992 National and Interstate Championships.

As in prior years the Department of Sport and Recreation has contributed significantly to the funding requirements of the Association and we thank the Department for their support.

The Victorian Institute of Sport and the Australian Sports Commission have again assisted by continuing to provide significant benefits to the Association in supporting competitors and contributing to various development activities.

During the year the Association's affiliation fees were restructured with effect from 1 July 1993. The impact of this will be that affiliation fees for competitors will increase in the coming season while affiliation fees for non-competitors will fall significantly. This will ensure that the costs of running the Association's operations is more equitably shared between participating and non-participating members.

A computer software package was acquired for the purpose of managing club and school affiliation fee information.

As a result of the significant fall in interest rates on offer in respect of maturing debenture securities it was resolved that the Association commence a program of equity investment.

This program aims to maximise return to the Association over the medium to longer term through a series of strategic investments in blue-chip stocks and I would like to thank Mr J Nickson and Mr D Larsson of J B Were & Son for their assistance in developing an appropriate investment strategy and for on-going management of the Association's position.

The Association is well placed financially to continue to support the members and member clubs and schools particularly following the securing of the Carlton and United Sponsorship. Hopefully the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation will continue to provide sponsorship funding on an on-going basis.

1992/93 has been a year with a number of significant developments off the water and your Committee looks forward to the coming year with enthusiasm to further the development of the sport in Victoria, in conjunction with the Victorian Institute of Sport and to ensuring Victoria's 'on-water' success continues.

Finally, I would like to again thank Bill Waterfield and Melvina Harvey for their efforts and support in the management of the Association's finances in what has been another very busy year.

Such as nine Heart Health regattas, corporate sponsorship and sponsorship of the VICROW community based rowing program undertaken in June and July 1993.

Again on behalf of the Association, I would like to thank The Victorian Health Promotion Foundation for their sponsorship of the Association and its activities over the past season and Colin Rawson for his securing of the sponsorship and sponsorship co-ordination activities.

On behalf of the Regatta Committees I thank Carlton and United and Vic Health for their sponsorships which have made a significant contribution to the success of the local regatta racing program and we look forward to their continuing support in the years to come.

A full analysis of the activities and events which have been funded by the Carlton and United Breweries Limited and The Victorian Health Promotion Foundation sponsorships is set out in the attachment to the financial statements.

## **ADMINISTRATION OFFICER**

The continuing financial assistance and support received from Sport and Recreation Victoria, for which the Association is extremely grateful, together with a specific portion of the members' affiliation fees has provided the funds for the employment of Mr Bill Waterfield, your full-time Administration Officer, who has performed the secretarial duties and various administration functions of the Association.

The Association's Office, which after ten years at Olympic Park will shortly be moving to Jolimont, provides a point of contact and source of information which is appreciated by clubs, schools, oarspeople, prospective oarspeople, other rowing Associations, Government and other organisations, various media outlets and members of the public who ask questions on anything related to the sport of rowing.

The Association greatly appreciates the valuable assistance of Mrs M L Harvey, Administrative Assistant, in the operation of the Office.

In his dual positions of Administration Officer and Official's Panel Secretary, Mr Waterfield has attended most regattas during the season and helped to maintain the liaison established with Association members and clubs, especially in country areas. He has also represented the Association at meetings of the Sports Federation of Victoria and at other official functions and meetings during the season.

## **COACHING DIRECTOR**

The priority funding from the Australian Sports Commission, for which the Association is most grateful, enabled the Coaching Directors, Mr Brian Richardson and later in the season Mr Noel Donaldson, and the Coaching Development Co-ordinator, Mr Paul McGann, to continue the Victorian Intensive Training Centre program and to conduct accredited coaching courses and coaching education seminars.

Hosted by Ballarat City Rowing Club, with support and testing facilities provided by Dr Warren Payne of Ballarat University College, the Ballarat Talent Identification Program is also conducted through the priority funding received from the Australian Sports Commission.

Aimed at taking students without any rowing background through an intensive program to reach Australian Junior representation in a few years, the squad of boys and girls, now in their second year, have competed in a number of regattas during the season and at the Australian National Championships with mixed success.

To maintain the momentum of the Program a second group of students have been through the process of assessment, testing and evaluation and are now ready to commence training.

We extend your congratulations to Kate and Dan Elliott and Warren Payne for their success with the program and thanks to Mr David O'Loughlin for his liaison work.

Mr McGann has conducted a number of well attended Level One Coaching Courses and a Level Two Coaching Course during the season and also organised numerous informative seminars on various subjects, including one for coxswains, and the presentations by qualified and interesting speakers were well received by those in attendance.

The Level One Course at Hamilton and the Level Two Course at Geelong were both conducted with funding support from the Country Sports Education Scheme which is sponsored by Sport and Recreation Victoria and the Commonwealth Bank and the Association is most grateful for this support.

The fleet of sculling boats have been widely used by clubs and schools for the promotion and development of rowing and at the State Secondary Schools sculling regatta conducted by Bendigo Rowing Club.

Your thanks are extended to Brian Richardson, Noel Donaldson and Paul McGann for their efforts on our behalf and we wish Brian Richardson every success with his new rowing appointment in Canada.

### **VICTORIAN INSTITUTE OF SPORT**

The Rowing Program at the Institute has seen a number of administrative changes during the season. In November, Mr Noel Donaldson was appointed to the new position of Senior Rowing Coach, a position made possible through funding from your Association, to work alongside the Head Coach, Mr Brian Richardson, and to be primarily responsible for the development of lightweight rowing.

Mr Richardson announced in April that he was to take up a rowing position in Canada and in June Mr Noel Donaldson was appointed as the Head Coach of the Rowing Program. A new Senior Coach is still to be appointed.

The Institute program provides coaching, training and competition support and sports testing for elite athletes, which allows for a longer duration of participation in sport. A Careers Officer to assist with studies and employment and a Medical Officer are available to assist athletes.

A number of rowing camps were conducted to aid development and selection, including one held at Falls Creek, and in 1993, 23 full scholarships and 11 part scholarships were awarded to oarspeople from both open weight and lightweight categories.

The Institute is also assisting a Men's Under 23 Development Eight who are to compete at the Trans- Tasman Challenge Series to be conducted at Lake Karapiro in New Zealand.

At the 1993 Annual Assembly of Athletes, Peter Antonie OAM was named as the winner of the 1992 VIS Award for Excellence and your congratulations are extended to this fine rowing ambassador and sportsman.

A special presentation was made to Brian Richardson OAM, the first Head Coach appointed by the Institute in any sport, on his departure for Canada and we add our thanks for his efforts in establishing rowing at the Institute and his contribution over three years.

We take this opportunity to thank the Institute Board members and Dr Frank Pyke, Chief Executive Officer, for their support and encouragement of our members and the sport of rowing.

We also thank Mr David Pincus, for his liaison work between the Institute and your Association, and Mr Noel Donaldson for his efforts on our behalf.

### **OFFICIAL'S PANEL**

During the season the Panel were able to provide officials to operate at all 27 days of regatta racing, even if on occasions the numbers were a little low, together with a number of Junior regattas and also assist with the conduct of the two National Selection Regattas held at Carrum, thanks to the support and participation of most officials for, no matter in what capacity they acted, all contributed to the successful conduct of regattas throughout Victoria.

To help replace those who have opted out of active regatta participation, new officials are always required and the Panel will be conducting tests for prospective officials early in the new season.

Congratulations are extended to Messrs Noel Clark and James Gobbo on obtaining their Australian Umpires licence during the season.

We again thank Mercantile Rowing Club for the use of their facilities and Messrs Ron Richardson and Jim Skidmore for their assistance with equipment.

Special thanks are expressed to the members of the Panel, Messrs Bruce Adam, Bob Duncan, Ralph Murphy, Ron Podbury and Martin Tomanovits, for their efforts in maintaining our high standard of regattas during the season.

A new innovation this season has been the Juniors Regatta Officials Program aimed at locating through various schools, students who may be interested in gaining knowledge and skills applicable to the various facets of rowing administration with particular emphasis on regattas.

A sub-committee of Messrs Noel Clark, Convenor, James Gobbo, Robin Murphy and Bill Waterfield have contacted nearly one hundred schools and received numerous expressions of interest in participating in the program.

Ten students have received training through the program and, with the assistance of licenced officials, hands-on experience at regattas and four have been granted a Juniors Licence which allows them to work at any regatta under the direction of the referee of the day.

Australian Umpires Panel members and officials have been so impressed with their performance that the program is now being introduced by a number of State Associations.

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS**

**NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

(a) Basis of Accounting

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs. The accounts have been made out in accordance with Schedule 5 to the Corporations Regulations.

(b) Income and Expenditure

Income has been brought to account on a due and receivable basis. Expenses have been brought to account as incurred.

(c) Income Tax

The Association is an exempt body under the Income Tax Assessment Act, as amended.

(d) Investments

Debenture securities are included in the accounts at cost with any premium or discount on acquisition being amortised on a straight line basis to maturity, being the date to which they are normally held. In previous years debenture securities were included in the accounts at cost. As a result of this change, debenture securities have been increased by \$1,397 and operating profit after income tax has been increased by \$1,397.

Listed equity securities are included in the accounts at the lower of cost and market value.

(e) Depreciation

Depreciation in respect of all fixed assets is calculated so as to write off the cost of each asset over its effective useful life.

(f) Comparatives

Where necessary comparative figures have been amended to accord with the presentation in 1993.

(g) Cash Flows

For the purpose of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, deposits held at call and investments in money market securities.

(h) Employee Entitlements

The amounts to be paid to in respect of employees' pro-rata entitlements to long service leave and annual leave are accrued annually at current wage rates.
