To the Members, Victorian Rowing Association,
Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Committee has pleasure in presenting the One Hundred and Eighteenth Annual Report for the 1993-94 rowing season, together with the audited Balance Sheet and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1994.

The season was again one of many highlights which were spread through most sectors of the Association's activities from the development of rowing in Victoria to the achievements of Victorian oarspeople in elite competition.

Some of the highlights were, the success of the Australian crews at the World Championships in the Czech Republic, the World Junior Championships in Norway and the Trans Tasman Under 23 series together with the successes of Victorian State and Club crews at the Australian Championships.

We congratulate the Men's Lightweight Double Scull (Gold Medal), the Men's Lightweight Single Sculler (Silver Medal) and the Women's Coxless Pair (Silver Medal) on their success and the other members of the Australian Team on their good performance at the World Championships. We also extend our congratulations to the Women's Coxless Pair (Gold Medal), the Women's Single Sculler (Silver Medal) and the Men's Double Scull (Bronze Medal) on their performances at the World Junior Championships. Congratulations go also to the Trans-Tasman Under 23 team members for their domination of this series and for continuing an eleven year success story.

Victoria retained the King's Cup to continue their history making succession of wins and also won the President's Cup for Men's Sculls and the Noel F Wilkinson Trophy for Men's Youth Eights. Unfortunately, Victoria were unable to continue their long succession of wins in the Victoria Cup for Women's Lightweight Fours. Victorian Club and School crews also had success in the National Championships winning ten of the fifty two events contested and we congratulate the winning crews and individuals.

The Australian Championships Regatta at Lake Barrington International was an excellent regatta and we congratulate the Organising Committee on an enjoyable regatta.

Your Association was delighted to receive the continuing sponsorship from Carlton and United Breweries Limited and congratulations are extended to Mr Colin Rawson, Sponsorship Co-ordinator, and members of the Sponsorship Sub-Committee for the success of this sponsorship and the support of the Interstate Team, Regatta Committees and the conduct of both State Championships and the National Selection Regatta.

The Association is most grateful for the continued support received from Sport and Recreation Victoria in both financial assistance and guidance. A subsidy towards the salary of the Administration Officer was received together with support for the conduct of Coaching Courses in country areas. Grants were also provided for individual oarspersons through the 'Vicalent' program to assist developing athletes in country areas which are greatly appreciated by the recipients of these grants.

The Association greatly appreciates the support and encouragement of our members and the sport of rowing by the Victorian Institute of Sport Rowing Program under the direction of Head Coach Mr N

Donaldson and Senior Coach Mr J Cumper.

The priority funding from the Australian Sports Commission has enabled the State Director of Coaching, Mr N Donaldson, together with Mr P McGann and Mr J Cumper to continue the Victorian Intensive Training Centre program and to conduct accredited coaching courses and coaching education seminars. The Ballarat Talent Identification Program hosted by Ballarat City Rowing Club under the direction of Mr & Mrs Elliott with support from Dr W Payne of the Ballarat University College is also assisted by the Australian Sports Commission funding. We extend our congratulations to these people for their work on these programs.

We congratulate Team Manager, Mr S Pennicott, and members of the Australian Team on winning two Bronze Medals in good performances at the World Universities Games conducted at St Catharines in Canada.

During the season there have been major changes in the Australian Rowing Council Inc following a number of resignations, a retirement and a spill of positions followed by the appointment of new OfficeBearers, including a Chief Executive Officer, and a Head Coach of Australian Rowing and we extend our thanks to both the Victorian and Interstate members and officials of Council for their time and effort devoted to our sport.

Congratulations are extended to Messrs R R Aitken, B H Durston and J D Coates on being appointed Life Members of the Australian Rowing Council Inc.

As this report is being prepared Victorian members of Australian Rowing Teams are preparing for competition at the World Championships in Indianapolis, USA, the World Junior Championships in Munich, Germany, the Trans-Tasman Under 23 Challenge in South Australia and other European Regattas and we wish all team members every success.

Congratulations are extended to Mr David Boykett who was appointed a Life Member of the Association in recognition of his many years service to rowing in many fields.

Congratulations are also extended to Mr S Patten on being appointed as a member of the Australian Olympic Committee Athletes Commission.

It is pleasing to record the affiliation of new clubs at Geelong and Shepparton and new schools at Mildura and Shepparton which augers well for the development of rowing in the Shepparton area. However this is offset by the demise of one club and one school from those affiliated with the Association.

The Junior School regattas conducted by the Association to provide racing experience without the pressures of a major regatta and to assist the development of school oarspeople have been fully supported and your thanks are extended to the numerous people who assisted with the conduct of these regattas.

The Association is most grateful for the assistance and support of the members of the Victorian Oarsmen and Womens Association who are dedicated to supporting rowing in Victoria.

Again this season there were far too many ineligible crews appearing at regattas which shows a lack of consideration for eligible crews who are denied a result and regatta committees who are caused additional work after accepting entries in good faith. As well as attracting monetary penalties these ineligible crews do nothing to promote our sport and reflect poorly on club administration. Remember, if you want your sport to be promoted and improved the matter is in your hands.

With the award of the 2000 Olympic Games to Sydney there are many changes taking place within rowing to meet the challenge of achieving success in both the year 2000 and the intervening years and we seek your support and co-operation in meeting these changes for the benefit of oarspeople and our sport at all levels from the elite to the person just starting out on a rowing career.

DONATIONS

The sincere thanks of the Association are extended to the following supporters of Victorian Rowing for their generous donations and contributions during the year.

R W Thursfield Trust Fund, Lodge Henley Trust Fund, Marcus Burke Trust Fund, N F Wilkinson Trust Fund, M S Williams Trust Fund and Dr H C Disher Trust Fund.

FINANCE

The result for the year ended 30 June 1994 was a surplus of \$19,825 (1993 - \$33,130) which was in line with budgetary expectations.

As detailed in the attached accounts the major factors which impacted the result for the year were:

- The Carlton and United Breweries Limited sponsorship of \$58,850 for 1993/94 and \$5,000 received in respect of 1992/93. The sponsorship statement following the accounts details those activities which were funded by this sponsorship, the main activities being the sponsorship of the Interstate Team to Tasmania and Victorian metropolitan and country regattas. In addition the sponsorship of the State Championships and National Selection Trials helped defray the costs of these events which would have otherwise been borne by the Association.
- A reduction in the level of interest received as a result of low interest rates on offer for maturing debenture investments. At 30 June 1994 the Association's debenture portfolio was yielding a return of 9% per annum.
- An increase in Australian Rowing Council affiliation fees as a direct result of an increase in the number of registered competitors.

As in prior years the Department of Arts, Sport and Tourism has contributed significantly to the funding requirements of the sport and we thank the Department for their support.

The Victorian Institute of Sport and the Australian Sports Commission have again assisted by continuing to provide significant benefits to the Association in supporting competitors and contributing to various development activities.

It is pleasing to note that affiliation fees received, following the restructuring of the affiliation fees, were in line with expectations.

The equity investment program, which was commenced in May 1993, aims to maximise returns to the Association over the medium to longer term through a series of strategic investments in blue chip stocks. At 30 June 1994 the market value of the investments was slightly below cost.

The equity portfolio will be subject to fluctuations in market value over the short term, however as the Association is a long-term holder of equity investments no adjustment for the decrement has been brought to account.

The Association is well placed financially to continue to support

member clubs and schools particularly as a result of the Carlton and United Breweries Limited sponsorship.

There have been significant changes in the administration of the Australian Rowing Council recently, both on and off the water, and your Committee looks forward to the coming season with enthusiasm, particularly as many of the changes are designed to achieve maximum success in the 1996 Olympic Games and in the lead-up to the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

Finally, I would like to again thank Bill Waterfield and Melvina Harvey for their efforts and support in the management of the Association's finances in what has been another very busy year.

It was disappointing that the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation did not renew their sponsorship in 1993/94.

ADMINISTRATION OFFICER

The Association is extremely grateful for the continuing support and financial assistance received from Sport and Recreation Victoria which, together with a specific portion of members' affiliation fees, has funded the employment of your full-time Administration Officer, Mr Bill Waterfield, who has undertaken the secretarial and various other administration functions for the Association.

The Administrative Assistant, Mrs M L Harvey, who is often the first contact for callers to the Office, provides valuable assistance in the functioning of the Association which is greatly appreciated.

The Association's Office, now part of Sports House in Jolimont, is a much used point of contact and source of information for numerous clubs, schools, oarspeople, other Rowing Associations, Government departments and other organisations, various media outlets and the general public, including a regular flow of potential oarspeople, on all aspects of rowing.

Mr Waterfield has represented the Association during the season at meetings of the State Directors of Sport and the Sports Federation of Victoria as well as at other official functions and meetings. He has attended most regattas during the season in the dual role of Administration Officer and Official's Panel Secretary and helped to maintain contact with Association members and clubs, especially in country areas.

STATE DIRECTOR OF COACHING

The Association is most grateful to the Australian Sports Commission for the priority funding which has enabled the State Director of Coaching, Mr Noel Donaldson, together with Mr Paul McGann and Mr John Cumper, to continue the Victorian Intensive Training Centre program and to conduct accredited coaching courses and coaching education seminars.

The Ballarat Talent Identification Program, also conducted through the Australian Sports Commission priority funding, is hosted by Ballarat City Rowing Club with support and testing facilities provided by Dr Warren Payne of the Ballarat University College.

Aimed at taking students without any rowing background through an intensive program to reach Australian Junior representation in a few years, the program, now in its third year and second squad of students is successfully identifying and developing talent to the top levels of rowing. The enthusiastic and dedicated group have competed in a number of regattas during the season and at the Australian Rowing Championships.

Your congratulations are extended to Kate and Dan Elliott and Warren Payne for their success with the program and we thank Mr David O'Loughlin and Mr Noel Donaldson for their liaison with the program.

During the season Mr McGann conducted a number of Level 1 Coaching Courses in both Melbourne and country centres, the country courses being conducted with funding support from Sport and Recreation Victoria for which the Association is most grateful.

Mr Cumper has conducted a successful Level 2 Coaching Course in Melbourne and, in conjunction with his position as Senior Coach at the Victorian Institute of Sport, established a Coaching Network, aimed at keeping the more senior coaches informed with current information, which has been well received and supported.

A number of clubs and schools have widely used the fleet of sculling boats for the promotion and development of rowing and the boats were also used in the conduct of a State Secondary Schools sculling regatta by Bendigo Rowing Club. We thank Mr David Boykett for his management of these boats.

Your thanks are extended to Noel Donaldson, Paul McGann and John Cumper for their efforts on our behalf and we wish Paul McGann every success with his appointment as Head Rowing Coach at the University of London.

VICTORIAN INSTITUTE OF SPORT

The Victorian Institute of Sport Rowing Program provides coaching, training and competition support and sports testing for elite athletes, which allows for a longer duration of participation in sport. A Careers Officer to assist with studies and employment and a Medical Officer are available to assist athletes. The Program is conducted by Head Rowing Coach, Mr Noel Donaldson, and the Senior Rowing Coach, a position made possible through funding from your Association, Mr John Cumper. They are assisted by an Apprentice Coach Miss Deirdre Fraser.

A number of rowing camps were conducted to aid development and selection, including one held at Falls Creek with rowing on Rocky Valley Dam. For 1994, 24 full scholarships and 4 part scholarships were awarded to oarspeople from both open and lightweight categories.

The Institute is also assisting a Development Squad to compete in the Under 23 Trans Tasman Series to be conducted in Adelaide, South Australia.

We extend our thanks to the Institute Board members and Chief Executive Officer Dr Frank Pyke and his staff for their support and encouragement of our members and the sport of rowing.

Your thanks are also extended to Mr David Pincus for his liaison work with the Institute and to Mr Noel Donaldson, Mr John Cumper and Miss Deirdre Fraser for their efforts on our behalf.

OFFICIAL'S PANEL

This season, with the support and participation of many officials, both long serving and newly licenced, the Panel were able to provide a complement of competent officials for all 29 days of regatta racing, even if on occasions the numbers were a little sparse, and also assist with the conduct of the National Selection Regatta held at Carrum.

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS
NOTE I SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT
ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

- (a) Basis of Accounting
The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs.
- (b) Income and Expenditure
Income has been brought to account on a due and receivable basis. Expenses have been brought to account as incurred.
- (c) Income Tax
The Association is an exempt body under the Income Tax Assessment Act, as amended.
- (d) Investments
Debenture securities are included in the accounts at cost with any premium or discount on acquisition being amortised on a straight line basis to maturity, being the date to which they are normally held.
Listed equity securities are included in the accounts at the cost. Changes in market values of listed equity securities are not taken into account unless there is considered to be a permanent diminution in value.
- (e) Depreciation
Depreciation in respect of all fixed assets is calculated so as to write off the cost of each asset over its effective useful life.
- (f) Comparatives
Where necessary comparative figures have been amended to accord with the presentation in 1994.
- (g) Cash Flows
For the purpose of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, deposits held at call and investments in money market securities.
- (h) Employee Entitlements
The amounts to be paid to in respect of employees' pro-rata entitlements to long service leave and annual leave are accrued annually at current wage rates.

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF VICTORIAN ROWING ASSOCIATION INC.

Scope

I have audited the financial statements of the Victorian Rowing Association Inc. for the financial year ended 30 June 1994 consisting of the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statement, Statement of Cash Flows and accompanying notes 1 to 12 set out on pages 32 to 40. The Committee members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information they contain. I have conducted an audit of these financial statements in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Association.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and statutory requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Association's financial position and the results of its operations and its cash flows.

Qualification

It was not practicable to establish accounting controls over cash received from all sources prior to their receipt by the Association. Accordingly, it was not practicable to extend my audit examination of cash receipts beyond verification of the amounts recorded in the books and records.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion

In my opinion, subject to the limitations imposed by the foregoing, the financial statements of the Victorian Rowing Association Inc are properly drawn up:

- so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Association at 30 June 1994, and the results and cash flows of the Association for the financial year ended on that date; and
- are in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.
