THE ONE HUNDRED AND NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT AND STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS OF THE VICTORIAN ROWING ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED

To the Members, Victorian Rowing Association,

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with pleasure that your Committee presents the One Hundred and Nineteenth Annual Report for the 1994-95 rowing season, together with the audited Balance Sheet and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1995.

Once again the season provided many highlights covering most avenues of Association activity from consideration of the future direction of rowing in Victoria to the development and achievements of Victorian oarspeople in International and National competition.

The early season highlights were the success of the Australian crews at the World Championships held in Indianapolis, USA, and the preceding Commonwealth Regatta at London, Ontario in Canada, the World Junior Championships in Munich, Germany, and the Trans Tasman Under 23 series conducted at Westlakes in South Australia.

We congratulate the Men's Lightweight Coxless Four (Silver Medal), the Men's Coxless Pair (Bronze Medal), the Women's Coxless Four (Bronze Medal) and the Women's Coxless Pair (Bronze Medal) on their success and the other Australian Team members on their good performance at the World Championships.

Your congratulations are also extended to Amy Safe on her Single Scull Gold Medal, the Men's Coxed Four (Bronze Medal), the Men's Double Scull (Bronze Medal) and the Women's Double Scull (Bronze Medal) on their success at the World Junior Championships.

We also congratulate the Trans Tasman Under 23 team members for continuing their domination of this event with the twelth successive series win to mark the end of the competition in this format.

Retaining the King's Cup in a very close finish Victoria continued its record succession of wins in the Men's Eight event and was also successful in winning the ULVA Trophy for Women's Four and the Penrith Cup for Men's Lightweight Four at the Australian Championships conducted at Wellington Dam in Western Australia. Members of Victorian Clubs and Schools also were successful in winning twenty of the sixty two National Championships and your congratulations are extended to the winning crews and individuals.

The Australian Championships Regatta at Wellington Dam was an excellent regatta and we congratulate the hard working Organising Committee on their achievements in adverse conditions.

The continuing sponsorship funds received from Carlton and United Breweries Limited were gratefully accepted by the Association and applied towards supporting the Interstate Team, assisting Regatta Committees and the conduct of State Championships. Your appreciation is extended to the Sponsorship Co-ordinator, Mr Colin Rawson, and the Sponsorship Sub-committee for the continuing success of this sponsorship arrangement.

The continuing support from Sport and Recreation Victoria was again of immense benefit to the Association in both financial assistance and guidance and for this we are most grateful. A subsidy was received towards the salary of the Administration Officer together with financial support for the conduct of Coaching Courses in country districts and towards the preparation of a Strategic Plan to guide the Associations development in the coming years. Individual oarspersons also received grants through the "Victalent" program for assisting developing athletes in country areas which are greatly appreciated by these oarspeople. The support and encouragement of our members and the sport of rowing by the Victorian Institute of Sport is greatly appreciated by the Association. The Rowing Program, which now incorporates the Intensive Training Centre program, is under the direction of Head Coach Mr N Donaldson who is ably assisted by Senior Coach Mr J Cumper, Development Coach Mr R Henderson and Apprentice Coach Miss D Fraser. Mr J Cumper has also been responsible for the conduct of accredited coaching courses and coaching education seminars and your thanks are extended to these people for their work on these programs.

Victorian members of Australian Rowing Teams are preparing for competition at the World Rowing Championships in Tampere, Finland, the World Junior Championships in Poznan, Poland, and the Nations Cup in Groningen, Holland, as this report is being written and we extend to all team members our best wishes for success.

During the season there have been further changes in the functioning of the Australian Rowing Council Inc with the Head Coach of Australian Rowing being given control of the selection of Australian Teams and their International competition and the appointment of a High Performance Manager to manage the National selection and training program and assist the Head Coach. We extend our thanks to both the Victorian and Interstate members and officials of Council for their time and effort spent in the management of Australian rowing.

Your congratulations are extended to Miss M E Foster on her appointment as a member of the FISA Masters Rowing Commission and to Messrs P Antonie (Chair) and M McKay on their appointment to the ARC Athletes Commission.

During the season a well attended Future Directions of Victorian Rowing Seminar was conducted at St Patrick's College, Ballarat, over two days during which a number of issues were discussed and resolutions decided which should lead to initiatives being put in place for the betterment of Victorian Rowing. One outcome of these resolutions is the current preparation of a Strategic Plan to guide the development of Victorian Rowing in the coming years. Your thanks are extended to the members of the Organising Sub-committee who arranged the seminar and to the attendees who contributed to the discussions and resolutions.

The Association is grateful for the work of the Melbourne Parks and Waterways, Waterways Division in the preparation of the "Check It" river awareness program aimed at providing information and guidance for the safe use of waterways by rowers and other users. Details are available from all Victorian Club captains and School rowing administrators.

It is pleasing to record the successful merger of the Albert Park and South Melbourne Rowing Clubs and the affiliation of new schools in Geelong, Hamilton and Melbourne. These however are offset by the demise of two clubs, the closing of one rowing school and the lack of rowing at another school.

The Junior School regattas conducted by the Association to assist the development of school oarspeople were fully supported by most schools and your thanks are extended to the numerous people who assisted with the conduct of these regattas.

Over the years this Association has been indebted to the Victorian Oarsmen and Womens Association for their continued support of rowing in Victoria and again this season we are most grateful for their assistance and support. All members are urged to further their interests in rowing through membership of the Oarsmen and Womens Association which is available at a very nominal fee.

A continuing handicap to the administration of your sport is the lack

of responsibility shown by numerous clubs and schools in their tardiness in meeting their obligations with regard to affiliation returns and outstanding accounts which is increasing the costs to all Victorian oarspeople - the future is in Your hands.

The Rowing Program for the 5th Australian Masters Games to be held in Melbourne in October 1995 is being organised by a sub-committee of your Association convened by Mr B Vear and you are urged to give your support to the conduct of the Rowing Program to ensure its success.

FINANCE

The result for the year ended 30 June 1995 was a deficit of \$5,513 (1994 - surplus of \$19,825). It is particularly disappointing to report a deficit after many years of surplus results.

As detailed in the attached accounts, the major factors which impacted the result for the year were:

The Carlton and United Breweries Limited sponsorship of \$62,970. The sponsorship statement following the accounts details those activities which were funded by this sponsorship, the main activities being the sponsorship of the Interstate Team to Western Australia and Victorian metropolitan and country regattas.

Funding required for the Interstate Team to Western Australia, which according to the funding formula requires 120% of the Interstate Fund's income to be available to the team. An overall loss of \$952 was incurred in the Interstate Fund this year compared to a surplus of \$11,228 in 1994 when the Australian Championships were in Tasmania.

Lower than expected competitor entries and higher than expected insurance premiums.

A reduction in the level of interest received as a result of low interest rates on offer for maturing debenture investments. At 30 June 1995 the Association's debenture portfolio was yielding a return of 8.5% per annum.

A significant increase in Australian Rowing Council affiliation fees as a direct result of an increase in the number of registered competitors.

As in prior years the Department of Arts, Sport and Tourism has contributed significantly to the funding requirements of the sport and we thank the Department for their support.

The Victorian Institute of Sport and the Australian Sports Commission have again assisted the Association by continuing to provide significant benefits to the Association in supporting competitors contributing to various development activities and in defraying administration costs.

The equity investment program, which was commenced in May 1993, aims to maximise returns to the Association over the medium to longer term through a series of strategic investments in blue chip stocks. At 30 June 1995 the market value of the investments was slightly below cost.

The equity portfolio will be subject to fluctuations in market value over the short term, however as the Association is a long-term holder of equity investments no adjustment for the decrement has been brought to account.

In light of the deficit for the year and falling competitor numbers it is clear that the Association (all clubs and schools) need to work hard to arrest this position so as to ensure Victoria is able to support its athletes and is well represented at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

Your Committee looks forward to the coming season with enthusiasm, particularly in light of changes proposed in the Strategic Plan for the Association taking effect and in the lead up to the 1996 Olympic Games at which the Association's members are expected to form a large part of the team.

Finally, I would like to again thank Bill Waterfield and Melvina Harvey for their efforts and support in the management of the Association's finances in what has been another very busy year.

The continuing financial assistance and support received from Sport and Recreation Victoria, for which the Association is extremely grateful, together with a portion of Association funds has provided for the employment of Mr Bill Waterfield, your full-time Administration Officer, who has undertaken the secretarial and various other administration functions for the Association.

The Association greatly appreciates the valuable assistance provided by Mrs M L Harvey, Administrative Assistant, in the operation of the Office and functioning of the Association. The Association's Office, now established in Jolimont, provides a contact point and information source which is widely used and appreciated by clubs, schools, oarspeople, prospective oarspeople, other rowing Associations, Government and other organisations, various media outlets and members of the public seeking information on anything related to the sport of rowing.

In his dual positions of Administration Officer and a member of the Officials Panel, Mr Waterfield has attended many regattas during the season and helped to maintain the liaison established with Association members especially in country areas. He has also represented the Association at meetings of the State Directors of Sport and the Sports Federation of Victoria and at other official functions and meetings during the season.

COACHING EDUCATION

The Association is most grateful for the funding support received from Sport and Recreation Victoria which has assisted Mr John Cumper in conducting a number of Level I Coaching Courses in country areas aimed at developing expertise and increasing the number of accredited coaches in these areas to ensure the safety and enjoyment of participants in rowing.

Mr Cumper has also conducted a number of successful Level I and Level 2 Coaching Courses in Melbourne and kept coaches informed of the latest developments through the Coaching Network established in conjunction with his position as Victorian Institute of Sport Senior Rowing Coach.

The fleet of sculling boats have been widely used by clubs and schools for the promotion and development of rowing and were also used at the State Secondary Schools sculling regatta conducted at Bendigo. Your thanks are extended to Mr David Boykett for his management of the sculling fleet.

Your thanks are extended to Noel Donaldson, John Cumper and his course presenters for their efforts on our behalf.

VICTORIAN INSTITUTE OF SPORT

The Rowing Program at the Institute is conducted by Head Rowing Coach, Mr Noel Donaldson, ably assisted by Senior Rowing Coach, Mr John Cumper, Development Coach, Mr Ross Henderson, a new appointment during the season to manage the State Development Program for Junior and Under 22 years rowers including liaison with clubs and schools, and Apprentice Coach Miss Deirdre Fraser.

The aim of the Institute is to assist the talented athletes of Victoria to achieve at the highest levels of sports performance and to implement programs both elite and development that serve this aim. The Institute program also incorporates the Victorian Intensive Training Centre which is a part of the National Rowing Program.

The Institute provides support through access to coaching, elite training and competition, sports science and sports medicine and an athlete career and education program. The Institute also provides sports science and sports medicine support for athletes on the Olympic Athlete Program funded by the Australian Sports Commission.

For 1995 the Institute awarded 21 full scholarships to oarspeople from both open and lightweight categories.

We take this opportunity to thank the Institute Board members and Dr Frank Pyke, Chief Executive Officer and his staff for their support and encouragement of our members and the sport of rowing.

We also thank Mr David Pincus, for his liaison work between the Institute and your Association, and Mr Noel Donaldson, Mr John Cumper, Mr Ross Henderson and Miss Deirdre Fraser for their efforts on our behalf.

OFFICIAL'S PANEL

After their late appointment, the Panel were able to provide officials to operate at all days of regatta racing during the season, even if on occasions the numbers were a little sparse, together with a number of Junior regattas, thanks to the support and participation of many officials for, no matter in whatever capacity they acted, all contributed to the successful conduct of regattas throughout Victoria.

To help replace those officials who have opted out of active regatta participation, new officials are always welcome and the Panel will be conducting tests for prospective officials early in the new season.

Qualification

It was not practicable to establish accounting controls over cash received from all sources prior to their receipt by the Association. Accordingly, it was not practicable to extend my audit examination of cash receipts beyond verification of the amounts recorded in the books and records.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion

In my opinion, subject to the limitations imposed by the foregoing, the financial statements of the Victorian Rowing Association Inc are properly drawn up:

- (a) so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Association at 30 June 1995, and the results and cash flows of the Association for the financial year ended on that date; and
- (b) are in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.
