### President's Foreword, Mr. David Deeble

2005 has been another good year for Rowing Victoria as we continue to deliver for all our stakeholders. We have supported clubs with a very active member services program and established a clear set of vision, mission and values statements that will build the unique culture we are seeking. This will lead staff performance and customer satisfaction objectives for Rowing Victoria.

On the competitive side, we are seeing a growth in all aspects of rowing. We have achieved good results at the elite level, which assist greatly in lifting the profile of the sport. Our congratulations go to all our State and International representatives and particularly the women's' teams who have been superb in 2005.

Season 2005 has seen a number of new initiatives implemented with a number of major changes planned for 2006.

### These initiatives are:

- 1. Completion of Rowing Victoria's Vision, Mission and Values statements.
- 2. Rowing Victoria taking on an events management role starting with the *Head of the Schoolgirls* and Rowing Victoria's own *State Championships*.
- 3. Establishment of the Victorian Rowing Open Day.
- 4. Establishment of the Rowing Victoria Competition Commission.
- 5. Restructuring of the Boat Race Official's Panel.
- 6. Contribution to a joint *Strategic Intent Policy* with the Shire of Strathbogie and Murray Goulburn Water.

In 2006 the two major initiatives to be introduced are:

- 1. Rowing Victoria Score (RVS) system that replaces the existing competition status structure.
- 2. Rowing Online Management System (ROMS) that is a Rowing Australia initiative that has been driven by Rowing Victoria and Rowing Queensland.

Both of these initiatives are major projects that have been developed and broadly communicated to members during the past year. The implementation of both will transform the current way we do business at State, Club and Individual rower level.

In addition, Rowing Victoria has been chosen to conduct the Australian Masters Regatta in 2006 and the Australian National Championships and Interstate Regatta in 2007.

During 2006 Rowing Victoria faces a number of challenges:

- 1. Communicating and living the Rowing Victoria values.
- 2. Reviewing and aligning our racing rules with Rowing Australia apart from Victorian differences, e.g. RVS system, etc.
- 3. Managing the continuing growth and development of our sport, e.g. distributing the competition calendar rather than condensing as it is known, and building our volunteer resources to adequately support an expanded regatta program.
- 4. Continually enhancing the skills of our large volunteer pool.
- 5. Successfully implementing and leveraging ROMS to provide *significant* benefits at all levels of rowing administration and communication.
- 6. Fine-tuning Rowing Victoria to ensure a meaningful and enjoyable competitive experience for all competitors at whatever level of competence.
- 7. Benchmarking Rowing Victoria against the world's best to ensure a culture of continuous improvement. Improvement objectives have now been established for the Competition Commission and the Boat Race Official's Panel.

Rowing Victoria has a very large base of volunteers and the sport would not survive without their skill and commitment. This is particularly so to the Boat Race Official Panel Chairperson, Rod Florence, and his team, whom we thank most sincerely for their continued support and endeavour to make rowing competition safe and fair for all.

We have a keen and energetic staff lead by Grant Cosgriff (CEO), Zoe Ryan (Member Services), Barbara Williams (Finance—part time) and Herb Ellerbock (Regatta Management—part time). Grant's energy and leadership has been great and Rowing Victoria is very fortunate to have a professional of Grant's ability and vision. We welcome the addition of a full time Competition and Events Coordinator to provide Rowing Victoria with a team of very skilled people who are keen to build and lift the profile of the sport in Victoria to deliver our mission of being a world leader.

Rowing Victoria is also very fortunate to have a strong Board of Directors whose wisdom and counsel is valued. Jim Lowe, or Finance Director for the past 16 years, has resigned due to heavy work commitments. We extend to Jim our grateful thanks for his long and valuable contributions. The strong financial position of Rowing Victoria today is due in no small part to Jim and others before him who have similarly

### Chief Executive Officer, Grant Cosgriff

The 2004/2005 year has been another year of significant growth and development. The changes implemented and those planned for the future address the changes that have occurred in the sport and will allow Rowing Victoria to lead the sport in coming years

You will have noticed the Rowing Victoria values highlighted throughout the Annual Report, being reinforced in all our correspondence and presentations. The values express the behavioural parameters for Rowing Victoria and all its stakeholders and will become a mechanism for the review of the organisation on a regular basis.

The Annual report is a great opportunity to reflect on the past year and all that Rowing Victoria and its members have achieved. In no particular order:

- Another year of a financial surplus which continues to place the association in a strong position to develop and grow the sport in the coming years.
- The continuation of funding from both Sport and Recreation and VicHealth which has enabled us to look at expanding the office staff (and hence service to the membership) and commit to the development of a new membership and competition management system (ROMS).
- Successfully bidding to host the 2006 Australian Masters Rowing Championships and the 2007 Australian Youth Cup.
- The expansion of the Event Management role of the association and the partnerships with the Head of the Schoolgirls Regatta, APS Head of the River, etc.
- The development and refinement of the Rowing Victoria Score (RVS) in conjunction with Sandy Mitchell and Herb Ellerbock who have contributed greatly to the development. This change has been commissioned with significant consultation with the membership and will be a major focus of the 2005-06 calendar season. The RVS addresses the needs of the competitors in providing a flexible system for grading and will place rowing as a sport in a position to allow lifelong participation to all. It considers age, the distance of racing and the frequency with which a competitor wins in the changes to a competitor's RVS. It is an exciting initiative and one that is eagerly awaited.

The Inaugural Victorian Rowing Open Day was proudly supported by Sykes Racing and the Victorian Institute of Sport. The day had the following 13 clubs open their doors to the public - Bendigo, Carrum, Corio Bay, Footscray, Hamilton, Hawthorn, Melbourne Argonauts, Nestles, Wahgunyah, Wendouree Ballarat, Y rowing, Yarra Yarra and Yarrawonga. It was a tremendous day with over 400 newcomers to



### Member Services, Zoe Ryan

Member services for 2004-2005 has taken on a number of initiatives to provide greater opportunities to its membership and to increase participation and quality of Rowing within Victoria.

**Coaching**—Rowing Australia introduced the new NCAS structure which saw many Victorian rowing coaches having their accreditation upgraded. A new Level 1 course has been introduced and Rowing Victoria has run three Level 1 courses, with approximately 50 coaches going through the program. One Level 2 course has been held and it is anticipated that a new Level 3 course will run in 2006.

*Membership*—Victorian Rowing has had a steady increase in membership. Figure 1.1 illustrates this. This is a positive sign for Rowing, demonstrating that rowing is growing and becoming stronger.









### **Competition Health Index**

The number of competitors grew in 2004-05 by 3.2% for club rowers, and 11% for schools. This is a great result and indicates that the increasing number of regattas and more importantly those with an 'event' focus are encouraging the club member to compete.

The number of regattas attended in a season by schools and combined clubs and schools also increased. This indicates that there is an increasing appetite for competition from the members.




The number of races conducted during the 2004-05 Regatta season increased by 11.5%. This was due to the increase in regatta attendance, increase in the number of regattas and the implementation of a 'round robin'/seeded final for Beginner and Novice grades.

The frequency of participation by competitors increased from the previous year. Club competitors attended on average 5.27 regattas for the season (compared to 4.85 the previous year), School competitors attended on average 4.4 regattas for the season (up from 4.0 the previous year). Attendance for all competitors increased from 3.85 to 4.24 regattas for the season. Whilst the increase is great to see, the growing focus in coming years will be to have rowers compete more often, aiming for a frequency of 6-7 regattas for the season.
