## President's Report

This season was one of reaping the rewards of past good work and strengthening the foundations for yet greater success.

But first, let us celebrate our champions.

Drew Ginn and David Crawshay became Beijing Olympic Champions, Drew becoming a three time Olympic Champion. Perhaps more astonishing, Drew won whilst suffering a debilitating back injury which preventing getting into a boat between heat and semi final, and semi-final and final. David Crawshay is well advanced with his attempt to climb the Olympic mountain again and it is my prediction he will again reach the summit. Our VIS head coach Chris O'Brien coached the pair again and now becomes one of Australia's most successful coaches.

We also celebrate the great silver medal in the four with James Marburg and Cameron McKenzie-McHarg. Their race was exceptional and the result well deserved. The number of Victorians racing and coaching Olympians was again disproportionate to our size.

The World Championships brought forward another World Champion in Alice McNamara who won gold in the lightweight quad.

Back home at the Interstate Championships, Victoria was the most successful State but missed out on the King's Cup to a determined NSW crew to whom we extend our congratulations. Congratulations to our Victorian team who performed so well and in particular to our winning women's eight, men's youth eight and men's sculler, David Crawshay who all won their races. We also congratulate the Tasmanian Rowing Council on a well run regatta.

The 2009 World Championships have produce two Victoria's first junior medallists with Daniel Brighthope and Michael Poulter. At the 2009 senior World Championships, James Marburg and Cam McKenzie-McHarg did well with a silver medal in the coxless four and David Crawshay a silver in the quad.

### Administration

Over the past year, your Board has completed several significant administrative changes to better provide our critical services and is well advanced with a review to strengthen our financial base.

1. We completed the take over of all development activities from grass roots to elite development. Development is now a fundamental activity of the Association and one which we are committed to do better and more extensively.

With that responsibility settled, your Association's activities are managed as planned into three distinct areas:

- a. Corporate - under the control of our CEO Daniel Hutchinson. This area comprises dealing with Clubs and Schools, Commissions, RA, State Government, sponsors, etc and being the leader of the Association and it's staff. It is a demanding and difficult task.
- b. Events - under the control of Alice Evans. This is also a demanding role which has periods of enormous stress and activity.
- c. Development - under the control of Richard Bartlett. This area is breaking new ground and creating new and exciting programs.

Reports on these areas will follow later in this report.

With the settlement of the development changes, our relationship with the VIS has been defined with a new agreement where RV is responsible for development and the VIS responsible for the top open athletes in the State.

2. Your Board has been the beneficiary of our current business model based upon event management and management of domestic regattas. Alas, the opportunities for event management of national events going forward is reduced and the growth in entries at our regattas is lower than our growth in expenses. The successful operation of the 2010 National Championships will assist us in 2009-10 season, but the widening of the gap between income and expenses will become a growing and significant issue in subsequent seasons. Or expressed more bluntly, changes to our business model are required.

Steve Whittington has taken a leave of absence from the Board for two months to undertake a detailed review of our business model. His report is due before the AGM and we can report on it at that meeting.

### Victorian Institute of Sport

We were pleased to enter into a long term agreement this year with the VIS for rowing to continue to be a VIS sport until 2014. I am pleased to add that the co-operation between RV and VIS is admirable and we look forward to this continuing and providing even more success to our athletes.



## President's Report, *Continued*

### Volunteer Recognition

The Association could not operate without the support of volunteers, whether umpires, regatta volunteers, commission members, board members, club members and others.

Accordingly, last season saw in the formation of the RV Awards Committee under the chairmanship of past President Peter Fraser. The other members of the committee are Roger Wilson OAM and the President for the time being of RV. This committee has proposed and the Board have accepted, the proposals that RV creates a Hall of Fame and introduces the following two new awards:

1. The William Waterfield Award for outstanding service to Victorian rowing. Our life member William Waterfield has been a fine example of a person who has provided outstanding service to the sport in Victoria and has consented to having the award named in his honour.
2. The Kath Bennett Award for outstanding service to a rowing community in the sport in Victoria. The award is planned to capture those people who have done outstanding work in a club, regatta committee or region which has benefitted the sport. Kath Bennett is a fine example of such work in more than one area and has kindly consented to have this award named in her honour.

Both awards will be presented at the luncheon following the AGM and nominations can be sent to the RV office. The Hall of Fames is still being worked on and will hopefully be inaugurated in 2010.

Whilst on awards, the Association congratulates Roger Wilson OAM on his award in the Queen's Birthday honour list. This award was well deserved and we are proud that one of our number has received such a high honour.

The Board, on the recommendation of the RV Awards Committee, has recommended that Eric Waller be elected a life member of the Association. This is a well deserved nomination and one which we are very pleased to put before the annual general meeting.

### MUBC 150th

We congratulate MUBC on celebrating their 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary in September this year. MUBC is a club which has been influential in the development of amateur rowing both in Victoria and Australia and is the oldest club still in existence in Australia. Mildura Rowing Club will also celebrate their centenary in 2009.

### Commissions

The work of the Association is devolved to a large extent to the Commissions. They comprise, Competition, Development, Masters, Media, Medical, Umpires and Waterways and Courses. The Commissions enable the Association to harness the expertise of our members and provide opportunities for those wanting to assist our work. We recognise and thank all the Commission members who have given so much time and effort to the work of the Association.

In particular, I would like to highlight the work of the umpires and Eric Waller as our field of play manager.

### Staff

The work of the Association is undertaken to a large degree by our staff who undertake their work with the enthusiasm of volunteers and work well beyond their responsibilities. We are most grateful for their continued excellent work.

### Next Season

Our focus in the next season is split amongst a number of vital tasks, running the National Championships, implementing the safety management plan, increasing participation at our regattas and improving our competition program, and taking our development activities to the next level. This is much to do and we look forward to the challenges that lie ahead.

Finally, on behalf of the board, I would like to thank the member clubs and schools for their continued support of the Association.

## Chief Executive Officer Report

The Beijing Olympics proved to be a very successful regatta for Victoria with Drew Ginn winning his third Gold medal in three attempts and David Crawshay his first with Cameron McKenzie-McHarg and James Marburg winning Silver in the Coxless Four. Alice McNamara backed up good performances of previous years by winning the World Rowing Championships lightweight quad scull.

Increasing membership and participation along with improving our underage-elite competitors continues to be key areas of focus for Rowing Victoria. Regatta operations and event management are still core activities and much work over the past 12 months has been dedicated to enhancing this area. Items of note for the year include:

- Successful management of six major regattas including the Australian Masters Games and Head of the Schoolgirls Regatta and contribution to the Heads of the River
- Finalisation and roll-out of the Safety Management Plan
- Staging of a Club-School forum to review the regatta season
- Creating, reviewing and updating rules, policies and guidelines consistent with best practice and current standards
- Increasing development activities
- Renewal of the Victoria Institution Sport Rowing Program
- Contributing to Rowing Australia's Strategic Plan, Competition Review and implementation of a common logo for all of Rowing.

### Rules, Policies and Guidelines

The Safety Management Plan (SMP) is now in effect and is to be phased in over a period of 18 months with full compliance required by 1 June 2010.

The SMP was circulated to all clubs and schools in

March 2008 and discussed at the Club-School forum and each General Meeting. Additionally 10 information sessions throughout Victoria were conducted. The SMP will serve to formalise many of the current safety practices and develop other areas. Compliance with the SMP will mean that rowing maintains its exemption from the PFD legislation gazetted in December 2005.

### Regatta Management

RV successfully managed the Australian Masters Games in Geelong, the Head of Schoolgirls and Victorian Open, Grade, Senior and Junior Schools and Masters Rowing Championship.

RV were granted the 2010 Australian Rowing Championship in December 2008 and a steering committee formed soon after. The committee has been working well together and we anticipate a fantastic event at Nagambie Lakes.

### Club Forum

Melbourne Rowing Club was the host of the 2009 Club School Forum held on Saturday 20 April. The primary aim was to review the previous regatta season and work on developing the next. More than 35 members from 22 clubs and schools attended the forum.

### Branding

A new logo was adopted by Rowing Victoria inline with the logo developed for Rowing Australia and the other State Associations. This initiative has provided a united front for Rowing through Australia and a stronger corporate image.

In addition to the corporate logo, a new logo was developed for the Victorian Rowing Championships and Queensland Rowing adopted the Australian Masters Rowing Championship logo created by Rowing Victoria the previous year.

### Development

Development programs were expanded in the past 12 months with Grassroots, Rising Athletes, Tomorrows Gold and Oars for All programs and the ongoing refinement of the coaching and coxswains education programs rowing will only get stronger. Further details are contained in the development report.

### Fundraising

Fundraising activities significantly increased this year with introduction of the Kings Cup breakfast, cocktail party and luncheon. There was a 40% increase in the funds raised with the extra activity. RV intends to continue running these 3 key functions.

### Rowing Victoria History

Congratulations to the Melbourne University Boat Club for their first 150 years which they will celebrate in September 2009.

### Facilities and Waterways Commission

During the year a commission was formed to advise Rowing Victoria on facilities and waterways. With the development of Victoria Park in Shepparton, Lake Wendouree in Ballarat, Como Park in South Yarra and Lend Lease exploring the possibility of a boating hub on Victoria Harbour at Docklands the Facilities and Waterways Commission have been kept very busy.

One of the limiting factors in growing the sport are facilities and waterways, increasing our access to water is a critical strategic initiative.

## Regatta and Event Manager Report

Overall Rowing Victoria has managed directly or assisted with an impressive 42 regattas that were affiliated with Rowing Victoria and conducted during the 2008-09 season.

They were highlighted by a number of major regatta's including four days of State Championships and the Head of the River at the Nagambie Lakes Regatta Centre and the Australian Masters Games Rowing and the Head of the Schoolgirls regatta on the Barwon River at Geelong.

The ROMS system has played a major role as we have effectively handled the growth in participation in recent years illustrated by the more than 52,500 seats (8,000 crews) entered through the system for Victorian regattas throughout the 2008-09 season.

The ROMS system, of which on-line entry management is a key part, has undergone further significant development over the past 12 months including the ability to now upload results to ROMS, ability to communicate directly with regatta competitors via email and general member regatta entries.

## Development Report

The 2008-09 year saw continued and significant growth in the development activities undertaken by Rowing Victoria from a grassroots to sub-elite level. Rowing Victoria continues to undertake initiatives to:

- Increase the participation of boys and girls in the sport of rowing, and
- Increase the number and success of Victorian boys and girls in a pathway to elite underage success.

### Grass Roots

In the second of a two year project Rowing Victoria continued its partnership with 7 RV affiliated clubs to increase the participation of boys and girls from non-traditional rowing backgrounds into the sport. A partnership with Concept II proved valuable with over 50 rowing machines being placed into schools partnered with a club. Each club also received 1 rowing machine for the program period.

Numerous visitations and education sessions have been made to schools to promote the sport and these (through feedback from the clubs and schools) resulted in increased interest in the sport and increased numbers at learn to row days. It is clear from the work completed in this project that our clubs all face different challenges in the development of underage rowing that include coaching, equipment and of course access to water.

Rowing Victoria ran the VSSSA regatta as a peak event for schools associated with clubs in the grassroots program. The regatta attracted 309 participants (70% increase) from 28 schools (75% increase). Indoor Rowing events were held at this regatta for the first time for those boys and girls who had participated on indoor rowers throughout the season but were yet to 'Learn to Row'. Feedback was extremely positive for both the Indoor and on-water rowing events. At the conclusion of the program statistics indicate an increase in participation and membership in all grassroots clubs.

### National Elite Development Program (NEDP)

The Rowing Victoria State Development Coordinator managed the operation of the 2008/09 NEDP. Rowing Victoria engaged three clubs (Melbourne University Boat Club, Mercantile Rowing Club and Banks Rowing Club) to deliver the program. Each club demonstrated the capacity to deliver elite outcomes at U19 and U23 level as well as a capacity to continue this pathway to Senior Open standard.

All clubs acquitted the funds to appoint coaches used in U19 and U23 programs. Each of these clubs was also responsible for a number of deliverables which included supporting State based initiatives.

### Summary of Outcomes

#### Victoria

- 10 athletes in the Australian U19 and U23 National Team.
- 2 further U23 athletes in the National Senior team
- Both U23 National team reserves from Victoria.
- Completed the 2008/09 year with a total of 38 athletes under management.
- 10% of National U19 team was from Victoria (#4 ranked state)
- 26% of the National U23 team was from Victoria (# 1 ranked state).

The two State Based initiatives that relate to the NEDP are the 'Rising Athletes' program and the 'Tomorrow's Gold' program.



## Development Report, *continued*

### 'Rising Athletes'

The program this year included a three day camp in Nagambie, a monthly lecture series with presentations on Injury prevention, recovery training, diet for performance and an ASADA presentation and monthly rows in a school to club transition program. The program inducted 30 boys and 30 girls identified from rowing schools in Years 10 to 12. The program aimed to extend and accelerate the development of successful U19 rower's. From this group



Rising Athletes Camp

- 24 athletes were selected to row against New Zealand in the Victorian Under 18 team
- 8 athletes were selected to attend the Rowing Australia NTID camp
- 5 athletes were selected to attend the Rowing Australia NTID tour to New Zealand
- 4 athletes attended Australian Junior selection trials
- 2 athletes were selected in the Australian Junior Rowing team.

### 'Tomorrow's Gold'

This program aimed to identify and develop existing athletes capable of inclusion in the National U23 team.

RV identified 26 U23 athletes from the NTC TT system through September to December period. These athletes met for fortnightly big boat rows with the aim to develop combinations and skills between athletes from different

clubs. These athletes attended a three day Development camp in December where a matrix was completed to identify combinations for possible inclusion at National Championships and selection trials. From this group

- 8 athletes were selected in the 2009 Australian U23 team.
- A further 8 athletes qualified and attended the 2009 Australian selection trials.

### **Coaching**

The 2008-09 season saw the number of accredited coaches remain steady at 234. The figure reflects a more formalised and accurate accreditation catalogue through the Australian Sports Commission. Throughout the season, Rowing Australia worked in conjunction with State Associations to revise the current course structure and an improved syllabus will be presented in the coming season.

Course demand increased across the board, and an additional 21 coaches sat the Level 1 (Learn to Row) coaching course. Courses were held throughout the state, including Melbourne, Geelong, Ballarat and Mildura. The number of coaches who attended courses in 2008-09 is as follows:

- Level 1 – 139
- Level 2 – 11
- Level 3 – 10

### Good Coxswain

Rowing Victoria ran 24 Level 1 Good Coxswain courses in 2008-09. The total number of coxswains educated via the program is now 557. This season also saw a number of Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) options offered to experienced coxswains. We are pleased to announce that the Level 2 Good Coxswain course is now complete and will be offered during the coming season. The Level 2 course provides a comprehensive examination of the more advanced skills of coxing.

### Oars for All – Inclusive Rowing

The 'Oars for All – Inclusive Rowing' program was further developed in conjunction with VicHealth and various community organisations. The program aims to provide greater opportunities for participation at all levels of sport and active recreation, particularly for people with disabilities and from disadvantaged backgrounds.

During the season a partnership was formed with Victoria Police, Victorian Aboriginal Sport and Recreation, Melbourne Aboriginal Sport and Recreation, Yarra Yarra RC and Carey Grammar School. A three day learn to row program was offered for police and Aboriginal youths. The initiative aimed to build ties between police and Aboriginal youth and provide an opportunity for active recreation. It was considered a success by all involved.

Creation of the Oars for All – Inclusive Rowing Manual is well under way, with a number of disability organisations, rowing clubs and sports organisations contributing to the resource. The manual aims to assist clubs to become more inclusive and to provide opportunities for people with disabilities and from disadvantaged backgrounds.



### Website

Membership to the Rowing Victoria website increased by over 30% during the past season. This membership base enables greater sharing of opportunities and information. Rowing Victoria's new website is nearing completion in anticipation of a 15<sup>th</sup> September launch date. The site has been substantially modernised and boasts increased usability and functionality.

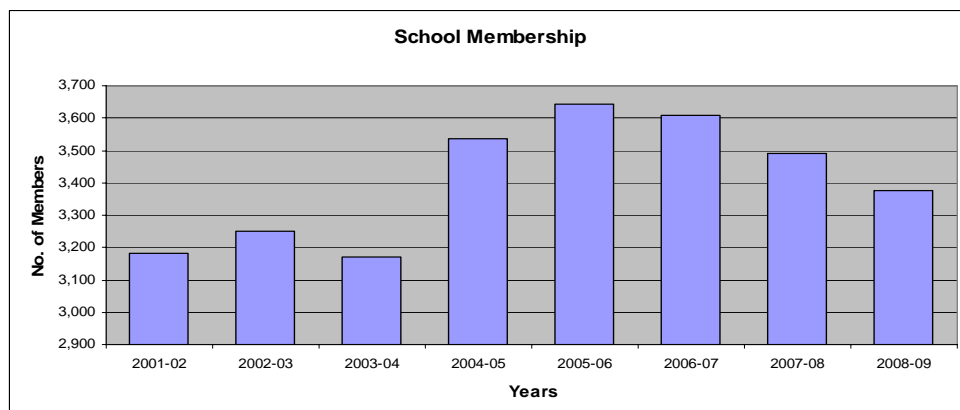
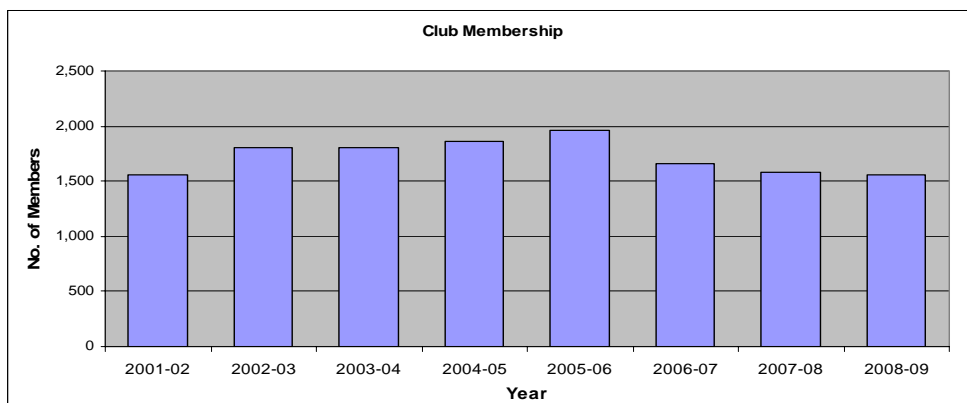

## Umpires Commission Report

2008/2009 proved to be a very interesting season for Rowing Victoria. The umpires once again were able to support all regattas ensuring safe and fair competition.

The number of active umpires has fallen over the past few years, and a number of our older brigade have significantly reduced their availability. This has tested the resolve of those who were able to help out. A number of umpires worked in excess of 15 regatta days. This is significant if you consider that umpiring these days is a full day's activity, with an extra hour before the regatta to meet as a jury to ensure everything is in readiness and any last minute changes are identified, as well as an extra hour after the regatta in doing the equipment checks and debrief. This puts many of the regattas during January to March in the 11 to 12 hour bracket. Coupled with travel, our workload on the day is extraordinary. Thank you to all our umpires for working so many times for so long.

It is clear we need to recruit new umpires. The level 1 program proved extremely valuable by providing umpires for the less demanding tasks when there were insufficient Level 2 umpires available for a particular regatta. Some of these Level 1s are now working toward their Level 2 licence. We wish them every success and the Umpires Commission will do everything in its power to help them gain the higher qualification.

Anyone who would like to upgrade their licence to Level 2 or higher, should contact Rod Florence the new Umpire Commission chairman.

Rod is taking back his old role for a year while mentoring a new chairman. I have left the RV Umpires Commission to take up a role on the RA Umpires Commission. I will be liaising with the RV Umpires Commission in RA matters in particular on NOAS.

I would like to thank the commission members for their support and hard work over the last few seasons: Robin Burrows, Dave Grubits, Robbie Allan and of course Rod Florence. I also welcome Bill Webster to the RV Umpires Commission.

I would also like to thank the hard working staff of RV and particularly Alice Evans who tirelessly manages our regatta season including dealing with the umpires. The Umpires Commission is also ably supported by Eric Waller our ever youthful Field of Play director who is rumoured to be the "father and mother" of our equipment trailers. (wonder who started that rumour Kevin O'Brien??)

Finally I would like to thank Daniel Hutchison for his overwhelming support of the umpires and indeed all the volunteers that work for RV. Daniel has made it easy to deal with the various small issues that always crop up and has always been willing to discuss any ideas that we may have had.

We are indeed a family united in our sport. Family life may not always be smooth, but families always stick together. Thank you to all who have made the season 2008-2009 successful.

## Finance Report

I am pleased to present the financial statements with this report together with the auditor's report thereon.

Rowing Victoria continues to be managed on a sound financial footing as the premier association in the country. However, RV has recorded a trading loss for the year of \$18,754 (compared to a trading loss for the prior year of \$8,393), and faces a more difficult outlook over the next 12 to 24 months.

Gross revenue (excluding the prior year's profit on sale of shares) has risen by 8.6% to \$1,000,154 despite general rowing activity remaining steady. The principal cause is the increased involvement of RV in team and event management. This includes a 18.2% increase in government grants to \$248,000 however this includes grant revenue of \$57,000 that has been carried over from the 2008 year. The vast majority of this additional revenue has been spent on increased activity in the development area. This does however foreshadow potential revenue reductions in government grant income in future periods.

Net assets of the association have fallen by \$140,252, representing the loss for the year of \$18,754 and a reduction in the value of the investment portfolio of \$121,498. This reduction in the value of our portfolio to 30 June 2009 of 17.0% is a reflection of the stock market volatility that has continued in this period.

Going forward the Board of RV has adopted a policy of budgeting for a better than breakeven position. There are a number of challenges facing the organisation, with the most significant being the need to maintain and grow external and alternative sources of income in order to offset the significant falls in value of government grants expected going forwards. In the short term this will be achieved by hosting the Australian Championships in March 2010. The Board will need to work hard to maintain the programs and services that RV offers its members so that it can continue to expand and improve.

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Victoria). The board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and based on historical costs and does not take account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) *Revenue recognition*

Sponsorship contributions are generally recognised as revenue on receipt except for specific sponsorships or donations for which the Association has received a commitment from the sponsor or donor.

Proceeds from additional activities are recognised on receipt. Interest revenue is recognised as it is earned. Donations and dividends are recognised when the Association receives control over the related funds.

(b) *Plant and equipment*

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

The depreciable amount of fixed assets, is depreciated on the diminishing value method over the asset's useful life commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Office equipment	7% to 40%
Regatta and rowing equipment	7% to 50%

(c) *Employee benefits*

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(d) *Payables*

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the company prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(e) *Cash and cash equivalents*

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(f) *Financial assets*

Investments held are originally recognised at cost which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at reporting date. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

(g) *Inventories*

Inventories are measured at cost, adjusted when applicable for any loss of service potential.

(h) *Goods and services tax (GST)*

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(i) *Impairment of assets*

At each reporting date, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expenses to the income statement.

(j) *Available for sale financial assets*

All investments are classified as available for sale financial assets. Available for sale financial assets are reflected at fair value unless the fair value cannot be reliably measured. Unrealised gains and losses arising from changes in fair value are taken directly to equity.

(k) *Key estimates*

The association assesses impairment at each reporting date by evaluation of conditions and events specific to the association that may be an indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

(l) *Key judgements – Provision for impairment of receivables*

Included in accounts receivable at 30 June 2009 is an amount receivable from the rowing clubs which is material. The Directors believe that the some of the amount of the debt will not be recoverable and a doubtful debt provision has been made at 30 June 2009.

(m) *Comparative figures*

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.


