

# President's Report

The past year has been one of continuing success for Victorian rowing and one of significant activity as this report will reveal.

#### **World Class results**

Since the last report Victorians have been prominent in the superb results of the 2011 World Championships, the 2012 under 23 Championships and in the medals won at the Olympic Games. We congratulate these teams on their results and in particular the Victorians who formed part of them.

The 2011 World Championships produced great results for Australia and the many Victorians in that team. We congratulate the bronze medal winning men's four which included Drew Ginn, Josh Dunkley Smith and coach Chris O'Brien, the gold medal lightweight eight which included Tom Bertrand, Nick Baker and David Webster, silver medal double scull including Kim Crow, gold medallist Kartsen Forsterling in the quad scull, silver medallists Kate Hornsey and Pauline Frasca in the women's four, bronze medallist Kathryn Ross in the adaptive trunk and arms mixed double, silver medallists Will Lockwood and David Webster in the coxed pair and bronze medallists Sarah Tait, Kate Hornsey and coach Bill Tait in the women's pair. These were outstanding results for Australia and for the Victorians in that team. Congratulations to the Australian team and to the other Victorians in that team.

In the 2012 Under 23 Championships, Victorian Rebekah Hooper stroked the winning women's quad scull, Victorians Sam Hookway and Tim Webster were part of the bronze medal winning men's eight, Owen Symington and Tim Masters were part of the silver medal winning men's coxless four, Victorian Katrina Bateman improved on her bronze in 2011 with a silver in 2012 in the women's coxless four with Lucy Stephen and coach Mark Fangen-Hall. To the other Victorians in the team, namely George Ellis, David DeLang, Sean Lake, Alex Henshilwood and reserves Michael Poulter and Hannah Clark, our hearty congratulations.

The Olympic Games saw many Victorians in the medals and many in the team. The stand out athlete of the regatta for Australia was Victorian Kim Crow who won silver in the women's double and bronze in the single. She was the only athlete at the regatta to double up in two events. The silver medal winning women's pair was an entirely Victorian crew of Kate Hornsey, Sarah Tait and coach Bill Tait. The silver medal winning men's four comprised three Victorians, Drew Ginn, Josh Dunkley-Smith and coach Chris O'Brien. Congratulations also to Victorian Karsten Forsterling who was a member of the bronze medal winning quad scull. Unfortunately injuries played their part in the men's double scull in

which Victorian David Crawshay was part. The men's eight comprising Victorians Tom Swann, Josh Booth and Cameron McKenzie McHarg narrowly missed out on a bronze medal. Victorians Phoebe Stanley, Robyn Selby Smith and Lizzie Patrick were members of the women's eight which was a late addition to the team and which made the final. Pauline Frasca was a member of the women's quad which finished fourth and James Marburg was a member of the men's pair which also raced very well. Congratulations to the Olympic rowing team and in particular to our Victorians in that team.

At the time of writing this report the Paralympics have not yet been commenced. Best wishes to the Australian team and in particular to the Adaptive Trunk and Arms Mixed Double Scull in which Victorian Kathryn Ross and Gavin Bellis are members.

Back home at the Interstate Championships, Victoria was yet again the most successful State but missed out on the King's Cup to a determined NSW crew to whom we extend our congratulations.

Congratulations to our Victorian team which performed so well. Mention must be made of our winning women's eight whose race was one of the best ever seen at an Interstate Championships. The crew was brilliantly led by Phoebe Stanley and dominated their race. Congratulations also to Kim Crow and David Crawshay who won their respective sculling races. We thank our team led by Head Coach Chris O'Brien and manager Nick Gall.

Also locally, the Victorian Masters teams did very well winning three of the four Interstate events, the men's and women's eights and the women's quad scull. Congratulations to the crews and to their coaches Brenton Terrell, John Reddaway and Paul Guest.

These results would not be as good if it were not for all our coaches and selectors. We are fortunate to have Christian Ryan as our Chairman of Selectors and he has supporting him senior selectors Ion Popa and Pete Somerville, Youth selectors Annabelle Eaton and Ross Henderson and masters selectors Paul Guest, Stuart McShane and Neville Smith.

#### Strategic Plan

The Association has adopted a new strategic plan for the next three years. It was presented to the July general meeting. It is less ambitious than past plans but will enable us to better achieve the key objectives of greater participation in the sport and supporting member clubs and schools. The plan focuses our efforts on the four areas of operation of the Association, namely:

- Regatta operations and event management. This is the key business activity of the Association.
- Representation comprising management of both

internal and external relationships and administration.

- Development including coach and cox education and support of member clubs.
- Selection and management of Victorian teams

The Association has limited resources and so strives to do the key areas of activity well rather than embrace the many other areas of activity available to it. We continue to be the least expensive State Association in Australia for our members.

#### **Constitutional Changes**

The Board has recognised the need to continually innovate and improve the administration and coordination of the sport in Victoria. Over many years it has been gradually moving from a committee of management with significant managerial responsibilities to a Board focused on Board responsibilities. The changes have included a governance policy, increased importance of commissions with less involvement of Board members, constitutional changes to enable the Board to appoint directors to fill skill gaps, increased focus on risk management and compliance and less involvement in the day to day management of the Association. The proposed changes are some of the last steps in this change and are recommended to members. If approved, the Board plans to operate strictly as a Board and leave the management to the commissions and employed staff. This is a significant step forward for the Association.

#### **Finances**

The finances of the Association continue to be sound and do not require increases in affiliation fees. We were fortunate to have had profitable events which have enabled a material profit this year. This profit will assist in maintaining the real value of our reserves. The budget for next year is break even.

#### Venues

The Association could not operate as effectively without the support of venue operators. Our key 2000m during the year continued to be Nagambie and we thank the Shire of Strathbogie for their continued support. Next year the Ballarat course will come back on board after many years of drought. We are assured that the Lake is now drought proof and has been excavated to make the course an even depth. We will therefore have the luxury of two good 2000m courses going forward and both will be supported. The State's main training venue the Yarra River is suffering from silt and is becoming a serious concern. This has become a focus of attention of the Yarra clubs and the Association.

#### Chris O'Brien

Rowing Victorian and VIS Head Coach Chris O'Brien has been appointed as the new National Performance Director of Rowing Australia. Chris has been a club coach, VIS coach and until his recent appointment, VIS Head Coach. He has come through the coaching ranks and established himself as Australia's most successful Olympic rowing coaches with two gold and one silver medal across the last three Olympiads. The outgoing Director Andrew Matheson is returning to New Zealand to take up a new role with their high performance sport program. Congratulations Chris on your appointment.

#### 2012 Australian Masters Championships

The Association was host of the Masters Championships in May 2012 which was unfortunately undertaken in adverse weather conditions. It was a pity that the regatta was not held in October as requested by RV to test the course out at the same time of year as the 2014 FISA Masters Championships. The regatta was a great credit to the organizing committee headed by Peter Fraser which was asked to put on a major regatta so soon after the course was completed. Their only warm up regatta was the Victorian Championships the weekend before. Further the regatta was very well run given the weather conditions but of course we would certainly do things differently with the benefit of greater experience of this course. The Organising Committee did a superb job and the City of Ballarat was very supportive. Special mention must also be given to Eric Waller who did a magnificent job in many areas, the Rowing Victoria staff headed by Nick Gall, the referee Victor Walter and RA technical officials and advisers Matt Draper and Michael Eastaughffe.

#### 2014 FISA Masters Championships

Rowing Australia has won the bid for the FISA Masters Championships for 2014 to be held at Ballarat. The great benefit to the Association will be the upgraded facilities at Ballarat. Rowing Victoria will need to play a significant role in the support of this event and it will no doubt impact our other work. However the legacy of another Championship course will be worth the efforts involved.

#### **ROMS Replacement**

One of the difficult decisions made during the year was the deferment of the decision to replace ROMS with a new software solution based on a program called Regatta Central. Rowing Australia has recommended this change. Your Board was not satisfied that this software was sufficiently developed to go live with in 2012 and has therefore extended its contract with ROMS. The matter was brought to the

July general meeting for debate and the actions of the Board endorsed.

#### **Victorian Institute of Sport**

I am pleased to report that the VIS continues to serve our Victorian rowing community well. Under head coach Chris O'Brien and head women's coach Bill Tait, our elite athletes are well served. Obviously a new head coach will be appointed with the departure of Chris O'Brien. The co-operation between RV and VIS is admirable and we look forward to the continued development of our elite athletes under their care.

#### Life Memberships

The Board, on the recommendation of the RV Awards Committee (excluding Peter Fraser the Chairman of that Committee), is recommending to members the bestowing of life membership on Peter Fraser. His superb and extensive achievements on behalf of the Association clearly demonstrate that we should bestow our highest honour on him. The notice of meeting provides details of his fine work for the information of members.

#### Vale Hubert Frederico

Late in the 2009-10 season, the Association lost our esteemed Past President Hon Justice Hubert "Freddie" Frederico. Throughout his 50+years of dedicated involvement in the sport, he excelled as a rower, coach, administrator and leader. In 1979 he followed the footsteps of his father in law and became President of Rowing Victoria. In that role he provided excellent leadership and sage advice to the committee. In his first year as President of Rowing Victoria, he oversaw the amalgamation of the Victorian Rowing Association and the Victorian Ladies' Rowing Association. The Rowing Victoria Annual Report noted this event as "probably the most important happening in the 105 year history of the Association." His input into the many months of discussions was profound. He also oversaw the creation of two new courses during his term, namely the new Carrum and Nagambie courses and the holding of National Championships at both these venues.

Further during his time as President, he oversaw the introduction of professional management of the Association. He also personally pursued some projects which he deemed important to Victorian rowing. For example, he had Jeffries Parade renamed Boathouse Drive to cement the position of the Boat Clubs.

#### **Vale David Deeble**

Last year our esteemed life member and Past President David Deeble lost his battle with a debilitating illness. Upon his election to President in 2003, he immediately made significant changes to the Association. He appointed Grant Cosgriff as CEO and an excellent team was created. They immediately undertook a strategic review of all areas and created a suitable structure from which change could be achieved. Not only did he provide breadth of vision, but always applied good analysis as the basis of decisions. Some of the important changes made by David Deeble to Rowing Victoria in that time, were: the further development of good regatta management skills within the Association, the establishment of rigorous a regatta application processes to lift the standard of regattas for the enjoyment of all participants and the complete review of the competition structure to overcome serious deficiencies with it, and the establishment of the rowing score system as an outcome. David was elected as a life member of the Association in 2009 in recognition of his outstanding work. At the national level he engaged Rowing Australia and members state associations with a national Rowing Online Management System. His leadership and advocacy for it was recognised in 2006 being named Rowing Australia volunteer of the year.

#### Oarsmen's Cenotaph

Rowing Victoria, with the assistance of a generous grant from the Victorian Government, is restoring the Oarsmen's Cenotaph which commemorates the many oarsmen who died in WWI. The restored monument will be rededicated at a service at the Henley Regatta in February 2013. We will be asking clubs to attend this service and join the Association in laying wreaths to remember those who died in that conflict.



#### Volunteer Recognition

The Association could not operate without the support of volunteers, whether umpires, regatta volunteers, commission members, board members, club members and others.

Our RV Awards Committee under the chairmanship of past President Peter Fraser, continues to undertake the important work of recognition. The other members of the committee are Roger Wilson OAM and the President for the time being of RV. They undertook another induction of new members into the Rowing Victoria Hall of Fame in November 2011 bringing the total of people inducted into to 88.

# Presidents Report

The Awards Committee have recommended the following awards for the 2011-12 season.

The William Waterfield Award for outstanding service to Victorian rowing. This award is named after life member William Waterfield who has been a fine example of a person who has provided outstanding service to the sport in Victoria. This year the award is going to be presented to Frank Covil for his magnificent and long contribution to the sport and in particular to the advancement of the sport in Geelong, the Geelong Rowing Association and to school rowing.

The Kath Bennett Award for outstanding service to a rowing community in the sport in Victoria. The award is planned to capture those people who have done outstanding work in a club, regatta committee or region. Kath Bennett is a fine example of such work with reinvigorating women's rowing prior to amalgamation with the men's association in 1979. This year the award is going to be presented to Glenn Bottrell, the President of Essendon Rowing Club. Essendon has been the Champion Club of Victoria for several years and has developed a successful junior program which now has a waiting list of young people wanting to join. Glenn has been a driving force behind the creation of this success in the Essendon community through coaching, administration, time and devotion.

A new award was commenced in 2010, the Bob Duncan umpiring award. Bob Duncan is an Olympian but more importantly, a dedicated, long serving and excellent umpire. The 2012 award recipient is Bill Webster. Last year he gained his international umpires licence and is improving the quality of umpiring in Victoria through his position as the Chair of the Umpires Commission. He is also a key referee.

A new award last year was the Susie Palfreyman Award for contribution to school rowing. Susie Palfreyman has been a key person in the development of school rowing in Victoria. She developed a world class girls program at MLC, was a founder of the Head of the Schoolgirls regatta and a great supporter of school rowing. She has been a great role model for women in sport. The award this year goes to Rob Zahara for his long and distinguished service to school rowing with particular reference to the Head of the Schoolgirls regatta. He is an outstanding member of the rowing community.

These awards will be presented at the AGM.

#### Commissions

The work of the Association is devolved to a large extent to the Commissions. We recognise and thank all the Commission members who have given so much time and effort to the work of the Association. In

particular, I would like to highlight the work of the umpires headed by Bill Webster and also the work of our field of play manager Eric Waller.

#### **Board**

The Association is fortunate to have a dedicated and hard working Board and I would like to express my thanks and gratitude to them for their efforts on behalf of the Association. This year the President, Director-Finance David Pincus, Felicity Nutter, Lance Deveson and Rod Florence come up for election. Lance Deveson has indicated that he will not stand again. I thank Lance for his wise counsel and contribution to the Board and Association. He continues to be of great assistance in the fund raising efforts for the Victorians in under age Australian teams. If the constitution changes are approved by members, the Director Finance position will be removed. David Pincus has held this position for many years and has provided insightful advice and provided great control over the finances of the Association. His contribution to the management of our finances has been significant.

#### **Staff**

The staff of the Association undertake their duties with great enthusiasm and work well beyond their responsibilities. We are extremely grateful for their continued excellent work.

#### **Next Season**

Our focus in the next season is improving the basics of the sport in Victoria, competition, teams, representation and member services and in particular coaching and coxswain education. We also have the responsibility of much of the operations of the 2014 FISA Masters Championships at Ballarat.

Finally, on behalf of the board, I would like to thank the member clubs and schools for their continued support of the Association.

### **Chief Executive Officer Report: Nick Gall**

Rowing Victoria is nearing the end of our first Strategic Plan. The plan was updated in May for a further 3 year term (2012-2015) as a result of a new round of funding from Sport & Recreation and a management review of the role of Development to our members. It was promoted to all stakeholders and members, and appears on the website under "About RV".

# Regional Clubs – Our focus this year has been support and growth to regional clubs;

One of the key benefits to two regional clubs this year was the implementation of the 'Adopt A School' program which is a partnership between the Australian Sports Commission, Rowing Australia and Rowing Victoria. This program funded two regional clubs to fifteen thousand dollars each to build a relationship with a school and run rowing programs without charge. Over one hundred new kids sampled the sport of rowing in Victoria and RV have supported this Grass Roots Development through facilitating the donations of boats from clubs, reported progress to RA and the ASC and ran all the appropriate courses for coaches, coxswains. The greatest benefit of this program to this program is the funding goes to the club directly. Next year we will be targeting over two hundred new kids for the program.

RV this year visited every regional club and conducted one on one interviews with club presidents on their perceptions of RV and what we could be doing better. The overwhelming response was the need for a "Healthy Club Toolkit" that would benchmark things such as coaching right through to club & committee structure. The second area of need was for "Regional Sculling Camps" and we will start running these in the next year. Regatta programs were raised as a side note with many clubs which we will address on an individual basis with regatta committees.

RV has supported the redevelopment two regatta venues. Lake Wendouree in Ballarat and the Mitchell River in Bairnsdale. We are committed to consultations with both shires to get the venues to the highest level of quality as possible.

RV held the State and National Masters Championships at Lake Wendouree in late May and we are pleased with the efforts The City of Ballarat went to at this stage and we look forward to all the improvements planned for next year's budget.

# Maximising Funding - State and National Government Opportunities;

Australian Sports Commission offered funding to some of the tier 1 sports for "Grass Roots Development" outcomes this year in which Rowing was unsuccessful. The reasoning behind their decision was that we could not identify a large portion of people involved in the sport of rowing. Rowing Victoria has introduced a new membership category for recreational rowers and we are now putting together a membership package for "Friends of Rowing Victoria".

Through application to Sport & Recreation, RV was successful in achieving Travel Grant Funding for Underage athletes in excess of thirty thousand dollars. We are actively engaging the Minister for Sport on getting greater funding in this area.

RV through our President was successful in obtaining a grant for ten thousand dollars to restore the Oarsmen's Cenotaph situated in Boat House Drive.

RV was also successful in obtaining thirty thousand dollars as part of the Significant Sporting Event Grants to help support the running of The Australian Masters Rowing Championship at Ballarat.

RV was also successful in its proposal for Future Directions Projects and Organisational Support Grants from Sport & Recreation that will support our Association over the next 3 years.

We thank the Victorian Government for all their support and we look forward to working with them over the next three years.

# Facilities & Infrastructure – Lobbying councils and waterways managers;

RV negotiated with Parks Victoria and interested clubs on the building of a new boat launching area at National Waters Sports Centre (Carrum) this year. The safety of our members is our highest priority and we hope that we can continue to improve this venue for our members. Negotiations for the implementation of a new staging at Princes Bridge have been successful and Parks Victoria are currently running a test patch of the new product. Another successful Boat Launching implementation with Bairnsdale Council has seen the laying of a forty metre boat launching area on the Mitchell River for the inaugural Head Race in September 2012.

RV continues to liaise with Shepparton City Council on the building of the new Shepparton Rowing Club. We look forward to pursuing the needs and best interests of SRC in 2012.

One of the priorities for 2012 will be the infrastructure needs for Lake Wendouree prior to the 2014 World FISA Masters. The relationship with the City of Ballarat and RV is very good and we feel confident they will do their utmost to support us.

#### Relationships - RA, VIS, Regatta Hosts;

RV would like to thank Rowing Australia for their support to our elite and underage athletes. A clearly articulated pathway to High Performance defines the professionalism the sport stands for.

RV continues to work closely with the VIS to support High Performance outcomes for our Victorian athletes. We thank them and look forward to working with them this year

A special thanks to all our regatta hosts. We realise the challenges we all face in running a quality regatta and adhering to all the safety protocol. We hope we are easing the administrative burden to you with the RV support. RV looks forward to working with you 2012 season.

# A State or Rowing Excellence—Grow Our Base

Volunteers, coaches, officials and committee members are the life-blood of delivering our sport at the grass-roots level.

This has been demonstrated in 2011-12 via:

- Rowing Victoria continues to lead the way in working collaboratively with Rowing Australia to set the standard and structure of Umpires' Accreditation and Education
- Over 8,700 crews and 33,000 seats were entered in various regattas throughout Victoria this year supported by the ROMS system.
- Over 7700 hours are provided by level 1 and 2 Boat Race Officials and Regatta Volunteers

Assisting clubs to build their capacity to recruit and retain new members is an essential part of Rowing Victoria programs.

#### **Increase Competitors**

- 2011-12 saw a steady although slight reduction in membership base across total membership.
   Senior membership remained steady whilst junior and school memberships were slightly reduced.
- Reduced school memberships can be represented by slight changes to the way school programs have been managed; to provide higher quality program to more a sustainable number of students.
- More consistent and appropriate events were offered across all regattas to enable continuity throughout the season. This saw a significant increase in seats entered compared with the previous season.

#### Increase Volunteers

- 260 new volunteers completed the level 1 BRO course
- 5 L2 Umpires have elected to work towards their L3 Rowing Australia accreditation

#### Increase Coaches

- Accredited coaches within Victoria dropped slightly over the past 12 months.
- This was due to main coaches failing to reaccredit.
- 79 participants enrolled for the L1 (Learn to Row) Coaches' Course, however very few have completed their assessment.

• No level 2 we run due to new course material being produced and a lack of enrolments.


Increasing opportunities for participation, competition, volunteers and new forms of membership have been key initiatives in 2011-12. We aim to increase the number of boys, girls, men and women who 'find rowing' and then continue.

- The Rowing Victoria 'Go Rowing' program linking non-rowing schools to local clubs continues to grow
- School leaver recruitment initiatives promote pathways for young rowers
- Development and maintenance of partnerships with Victorian Regional Academies of sport to offer opportunities to talented athletes in regional areas
- Recreational memberships are now open and active allowing non competitive rowers to participate and be covered under the safety management plan and the national insurance scheme.
- Two Corporate rowing days were undertaken by Rowing Victoria this year and gave approximately 120 people an opportunity to experience the sport.
- One new clubs was created this year— Shepparton Rowing Club



### **Umpires Commission's Report**

During the last year Ben Ratcliffe, Bill Day and Grace Blake have achieved their Level 2 umpiring licence. Another person is expected to complete the test very shortly. This is the largest intake for some time, which is very pleasing. Another handful of people have been identified as interested and ready to progress toward Level 2 in the coming season. Recruiting is our biggest concern and we seek the assistance of clubs in identifying and putting forward potential umpires. We encourage members of the RV community to consider becoming an umpire. As well as enabling our regattas to function it is an excellent way of maintaining an active involvement in the sport.

Our bi-annual conference was held in August 2011 at Ballarat. The aim of the conference is to update and refresh our knowledge of the rules and ensure a consistency of approach. David Grubits put together a topical and interesting program which included presentations from a current elite competitor, a club competitor and a school coach who each gave valuable feedback on their perceptions and views of umpiring. We were also fortunate to have two senior interstate umpires attend the conference. Congratulations and thank you to David for orgainsing another excellent conference. Thanks also to Eric Waller and Wendouree - Ballarat Rowing Club for hosting the event.

After almost a decade we returned to the water on Lake Wendouree in Ballarat for the Masters regattas. While many of the masters can remember competing on Wendouree most of our younger competitors are yet to have ever rowed on the lake. Traffic patterns and logistics will need to be refreshed and promoted to all participants before the next regatta. A lot of work has been done to reinstate the course and facilities and it was good to return to our very own Olympic venue. We look forward to the full list of regattas that will be hosted there in 2012/13.

The men and women of Surf Life Saving Victoria again provided their invaluable assistance to us at all regattas and we thank them for their efforts. The service they provide has become a benchmark for rowing in Australia and we simply would not run a regatta without them.

Our new green and gold uniform matching the style and colour scheme of the RA uniform was successfully introduced. Full implementation of the national accreditation scheme is also progressing, albeit slowly.

After many years Rod Florence stepped down from the Umpires Commission to focus on his Board duties. Rod has made a lasting contribution to umpiring in Victoria and we thank him for the great example he

has set. Thankfully he is not 'lost' to us as he continues as an active umpire and valuable mentor to our new trainees.

We are very grateful for the continued support of the RV office and in particular Nick Gall, Laura Schouten and especially Alice Evans. We welcome the addition of Tim Murdoch to the office and look forward to working with him in his new role.

I would like to thank Robin Burrows, Greg Falk, David Grubits and Rob Allen who continued their excellent service to the Commission and have been joined by Paul Hargreaves, who ably eased the burden on Robin Burrows. Rene Klupacs as a member of the Rowing Australia Umpires Committee provide valuable liaison with the national body. Thanks also to John Nichols, Robin Murphy, Rob Kemp, Greg Falk, Rene Klupacs, Rob Allen, Rod Florernce, Robin Burrows, Terry Blyth and Andrew Guerin for their work as presenters of Level 1 training courses during the year.

Planning is well advanced for Season 2012/13 but our biggest challenge remains recruiting new umpires. Rowing in Victoria is 'owned' and run by and for it's participants – the members of clubs and schools. We urge and encourage members of the RV community to taking up the challenge and playing an active part in the running of our regatta by becoming an umpire.

# Financial Report

I am pleased to present the financial statements with this report together with the auditor's report thereon.

Rowing Victoria has further improved its position with a trading surplus for the year of \$94,700 (compared to a trading surplus for the prior year of \$35,360), and a profit on the sale of shares of \$2,637 for a net surplus for the year of \$97,337. The principal sources of this improvement were the conduct of the Australian Masters Championships, and the short staffing of our office operations.

While revenue from operating activities increased to \$1,036,311 a marginal increase on the previous year, underlying revenue declined with declines in government grants and reduced member service activity being offset by the one off effect of the Australian Masters Championships.

Net assets of the association have risen by \$42,286, to \$1,142,755 with the major items being the surplus for the year of \$97,337 and the decline in the value of the investment portfolio of \$46,308. The net asset figure includes the investment portfolio (\$631,502) and cash (\$517,792).

Notwithstanding the significant surplus in 2011/12 RV faces challenges in 2012/13 with the budget back to breakeven as the one off effects of the Australian Masters Rowing Championships and the short staffing of our office are removed. To avoid increases in fees and levies into the future will require careful management.

The Board is pleased to announce that fees and levies remain unchanged for 2012/13.

### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report covers Rowing Victoria Inc. as an individual entity incorporated in Victoria under the Associations Incorporation Act (Victoria) 1981.

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Victoria) 1981. The Board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### Revenue recognition

Sponsorship contributions are generally recognised as revenue on receipt except for specific sponsorships or donations for which the Association has received a commitment from the sponsor or donor.

Proceeds from additional activities are recognised on receipt. Interest revenue is recognised as it is earned. Donations and dividends are recognised when the Association receives control over the related funds.

### (b) Plant and equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, is depreciated on the diminishing value basis over their useful lives to the association from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Office equipment 7% to 40%

Regatta and rowing equipment 7% to 50%

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the association to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

### Employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the net present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may not satisfy vesting requirements. Those cash outflows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cash flows

### **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont'd)**

#### Trade and other pavables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

#### Financial assets

Investments held are originally recognised at cost which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at reporting date. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

#### (g) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost, adjusted when applicable for any loss of service potential.

#### Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

### Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expenses to the income statement.

### Available for sale financial assets

All investments are classified as available for sale financial assets. Available for sale financial assets are reflected at fair value unless the fair value cannot be reliably measured. Unrealised gains and losses arising from changes in fair value are taken directly to equity.

### Key estimates

### **Impairment**

The association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting date by evaluation of conditions and events specific to the association that may be an indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

No impairment has been recognised in respect of assets.

### Key judgements

Provision for impairment of receivables

Included in accounts receivable at 30 June 2012 is an amount receivable from the rowing clubs which is material. The directors believe that some debts will not be recoverable and a doubtful debt provision has been made at 30 June 2012.

### Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Rowing Victoria Inc, which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 June 2012 for the year then ended, the income statement, statement of changes to equity, cash flow statement, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the statement by directors of the board.
