AG to update



Chief Executive Officer Report: Nick Gall

2012/13 has been a busy, and in many ways a successful year for Rowing Victoria. I would like to start this report by thanking all contributors for their fantastic efforts. This includes, however is not limited to the RV staff umpires and board, committee members, volunteers, club committees, regatta committees and other club representatives, coaches, and all other race officials. I would also like to recognise the fantastic support we have received from the Victorian Government, and the Victorian Institute of Sport. Thanks also Parks Victoria and Transport Safety Victoria, who are fantastic partners and great supporters in regard to access of waterways

A highlight of the year has been a 10% increase in Competitive memberships to just over 6,000 competitive members. This comes at a time when RV facilities strategy has provided the opportunity for access to water such as Ballarat and better landing facilities on the Yarra and Carrum. This focus will continue in the year ahead.

Rowing has a major challenge with metropolitan clubs at near capacity to recruit and sustain athletes for a significant period of time. Capacity coupled with increasing legislation on Water Safety has seen the need to capture all social rowers under the recreational rowing membership. This has seen the recreational membership double in size and state government are very pleased to see the identification of these people associated with rowing.

This year saw five Victorian clubs obtain "Adopt A School" funding for developing a dedicated school to club rowing program which was instigated by RA and ASC on a participation pilot program. All clubs and schools have been very pleased with the progress and we hope that the ASC will consider ongoing funding of the program.

The financial result included an operating surplus in the area of \$25,000 and an improved net asset position in the area of \$140,000, which has been quite pleasing. The Finance Directors Report will go into greater detail, however it has been extremely pleasing to deliver this improved position from our initial budget of \$2,000 surplus which the Board felt was necessary.

This year has seen further reductions in Level 2 Umpires from 53 down to 38. We are now at critically low levels and we have major concerns about some regattas going ahead. Our recruitment drive has not been supported and we now need to look at mandating club Level 2 umpires that represent the equivalent amount of votes.

Regatta seats in the 2012-13 season is up 4000 which is the largest lift in competition seats in10 years. This was desperately needed due to not having any national events in Victoria last year.

Excitingly our Victorian's performed admirably in London Olympics and we are very proud to call these exceptional athletes ours. This will be detailed further into the Annual Report.

The focus on the year ahead will be to streamline course material to make it easier for regional members to accredit and bring online all data for ease of access.

We would like to thank all our members for their support.

A State or Rowing Excellence—Grow Our Base

The competition format is the core of RV's business and significant effort was put into creating formats that suited all our membership

Assisting clubs to build their capacity to recruit and retain new members is an essential part of Rowing Victoria programs.

The endorsement of 4 regional clubs & 1 metropolitan club for the Adopt A School Program saw \$100,000 go directly into our clubs this year to build and retain membership.

Increase Retention

The pathway eights was an initiative by RA in conjunction with RV to deliver a transition for the best school athletes to represent their country. It was really exciting to see that both the Victorian crews selected went on be the Australian Crews. All other Junior & U23 crews who attended World Championships just recently demonstrated the depth of our younger generation in rowing

Increase Membership

The biggest increase in membership this year was in school age female & male athletes due to the sanctioning of further school regattas. This is exciting news for RV as we feel we can now meet the safety benchmark we require to run all Victorian regattas. Increase Coaches

RV aims to offer assistance to all rowing events including regattas outside the formal competition format.

RV recognises that rowing needs to be fun and inclusive and we will continue to promote more relaxed formats for participation.

The Oars for All program has remained constant in participation.

The Hearing Impaired program at Albert Park showed sustainable growth and we look forward to further increases.

It was also great to see RA formalise a recruitment structure for Para Rowing to support our clubs in Victoria.




In the year to come recruitment of Umpires will be paramount and we will focus on this as a priority to give Umpires a more enjoyable experience.



A State or Rowing Excellence—Strengthen our Partnerships - NG

Relationships with our external stakeholders have been continually expanded throughout the 2012/13 season.

RV have been working closely with Transport Safety Victoria & Parks Victoria to meet the requirements for the new Marine Safety Act.

The concerns around credited coxswains were taken on board and the implementation of all course methodology being online was necessary. This will now allow members to accredit at their own pace and not be restricted to the next course being run.

Rowing Victoria supported our clubs and members this year by way of facilitating & supporting grant opportunities.

Over \$ 50,000 of state government funding was distributed to our underage elite athletes for travel while representing state and country.

\$15,000 of uniforms grants were distributed to our clubs in the 2012-13 season .

Over \$2,400,000 was spent on infrastructure in the 2012-13 season greatly improving access to our rowing facilities

Tailoring our support to improve regattas

RV have run a total of 4 score workshops this year with the intention of making Rowing Score more workable & inclusive to participate. The outcome of the forum so far was to take the age and distance calculation out of the score and work on a similar model to NSW. Some other really other great ideas came out of the forums and will be implemented on a stage by stage basis.

Time Trials

RV also ran time trials around our 2000 m events to allow closer competition through the age brackets give younger athletes the opportunity to race against the senior rowers in their finals. This saw some really good racing and we plan to explore this style of racing more throughout divisions & grades.

Council Funding

RV are working with several regional regatta hosts to obtain further funding from their local councils for hosting events. RV understands the challenges & risks financially in running regattas and will do what ever we can to underpin the health of all regattas.

This Year

3 further regattas will be hosted this year being the Australian Universities Regatta, Australian Masters Games and a different format regatta to be held in middle of February.

We again look forward to hearing your feedback on regattas.

The Commissions are;



Umpires Commission's Report

Umpires Commission Report 2012/13

Recruiting remains the number one issue for umpiring in Victoria. The burden of an increasingly busy regatta season is falling to fewer people. Regattas are cooperative ventures between organisers, umpires and competitors conducted for the benefit of the competitors. The reason we have dedicated, qualified and impartial umpires is to provide the best possible service to rowers at regattas. Our ability to provide the level of service that our competitors have come to expect, is now on the verge of being compromised. We simply need more people to get involved and become umpires. The clubs and schools of Rowing Victoria need to assist by identifying and encouraging their members to become umpires. This means going beyond the Level 1 program and onto becoming a fully qualified Level 2 umpire. There was a proposal a few years ago that each club provide the same number of Level 2 umpires as they have votes at a General Meeting. This would provide the sort numbers needed, however the proposal has not been adopted. This should be reconsidered.

Clubs need the involvement of their members and the association needs the involvement of its members. It is fair and seems to make sense that the task of officiating at regattas is shared as widely and evenly as possible amongst competing clubs.

Even though our numbers were stretched at times, all regattas were successfully and safely delivered in season 2012/13. Over 40 regattas were held with often 3 regattas on a weekend at different locations. When you consider that between 6 and 12 umpires are required for each regatta, depending on the venue, our current number of about 30 umpires is clearly inadequate. It is a credit to our current umpires that such a large program of regattas was safely and successfully conducted.

Lesley Skevington was awarded her Australian Licence in March and in October David Grubits will sit the FISA Umpires Examination. It needs to be noted that umpiring provides a tremendous opportunity to attend national and international regattas. Over the years Victoria umpires have been well represented at national and international regattas. We look forward to this tradition continuing.

The Board approved our proposal that accommodation be provided for umpires at 2 day regattas, this is much appreciated as umpires receive no reimbursement for their attendance at regattas.

The course set-up at Carrum was a major concern. Progress is now being made by the Field of Play Manager and with further cooperation from venue stakeholders and regatta organisers we hope to see an improvement next season. In the last season there were a couple of instances of poor behaviour toward umpires by coaches. This is regrettable. It is hoped that this is not the start of a trend. All participants at a regatta are subject to a code of conduct as well as the common standards of respect and courtesy which should govern behaviour. At a time when we are struggling for numbers any perception of a lack of respect makes it even harder to attract new umpires. The men and women of Surf Life Saving Victoria again provided their invaluable assistance to us at all regattas and we thank them for their efforts. The service they provide is the benchmark for rowing in Australia and we simply would not run a regatta without them.

We are very grateful for the continued support of the RV office and in particular Nick Gall, Tim Murdoch, Laura Schouten and especially Alice Evans.

I would like to thank Robin Burrows, Greg Falk, David Grubits, Paul Hargreaves and Rob Allen who continued their excellent service to the Commission. Rene Klupacs as a member of the Rowing Australia Umpires Committee provide valuable liaison with the national body. Thanks also to John Nichols, Robin Murphy, Rob Kemp, Greg Falk, Rene Klupacs, Rob Allen, Rod Florernce, Robin Burrows, Terry Blyth and Andrew Guerin for their work as presenters of Level 1 training courses during the year. The commission and committee structure within Rowing Victoria is set to change in the next season. Whilst the details are still being finalised the Umpires Commission will become an Umpires Committee working through an Officials Commission. The essential tasks will remain the same. Whatever the structure what umpiring and Rowing Victoria needs most from its members is more involvement.

Financial Report

I am pleased to present the financial statements with this report together with the auditor's report thereon.

Rowing Victoria recorded a trading surplus for the year of \$24,673 (compared to a trading surplus for the prior year of \$94,700) and a profit on sale of shares of \$5,994 for a net surplus of \$30,667. The principal reason for the reduced trading surplus was that Rowing Victoria did not enjoy the one-off benefit from managing the Australian Masters Championships in the current year.

Revenue from operating activities declined from \$1,036,311 to \$687,267, largely due to lower income from managed events, state team fees, government grants and other income. This was partially offset by increases in regatta and affiliation fee income.

Net assets of the association have risen by \$138,708 to \$1,281,463 with the major items being the surplus for the year of \$30,667 and the increase in the investment portfolio of \$108,041. The net asset figure includes cash of \$641,813 and the investment portfolio valued at \$618,728.

Notwithstanding the surplus in 2012/13, Rowing Victoria faces the challenge of operating in an environment whereby attracting government grants and sponsorship revenue is increasingly difficult. This challenge is being addressed by continuing to support growing participation in the sport while carefully managing costs.

The Board is pleased to announce that fees and levies will remain unchanged for 2013/14.
