## President's Report: Fiona Dickson

On behalf of the Board of Rowing Victoria, I am pleased to present this Annual Report to our members, friends, supporters and sponsors. In this last year we have seen a number of changes to Victorian Rowing and to Rowing Victoria.

### People and Partners

The Victorian Rowing community includes some legends of the sport and this year has seen a second Australian and Victorian receive the sport's highest honour. In June, Drew Ginn was awarded the FISA (World Rowing) *Thomas Keller Medal* – a fitting tribute to the dedication, hard work and vast contribution to the sport.

While elite athletes represent the pinnacle of the sport, volunteers provide the critical foundation. I would like to thank those volunteers who took up newly created positions on the Commissions and Panels during this last year. These groups have been at the forefront of a process of broader representation in the decision-making for RV and we hope that this will ultimately provide a pathway for future Board membership.

A most notable volunteer, Andrew Guerin, resigned from the position of President in December to join the Board of Rowing Australia. Andrew has been an extremely diligent servant of the sport of rowing through his roles as an accomplished umpire, administrator and historian and was awarded the *Julius Patching Award* in recognition of this service during the year. We thank Andrew for his stewardship of Victorian Rowing for almost five years and for his significant work in improving the governance and focus of Victorian Rowing.

### Performance

While the growth of Victorian rowing can be measured through the number of new members and financial health of clubs and school programs, the retention and satisfaction of current members is critical to our continued success. This year we have seen growth in participation and increasing levels of enjoyment with the various competition formats that have been convened by enthusiastic regatta committees around the state.

Performance is also measured through the success of our representative teams. Victorian and Australian teams provide inspiration to the entire rowing community and we salute those athletes who achieved. These performances will be recognised within the Victorian and Australian teams section of this Annual Report.

The Board is also pleased to report our financial performance, noting a moderate surplus for the year. Included in this report are the audited financial statements and the report of our Finance Director, James Hatherley.

### Plans and Purpose

While we may be passionate about rowing, our shared challenge is to raise the profile of the sport and to secure our future in terms of facilities, programs and participation. The Board has developed a new strategic plan which we commend to all members of the Victorian rowing community. This plan includes:

- a long term program to lift the standard of our facilities across Victoria;
- changes to the regatta calendar to provide innovative opportunities to compete and to reinvigorate regional regatta attendance; and

- a revitalised approach to the provision of support to clubs and schools and to volunteer coaches, umpires and administrators.

This year the Board commissioned a review of an incident at a particular regatta. This review, conducted by the Hon. Murray Kellam AO QC, gave rise to seven recommendations which touched upon governance, rules, training, communications and continuous improvement.

The Board has begun the process of rolling out actions to respond in a structured way to each of these recommendations. In addition, significant bodies of work have been undertaken by Board members with Tom Wood, Felicity Nutter and Margot Foster collectively undertaking reviews of the Rules, Constitution and Policy framework and James Hatherley leading the risk analysis and management for the Association. Pat McNamara has served as the Association's Councillor to Rowing Australia and Rene Klupacs has continued to provide IT and consulting for regatta software and ongoing technology management.

Recognising contributors to the Sport, under the leadership of the Awards Committee, provides a wonderful opportunity to acknowledge some of the quiet achievers in Victorian rowing. The following pages provide details of our very worthy award recipients for contributions to school rowing, services to umpiring, service to a rowing community and for outstanding service to Victorian rowing. The Board commends these award recipients.

## Umpires Panel Chair Report: Bill Webster

The last year is unfortunately tinged with sadness by the passing of two long serving umpires. Leigh Gallagher, a member of Yarra Yarra, and Phil Reynolds a member of Banks were both great servants of their clubs and always brought a generous spirit to their umpiring. They are greatly missed.

The new commission structure has now come into effect. The Officials Commission has a broad remit covering umpiring, other areas of officiating and volunteering. The Officials Commission will draw on specific technical matters from the Umpires Panel but otherwise is responsible for all other aspects of officiating. Umpire recruiting is now a key focus of this commission and its chair, Sam Lovick is bringing energy and enthusiasm to the task. The commission is mapping out the pathways for umpire training for next season with a view to having a graduating class of new umpires by the State Championships regatta in 2015.

The RV Board commissioned an independent review of some matters that arose at a regatta this year. In consideration of these matters recommendations were made for systemic improvements. These recommendations include; updating the Rules of Racing to match the latest version of FISA rules (with allowance for local variations), improved communication of regatta traffic plans, clarification of penalties and authorisation of umpires along with additional training for umpires. The Board resolved to fully implement these recommendations and this is a very positive outcome.

For the second time the Victorian Olympic Committee has awarded the *Julius Patching Award* to a Victorian Umpire. Andrew Guerin was recently presented with this award to recognise his service to rowing as an official and administrator. This is one of the highest Honours in Victorian sport and recognises Andrew's contributions as an umpire for more than 25 years at State, National and International level and as an administrator and team manager over many years. Reg McKay won this award in 2011.

Congratulations go to David Grubits for gaining his FISA License in October 2013. Victoria currently has 4 FISA umpires, the most of any state.

Eric Waller continued to provide great assistance to the Umpire's Panel and most importantly to umpires on regatta days in his role as Field of Play Manager. Eric's knowledge of every venue, common sense and years of practical experience are invaluable.

The men and women of Life Saving Victoria again provided excellent service to us at all regattas and we thank them for their efforts. The service they provide continues to be the benchmark for safety in Australia.

Thanks also to the RV office, Nick Gall, Lynne Charge, Laura Schouten, Edwina Gadsby and James Scott for their efforts and patience in a very long season.

Following the review mentioned earlier in this report, the Umpire's Panel will be reconstituted and its functions redefined. Thanks to Robbie Allen, Greg Falk, David Grubits, Terry Blyth and Paul Hargeaves for their efforts over the last year.

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The Association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial report covers Rowing Victoria Inc. as an individual entity incorporated in Victoria under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria)*.

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria)*. The Board has determined that the Association is a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs and do not take account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The financial statements were approved on 20 August 2014 by the Board.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) *Revenue recognition*

Sponsorship contributions are generally recognised as revenue on receipt except for specific sponsorships or donations for which the Association has received a binding commitment from the sponsor or donor.

Grants are recognised at fair value where there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all grant conditions will be met. Grants relating to expenses are recognised as income over the periods necessary to match the grant to the costs they are compensating.

Proceeds from additional activities are recognised on receipt. Interest revenue is recognised as it is earned, using the effective interest method. Donations and dividends are recognised when the Association receives control over the related funds.

(b) *Plant and equipment*

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, is depreciated on the diminishing value basis over their useful lives to the Association from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Office equipment	20% to 50%
Regatta and rowing equipment	12.5% to 50%

#### (b) *Plant and equipment (continued)*

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Association to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

#### (c) *Employee benefits*

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the net present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may not satisfy vesting requirements. Those cash outflows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cash flows

Contributions are made by the entity to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred. Annual leave that is not expected to be wholly settled within 12 months is discounted allowing for expected salary levels in the future period when the leave is expected to be taken.

#### (d) *Trade and other payables*

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

#### (e) *Cash and cash equivalents*

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

#### (f) *Financial assets*

Investments held are originally recognised at cost which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at reporting date. Movements in fair value are recognised through the asset revaluation reserve.

#### (g) *Inventories*

Inventories are measured at lower of cost and net realisable value, adjusted when applicable for any loss of service potential.

(h) *Goods and services tax (GST)*

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of the GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet.

(i) *Impairment of assets*

At the end of each reporting period, the board reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment is carried out on the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use, to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(j) *Available for sale financial assets*

All investments are classified as available for sale financial assets. Available for sale financial assets are reflected at fair value unless the fair value cannot be reliably measured. Unrealised gains and losses arising from changes in fair value are taken directly to equity.

(k) *Key estimates*

*Impairment*

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting date by evaluation of conditions and events specific to the Association that may be an indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

No impairment has been recognised in respect of assets.

(l) *Key judgements*

*Provision for impairment of receivables*

Included in accounts receivable at 30 June 2014 is an amount receivable from the rowing clubs which is material. The directors believe that some debts will not be recoverable and a doubtful debt provision has been made at 30 June 2014 as disclosed in note 5.

(m) *Comparative figures*

Where necessary, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(n) *Fair Value Measurement*

AASB 13 Fair Value Measurement and AASB 2011-8 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from AASB 13

The incorporated association has applied AASB 13 and its consequential amendments from 1 July 2013. The standard provides a single robust measurement framework, with clear measurement objectives, for measuring fair value using the 'exit price' and provides guidance on measuring fair value when a market becomes less active. The 'highest and best use' approach is used to measure non-financial assets whereas liabilities are based on transfer value. The standard requires increased disclosures where fair value is used. These are detailed in note 19.

When an asset or liability, financial or non-financial, is measured at fair value for recognition or disclosure purposes, the fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date; and assumes that the transaction will take place either: in the principle market; or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market.

Fair value is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming they act in their economic best interest. For non-financial assets, the fair value measurement is based on its highest and best use. Valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, are used, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

(o) *Adoption of new and revised accounting standards*

During the current year, the Association adopted the following new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations applicable to its operations which became mandatory.

*AASB 13 Fair Value Measurement and AASB 2011-8 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from AASB 13*

The entity has applied AASB 13 and its consequential amendments from 1 July 2013. The standard provides a single robust measurement framework, with clear measurement objectives, for measuring fair value using the 'exit price' and provides guidance on measuring fair value when a market becomes less active. The 'highest and best use' approach is used to measure non-financial assets whereas liabilities are based on transfer value. The standard requires increased disclosures where fair value is used.

The standard also changed the definition of short-term employee benefits, from 'due to' to 'expected to' be settled within 12 months. Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.





## Reporting to the 2010 –2014 Strategic Plan—Grow Our Base

**Regattas are the core of RV's business and significant effort was put into creating competition formats to suit the whole of RV's membership.**

**Assisting clubs to build their capacity to recruit and retain new members is an essential part of Rowing Victoria business**

### **Rowing Victoria programs.**

The endorsement of four regional clubs and one metropolitan club for the Adopt a Schools Program saw \$51, 000 go directly into our clubs this year to build and retain membership. The funding of this came through the Australian Sports Commission facilitated by Rowing Australia on a pilot programme that ran for 3 years.

### **Increased Membership**

The biggest increase in membership this year was in school age female and male athletes due to more school regattas. This was created in response to school requests and the continuation of Ballarat school growth since the resurrection of the lake.

### **Increased number of Volunteers**

Two hundred and eighty two new volunteers completed the level one BRO course

Two level two umpires has elected to work towards their level three Rowing Australia accreditation.

RV was also successful in receiving an addition \$5,000 grant to help promote and increase volunteer numbers. The focus for the upcoming year needs to be on transitioning Level 1 BRO's into Level 2's.

### **Increased number of Coaches**

Rowing Victoria was successful in receiving \$10,000 'Local Clubs Local Schools' grant for level one coaching courses through SRV. This allowed an additional 100 regional participants to take part in a Level 1 course.

RV aims to offer assistance to all rowing events including regattas outside the formal competition format.

RV recognises that rowing needs to be fun and inclusive and we will continue to promote more relaxed formats for participation. This can be seen through the introduction of Coastal Rowing.

### **Strategic Plan**

Renewal of the Strategic Plan has been completed. A key focus of the Board is to establish and implement best practice governance and management policies. Our membership consultation identified the 3 key objectives to fulfil by 2016/17

1. It will be easier and more enjoyable to go rowing
2. Rowing in Victoria will have a higher profile
3. Support to clubs, schools and associations will be enhanced to better enable them to serve the needs of their members and rowing in Victoria.

### **Communication Plan**

Internal and external communications plans are in development phases, to increase the level of communication between RV and its various stakeholders. The plan will work to implement more effective ways to disseminate information to the rowing community such as creating an online forum through the RV website. This would allow RV to communicate and gather regular feedback from events and promotional activities. Through the employment of a Club Development Coordinator, RV will engage and visit all regional clubs and offer to assist them. RV will visit each rural and regional club at least 2 times per year.

### **New Commissions**

#### **Sport Development Commission:**

The Sport Development Commission focused on promotion and communications, new competition formats and opportunities, partnerships and events with other sporting associations, and expansion and recruitment activities which serve and raise the profile of the sport.

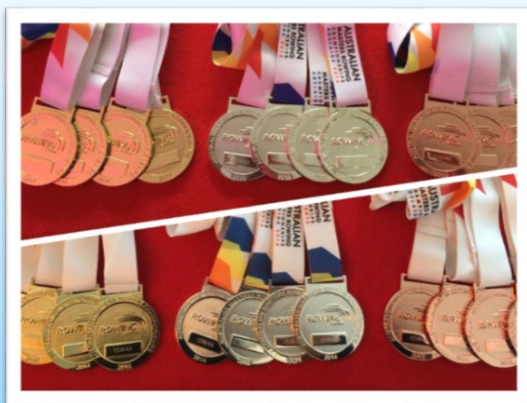

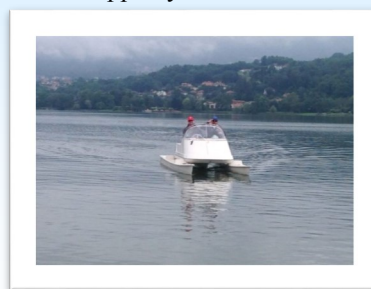
