Rowing Victoria Obituaries

Rowing Victoria wishes to offer sincere condolences to the following members who have passed in the last 12 months. Each made a significant contribution to rowing in Victoria.

David Boykett

David was an exceptional rower, coach and administrator of the sport. Bronze medallist at the Melbourne Games, member of the Australian eight at the 1st and 2nd World Championships and coach of the men's eight at the 3rd World Championships. Six wins from seven starts in the King's Cup and two wins from three starts as coach. Initiator of the youth category in Australia, coaching education and several rowing bodies. He was selfless man who gave generously of his time, energy, leadership and knowledge to others. He was an icon of the sport.



Graeme McCall

Graeme began his rowing career at Scotch College and was a member of many school crews, rowing in the 6 seat of the Scotch 1st Crew in 1955. After leaving school he joined Mercantile Rowing Club and rowed in their Junior and Senior Crews under the coaching of Norm Cairns and Robert Aitken, with some great successes. He went on to represent Victoria in 5 Kings Cup crews and then Australia rowing in the 1st World Rowing Championships in Switzerland, the Commonwealth Games in Perth, and the Olympic Games in Japan, in the 6 Seat. After retiring from active rowing he coached at Mercantile and an Australian Eight and pair who competed in New Zealand in 1967. Graeme is the father of Australian representative, Felicity McCall.



Sarah Tait

Victorian's adopted Sarah as their own after she relocated to Victoria from WA. Sarah had an outstanding career, she went to three Olympic Games (2004, 2008 and 2012) and memorably won a silver medal at the 2012 London Olympics with Kate Hornsey in the Women's Pair, which was coached by her husband Bill.



John Whiting

John was a great contributor to Victorian Rowing, a passionate competitor and a leader in running events. He was a driver in developing the Winter Sculling series and the Melbourne Head. He was also a sensible sounding board for us at Rowing Victoria in providing good advice on a range of rowing issues. The Victorian Rowing Community will sadly miss John.

President's Report: Patrick McNamara

On behalf of the Board of Rowing Victoria, I am pleased to present this 2015-16 Annual Report to our members, friends, supporters and sponsors.

This year has seen some challenges for Rowing Victoria as we embark on a range of changes within our environment to support a level of national alignment whilst focussing on delivering the best possible service to our member clubs and schools.

The Rowing Victoria Board and staff are acutely aware of the need to deliver on our *Strategic Pillars* which forms the basis of this Presidents Report.

Pillar 1: Making it easier to go rowing

The regatta program again saw a 10% increase in seats and a 9% increase in the individual membership of Rowing Victoria. Within these growth trends we also need to consider the capacity to deliver and the Board of Rowing Victoria are constantly reviewing our delivery standard.

In watching the sport grow it is important to recognise the many volunteers across our sport, that support the operations of our clubs, schools and regattas.

Capacity of rowing is also a significant challenge and it is important to consider the improvement and promotion of our waterways. Over the past year we were successful in obtaining the Australian Masters Rowing Championships for 2017, to be held at Nagambie Lakes which will allow us to negotiate course and facility improvements at the venue.

Pillar 2: Raising the profile of Victorian rowing

2016 was the year of consolidation at the Interstate Regatta. After last year's win of the Rowing Australia Cup, it was imperative that we delivered again. Victories in the Kings & Queens Cups, the Victoria Cup and the Nell Slatter Trophy saw the Victorian Team deliver in spades. We would like to thank all the parties involved for their tireless work outside the remit of their own careers and coaching roles.

The profile of rowing is also to be celebrated at this year's Rio Olympics with a very large contingent from Victoria. Special mention should go to our Victorian medallists:

- Kim Brennan – Gold Medal in the Women's Single
- Karsten Forsterling – Silver Medal in the Men's Quad
- Will Lockwood, Josh Dunkley-Smith and Josh Booth – Silver Medal in the Men's Four

We congratulate all our Victorians who made the Olympics and we wish you all a long and successful career in rowing and beyond.

Pillar 3: Supporting the clubs, schools and associations within Victorian rowing

Club development and underage pathways has become a key area of Rowing Victoria's service. The recent lean years highlighted that we need to make a bigger effort in recruitment and retention of athletes. This can only be achieved if the clubs have the capacity to support and develop these athletes. Our club development role is to help clubs to help themselves in retention and delivery of programs. Well done to all clubs and schools who have achieved membership growth.

Next Year

Over the next year our focus will be reviewing and improving our waterways. This will underpin opportunity for growth and provide a great opportunity to engage with all our stakeholders.

Finally, on behalf of the Board, I would like to thank the staff of Rowing Victoria for their diligence and commitment to supporting our member Clubs and Schools and to the Clubs and Schools for their continued support of their Association. I would also like to thank the Board of Rowing Victoria and in particular Tom Wood, who has decided not to stand for another term. Tom spent 5 years on the Board and has brought significant contribution to the new Governance structure in which the Board operates.

Chief Executive Officer Report: Nick Gall

Rowing Victoria ('RV') is now two years into our current Strategic Plan which ends in June 2017. The Board and staff will now review our achievements and make considerations on how to complete our *Strategic Plan Pillars* by June 2017.

National Alignment – Our focus this year has been to support cohesive growth for the sport of rowing;

Whole of Sport National Entry System and Membership Database:

RV has worked with Rowing Australia and all other rowing states to make the switch to Rowing Manager for our competition and state membership platform. The move is a big breakthrough for Australian Rowing with all states on the one platform. In 2017 we look forward to expanding the scope of Rowing Manager to improve services for club membership management.

Coach Education:

Rowing Australia recently released its new Online Level 1 Coaching Accreditation. Feedback from the membership has generally been positive although the cost of \$180 has been viewed negatively. Our Board has decided to reimburse RV's share for the 2016-17 season following receipt from Rowing Australia. The now mandatory status of the Level 1 Coach Accreditation has raised significant discussion. We plan to work with our members, Maritime Safety Victoria and Rowing Australia to ensure the course meets the expectations of Victorian rowing coaches as we set a benchmark standard for quality coaching along with a unified coaching methodology whilst covering off our exemptions with Maritime Safety Victoria.

Coxswain Accreditation:

Coxswain Accreditation has been an ongoing focus again this year due to a Maritime Safety Victoria's review of our sports compliance with our Safety Management Plan and the exemptions given for Coxswains which ensures they don't require marine licences. We understand that many coxswains will up-skill significantly beyond their Level 1 Accreditation assessment and their practical, although we need to set a minimum standard of coxswain knowledge which reduces the risk of incidents occurring.

Maximising Funding - State and National Government Opportunities;

RV was successful in the new round of funding from the Victorian Government. The *Supporting Victorian Sport and Recreation Program* is a new program that provides grants that assist state sporting associations and state sport and recreation bodies with initiatives that increase participation in sport and active recreation by:

- building a more sustainable sport and recreation sector in Victoria
- increasing the equity, diversity and inclusiveness of the sport and recreation industry in Victoria

The *Supporting Victorian Sport and Recreation Program* was developed in consultation with the sport and active recreation sector as part of an evaluation of the previous Sport and Recreation Victoria funded programs.



Chief Executive Officer Report: Nick Gall (cont.)

Our focus will be to assist at a club capacity level by helping clubs maintain and grow their membership. We will assist in providing clubs with a high standard club structure and compliance, underpinned by the new, “*Officially Awarded Rowing Standards*” (OARS) program, that will be rolled out within the Club Development department.

The *Elite Travel Grants program* has been on hold this year with Victorian Government reshaping the funding. The new *Athlete Pathway Travel Grants Program* provides grants to improve Victorian athlete development pathways from community to national representation level. This support will be available to assist community sport and recreation athletes, coaches, officials and teams with the travel costs of participating in training and competition, and for high performance Victorian athletes and teams to compete at national championships and/or selection events. These funds will be available from the beginning of 2017.

We also congratulate a number of our clubs that were successful in obtaining funding under the “*Local Grants for Local Clubs*” partnership with Victorian Government and endorsed by Rowing Victoria.

We thank the Victorian Government for all their support and we look forward to working with them over the next three years to achieve in greater outcomes for both our members and stakeholders.

Facilities & Infrastructure – Lobbying Councils and Waterway Managers;

RV has successfully lobbied Strathbogie Shire and the Victorian Government on the extension of the peninsula at Nagambie Lakes. We are also pleased to see the approval of a new amenities block that will assist us greatly in delivering the Australian Masters Rowing Championships in 2017. We thank Strathbogie Shire, and the Victorian Government for their support.

The City of Ballarat Council will again financially assist RV running regattas at Lake Wendouree. We thank the City of Ballarat for their continual improvement of the venue and their ongoing assistance.

RV was pleased to endorse the successful Geelong Rowing Association (GRA) Grant that will see the landing on the on the Barwon River rebuilt. We congratulate the GRA for their success.

Relationships – RA, VIS, Regatta Hosts;

RV would like to thank Rowing Australia for their support to our underage athletes through the High Performance clubs and the VIS. RV continues to work closely with the VIS and the High Performance clubs to support outcomes for our Victorian athletes. We thank them for all their work and in particular their efforts in supporting our Victorian State Team and look forward to continue working with them in the future.

A special thanks to all our regatta hosts; RV realises the challenges faced in running quality regattas and the efforts required to adhering to safety protocols. We hope we are easing the administrative burden for you through our support. RV looks forward to working with you throughout the 2016-17 season.

We also thank our member Clubs and Schools, and in turn their members and students, for your support of our programs and regattas in 2015-16.

Interstate & International Funds;

RV maintains investment portfolios whose income is used to support the Interstate Team and unfunded International Team members. During the 2015-16 year, the Interstate Fund earned \$27,148 with \$30,169 spent on the team. Including fundraising and donations, the International Fund earned \$31,233 and \$33,314 disbursed to, or spent on, athletes and coaches.

Our Team appreciation

I would like to thank the staff at Rowing Victoria including: Alice Evans, James Scott, Bron Humphrys, Andrew O'Brien, Lynne Charge and Ebony Tsomaropoulos, for their hard work and difficult hours the sport presents.

The Board of Rowing Victoria, led by Chair – Pat McNamara, Vice Chair – Bill Webster and Directors – James Hatherley, Tom Wood, Joseph Joyce, Caitlin Ripper and Josie Millard who have been instrumental in supporting the delivery of the Strategic Plan and the financial stability of the association.

I would also like to thank all the Boat Race Officials led by the Umpires Panel of Tony Lawless, David Grubits, Ben Ratcliffe and Paul Hargreaves.

Last of all I would like to thank our Selectors, in particular Simon Morrison as Chair of Selectors, all our state team coaches, state team athletes and nominees for delivering very successful Interstate teams. Our on-water performance again demonstrates the culture behind the Big White V.

Conclusion

This year, RV has conducted several education workshops which have been positively received and initiated the Victorian Rowing Coaches Network to support coach development and learning. Engagement within the rowing community has also improved through Social Media which has been positively received.

Umpires Panel Report: Tony Lawless

As President of the Umpires Panel, I am pleased to present this report on behalf of the Umpires Panel for 2015/2016 season. The panel comprised of Tony Lawless (President), Paul Hargreaves, David Grubits and Ben Ratcliffe. The Panel's charter is to provide technical advice to RV on matters relating umpiring, to provide recruitment, training and accreditation of NOAS officials, and to assist the Rowing Victoria membership in the management of regattas under the guidance of the Rowing Victoria office.

During the season, the Panel has:

- Provided recommendations to the RV Board on changes to the Rules concerning penalties and the running of preliminary races;
- Provided regatta day training, mentoring and observation of regatta officials;
- Overseen the mentoring, examination and subsequent accreditation of NOAS Level 2 Officials;
- Run a successful Officials Seminar prior to the start of the 2017 regatta season;
- Participated in a trial of a mobile version of Rowing Manager, in which the paperwork associated with bow numbers, starters and finish judges may disappear in favour of a computerised system.

Throughout the season there has been a real push to recruit more NOAS Level 2 umpires to run Victorian regattas. This year we have seen 7 people passing the test and moving onto general regatta duties. The panel still has another umpire to sit the exam and another 3 in the pipeline. Several Victorian umpires worked at a National level and a number at an international level with many others interested in achieving their Australian accreditation.

Many of the umpiring community have been selfless in the time they have also given away from competition. A large proportion of this is involved in running Level 1 BRO courses for clubs and schools in every imaginable corner of the state. This means many hours helping to promote and make sure there are the necessary numbers qualified to run regattas.

On the subject of hours worked, there are many umpires who work more than their fair share of hours. Some have clocked up well in excess of 200 regatta hours per year which does not include the large amount of hours travelling to and from at their own expense.

The panel would like to thank every umpire for helping to carry out such a successful season. And a special mention goes to Jim Skidmore as he approaches his 50th season as an umpire.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2016

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any significant impact on the financial performance or position of the Association.

The following Accounting Standards and Interpretations are most relevant to the Association:

- AASB 2012-3 *Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Offsetting Financial Assets and Liabilities*;
- AASB 2012 – 3 *Amendments to AASB 136- Recoverable Amount Disclosures for non-financial assets*; and
- AASB 2014-1 *Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards (Part A to C)*.

The following Accounting Standards have been issued but are not yet effective:

- AASB 9 *Financial Instruments*; and
- AASB 15 *Revenue from Contracts with Customers*.
- AASB 16 *Leases*

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted. The expected impact on the financial statements of the Accounting Standards that have been issued but are not yet effective is detailed below:

AASB 9 Financial Instruments:

AASB 9 replaces the existing guidance in AASB 139 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement. AASB 9 includes revised guidance on the classification and measurement of financial instruments, including a new expected credit loss model for calculating impairment on financial assets, and the new general hedge accounting requirements. It also carries forward the guidance on recognition and derecognition on financial instruments from AASB 139.

AASB 9 is effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2018, with early adoption permitted.

The Association anticipates that the application of AASB 9 in the future may have an impact on the amounts reported in respect to the Association's financial assets and financial liabilities. However, it is not practicable to provide a reasonable estimate of the effect of AASB 9 until the Association undertakes a detailed review.

AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers:

AASB 15 establishes a single comprehensive model for entities to use in accounting for revenue arising from contracts with customers. The core principle of AASB 15 is that an entity should recognise revenue to depict the transfer of promised goods or services to customers in an amount that reflects the consideration to which the entity expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services.



Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2016 (cont.)

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

AASB 15 is effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2018, with early adoption permitted.

The Association anticipates that the application of AASB 15 in the future may have an impact on the amounts reported and disclosures made in the Association's financial statements. However, it is not practicable to provide a reasonable estimate of the effect of AASB 15 until the Association undertakes a detailed review.

AASB 16 Leases:

AASB 16 introduces a single lessee accounting model and requires a lessee to recognise assets and liabilities for all leases with a term of more than 12 months, unless the underlying asset is of low value. A lessee is required to recognise a right-of-use asset representing its right to use the underlying leased asset and a lease liability representing its obligations to make lease payments.

AASB 16 is effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2019, with early adoption permitted.

The Association anticipates that the application of AASB 16 in the future may have an impact on the amounts reported and disclosures made in the Association's financial statements. However, it is not practicable to provide a reasonable estimate of the effect of AASB 16 until the Association undertakes a detailed review.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The Association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial report covers Rowing Victoria Inc. as an individual entity incorporated in Victoria under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria)*.

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria)*. The Board has determined that the Association is a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs and do not take account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.



Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2016 (cont.)

(a) *Revenue recognition*

Sponsorship contributions are generally recognised as revenue on receipt except for specific sponsorships or donations for which the Association has received a binding commitment from the sponsor or donor.

Grants are recognised at fair value where there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all grant conditions will be met. The grants are recognised in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income when the Association obtains control of the revenue, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the contract will flow to the Association and the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably.

When grant revenue is received whereby the Association incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised in the Statement of Financial Position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

Proceeds from additional activities are recognised on receipt. Interest revenue is recognised as it is earned, using the effective interest method. Donations and dividends are recognised when the Association receives control over the related funds.

(b) *Plant and equipment*

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, is depreciated on the diminishing value basis over their useful lives to the Association from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Office equipment	20% to 50%
Regatta and rowing equipment	12.5% to 50%

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Association to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

(c) *Employee benefits*

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the net present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may not satisfy vesting requirements. Those cash outflows are discounted using market yields on corporate bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cash flows

Contributions are made by the entity to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred. Annual leave that is not expected to be wholly settled within 12 months is discounted allowing for expected salary levels in the future period when the leave is expected to be taken.



Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2016 (cont.)

(d) *Trade and other payables*

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(e) *Cash and cash equivalents*

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments. The term deposits, which short term in nature and are available as cash on call, have been included as cash and cash equivalents.

(f) *Financial assets*

Investments held are originally recognised at cost which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at reporting date. Movements in fair value are recognised through the asset revaluation reserve.

(g) *Inventories*

Inventories are measured at lower of cost and net realisable value, adjusted when applicable for any loss of service potential.

(h) *Goods and services tax (GST)*

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of the GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to tax authority, are presented as operating cash flows.

Commitments and contingencies are disclosed net of the amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, tax authority.

(i) *Impairment of assets*

At the end of each reporting period, the board reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, impairment is carried out on the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use, to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

(j) *Available for sale financial assets*

All investments are classified as available for sale financial assets. Available for sale financial assets are reflected at fair value unless the fair value cannot be reliably measured. Unrealised gains and losses arising from changes in fair value are taken directly to equity.



Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2016 (cont.)

(k) *Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions*

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events; management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

Key estimates

Useful lives and depreciation

The Association has assessed the useful lives of assets and to recognise these assets over their useful lives using an appropriate depreciation method and rate. Refer to Note 1(b).

Impairment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting date by evaluation of conditions and events specific to the Association that may be an indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

No impairment has been recognised in respect of assets.

Provision for Employee benefits

The Association has determined the liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting year. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. Refer to Note 1(c).

Key judgements

Provision for impairment of receivables

Included in accounts receivable at 30 June 2016 is an amount receivable from the rowing clubs which is material. The directors believe that some debts will not be recoverable and a doubtful debt provision has been made at 30 June 2016 as disclosed in Note 5.

(l) *Comparative figures*

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.



Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2016 (cont.)

(m) *Fair Value Measurement*

When an asset or liability, financial or non-financial, is measured at fair value for recognition or disclosure purposes, the fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date; and assumes that the transaction will take place either: in the principle market; or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market.

Fair value is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming they act in their economic best interest. For non-financial assets, the fair value measurement is based on its highest and best use. Valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, are used, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

(n) *Income tax*

The Association is exempt from paying income tax under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(o) *Current and non-current classification*

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when: it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when: it is either expected to be settled in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

Susie continues to be a wonderful role model for Women in Rowing. The award this year goes to **Ross Henderson**.

You have provided a valuable service to school and youth rowing through your work at Rowing Victoria while working and volunteering. You have provided valuable assistance with the Head of the Schoolgirls, the Head of the Lake and the resurrection of lake Wendouree that has benefited many schools from your drive and purpose. Your outstanding leadership and work has enabled far more school age rowers the opportunity to enjoy and participate in the sport of rowing. Your contribution has been distinguished by passion and an enduring love of the sport.

Regatta Calendar

Rowing Victoria (RV) embarked on a submission and consultation process for determining the Regatta Calendar for the 2016-17 season. This calendar will see more opportunities for junior rowing and masters rowing which represents 3700 individual rowers amongst our members. This demand driven approach saw the plans for a Head of School Boys Regatta that will offer the same experience for boys as the Head of School Girls does for girls. A significant amount of consultation and an independent committee will drive the success of this innovative idea.

RV sought feedback from athletes and officials at a range of regattas to evolve and improve the regatta hosts future regattas. We thank you all for your feedback.

RV delivered a draft calendar in April 2016 engaging incumbent regatta hosts and potential new hosts to apply for their preferred regatta dates with the 2016-17 season calendar finalised in June.

RV trialled the delivery of more under age events at various regattas to great success. These events will be offered more frequently in coming seasons.

The Masters Championship events were expanded, with the regatta running over two days, exceeding expectations.



Facilities

RV has continued to lobby State and Local Government agencies to drive waterway and infrastructure improvements, including;

- Developing criteria for facility improvements at the National Water Sports Centre and submitting to State Government in conjunction with waterway users;
- Identifying facility gaps at Nagambie Lakes and lobbying State Government and in particular the Regional Development fund for investments for improvements of up to 2.8 million dollars over the next 5 years;
- Providing endorsed support to Warrnambool Rowing Club on the rebuild of the floor in the club house that was paid for by the Local Support for Local Clubs fund;
- Continuing to engage with Parks Victoria and Maritime Safety Victoria to develop a clearer understanding for the waterway users on the Yarra. Over the next year we will see a significant change in signage and traffic information.

Recreational Rowing

Rowing Victoria has been working in consultation with Rowing Australia's National Participation Committee to work on ways to provide recreational rowing support outside the mainstream. A planned Indoor Rowing Championships will be delivered in November 2016 and a number of informal *Sporting Schools Pilot Programs* will be delivered in Australia. Rowing Victoria was successful in being awarded one of these pilots.

Recognise and Reward Volunteers

RV recognises and greatly appreciates the investment our members make in volunteering at regattas. As part of making it easier and more enjoyable to volunteer, RV has introduced a new portal called “*Rhino Roster*”, that has been independently developed to meet the needs of our volunteers. This portal will become a ‘one stop shop’, for all Officiating and volunteering services. In particular;

- Rostering at regattas
- Keeping track of accreditation and qualification
- Ensuring skills are maintained
- Identify and nominate volunteers for outstanding achievements.

RV values and respects the contribution of all our volunteers in whatever capacity they may fulfil. We realise the work they do is essential to the functioning of rowing as a sport in Victoria.

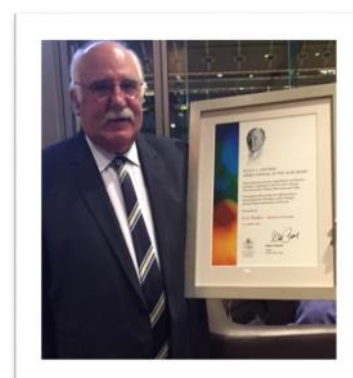
The aim of these guidelines is to ensure that the work of our volunteers is recognised by our members, and that our volunteers in turn feel appreciated for their work.

The RV Board, its staff and members have introduced these guidelines when recognising volunteers;

- Assist volunteers in maintaining appropriate records of experience that will help them in future career opportunities, both paid and volunteer.



Umpire Recruitment

Our Level 2 Umpires have achieved significant gains in the numbers for NOAS Level 2 accredited umpires this year through the mentor buddy system that has been running for the past two years. We greatly appreciate the work our umpires do on recruitment and we continually encourage all volunteer enthusiasts to consider getting involved.

Communications

Rowing Victoria (RV) has this year expanded the role of their Member Services and Educational Coordinator to include that of Media and Communications in order to develop member engagement.

Through both internal and external communication strategies, RV has and will continue to develop the articulation of content as well as the frequency and amount of reach to serve our *pillars* and align with our values. To realise our core objectives, building the profile of rowing in Victoria through media, internal and external communications will assist in supporting our club, school and other associations to make it easier and more enjoyable to go rowing in the state of Victoria.

Successful internal and external communications with our members, stakeholders and the general public of Melbourne, wider Victoria and even throughout Australia has given us the opportunity to come across as the facilitator of rowing. *One team, more fun.*

Through utilising all of our available resources, RV has developed further resources, provided insights, feedback and access to facilities, equipment and a variety of educational resources. Communication of these to, from and across all stakeholders, member clubs, schools and associations as well as the wider public all contribute towards the achievement of our *Strategic Pillars*.

Internal communications

Greater teamwork and 'role-sharing' within the workforce and our volunteers' scope at RV has assisted in the development and successful progression of our individual roles. The success of this developed communication and support strategy is evident across the sport and more specifically through our rule changes, policy updates, and overall membership growth.



From the small team at RV, to the stakeholders and wider rowing community, the achievement of our *Strategic Pillars* by the June 2017 timeline is achievable.

External communications

Our key stakeholders include VicSport, the Victorian Government, Maritime Safety Victoria, Rowing Australia and the VIS. Communications with these entities on an individual and collaborate level has seen an opportunity to tap into resources that help build the sustainable growth and capacity of our clubs and members.

In addition to this, RV has continuously worked with regatta host committees to improve their communications through more efficient and effective promotion to ensure greater success at regattas.

In the 2015-16 season through the utilisation of Facebook, Twitter and the creation of Instagram, RV have and continue to create, share and promote rowing in Victoria and across Australia. In addition to this, the recently created "*Victorian Rowing Coaches Network*" exists to connect and support all accredited rowing coaches with information, education and inspiration. The group allows for coaches

(and aspiring coaches) to come together from a variety of locations, backgrounds, experience, knowledge and employment status to support each other to promote rowing and excellence in the practice of coaching across Victoria.

Social media and external communications have developed significantly (see statistics) since the implementation of the role into the Member Services & Education position at RV. Available time and resources remains a major limitation to further expansion.

Rowing Victoria worked with stakeholder groups including VicSport to lobby 3 tiers of government, CALD communities and disability groups for necessary support to our strategic objectives.

RV continues to work with VIS and RA to underpin a unified coaching methodology that is currently under construction.

RV continues to consider the RA commissioned *Gemba Survey* outcomes and assess the benefits for nationally aligned programs to strengthen the value of all programs we deliver.

RV is working cohesively with RA to align our grassroots programs to obtain Australian Sports Commission participation funding for the Victorian Rowing Community.

RV has been lobbying Maritime Safety Victoria around access to waterways, legislation and affordability to participate.

RV has engaged with the Victorian Government on our opportunities for rowing in *Plan Melbourne*.

RV continues to explore funding scope with Sport & Recreation Victoria around community participation venues.



Victorian State Team Success

Victoria again won the Rowing Australia Cup at the Interstate Regatta this year. Success in the Kings, Queens and Victoria Cup along with the Nell Slatter Trophy saw Victoria finish at the top of the points table. The Masters Interstate crews also accumulatively finished at the top of the points table.

These high-achieving on-water results underpin both the participation and performance culture we have in Victoria which in turn significantly supports the profile of the sport in Victoria.

The primary focus of Rowing Victoria's (RV) Club Development in 2015-16 has been to establish long-term strategies and processes that will support clubs in delivering service excellence to their membership. In supporting each club's accountability to their membership, RV has drafted and implemented a range of new policies, projects, processes and support networks that will be phased in over the next twelve months.

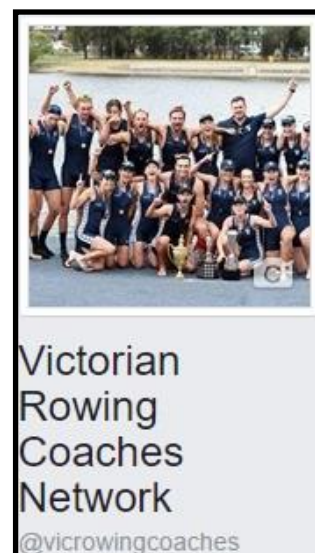
Each of these initiatives has evolved extensively through visiting clubs and meeting with club representatives. During this process, particular note was taken of what constitutes best practice in a rowing club environment and what sustainable support clubs require from external sources and / or RV to advance the satisfaction of their membership.

The development of the **OARS** (Officially Awarded Rowing Standards) project has been key to this and has manifested further key projects that support the fundamentals of the RV Strategic Plan. These include: Coaching Accreditation, Coaching Support Network, Regional Pathways, Find a Club, etc.

OARS addresses the fundamental areas for clubs such as:

- strategic planning
- marketing
- support structures
- role descriptors
- governance / management
- targeted service delivery
- resource access and sharing

The introduction of the **Mandatory Coaching Accreditation Policy** and the foundation of the **Victorian Rowing Coaches Network** (VRCN) contributed toward:

- advancing service delivery standards in clubs and schools
- aiding in securing the safety / wellbeing of members and
- promoting the ongoing professional development of coaches as key service providers within clubs and schools.

Both these initiatives will continue to be integral to the ongoing dialogue between members (rowers and coaches), clubs and RV regarding service accountability.

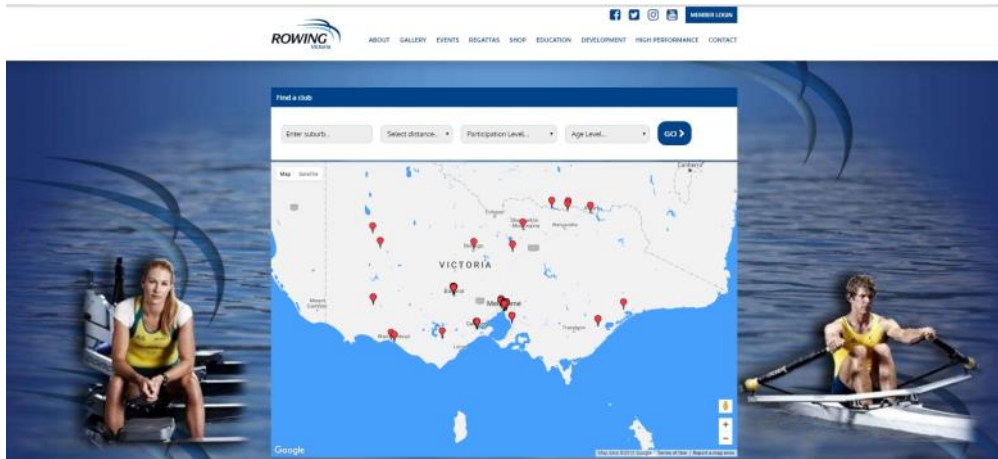
School to club transition continued to be a focus. The successful piloting of **Regional Pathways** in 2015 prepared the way for the full program in 2016. Ballarat schools once again benefited from the collaboration between the WestVic Academy of Sport, Ballarat rowing clubs, the Victorian Institute of Sport and Rowing Victoria. Selected applicants were provided with the opportunity to attend specialist workshops, strength training and Melbourne based camps under the guidance of a national coach and international competitors. The networking opportunities between these bodies and the development of potential rowing talent recommends the program for wider application in 2017.

The addition of **Find a Club** to the Rowing Victoria website has also prompted clubs to complete a matrix that clearly articulates their targeted membership. It has also become a basic reference point for individuals new to the sport of rowing. This feature will underpin future work on the OARS project.



Further services of RV members

RV through the Umpires Panel continues to promote recruitment of umpires with the pathway published on the RV website in addition to being communicated through various online methods.

RV has been working with Maritime Safety Victoria to assist our members in meeting the requirements for our sports waterway exemptions. RV is also developing a simple annual review of all Safety Management Plans.

RV continues to review rules and policies to assist our members in comprehending them. RV then host a yearly Umpire's Conference to discuss and deliver these revised rules. It is imperative that these are more strongly communicated to our members and enforced at regattas. RV will communicate understanding of the roles and contribution of volunteers and referees to all members and why they need to enforce rules. This in turn aims to build mutual respect and ensure greater success at regattas for all involved.

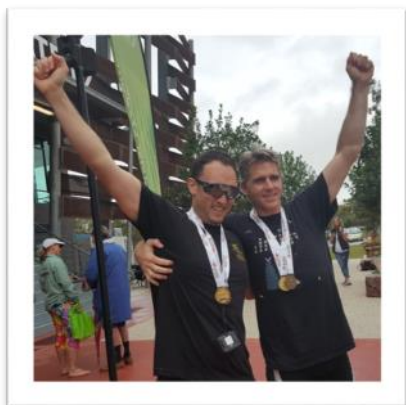
